Funding opportunity – Continuum of Care grant

Continuum of Care proposal 2018-19

SHIP has been approached to apply for funding from the Continuum of Care, federal funding through HUD that flows through the Siouxland Coalition to End Homelessness. The project would support a full-time project coordinator that would engage homeless persons prioritized for permanent supportive housing by Coordinated Entry through the Institute for Community Alliances and would find them permanent housing with wraparound services in Woodbury and Dakota County. The project would:

- Employ a full-time project coordinator with full salary and benefits, salary range between \$35,000 and \$45,000 (salary depending on past experience and education)
- Partner with the Siouxland Coalition to End Homelessness and the Institute for Community Alliances, along with other partners, in determining eligible candidates for permanent supportive housing based on an established priority list
- Engage the top 10 candidates from list, determine eligibility, provide care coordination to candidates and seek wraparound services to facilitate a successful reintegration into the community by maintaining permanent housing
- Partner with local housing and landlords to identify accessible, affordable and tenable housing for clients
- Utilize budget to pay for housing and help to engage supports within the community for the individual
- Ensure that Coordinator carry a caseload of all clients and continually offer case management and engage the individual

This grant asks for a 25% match, which can be in-kind and can include Siouxland Street Project meetings and staff time. SHIP will ask for a 10% indirect cost rate. Total budget for this project is \$186,285 (including match).
