




Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

1. The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert renairs.
- 5. Applicant shall my, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become accessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said-ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be reseeded.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.

ORDINANCE	#
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An Ordinance permitting the operation of All-Terrain Vehicles and Off-Road Utility Vehicles in Woodbury County, Iowa

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has evaluated the traffic conditions on all County roadways/highways and has determined that all-terrain vehicles and off-road utility vehicles can be operated without unduly interfering with or constituting an undue hazard to conventional motor vehicle traffic, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Iowa Code section 321I.10, the County may permit operation of said vehicles on the roadways of the county, and;

WHEREAS, the operation of said vehicles would be regulated under lowa Code Chapters 321, 321.20B, 321A.21, and other applicable provisions of the lowa Code;

NOW, therefore be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors that the following regulations are hereby adopted regarding operation of all-terrain vehicles and off-road utility vehicles on county roadways within Woodbury County, Iowa:

Section 1: Purpose

To designate the county roadways upon which all-terrain vehicles and off-road utility vehicles may operate and to establish regulations regarding such operation.

Section 2: Definitions

- All-Terrain Vehicle 321I.1(1)(a): means a motorized vehicle with not less than three and not
 more than six non-highway tires that is limited by engine displacement to less than one
 thousand cubic centimeters and in total dry weight to less than one thousand two hundred
 pounds and that has a seat or saddle designed to be straddled by the operator and handlebars
 for steering control.
- 2. Off-Road Utility Vehicle 321I.1(17)(a): means a motorized vehicle with not less than four and not more than eight non-highway tires or rubberized tracks that has a seat that is of bucket or bench design not intended to be straddled by the operator and a steering wheel or control levers for control. Off-road utility vehicles include Type 1, Type 2 & Type 3 vehicles.
- 3. Roadways 321I.1: means that portion of the highway improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel. Roadway does not include the ditch.

Section 3: Operation on Roadways

A vehicle properly registered with the Iowa DNR, pursuant to Iowa Code section 321I.3, and with proper Woodbury County identification, pursuant to Section 5 of this ordinance, may be operated on any roadway in Woodbury County, Iowa pursuant to the restrictions in this ordinance and those restrictions imposed by Iowa Code. All-Terrain Vehicles and Off-Road Vehicles shall not be operated on dirt or earth surface roads or other Class B roads when wet conditions exist that would cause damage to the roadway or would cause the vehicle to get stuck. They are prohibited from Class C Roads. Operation under this

ordinance is only permitted on the county roadways lying outside the city limits of any incorporated city which does not have an ordinance or other regulation in effect allowing such operation. Operation is not permitted at any time on Interstate 29 and state highways.

Section 4: Unlawful Operation

A person shall not operate an All-Terrain Vehicle or Off-Road Utility Vehicle on county roadways under any of the following conditions:

- 1. At a rate of speed greater than the posted speed limit.
- 2. In a careless, reckless or negligent manner.
- 3. Without a lighted headlight or taillight.
- 4. In any tree nursery or planting in a manner which damages or destroys growing stock.
- 5. On private or public land prohibiting such operation.
- 6. In any park, wildlife area, preserve, refuge or game management area.
- 7. Any portion of a meandered stream or the bed of a non-meandered stream which has been identified as a navigable stream or river by the Iowa DNR and which is covered by water. Does not apply to designated riding areas and designated riding trails.
- 8. Upon an operating railroad right-of-way. May be driven directly across a railroad right-of-way only at established crossings.
- 9. With more persons on the vehicle than it was designed to carry.
- 10. While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotics or drugs.
- 11. Without a valid driver's license and proof of insurance.
- 12. Under the age of 18.

Section 5: Identification Requirements

Individuals who operate an All-Terrain Vehicle or Off-Road Utility Vehicle on the roadways of the county must obtain an identification sticker from the office of Woodbury County Treasurer. The following conditions apply:

- 1. For each vehicle, the owner must provide proof of ownership, current registration with the Iowa DNR and proof of liability insurance.
- 2. Pay an annual registration fee in the amount of \$25.00.
- 3. Stickers must be affixed to the right-rear portion of the vehicle such that it is clearly visible.
- 4. Stickers are non-transferable.
- 5. Out of state vehicles are also required to be registered with Iowa DNR.

Section 6: Exempt Vehicles and Operators

This ordinance does not apply to any vehicles operated pursuant to Iowa Code section 321.9 (government and farm implements) or Iowa Code section 321.234A (agricultural purposes, government, public utilities, licensed engineers and licensed surveyors).

Section 7: Penalties

Violation of this ordinance shall constitute a simple misdemeanor punishable by a minimum fine of \$65.00 and a maximum fine of \$625.00, plus applicable surcharges and court costs.

Section 8: Effective Date


I have reviewed the situation and present the following:

The 1988 UBC (assumed design reference) would allow an A-3 occupancy to have 6000 sq ft of area...this may be increased 100% by the separation on all sides...section 505 would allow a multi-story structure to have twice the allowable area which would be 6000 x 2 x 2 or 24,000 total for the structure and as such the (assumed) area separation wall would technically not have been a requirement (perhaps when the design was envisioned this was not the logic followed or the wooded area was not considered open – I do not think it is an occupancy separation wall either due to the fact that there was no requirement between an A-3 and office spaces B-2).

In reviewing the plans I am admittedly confused by the number and locations of the rated partitions (between the main exhibit area and the multi purpose rooms for instance) and as such I am not certain to what is truly required and what is not....so please provide the following

The resource room walls that were originally constructed as rated walls shall be provided with dampers...all other walls may remain as constructed with the corresponding protection for the penetrating items.


