WOODBURY COUNTY COURTHOUSE SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICY

As adopted by Resolution on August 26, 2014

I. Policy:

All individuals entering the Woodbury County Courthouse shall be subject to this Safety and Security policy at all times.

All individuals entering the Woodbury County Courthouse during public hours shall be subject to Safety and Security screening by the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team using a combination of walk-through, handheld, and package screening devices. Firearms, knives and personal protection devices are prohibited in the Courthouse subject to the provisions of Section IV of this policy.

The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors seeks to establish an appropriate level of Safety and Security that minimizes the opportunity for physical violence and/or injury to employees, the public, and anyone conducting business in the Woodbury County Courthouse. Responsibility for implementing and enforcing this Safety and Security policy falls under the guidance of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 331.502(1) and 602.1303.

Woodbury County does not discriminate on the basis of disability in the admission or access to its services, programs, or activities. For information on accessibility and to request reasonable accommodations at least three (3) days in advance, please contact the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors 712-279-6525 or Woodbury County Human Resources at 712-279-6480.

II. Scope:

If not otherwise specified in this policy, the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team shall establish screening procedures that balance the need for Safety and Security with the productivity and functional needs of maintenance workers and employees of contractors/businesses hired by Woodbury County or the Judicial Branch to conduct work in the building. The Board Chairman (or their designated representative if he or she is not available or so elects) shall mediate any dispute regarding required access that may occur between a department head or elected official and the Courthouse Safety and Security Team.

All persons entering the Woodbury County Courthouse are subject to Safety and Security screening including elected officials, judges, and employees of said. The only exception would be duly authorized and sworn officers with proper identification who are responding to a disturbance, request for assistance, or other urgent professionally related matter. All persons in the Courthouse may be subject to additional unannounced searches with probable cause at any time as determined by the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team or at the direction of the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial District of Iowa.

Access to the Woodbury County Courthouse during non-public hours and within the Courthouse shall at all times be controlled by an access control system.

III. Entrances:

- A. North Door Access:
 - The North Door entrance shall be staffed as a Security screening entrance by Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team. The entrance shall be open to the general public from 8:00 am until 4:30 pm and at all times court is in session, Monday through Friday (except legal holidays common to both County and Judicial Branch employees).
 - 2. The Safety and Security Team will be in place from 7:00 am until 5:00 pm to screen for employees and shall be available as needed for meetings and special events held in the Courthouse outside those hours.
 - 3. The North Door entrance shall be designated as the entrance that is accessible to persons with disabilities and for deliveries to the Courthouse.

B. West Door Access:

The West Entrance is an emergency egress only with alarms.

- C. East Access (Supervisors' Chambers and Freight Access): The east entrances are emergency egress only and shall only be used as an entrance as necessary for proper building function as approved by the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team.
- D. The Northeast Door Access: The northeast entrance is an emergency egress only with alarms and shall only be used as an entrance as necessary for proper building function as approved by the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team.
- E. Cameras will be placed to monitor and record entrance and exit activity at all times.

IV. Weapons:

- A. Firearms, Knives, and Other Weapons:
 - Any unauthorized person who is attempting to enter the Courthouse with a firearm, explosive device, offensive weapon, knife of any size, electronic control device, or other dangerous weapon shall be denied access and may be subject to arrest or detainment for arrest.

Under no circumstance shall said person be allowed entry with the weapon remaining in their possession.

- 2. Court Security Deputies and Deputies escorting inmates to court shall be authorized to carry weapons in the Courthouse.
- 3. The Sheriff and his Deputies shall be allowed in while on official duty and on a priority basis when responding to a call for assistance in the courthouse.
- 4. Courthouse Safety and Security personnel shall be authorized to carry firearms and other weapons (provided they are certified in the use thereof) as approved by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.
- 5. Uniformed law enforcement personnel or law enforcement personnel with valid official identification displaying their photograph shall be authorized to carry weapons in the Courthouse.
 - a. Judges may set additional restrictions governing the possession of weapons by law enforcement personnel within a courtroom.
 - b. Law enforcement personnel involved as a party in a civil proceeding which is not related to his/her employment as a peace officer shall be subject to the restrictions as outlined in subsections (1) and (2) above.

With prior approval, the provisions of this section may be waived to allow reasonable accommodation for the lawful activities of participants in judicial matters, e.g., court exhibits. Authorization to bring items restricted by this policy into the Courthouse shall be evaluated and granted/denied on a case-by-case basis by the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Team. The Courthouse Safety and Security Team shall establish a procedure to accommodate such requests and the safe handling of restricted items while within the Courthouse.

V. Personal Electronic Devices:

New technologies have facilitated legal research as well as case preparation and presentation. They have also dramatically changed the means and expectations, which people have, in communicating with one another. Many people routinely carry some form of cell phone, smartphone, personal digital assistant, tablet, laptop, or other similar portable wireless communications or computing device (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Personal Electronic Devices"). To maintain the decorum of court proceedings, ensure a fair trial, and protect the rights and safety of court participants in this rapidly changing environment, it is important that courts place appropriate limits on the use of Personal Electronic Devices.

- A. Within the Courthouse (Outside Courtrooms):
 - 1. Any person may bring a Personal Electronic Device, subject to inspection and security screening, into the Courthouse.
 - If the Personal Electronic Device contains a phone function, its ring function shall be turned off at all times within the Courthouse. Telephone conversations are permitted but shall not interfere with the efficient functioning of the courts or County offices.
 - 3. Persons inside the Courthouse may use a Personal Electronic Device but only if the Personal Electronic Device is operated in a manner that is unobtrusive and does not interfere with the integrity, dignity, and decorum of the Courthouse or the efficient operation of court business.
 - 4. No person shall use a Personal Electronic Device to communicate with any courtroom participant at any time during the course of any proceedings. A "courtroom participant" includes an attorney, litigant, witness, or juror, who is present in the courtroom as part of the conduct of any proceedings.
 - No person shall use a Personal Electronic Device to photograph or otherwise communicate identifying information regarding jurors or witnesses. In addition to any penalties described below, violation of this subsection may result in criminal prosecution.
- B. Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Detail shall not substitute or interfere with the Courtroom Security provided by the Sheriff per Iowa Code Section 331.653(4).
- C. Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security shall work in harmony with those employed by the Sheriff to ensure that all people are safe and secure.

- D. Visitors and employees must be aware that within the Courtroom:
 - 1. Unauthorized persons must turn off all Personal Electronic Devices before entering a courtroom.
 - 2. Courtroom participants, as defined in above subsection A (5), excluding jurors, shall be authorized to use Personal Electronic Devices. However, if the Personal Electronic Device contains a phone function, its ring function shall be turned off at all times within the courtroom. No telephone conversations are permitted within the courtroom, unless specifically authorized by the presiding judge.
- E. Media Coverage:

The Expanded Media Coverage rules found in Chapter 25 of the Iowa Court Rules shall apply to all persons entering the Courthouse. A copy of the full rules may be found at https://www.legis.iowa.gov/IowaLaw/CourtRules.aspx.

Unless otherwise specified in the Iowa Court Rules, members of the media seeking to use Personal Electronic Devices within a courtroom shall submit such requests to the Regional Media Coordinator. All media will need to submit to the screening process upon entry to the Courthouse and check in with Court Administration.

F. Violation:

Persons violating this section may have the use of their Personal Electronic Device restricted, including, but not limited to, being asked to move to another location or having their Personal Electronic Device confiscated. Persons in violation of this section shall also forfeit the privilege of bringing a Personal Electronic Device into the Courthouse or courtroom for the remainder of the proceedings for that particular case. Furthermore, persons in violation of the section may be held in contempt, which could result in a fine or jail time being levied. Finally, the court, in its discretion, may order that any audio recording, photographs, video, or communication made in violation of these rules be destroyed.

VI. Deliveries:

Delivery personnel and packages shall be subject to Safety and Security screening. Delivery vehicles shall be parked in a regular marked parking space. Delivery vehicles too large to fit in a regular marked parking space shall be directed by Courthouse Safety and Security personnel as to where they should park. No delivery vehicles shall be allowed to park directly in front of any entrance. All delivery persons and their deliveries are subject to search and shall only enter with approval and guidance of the Woodbury County Safety and Security Detail. Deliveries shall be scheduled at other than peak entry times.

VII. Public and After-Hours Use:

Use of the Courthouse by any entity or organization shall be governed by the Woodbury County Building Use Policy. All persons entering after hours shall enter through the North Door Main Entrance and shall check in. All off hour entry and exit will be monitored and reviewed by Safety and Security.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE WOODBURY COUNTY COURTHOUSE SAFETY AND SECURITY POLICY RESOLUTION #_____

WHEREAS, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors is charged with the duty to act in the best interests of the citizens of Woodbury County;

WHEREAS, lowa Code § 331.301(1) authorizes the Board to "exercise any power and perform any function it deems appropriate to protect and preserve the rights, privileges, and property of the county or of its residents, and to preserve and improve the peace, safety, health, welfare, comfort, and convenience of its residents";

WHEREAS, Woodbury County policies and the county employee handbook provide for the safety of Woodbury County employees;

WHEREAS, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors directs the "general custody and control" of the courthouse" (See Iowa Code § 331.502(1)) and provides for the courthouse physical facilities and its operational funding (See Iowa Code § 602.1303);

WHEREAS, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors has determined that establishing a Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Policy would promote the aforementioned interests;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors hereby approves and adopts the Woodbury County Courthouse Safety and Security Policy attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.
- 2. The provision of Resolution #10,795 that applies it to the Woodbury County Courthouse is hereby repealed. Resolution #10,795 shall otherwise remain in force and effect.
- 3. Notices shall be posted in the entryways of the Woodbury County Courthouse to advise members of the public of the existence of the Safety and Security Policy.

WOODBURY COUNTY COURTHOUSE SECURITY

USE OF FORCE POLICY

Individual circumstances will govern the appropriate order, combination(s) and level(s) of force to be applied to any given situation. However, a security officer should only use force which the officer reasonably believes is necessary under the circumstances. The following continuum generally describes the types of force employed by Woodbury County Courthouse security officers.

- 1. Verbal persuasion
- 2. Verbal command
- 3. Soft hands
- Hard hands used in a manner designed for greatest likelihood of compliance with least likelihood of injury
- 5. ASP baton
- 6. Lethal force
 - A. Security personnel are authorized to use deadly force to protect the officer or others from what is objectively and reasonably believed to be an imminent threat of death or serious bodily harm.

Under unique circumstances it may be necessary and appropriate to consider other methods or instruments of force, but only when the officer reasonably believes they are necessary to protect the individual, the officer, or other(s) from injury or harm.

Disengagement is also an option which may be considered depending on the circumstances.


The following factors provide a framework for a Woodbury County Courthouse security officer's assessment of whether use of force is necessary and for determining the level(s) and order of force to apply to a given situation.

- 1. The nature and scope of the acts or offense.
- Whether the individual poses an immediate risk to self, the officer or other individuals in the building.
- 3. The size, weight, and apparent physical ability of the individual.
- 4. The level of the individual's resistance.
- 5. Whether the individual is armed.
- 6. Whether the use of force would pose an unnecessary risk to the officer, or others(s).
- 7. Whether local law enforcement officials are present, on the way, or in the vicinity.

All incidents involving the use of force by security personnel will be documented and reported to the security supervisor.

Subject: Siouxland Paramedics & Emergency Medical Task Force

The City of Sioux City has a contract with Siouxland Paramedics to provide emergency medical services. Within that contract is a provision which allows Siouxland Paramedics to request a subsidy up to \$180,000 from the City of Sioux City. This funding subsidizes the operational budget for the services they provide.

The City of Sioux City has requested Woodbury County's cooperation and financial assistance with the funding of this year's subsidy for Siouxland Paramedics. The requested amount would not exceed \$35,000.

Woodbury County's Emergency Medical Service Providers use Siouxland Paramedics several times each month to assist with the care of critically sick or injured residents of Woodbury County. Last fiscal year we requested Siouxland Paramedics assistance 88 times.

I am recommending:

The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors to approve the request from the City of Sioux City.

Also, the Board of Supervisors request that Woodbury County have representation on the Siouxland Paramedic Board.

In addition, I am requesting the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors support the establishment of an Emergency Medical Task Force to bring forward a long range plan for providing emergency medical services in Woodbury County.

I will be present at your meeting to further discuss these requests and answer any questions you may have.

The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.

2.

- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be toroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.

- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- 12. Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.

2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:

A. The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.

B. The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.

C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.

D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.

E. The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.

F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.

This permit is subject to any laws now in effect or any laws that may be hereafter enacted and all applicable rules and regulations of local, state and federal agencies. This permit is subject to all the rules and regulations of Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department.

J. This permit is subject to revocation by the Department at any time and at no cost to the Department, when in the judgment of the Department it is necessary in the improvement or maintenance of the highway or for other reasonable cause.

Construction Project Report:

L-B(K199)—73-97, Michigan Avenue Bridge Replacement: Letting date: April 29, 2014. Contract price: \$510,724.50. Contractor: Christensen Brothers, Inc. Late start date: July 15, 2014. The project is funded by local secondary road fund dollars. The contractor has completed work on the south pier and this week is driving piling and forming the south abutment. The next work on site will be constructing cofferdams and driving north pier piling. The new bridge will be a 150' x 26' Precast Concrete Deck bridge. Completion is expected by late September, 2014.

STP-S-CO97(121)—5E-97, PCC Inlay Project on County Road D51from Port Neal Road to the Interstate 29 interchange. Letting date: February 18, 2014. Contract price: \$1,261,371.36. Contractor: C. J. Moyna & Sons, Inc. The project will consist of removal of the existing pavement, crushing the old pavement and placing it as road base, then placing a new 10" PCC pavement on the road grade. The county project is funded with MPO federal aid funds matched by the RISE funds awarded for the CF Industries project. The Iowa DOT is providing construction management and inspection to coordinate our pavement replacement project with the interchange work.

The two south ramps closed the week of June 30, 2014. Work on the county road and closure of the north ramps is scheduled for the week of <u>September 3, 2014</u>, with paving of the county road to take until the week of <u>October 24, 2014</u>. As discussed in prior reports, the schedule is subject to change due to weather and other project issues and each new schedule represents the contractor's best estimate at this time. All work at the interchange is scheduled to be completed in mid-December 2014.

BRS-0867(601)—60-97, Bronson Bridge and Box Culvert Replacement on County Road D38 near the intersection of 210th Street and the Bronson Blacktop on the corporation line road with Bronson. Letting date: June 17, 2014. Late Start Date: July 21, 2014. Contractor: Dixon Construction, Inc. Bid price: \$1,299,064.30. Working Days: 75 days. The project is funded with federal aid bridge funds matched with county farm to market fund money. The project includes replacement of the existing bridge with a new 150' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab bridge, replacement of the small bridge at the intersection of D38 and K42 with a new box culvert, and new PCC Concrete paving from approximately 100' SE of the bridge to the intersection of D38 and K42. The contractor has completed removal of the existing bridge. The contractor is driving sheet piling for the south pier cofferdam today and should be driving piling next week.

STP-S-CO97(110)—5E-97, HMA Overlay Project on County Road K45, Old Highway 75 from the south city limits of Sergeant Bluff to the intersection of K45 and D51 (Luton Pavement). Letting date: February 18, 2014. Contract price: \$764,253.46. Contractor: Knife River Construction. The project consists of placing a 2" HMA overlay on the existing HMA pavement. The project is funded

with MPO federal aid funds matched by the county farm to market fund. Late start date for the project is September 8, 2014. The contractor plans to start work on September 8 with pavement patching. The week of September 15 is scheduled for pavement milling in preparation for overlay of the pavement which is planned for the week of September 22. The contractor plans to complete the project within allotted working days and should be finished by September 30.

RCX-CO97(119)—9B-97, CF Industries Plant Road-grading for paving of the plant access road. Letting date: April 29, 2014. Late start date: June 2, 2014. Contract price: \$525,413.80. Contractor: Lieber Construction, Inc. Work started Monday, June 2nd. Work on the grade is now complete and the contractor has temporarily suspended work awaiting installation of the new water main that will serve the CF Industries north plant. The major work remaining consists of placement of rock base and surfacing on the finished grade and seeding the road embankment and ditches. The project is funded with RISE funds awarded for the CF Industries project and will be matched by local funds.

L-B(L136)—73-97, Pocahontas Avenue Bridge Replacement Letting date: June 10, 2014. Contractor: Dixon Construction, Inc. Bid price: \$497,757.65. Late start date: September 1, 2014. This bridge project is funded with the new Capital Projects Levy. The new bridge will be a 90' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab Bridge. Contracts were approved by the Board July 15. The contractor has not yet scheduled a preconstruction meeting for the project.


L-B(H109)—73-97, 185th Street Bridge Replacement: Letting date: June 10, 2014. Contractor: Dixon Construction, Inc. Bid price: \$508,087.40. Late start date: September 1, 2014. This bridge project is funded with the new Capital Projects Levy. The new bridge will be a 100' x 30' Continuous Concrete Slab Bridge. Contracts were approved by the Board July 15. The contractor has not yet scheduled a preconstruction meeting for the project.

240th Street Extension- Andrew Avenue improvement: Design work has started on the 240th Street/Andrew Avenue improvement project. Design work is being done in house by county staff. V&K Consultants of Sergeant Bluff have started work on platting required right of way. JCG Land Services of Nevada, Iowa have started appraisals for needed property and have contacted landowners to begin negotiations for the purchase of right of way. Our office is moving this project as quickly as possible, but no letting date for the project is set at this time.

Iowa 175 Detour: Last year, the county signed a detour agreement with Iowa DOT for the use of county roads around Danbury for a temporary detour. That detour use starts Thursday. A pavement reconstruction project on Iowa 175 through the town of Battle Creek will require detouring traffic beginning Thursday, May 15 until late November, weather permitting, according to the Iowa Department of Transportation's Cherokee construction office. Traffic will be detoured from Iowa 175 south at Danbury on Woodbury County Road L-37, east on Woodbury/Ida County Road D-54, and then north on U.S. 59 to Iowa 175 east of Ida Grove.

Port Neal Interchange Haul Road: The Iowa DOT approved the use of 210th Street, Old Lakeport Road, Old Highway 75 and 260th Street as a temporary primary haul road for hauling fill material for the ramps and road embankments to the I-29 interchange project. Fill material is being removed from the Alexson property behind 1483 210th Street. This haul road use is likely to be occurring through much of this summer as work continues on the interchange.

Four Lane Hwy 20 Construction work on U.S. 20 from east of Moville to Woodbury County Road L-25 has started. The \$11.9 million grading and structures contract was awarded to C.J. Moyna and Sons Inc. of Elkader. The grading project is anticipated to be completed in late 2015 and the completion of the four-lane roadway through Correctionville is scheduled for completion in late 2018. Motorists should pay special attention to the signs directing traffic through the construction zone.






