

AMENDMENT #1 Extending Performance Period and Returning Award Funds That Will Not Be Expended

ARTICLE I, EXTENSION OF PERFORMANCE PERIOD AND REDUCTION OF CLOSEOUT PERIOD

The overall performance period, originally ending June 30, 2014, is extended to July 6, 2014. Thus the entire sub-grant period of performance shall be October 1, 2012 to July 6, 2014. This amendment authorizes programmatic and fiscal actions, including payment of allowable costs, within the extended performance period. The closeout period immediately following the performance period however, is being reduced by this amendment to only 60 days. Therefore, all costs legitimately incurred during the extended performance period must be submitted, and all related matters closed, within 60 days of the performance period ending date.

ARTICLE II, REDUCTION OF HSGP AWARD

This amendment also reduces by \$9000.00 the amount of federal grant funding to Woodbury County on behalf of Law Enforcement Intelligence Network Region 1 (LEIN 1) under the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2012 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP). The original award granted to LEIN 1, hereafter referred to as the SUBGRANTEE, under FFY 2012 HSGP was \$143,500.00. This amendment reduces the grant award to \$134,500.00. The subgrantee's project budget is hereby amended to reduce the budgeted amount for Planning: Materials from the original amount of \$11,032.00 to \$2,032.00. The purpose of this reduction is the voluntary forfeiture of funds by the subgrantee in the amount of \$9,000.00 that would otherwise be un-expended, and allows such funds to be re-allocated to other approved 2012 HSGP projects in lowa or returned to the federal government. This change is made in accordance with 44 Code of Federal Regulations (44 CFR), Part 13.44.

INFORMATION SHARING OFFICE

Due to cuts in the State Homeland Security Grant Program, the State of Iowa will no longer be providing Intelligence and Information Sharing grant funds to the six regional offices in Iowa. Woodbury County's Homeland Security Department is one of the six affected offices and will close as of July 6th, 2014.

The purpose of this communication is to provide information and propose storage and disposition of documents, equipment, and supplies maintained within the Woodbury County Homeland Security Office.

Record Retention Requirements: All grant documents must be maintained for five years past the date that FEMA closes the entire award to the State of Iowa. This period is consistent with Iowa Code must be compliant with the *Code of Federal Regulations* 44 Chapter 1 13.42.

The chart below lists the retention period for the grants that have funded the Woodbury County Homeland Security Office (GY2011 and 2012 have not been provided as of yet). A binder for each grant will be prepared and left with the deputy auditor when the office funding ends on July 6, 2014.

Equipment Inventory and Disposition: An equipment Inventory list must be prepared and maintained to satisfy federal requirements identified in the Code of Federal Regulations 44 Chapter 1 13.32. The same regulation outlines specific requirements toward use, management, disposition, and rights to transfer title. Disposition of equipment with fair market value over \$5,000.00 must have HSEMD's pre-approval.

Property or inventory records must be maintained and include the following:

- Serial numbers or other identifying numbers
- The source of the property (HSGP)
- The title holder and/or whomever maintains physical possession of the property
- · Acquisition date of each item

- · Dollar cost of the item
- The percentage of federal funding used in the purchase
- The physical location of the item
- · Its condition (new, operational, under repair, etc)

The following is proposed to Woodbury County for Equipment Inventory and Disposition:

- In compliance with these regulations, a master sheet of equipment has been prepared that
 includes documentation for each of the bulleted points above. Each binder for the individual
 grants will also include a page that lists all of the equipment and disposition of the equipment
 purchased under said grant.
- 2. During the retention period, equipment must be inventoried bi-yearly.
- Ownership of all equipment that is assigned to outside agencies will be given to the agency that
 is currently housing the equipment. Ownership will be on file with the equipment master list.
 Ownership transfer of equipment with a fair market value at \$5,000.00 and above will be
 approved through IA HSEMD.
- All remaining equipment and supplies that is in the Homeland Security Office will be transferred to the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office.

Intel Sharing Exercise: It is proposed that the Woodbury County Homeland Security Planner be allowed to use the After Action Report (AAR) from the 2013 Intelligence Sharing Exercise as a resource to present findings to interested parties after her employment terminates. Woodbury County maintains the rights to the AAR. The exercise yielded positive feedback about the information sharing system in lowa and can be a benefit to other agencies in learning best practices.

Future of Information Sharing: Local law enforcement agencies from the 16 counties in LEIN Region1 and the tri-state area have found a great asset in Woodbury County's IA LEIN Region 1 Information Sharing Office (LEIN RISO1). LEIN RISO1 has purchased over 140 equipment items housed throughout the region, funded training for hundreds of officers, and shared thousands of informational, intelligence, and officer safety bulletins. The State of Iowa Department of Public Safety is seeking to develop a uniform and sustainable strategy for information sharing to replace the six regional offices that are affected by the funding cuts.





SERGEANT BLUFF/WOODBURY COUNTY 28E AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT MUTUAL AID and EMERGENCY/DISASTER RESPONSE

This Agreement is made pursuant to statutory authority granted to the parties pursuant to lowa Code section 285E.4 by and between the City of Sergeant Bluff, Iowa, (herein "City"), and Woodbury County (herein "Woodbury Co.").

Recitals

The City of Sergeant Bluff, Iowa, and Woodbury County, Iowa are separate governmental entities which provide law enforcement protection and other services within their respective jurisdictions. The parties have in the past cooperated in providing requested assistance from the other jurisdictions in emergency and non-emergency situations on a case by case basis. The parties further acknowledge that situations will continue to arise in the future when cooperate efforts will be needed between the law enforcement and other public agencies of the respective governmental entities. The parties- desire at this time to enter into a more formal mutual aid and emergency/disaster response agreement which defines and clarifies rights and responsibilities of the parties when providing requested assistance to other agencies.

Definitions

The terms as used in this agreement shall have the following meaning:

- 1. "Requesting agency" shall mean the law enforcement or other public service agency of the jurisdiction requesting aid within its territorial limits.
- 2. "Responding agency" shall mean the law enforcement or other public service agency of the jurisdiction supplying aid outside its territorial limits.
- 3. "Organized Civic Event" shall mean an annual or semi-annual fair, festival, and/or celebration.

- 4. "Scheduled Special Event" shall mean an event which is not an annual or semi-annual event or occurrence such as RAGBRAI or an historical commemoration.
- 5. "Shift work" shall mean regularly occurring patrol or investigative duties normally assigned in eight (8), nine (9) or ten (10) hour increments for which law enforcement officers are regularly employed to work by a law enforcement agency.
- "Calls for service" shall mean routine requests for law enforcement services including responding to citizen calls, taking reports, and performing other generally non emergency law enforcement duties.
- 7. "Employing agency" shall mean the department which is the primary employer of the law enforcement officer or public employee.
- 8. "Emergency assistance" shall mean requests for assistance where the lives of the public or other law enforcement officers are in danger and include but are not limited to assisting with search and rescue operations, standoff situations or other incidents where additional personnel, law enforcement officers, or equipment are needed to aid in restoring order or assisting in a natural or manmade disaster or assisting in an arrest in an emergency situation.

Agreement

I. Emergency Assistance - Requesting Agency Obligations

- (a) The requesting agency shall contact the ranking officer or department employee on duty for the responding agency to request emergency assistance and shall provide the ranking officer or employee with the number of officer(s) or employee(s) requested, the type of equipment requested and the estimated time that the officers or employees and/or equipment will be required to assist the requesting agency during the emergency/disaster response.
- (b) The requesting agency shall assume liability for loss or damage to equipment supplied in response to the request for emergency assistance. The requesting agency shall be responsible for reimbursing the responding agency for all lost or damaged equipment.
- (c) It is understood that the requesting agency shall assume command authority over the responding officer(s) utilizing the NIMS. A member of the responding agency will be afforded a position in the unified command/incident command, however, it is agreed that no officer or employee shall be ordered to perform actions which are in direct conflict with the training, standard operating procedures or policy directives of his/her employing agency.
- (d) The responding law enforcement officer(s) shall be given by the requesting agency the same authority as to law enforcement matters as sworn members of the requesting agency within its jurisdiction.

(e

II. Emergency Assistance - Responding Agency Obligations

- (a) The responding agency shall respond to the request for emergency assistance in a timely fashion and shall provide the requesting agency with an estimate of the time needed to comply with the request for assistance.
- (b) The responding agency has the ability to review the request for assistance and evaluate their ability to respond to the request.
- (c) The responding agency shall not be obligated to respond to a request for emergency assistance if doing so would endanger the lives, property or safety of the citizens of the responding agency's jurisdiction.
- (d) The responding agency shall not be obligated to provide assistance to the requesting agency in filling regular shift work.
- (e) The responding agency will not be responsible for providing officer(s) to answering routine calls for service when the requesting agency does not have sufficient officers on duty to cover the calls.
- (f) In the event the responding agency would have a higher priority incident occur within their own jurisdiction, the responding agency has the right and ability to recall personnel and equipment necessary to meet its own obligations.
- (g) The responding agency when acting outside its normal jurisdiction, shall promptly submit its reasonable charges for payment to the requesting agency.

III. Non-Emergency Assistance

- (a) This agreement does not apply to providing assistance with regular non-emergency shift work.
- (b) Each department's and/or agency's policy directives regarding secondary employment are not waived by entry into this agreement.
- (c) It is agreed that off-duty officers or employees from either of the undersigned jurisdictions may work organized civic events or scheduled special events at the request of the agency hiring the off-duty officer or employee and subject to the approval of the primary employing agency. While performing services requested for organized civic events or scheduled special events, the off-duty officer or employee is not acting as an employee of the primary employing agency and all liability for the officer or employee's wages and actions while performing the off-duty work shall be the responsibility of the agency hiring the off-duty officer or employee to work the organized civic or scheduled special event.

IV. Duration and Termination

- (a) The duration of this Agreement shall be continuous until terminated by either party.
- (b) Either party may terminate this Agreement upon 120 days written notice to the other party to this agreement.


Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

Other Special Provisions:

1. The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

Approved 1/19/99

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by Jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) fect of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be researched.
- The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only lasofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the ferms and conditions herein set forth.

Construction Project Report:

STP-S-CO97(110)—5E-97, HMA Overlay Project on County Road K45, Old Highway 75 from the south city limits of Sergeant Bluff to the intersection of K45 and D51 (Luton Pavement). Letting date: February 18, 2014. Contract price: \$764,253.46. Contractor: Knife River Construction. The project consists of placing a 3" HMA overlay on the existing HMA pavement. All contracts are signed and contracts have been approved by Iowa DOT. The project is funded with MPO federal aid funds matched by the county farm to market fund. Late start date for the project is September 8, 2014.

STP-S-CO97(121)—5E-97, PCC Inlay Project on County Road D51from Port Neal Road to the Interstate 29 interchange. Letting date: February 18, 2014. Contract price: \$1,261,371.36. Contractor: C. J. Moyna & Sons, Inc. The project will consist of removal of the existing pavement, crushing the old pavement and placing it as road base, then placing a new 10" PCC pavement on the road grade. The county project is funded with MPO federal aid funds matched by the RISE funds awarded for the CF Industries project. The Iowa DOT is providing construction management and inspection to coordinate our pavement replacement project with the interchange work. A preconstruction meeting was held on April 17. Work started on the interchange project the week of May 9, 2014. The two south ramps are scheduled to close the week of July 25, 2014. Work on the county road and closure of the north ramps is scheduled for the week of October 3, 2014, with paving of the county road to take until around November 17, 2014. The schedule is subject to change, this being the contractor's best estimate at this time. All work at the interchange is scheduled to be completed in mid-December 2014.

RCX-CO97(119)—9B-97, CF Industries Plant Road-grading for paving of the plant access road. Letting date: April 29, 2014. Late start date: June 2, 2014. Contract price: \$525,413.80. Contractor: Lieber Construction, Inc. Work started Monday, June 2nd with the contractor moving in and starting clearing and grubbing of the right of way. Subcontractors are expected on the job this week to start work on the 54' pipe in the wetland area. The project is funded with RISE funds awarded for the CF Industries project and will be matched by local funds.

L-B(K199)—73-97, Michigan Avenue Bridge Replacement: Letting date: April 29, 2014. Contract price: \$510,724.50. Contractor: Christensen Brothers, Inc. Late start date: July 15, 2014. The project was awarded May 6, 2014. The project is funded by local secondary road fund dollars. Contracts have been approved by the Board. Precast deck sections are complete, paid for, and awaiting delivery to the contractor. The new bridge will be a 150' x 26' Precast Concrete Deck bridge. Completion is expected by Fall 2014.

L-B(L136)—73-97, Pocahontas Avenue Bridge Replacement Letting date: June 10, 2014. Low bidder: Dixon Construction, Inc. Bid price: \$497,757.65. Late start date: September 1, 2014. This bridge project is funded with the new Capital Projects Levy. The new bridge will be a 90' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab Bridge. The bid will be recommended to the Board for award at the June 17th meeting.

L-B(H109)—73-97, 185th Street Bridge Replacement: Letting date: June 10, 2014. Low bidder: Dixon Construction, Inc. Bid price: \$599,950.35. Late start date: September 1, 2014. This bridge project is funded with the new Capital Projects Levy. The new bridge will be a 100' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab Bridge. The bid will be recommended to the Board for award at the June 17th meeting.

BRS-0867(601)—60-97, Bronson Bridge and Box Culvert Replacement on County Road D38 near the intersection of 210th Street and the Bronson Blacktop on the corporation line road with Bronson. Letting date: June 17, 2014. Late Start Date: July 21, 2014. Working Days: 75 days. The project is funded with federal aid bridge funds matched with county farm to market fund money. The project includes replacement of the existing bridge with a new 150' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab bridge, replacement of the small bridge at the intersection of D38 and K42 with a new box culvert, and new PCC Concrete paving from approximately 100' SE of the bridge to the intersection of D38 and K42.

Iowa 175 Detour: Last year, the county signed a detour agreement with Iowa DOT for the use of county roads around Danbury for a temporary detour. That detour use starts Thursday. A pavement reconstruction project on Iowa 175 through the town of Battle Creek will require detouring traffic beginning Thursday, May 15 until late November, weather permitting, according to the Iowa Department of Transportation's Cherokee construction office. Traffic will be detoured from Iowa 175 south at Danbury on Woodbury County Road L-37, east on Woodbury/Ida County Road D-54, and then north on U.S. 59 to Iowa 175 east of Ida Grove.

Port Neal Interchange Haul Road: The Iowa DOT approved the use of 210th Street, Old Lakeport Road, Old Highway 75 and 260th Street as a temporary primary haul road for hauling fill material for the ramps and road embankments to the I-29 interchange project. Fill material is being removed from the Alexson property behind 1483 210th Street. This haul road use is likely to be occurring through much of this summer as work continues on the interchange.

Grandy Drive repair: Last week, following a report of a defect from a sharp eyed neighbor, Grandy Drive off of highway 20 was found to be undermined and that the road had shifted due to water getting under the pavement. The county closed the road for two days while emergency repairs were conducted. Grout Scouts, a mud jacking contractor, was contacted to fill the voids and completed repairs in one day. The road has been sealed and the voids filled at considerably less cost and a shorter closure period than pavement replacement.
