A RESOLUTION ELIMINATING THE
"INVESTING IN WOODBURY COUNTY" LOAN PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the "Investing in Woodbury County" Loan Program was created by Resolution #10,691 on July 20, 2010 to benefit private business owners "and in order to offer local solutions to the national economic recession"; and

WHEREAS, a goal of up to \$1M in low-interest loans of 2% was established in a revolving loan fund, with current loan lengths ranging from 5-10 years; and

WHEREAS, Woodbury County appreciates the Siouxland Economic Development Corporation, which not only assists the county's loan program with screening and all loan recommendations, but manages a much larger private loan program, and therefore Woodbury County finds its own revolving loan program to be of diminished use; and

WHEREAS, Woodbury County's practice of being a partial lender gives no guarantee whether the low-interest loans they approve create jobs that would have otherwise already been created, or if taxpayers are comfortable

with a limited number of businesses being granted loans below market rate, in some cases for business expansion rather than creation; and

WHEREAS, Woodbury County funding for economic development projects that service the public good over private interests are in high demand and will continue to be so;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA that the program created by Resolution #10,691 is eliminated; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the action taken by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors on Feb. 24, 2015 to allocate a total of \$400,000 of Local Option Sales Tax funds to the Loan Program is hereby rescinded.

WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Community Attraction and Tourism Grant Support for Cone Park

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On August 10, 2015, the City of Sioux City Council approved a motion approving a recommendation for the Cone Park Development Project. The future park will include tubing hills, snow making equipment, an outdoor ice rink/splash pad, four season lodge, and a roadway. However, the roadway project will be funded separately from the rest of the park. The park elements are estimated at \$3,968,000. The current Cone Park trust is valued at \$2,600,000 and the City of Sioux City has committed \$800,000 towards the project. It is the City's intent to fund the remaining balance of \$568,000 through grants. The Parks and Recreation Department has applied for a \$250,000 local MRHD Grant. We also wish to seek funding for the remaining balance through the State of Iowa's Community Attraction and Tourism grant program. Eligibility for this grant program requires for the applicant to receive private, city, and county contributions. The City of Sioux City is respectfully requesting financial assistance from the county to be eligible for this grant. The application deadline for the Community Attraction and Tourism Grant is October 15.

BACKGROUND: The Cone Park Development Project will represent a significant testament to philanthropy and sense of community for many years to come. Mr. and Mrs. Frank and Ruth Cone moved to Sioux City from Chicago in 1917. After relocating, Mr. Cone went on to establish the Cone Livestock Company conducting business in the historic Stockyards. Mrs. Cone became actively involved in civic organizations. She passed on May 31, 1981 and per the terms of her will, a trust was established in which assets were to be invested for a period of 25 years and donated to the City of Sioux City for the establishment of a new city park.

In June of 2006, a City Council appointed ad-hoc committee was formed to determine and establish what the community needs were regarding this new park. Directed by City staff and the Cone Park Design and Construction Advisory Committee, a city-wide survey was conducted to identify the type of park and location residents of Sioux City would support. Based on the survey results, it was determined 67% of the population survey supported the development of an outdoor winter recreational park with 18% in support of a park developed in the Morningside area.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The City of Sioux City is respectfully requesting the financial assistance of \$75,000.

RECOMMENDATION: The City of Sioux City request the Woodbury County Supervisors approve financially supporting the Cone Park Development Project for the purpose of submitting a Community Attraction and Tourism Grant through the State of Iowa.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: This agreement allows Hungry Canyons Alliance to provide 54% of the costs up to \$110,000 for the project. The remaining 46% will be funded by FEMA.

BACKGROUND: This project site was damaged in the June 2014 flood event. The structure will be updated to include larger revetment and grout to help stabilize and protect it from future flood events. FEMA covers the repair costs while Hungry Canyons is funding the updated design including 15:1 slopes instead of 6:1 slopes and fish passage rock placement.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The project is funded with FEMA funds up \$92,000, and Hungry Canyons Alliance up to \$110,000.

PROJECT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 16th day of September, 2015, by and between Woodbury County, called the Sponsor, and the Hungry Canyons Alliance, hereafter known as HCA.

WITNESSED THAT:

WHEREAS, under the provision of Chapter 161D, Code of Iowa, the Hungry Canyons Alliance is authorized to assist the Sponsor in measures related to the unique natural resources, rural development and infrastructure problems of counties in the deep loess soil region of western Iowa.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of several promises to be faithfully performed by the parties hereto as set forth, the Sponsor and Hungry Canyons Alliance do hereby agree as follows:

- A. It is agreed that the following described work is to be performed at a total estimated cost of \$202,700. This amount includes survey, engineering, construction, inspection, and administration of:

Construction of stream channel stabilization structure(s) as proposed in the project application(s) labeled Attachment C to this agreement.

B. THE SPONSOR WILL:

1. Contract for and complete construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
2. Accept responsibility for land and water rights acquisition, survey, design, construction inspection, contract administration, and cost above that provided in C.1. for construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The Sponsor's share will constitute a minimum of 20% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
3. Accept all financial and other responsibility for excess costs resulting from their failure to obtain or their delay in obtaining adequate land and water rights, permits, and licenses needed for the work described in Attachment C.

4. Accept responsibility for the operation, maintenance and repairs of the structure unless it is determined by HCA and the Sponsor that the cost of repair exceeds the learned benefits of the repaired structure.
5. Hold and save the HCA free from any and all claims or causes of action whatsoever resulting from the obligations undertaken by the Sponsor under this agreement or resulting from work provided for in this agreement.
6. Accept responsibility for performing and keeping records regarding the operation and maintenance of works described in Attachment C and provide necessary facilities, administrative and bookkeeping personnel, and legal counsel for the provision of financial and technical assistance to support installation of grade stabilization measures as described in Attachment C.
7. Prepare a design, construction plans, and construction specifications in accordance with standard engineering principles. The design, construction plans, and construction specifications shall be reviewed and approved by a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa.
8. Ensure that all contracts for design and construction services will be procured in accordance with procedures prescribed in the Code of Iowa applicable to the Sponsor.
9. Ensure that any special requirements for compliance with environmental and/or cultural resource laws are incorporated into the project.
10. Retain all records pertaining to all work performed in Attachment C for three (3) years from the date of the submission of the final request for reimbursement or until final audit findings have been resolved, whichever is longer.
11. Require that a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa certify that the project was installed in accordance with the plans and specifications.
12. Request reimbursement from the HCA by submitting a Request for Reimbursement form.
13. Administer their action under this agreement in accordance with 7 CFR 3015, CFR 3016, CFR 3017, CFR 3018, CFR 3052, and OMB Circulars A-102, A-87, and A-133.
14. Comply with the requirements of Attachment A and Attachment B - SPECIAL PROVISIONS which are made a part of this agreement. Attachment A describes Drug Free Workplace and Clean Air and Water requirements. Attachment B describes equal opportunity and nondiscrimination requirements.
15. Comply with Hungry Canyons Cost-Share Program Administrative Procedures labeled Attachment D to this agreement.
16. Issue Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 1099 G, Statement for Recipients of Government Payments to the participant and to IRS as required by IRS regulations.

C. HCA WILL:

1. Provide a maximum of \$110,000 for total construction costs of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The HCA share will constitute a maximum of 80% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
2. Provide advice and counsel as needed with the technical and contractual administration of this agreement at the request of the Sponsor.
3. Upon notification of the completion of construction, HCA shall promptly review the performance of Sponsor to determine if it has met the requirements of this agreement and fund expenditures as agreed.
4. Pay the Sponsor pursuant to this agreement with request submitted on HCA Request for Reimbursement form.

D. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

1. All work under this agreement will be completed by December 31, 2017.
2. This agreement shall be effective on the date appearing in the first paragraph and shall continue in effect until the purpose of the agreement has been fulfilled or until the agreement expires on the date set forth in D.1.
3. Failure to properly design or construct a project receiving HCA funding will result in 10% of the final reimbursement being withheld and no approval of further county projects for HCA funding until the project has been fixed to accepted standards. All counties are encouraged to contact and work closely with the HCA project director to avoid this situation. All counties are to use the HCA weir design and construction checklist to help assure a good final product.
4. The furnishing of financial and other assistance by the HCA is contingent on the availability of funds appropriated by State Legislature from which payment may be made and shall not obligate the HCA upon failure of the Congress to appropriate funds.
5. HCA may terminate this agreement in whole or in part when it is determined by HCA that the Sponsor has failed to comply with any of the conditions of this agreement. The HCA shall promptly notify the Sponsor in writing of the determination and reasons for the termination, together with the effective date. Payments or recoveries made by HCA under this termination shall be in accord with the legal rights and liabilities of HCA and the Sponsor.
6. This agreement may be temporarily suspended by HCA if it determines that corrective action by the Sponsor is needed to meet the provisions of this agreement. Further, HCA may suspend this agreement when it is evident that a termination is pending.
7. The terms and conditions of this agreement are subject to modification by amendment agreed to in writing by both HCA and the Sponsor.

8. If any part of this agreement is found to be void and unenforceable, then the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in effect.
9. The contract for constructing the work described in Attachment C will not be awarded by the Sponsor to any company in which any official of the Sponsor or any member of such an official's immediate family has direct or indirect interest in the pecuniary profits or contracts of such company.
10. This agreement, as set forth on pages 1-4, constitutes the entire agreement between Hungry Canyons Alliance and the Sponsor. No representations, promises, or warranties have been made by either party that are not fully expressed in this agreement.
11. The program or activities conducted under this agreement will be in compliance with the nondiscrimination provisions as contained in Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (Public Law 100-259); and other nondiscrimination statutes: namely, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. They shall also be in accordance with regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture (7 CFR 15, Subparts A & B), which provide that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender, religion, age, disability, political beliefs, marital or familial status, or sexual orientation, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance from the Department of Agriculture or any agency thereof.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: This project is for the demolition of the existing concrete pavement on Port Neal Circle from Port Neal Road heading west and south to the entrance of AGP and MidAmerican Energy plant sites. This plans replaces project number RCX-CO97(130)—9A-97.

BACKGROUND: This project was approved on August 25, 2015 by the Woodbury County Board under the project number RCX-CO97(130)—9A-97. Except as modified by this Amendment, the provisions of the Amended and Restated Combined Central Sioux-City – CBD Urban Renewal Plan, as previously amended, are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved and shall remain in full force and effect as provided herein. In case of any conflict or uncertainty, the terms of this Amendment shall control.

PROPOSED URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS

The following new subsection (d) to Section G (1) is added to the Plan as follows:

G. Urban Renewal Projects

2. Development Agreements

(h) Downtown Redevelopment Project at 501 Pearl Street

Pursuant to Resolution No. 2011-0020 passed and approved by the City Council on January 3, 2011, the City of Sioux City and Rick Bertrand and Tammy Bertrand entered into a Contract for Private Redevelopment of Land and a Minimum Assessment Agreement relating to the real estate located at 501 Pearl Street, which Contract for Private Redevelopment of Land and Minimum Assessment Agreement were subsequently assigned to Matthew Mullen in addition to Rick Bertrand and Tammy Bertrand pursuant to Resolution No. 2014-0867 passed and approved by the City Council on December 1, 2014. The agreement specified the City would provide assistance through reimbursement of certain exterior improvements in an amount not to exceed \$54,000.

PROPERTY ACQUISITION/DISPOSITION

The City will follow any applicable requirements for the acquisition and disposition of property.

URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AMENDMENTS

The Plan may be amended from time to time for a variety of reasons, including but not limited to, adding or deleting land, adding urban renewal projects, or to modify goals or types of renewal activities. The City Council may amend this Plan in accordance with applicable state law.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Urban Renewal Plan Amendment No. 1 will become effective upon its adoption by the City Council. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Urban Renewal Plan, any prior amendment, resolution or document, the Urban Renewal Plan shall remain in effect until terminated by the City Council, and the use of incremental property tax revenues, or the "division of revenue," as those words are used in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, will be consistent with Chapter 403 of the Iowa Code.

REPEALER

Any parts of the previous Plan, as previously amended, in conflict with this Amendment are hereby repealed.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any part of the Amendment is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the previously adopted Plan as a whole or the previous amendments to the Plan, or any part of the Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.
