Woodbury County Human Resources would like to bring for "discussion and action" expense item reimbursements that are excludable from wages for the Woodbury County Activities Policy for County Economic Development.

The policy currently is quite restrictive for meals in the course of entertaining customers directly related to County business. We believe it to be in the interest of the County to allow any economic development business with meal expenses to be reimbursed outside of the employee's wages when entertaining clients in the course of direct County business incurred during the meal period.

WOODBURY COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES POLICY

All County business for economic development activities to be discussed during a meal period and/or meal setting needs to be approved by the Board of Supervisors and will be reviewed monthly. All expenses incurred will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Supervisors before they are paid. This policy can be used by an employee and/or elected official that conducts business for Woodbury County by means of actively conducting business to gain economic development and/or any significant business for the County during a meal setting and/or during a meal period with expenses considered directly related to County business.

Reimbursement or allowances to employees for meals in the course of entertaining customers may be excludable if the expenses are ordinary and necessary and meet either a **Directly-Related Test** or an **Associated Entertainment Test**.

Directly-Related Test – Entertainment-related meal may be excludable from wages if:

- The main purpose of the combined business and meal is the active conduct of business
- Business is actually conducted during the meal period, and
- There is more than a general expectation of deriving income or other specific business benefit at some future time.

All of the facts must be considered, including the nature of the business transacted and the reasons for conducting business during the meal. If the meal takes place in a clear business setting and is for your business or work, the expenses are considered directly relate to your business or work.

Associated Entertainment Test – Entertainment-related meal reimbursements meet the associated test and are excludable if the entertainment is:

- Associated with the active conduct of the employer's business, and
- Directly before or after a substantial business discussion.

Generally, an expense is associated with the active conduct of a business, if there is a clear business reason for incurring it. The purpose may be to get a new business or to encourage the continuation of an existing relationship. These activities need not occur in a clear business setting.

Whether a business discussion is substantial depends on the fact of each case. A business discussion will not be considered substantial unless you can show that you actively engaged in the discussion, meeting, negotiation, or other business transaction to get income or some other specific business benefit. You must be able to show that the business discussion was substantial in relation to the meal.

Receipts must be attached to all requests for reimbursement of meal expenses. These receipts must be itemized detailed receipts and not summary credit card receipts. Requests for reimbursement including receipts shall be itemized on an expense report and signed by the employee and the department head and/or elected official. All expenses incurred will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Supervisors before they are paid.



- All aspects of video production and editing, from raw footage to final video including professional voiceovers and background music (CGI reserves the right to use still images and photos for video production)
- Final draft of County Video Showcase content subject to your approval (up to 3 sets of revisions allowed). Any request for approval any revision, including final draft, shall be deemed approved if no response is received by us within thirty (30) days of request
- Patented OneClick™ Technology and encoding of all videos into multiple streaming digital formats to play on all computer systems, browsers, and Internet connection speeds; recognized player formats include WindowsMedia® and QuickTime®
- Store and stream all videos on CGI's dedicated server
- Businesses will be allowed to purchase various digital media products and services from CGI Communications and its company affiliates
- Business logos shall be displayed around the perimeter the of video panels
- Duration of sponsor participation will be one to two years. CGI Communications is solely responsible for sponsorship fulfillment including all related aspects of marketing, production, printing, and distribution



The overall Program was evaluated for effectiveness and programs having long term positive impact on youth are continued through the attached Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Sioux City Community School District. Programs were reviewed, prioritized and supported for continuation through the Mental Health Public Hearing process.

The Sioux City Community School District has provided \$30,000 for the continuation of the program.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
MENTAL HEALTH COMPONENTS OF

SIOUX CITY COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT**

This **Memorandum of Understanding** between the Woodbury County Social Services Office and the Sioux City Community School District shall serve to provide identification and clarification of specific responsibilities between the parties involved for performance and funding of programming related to activities identified as a continuation of the mental health components of the **Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative** undertaken by the Sioux City Community School District originating in 2001 with federal grant funds.

Under the terms and scope of this **Memorandum of Understanding**, the Sioux City Community School District agrees to serve as program administrator and fiscal agent for Woodbury County funds dedicated to and awarded under this effort.

The period of performance for programming contained within this agreement shall be effective from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. Funding continuation and levels of funding after expiration of the agreement shall be reviewed by the Sioux City Community School District and Woodbury County Social Services. Availability of funding and satisfactory performance by the School District and any/all subcontractors will be reviewed throughout the term of the agreement and taken into consideration for program continuation.

In accordance with the provisions of this funding agreement, the Sioux City Community School District agrees to the following:

- To dedicate \$30,000 from Sioux City Community School District funds to support efforts;
- To continue mental health service components of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative as specified in the original grant application;
- To assure receipt of documentation filed on a monthly basis, necessary to support expenditures. No costs will be reimbursed outside the scope or timeframe of the grant, nor without the proper documentation.
- To provide Woodbury County Social Services with appropriate and timely documentation, statistics and other related program progress and evaluation reports as designated in the original grant conditions and contract. At a minimum, throughout the term of the grant, these requirements will be reported on a quarterly basis and will include program and financial quarterly information.

Funds awarded under this agreement through the Woodbury County Social Services Office are at the discretion/review of said office. Any questions regarding allowable expenditures shall be clarified and/or determined as eligible through the Woodbury County Social Services Office.

In the application and administration of the contract involved, ALL PARTIES FURTHER AGREE to mediation if matters of unresolved dispute arise. All parties agree to resolve their differences through a process of mediation with a mutually agreed upon mediator and process.

A. PROCUREMENT OF EQUIPMENT

In addition to the above reports, final annual reports will be required. This data will verify the impact, success or failure of the project and a statement as to the effectiveness of the project. These reports will be used to file federal and community reports.

C. AMENDMENTS TO THE AGREEMENT

The Woodbury County/Sioux Rivers Region reserves the right to modify this agreement at any time.

All modifications or amendments of the agreement shall be in writing and approved by the Woodbury County/Sioux Rivers Region and the Sioux City Community School District prior to implementation.

D. COST OF PROPOSAL

Woodbury County/Sioux Rivers Region is not responsible for any costs incurred by the Sioux City Community School District related to other activities carried out by a sub grantee or Sioux City Community School District personnel outside the scope and definition of the budgetary parameters specified within as Attachments.

E. PUBLIC RECORDS

All report information submitted by an applicant will be treated as a public record by the Sioux City Community School District and the Woodbury County Social Services Office unless the information may be treated as confidential pursuant to applicable laws. Public records will be copied as necessary to comply with Iowa’s public record law. This does not apply to specific program evaluation requirements and rights of privacy.

F. CONFIDENTIALITY AND PARTICIPANT PROTECTION

Applicants and Subgrantees are expected to develop and implement appropriate procedures to address confidentiality and other ethical issues pertinent to the protection of participants in proposed projects. Treatment for mental illness must maintain confidentiality in accordance with professional standards of practice and applicable law.

If applicable, project staff must meet State and local licensure, and professional accreditation standards in addition to normal professional standards of care and practice. The Project Directors and Evaluators will have direct and continuing responsibility to ensure that participant protection is adequate.

Notwithstanding any of the above, the all Sub grantees agree to not disclose or otherwise release any personally identifying information, such as, but not limited to: names, social security number, or addresses of any individuals associated with services received pursuant to the grant and/or obtained while performing duties pursuant to the grant, to any third party without first obtaining the appropriate consent of the individual(s) concerned.



Vonda M. Anfinson has filed a subdivision application and final platting to subdivide 5.00 acres into 2 lots for residential development. The applicant currently resides on Lot 2 of Koch's Addition and wishes to subdivide the lot to allow a family member to construct a single family dwelling within close proximity.

The parent parcel lies in rural Woodbury County approximately 1.5 miles east of Sergeant Bluff on the south side of 220th St. in the NE ¼ of Section 04 of Liberty Township. The city of Sergeant Bluff has the right to extraterritorial review and subdivision approval.

The parent parcel is zoned AE (Agricultural Estates); not within a special flood hazard area; lies within the Farmer's Drainage District and is serviced by a drive addressed 1488 220th St, Sergeant Bluff.

As the use of the parent parcel is residential development no CSR value for the parcel is available. CSR values in the area average 59-67. The areas range is slightly outside of policies allowing subdivision but as the proposed location is already within a subdivision and not currently in agricultural production the policy does not apply.

The existing AE (Agricultural Estates) zoning district designation permits the potential residential density.

This location will require the recording of a paving agreement pursuant to County paving policy.

Your Board is asked to consider the final platting referring to the Zoning Commission for public hearing and recommendation.

Consideration of Final Platting for Marsh Addition - a Minor Subdivision with Referral to Zoning Commission for Public Hearing and Recommendation RE: Marsh Addition - a Minor Subdivision; GIS Parcel #s 864332200001; 864332200003; 864332200005; 864332200006 and 864332200007.

Carla A. Marsh has filed a subdivision application and final platting to subdivide 63.53 acres into 3 lots. The 63.53 acres lie currently within a portion of five (5) independent parcels. The applicant requests the subdivision in order the existing single family dwelling and outbuildings can be located on a lot independent from pasture and timber ground. The applicant also desires an independent frontage lot for potential residential development.

The parent parcels lie in rural Woodbury County approximately 2.5 miles east of Smithland on the south side of 330th St. in the NE ¼ of Section 32 in Oto Township.

The parent parcels are zoned AP (Agricultural Preservation); are not within any drainage district. Four (4) of the five (5) parent parcel have minor portions impacted by Zone A Special Flood Hazard Area (100 year floodplain). However, in each case the flood hazard areas are limited to the creek bed and embankment locations of Parnell Creek.

The existing single family dwelling is proposed to be located on Lot 1 which is currently serviced by a drive addressed 3776 330th St., Smithland. The parent parcels have CSR values averaging 30.90 to 43.39 and falling within County policies allowing subdivision.

The existing AE (Agricultural Estates) zoning district designation permits the existing Lot 1 and the potential residential density for Lot 2's development. Should a building permit application for dwelling construction be received for a third lot the zoning district designation for all lots would have to be re-zoned to AE (Agricultural Estates) before permitting could be approved upon the third lot unless the specific location on Lot 3 was in the far south quarter-quarter section.

This location will require the recording of a paving agreement pursuant to County paving policy.



Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and Uncle Ben 5K/Run/Walk (hereinafter referred to as property owner, organization or authorized representative) do hereby enter into the following permit and agreement:

1. Woodbury County hereby consents to and grants permission to the property owner, organization or authorized representative, to conduct the following described construction or activities within the right-of-way:

TO run a 5K race starting at the Cushing Fire Station, 201 Main Street, in Cushing and traveling East on 160th Street to the Woodbury/Ida Co. line. Anticipated time of 8 AM - 11 AM

2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:

A. The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.

B. The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.

C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.

D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.

E. The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.

F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.

G. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will reseed and mulch the disturbed areas. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will be responsible for seed, mulch, and labor unless otherwise provided in section L.

H. The applicant shall also save Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department harmless of any damage or losses that may be sustained by the traveling public on account of such construction, repair or maintenance operations, or other activities.

I. **FAILURE TO CONFORM TO OR TO ACQUIRE A PERMIT IS A VIOLATION OF SECTION 318.8, 2009 CODE OF IOWA.** This permit is subject to any laws now in effect or any laws that may be hereafter enacted and all applicable rules and regulations of local, state and federal agencies. This permit is subject to all the rules and regulations of Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department.



The Amended and Restated Combined Central Sioux City -CBD Urban Renewal Plan ("Plan") for the Combined Central Sioux City –CBD Urban Renewal Area ("Area" or "Urban Renewal Area"), originally adopted in 1967 and restated and amended as set out in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, is being further amended to add and/or confirm a proposed project to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area ("Amendment"). No land is being added to the Area by this Amendment.

Except as modified by this Amendment, the provisions of the Amended and Restated Combined Central Sioux-City –CBD Urban Renewal Plan, as previously amended, are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved and shall remain in full force and effect as provided herein. In case of any conflict or uncertainty, the terms of this Amendment shall control.

PROPOSED URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS

The following new subsection (e) to Section G (2) is added to the Plan:

G. Proposed Urban Renewal Projects

2. Development Agreements

(f) Downtown Development – Downtown Office Building Renovation

The City is considering entering into a Development Agreement with a private developer, by which the City would, subject to the terms and conditions of a negotiated Development Agreement, provide certain property tax rebates to assist with the renovation of an office facility located at 306 Virginia Street and the creation of new high quality jobs. It is expected that the aggregate economic development grants and other assistance will not exceed \$50,000.

The City will follow any applicable requirements for the acquisition and disposition of property.

URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AMENDMENTS

The Plan may be amended from time to time for a variety of reasons, including but not limited to, adding or deleting land, adding urban renewal projects, or to modify goals or types of renewal activities. The City Council may amend this Plan in accordance with applicable state law.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Urban Renewal Plan Amendment No. 1 will become effective upon its adoption by the City Council. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Urban Renewal Plan, any prior amendment, resolution or document, the Urban Renewal Plan shall remain in effect until terminated by the City Council, and the use of incremental property tax revenues, or the "division of revenue," as those words are used in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, will be consistent with Chapter 403 of the Iowa Code.

REPEALER

Any parts of the previous Plan, as previously amended, in conflict with this Amendment are hereby repealed.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any part of the Amendment is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the previously adopted Plan as a whole or the previous amendments to the Plan, or any part of the Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.
