BETWEEN THE CITY OF SIOUX CITY, IOWA AND THE COUNTY OF WOODBURY, IOWA;

2021 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) GRANT PROGRAM AWARD

This Agreement is made and enter into this 26th day of July 2021 by and between the CITY of Sioux City, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as CITY, and the COUNTY of Woodbury, acting by and through its governing body, the Board of Supervisors, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, both of Woodbury County, State of Iowa, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority of lowa Code; and

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this agreement: and

WHEREAS, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the CITY and COUNTY agree as follows:

Section 1.

CITY agrees to pay COUNTY 50% of funds received under the federal award for a total of \$24,096.00 in JAG funds.

Section 2.

CITY agrees to use \$24,096.00 for eligible activities under the JAG program until 09.30.2024.

COUNTY agrees to use \$24,096.00 for eligible activities under the JAG program until 09.30.2024.

Section 3.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the lowa Tort Claims Act.

Section 4.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against COUNTY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the lowa Tort Claims Act.

Section 5.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this Agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

Section 6.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 7.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.
