<u>Issue:</u> It has been reported to us that we may have people in violation of our workplace rules involving Outside Employment.

<u>Discussion:</u> Clarification of the current rules relating to Outside Employment and other potential conflicts of interest. We wish to remind everyone of the information in the current employee handbook that all employees have signed off on.

Action: We would request that it be put forth that all Department Heads, Appointed Deputies, Assistant Department Heads, and any other employees who work with outside vendors or are involved with procurement of any kind should attest annually to that potential conflict by signing off on a disclosure statement. We will work with the County Attorney to come up with the disclosure form and bring the form back to be approved by board stating that they have no conflict involving vendors, outside employment, outside boards the employee may serve on, and/or other areas of potential conflict.

Other Action and Public Notice: The current policy regarding outside employment is posted below. We have received no notices of outside employment in HR since I have been here. We expect written notices from all employees who meet the requirements listed in the handbook regarding outside employment on Page 2 of Section IX to provide HR with that written notice by the end of January. We would ask for the Board's blessing or approval and validation of this follow through on existing policy.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Employees shall not engage in any outside employment activity or enterprise that is inconsistent, incompatible with, or interferes with the employee's ability to effectively perform assigned duties for the County.

The County expects regular, full-time employees to consider County work their primary employment. Any other employment must be compatible, without conflict of interest, or schedule.

Employees may not engage in the following outside employment or self-employment activities, which are considered to be inconsistent with, incompatible with, and interfere with County employment:

- 1) Any employment activity that prevents an employee from being available for work beyond normal working hours, such as emergencies or peak work periods, when such availability is an expectation of the employee's job
- 2) Any employment activity or enterprise that involves the use of the County's time, facilities, equipment, or supplies, or the prestige and influence of a County office, or employment for private gain
- 3) Employment with a firm that has a contract with or does business with the County
- 4) Activities that involve the receipt or acceptance of money or other considerations by a County employee from anyone other than the County for the performance of activities that the employee is required or expected to provide in the course of the employee's employment with the County
- 5) Activities that involve so much of the employee's time that it impairs the employee's attendance or efficiency in the performance of duties assigned by the County
- 6) Activities that may reasonably be perceived by members of the public to constitute a conflict of interest or otherwise discredit public service.

Employees who engage in any outside employment or self employment must notify their department head and the Director of Human Resources in writing of such activities.

Property owners Ronald and Linda Clausen have filed a re-zoning petition for a single 26.3 acre parcel. The re-zoning petition requests a change from the current AP (Agricultural Preservation) zoning district designation to AE (Agricultural Estates) for residential development purposes. The current AP zoning limits the residential density allowed. The requested re-zoning would provide for the residential density potential of the approved subdivision. The final platting for the subdivision was conditionally approved at your January 6, 2015 meeting.

Should the re-zoning petition be approved the applicants have a purchase agreement in place for one of the three lots; the applicants will continue to reside on one of the lots; with the third lot intended to remain in agricultural production.

The location is within 2,800 feet of Sioux City at the northeast corner of the intersection of paved Buchanan Ave. and graveled 155th St. The parcel is currently addressed 1543 155th St. and located within a portion of the SENW of Section 32 in Concord Township.

On November 18, 2014 your Board forwarded the matter to the Zoning Commission for public hearing and recommendation. On December 22, 2014 the Commission met, held the public hearing and voted 3-0 to recommend Supervisor approval of the requested re-zoning.



On December 31, 2014 Commission member Grady Marx's term on the Woodbury County Zoning Commission expired. Commissioner Marx has completed his second 5 year term on the Board and cannot be considered for reappointment in 2015.

Iowa code states Supervisors shall attempt to provide gender balance when making appointments. Under our county's set of facts this means two or three of the five Commission members are to be female. The 2014 makeup of the Commission was one (1) female and four (4) male. In complying with the requirements of this subsection, political subdivisions shall utilize a fair and unbiased method of selecting the best qualified applicants. This subsection shall not prohibit an individual whose term expires prior to January 1, 2012, from being reappointed even though the reappointment continues an inequity in gender balance.





This Agreement, is entered into by and between the Iowa Department of Transportation, hereinafter designated the "DOT", and Woodbury County, Iowa, a Local Public Agency, hereafter designated the "LPA" in accordance with Iowa Code Chapters 28E, 306, 306A and 313.4 as applicable;

The DOT proposes to establish or make improvements to U.S. 20 and Iowa 31 within Woodbury County, Iowa; and

The DOT and the LPA are willing to jointly participate in said project, in the manner hereinafter provided; and

The DOT and the LPA previously entered into the following agreement(s) for the above referenced project: Agreement No. 2013-1-091 for right of way acquisition was executed by the DOT and LPA on April 14, 2012 and April 4, 2012 respectively; Agreement 2014-TJ-003 for transfer of jurisdiction was executed by the DOT and the LPA on April 3, 2014 and April 1, 2014 respectively; and

This Agreement reflects the current concept of this project which is subject to modification by mutual agreement between the LPA and the DOT; and

Therefore, it is agreed as follows:

1. Project Information

 The DOT will design, let, and inspect construction of the following described project in accordance with the project plans and DOT standard specifications:

Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) grade and replace on U.S. 20 in Correctionville and PCC pavement grade and construct new lowa 31 from southwest of Correctionville north to U.S. 20.

- b. Upon completion of construction, the LPA agrees to accept ownership and jurisdiction of the following referenced improvements. The LPA shall also assume responsibility for all future maintenance operations associated therewith, all at no additional expense or obligation to the DOT:
 - County Road L36 will be PCC reconstructed from Sta. 2202+45.38 to Sta. 2204+12.75 (167.37 feet).
 - The entrance to Copeland Park (gravel surfaced) will be relocated across from 5th Street on proposed lowa 31 from Sta. 66+55.26 to Sta. 75+36.99 (881.73 feet).

2. Project Costs

a. The DOT will bear all costs except those allocated to the LPA under other terms of this Agreement.

3. Traffic Control

- U.S. 20 through-traffic will be maintained during the construction.
- b. The DOT will temporarily close the highway project area by formal action in accord with lowa Code section 306.41. Iowa 31 through-traffic north of U.S. 20 will be detoured off of the project and onto Hackberry Street (city street) during Stage 2B of the project. The LPA will authorize the DOT to erect and maintain signs within its jurisdiction, consistent with Part 6 of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices", as necessary to direct traffic to and along said detour route during the construction period. The DOT will also remove said signs when the detour is discontinued. Details will be shown on the traffic control sheet(s) within the project plans. A separate detour agreement will be negotiated and the LPA will be eligible for compensation for the detour in accordance with the DOT Detour Policy.
- c. If it becomes necessary to temporarily close LPA side roads during construction, the DOT will furnish and install the required barricades and signing for the closure at project cost and shall remove same upon completion of the project also at no expense or obligation to the LPA. The DOT will work in close cooperation with the LPA and the contractor to accommodate emergency services and local access across the project during construction. Any detours which may be necessary for project related LPA road closures will be the responsibility of the LPA all at no expense or obligation to the DOT.
- d. If this project causes the temporary closure of a road during construction, the DOT shall meet with the LPA to determine whether said closure(s) will cause increased traffic on other LPA roads. The DOT and the LPA shall determine a plan, and the costs thereof, for the LPA to perform dust control on said LPA roads with increased traffic, should dust control become necessary. In that event, the LPA shall inform the DOT prior to performing said dust control. The DOT shall reimburse the LPA for the cost of said dust control measures following the receipt of a bill for the agreed upon costs (see lowa Code section 313.4 subsection 1.b.).

4. Right of Way and Permits

 The DOT will be responsible for the coordination of utility facility adjustments for the primary road project.

5. Construction & Maintenance

- Upon completion of the project, no changes in the physical features thereof will be undertaken or permitted without the prior written approval of the DOT.
- Future maintenance of the primary highway within the project area will be carried out in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in Instructional Memorandum 2.110.
- c. New lighting will be installed at the U.S. 20/lowa 31 intersections at no cost to the LPA. The DOT will be responsible for all future maintenance and energy for said lighting.

d. If necessary, the DOT will relocate at project cost all existing LPA-owned destination lights, and signs which require adjustment as part of this project (if any). If the LPA chooses to perform relocation of the LPA-owned lighting and signing, the DOT will reimburse the LPA for said relocations upon receipt of a properly documented billing from the LPA. Any destination lights which require adjustment as part of this project which are owned by a utility company and rented to the LPA will be relocated by the utility company at no cost to the project.

6. General Provisions

- a. If the LPA has completed a Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for an area which is affected by the proposed Primary Highway project and the FIS is modified, amended or revised in an area affected by the project after the date of this Agreement, the LPA shall promptly provide notice of the modification, amendment or revision to the DOT. If the LPA does not have a detailed Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for an area which is affected by the proposed Primary Highway project and the LPA does adopt an FIS in an area affected by the project after the date of this Agreement, the LPA shall promptly provide notice of the FIS to the DOT.
- b. The LPA will comply with all provisions of the equal employment opportunity requirements prohibiting discrimination and requiring affirmative action to assure equal employment opportunity as required by lowa Code Chapter 216. No person will, on the grounds of age, race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, religion, pregnancy, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which State funds are used.
- c. It is the intent of both (all) parties that no third party beneficiaries be created by this Agreement.
- d. If any section, provision, or part of this Agreement shall be found to be invalid or unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the validity of the Agreement as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not found to be invalid or unconstitutional, except to the extent that the original intent of the Agreement cannot be fulfilled.
- This Agreement may be executed in (two) counterparts, each of which so executed will be deemed to be an original.
- f. This Agreement, as well as the unaffected provisions of any previous agreement(s), addendum(s), and/or amendment(s); represents the entire Agreement between the LPA and DOT regarding this project. All previously executed agreements will remain in effect except as amended herein. Any subsequent change or modification to the terms of this Agreement will be in the form of a duly executed amendment to this document.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA PORT NEAL ROAD PCC OVERLAY

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this	day of 20, by
and between WOODBURY COUNTY, hereinafter referre	d to as the County, party of the
first part and VEENSTRA & KIMM, INC. a corporation of	organized under the laws of the
State of Iowa, hereinafter referred to as the Engineers,	

WITNESSETH, THAT WHEREAS, Woodbury County desires to mill and overlay with PCC a section of Port Neal road from the new Dogwood Trail to the I-29 bridge approach. Storm pipe, shouldering, slope reconstruction and ACC fillets onto Banner Avenue will be included in the re-construction.

WHEREAS, Woodbury County desires to retain the Engineers to perform design, bidding and construction engineering services on the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that the County retains the Engineers to act for and represent it in engineering matters on the Project. Such contract shall be subject to the following terms, conditions and stipulations to wit:

- SCOPE OF SERVICES. It is understood and agreed upon that the Project will include the design plans and specifications, bid letting, construction inspection, administration, and construction staking.
 - a. Design The engineer will prepare the plans consistent with Woodbury County's concrete overlay design standards. The plans will bid as one document and be incorporated by Division into the City of Sergeant Bluff's Dogwood Trail construction plans.
 - Management and oversight of the inspection by a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa.
 - c. Construction staking will be managed and completed under the direct supervision of a professional land surveyor registered in the State of Iowa.

- COMPENSATION. The County shall compensate the Engineers for services under this agreement as follows:
 - a. The design fee for plans and specifications though bid letting shall be hourly rates not to exceed fees of Thirteen thousand three hundred and forty five dollars (\$13,345).
 - Construction Inspection and construction staking shall be hourly rates not to exceed fees of Six thousand one hundred sixty three dollars (\$6,163).
- 3. METHOD OF PAYMENT. The Engineer shall submit monthly invoices for the actual cost for services provided. Invoices shall be due and payable upon receipt and shall be paid by the County within 30 days of the receipt of an approvable invoice.
- 4. TERMINATION. The County may terminate services under this agreement by providing the Engineers a written notice at least 2 working days before the termination date. In the event the County terminates the services under this Agreement the County shall compensate the Engineers for services completed through the effective date of the termination.
- ASSIGNABILITY. The Engineers shall not assign any interest in this Agreement and shall not transfer any interest in the same without the prior written consent of the County.
- 6. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. All notes developed under this Agreement shall become the property of the County upon completion or termination of the services by the Engineers. Upon request, the Engineer shall provide the County the original copy of all notes and documents. Nothing in this provision shall prohibit the Engineers from retaining a copy of all documents generated during the course of performance of services under this Agreement.
- 7. INDEMNIFICATION. The Engineers shall and hereby agree to hold and save the County harmless from any and all claims, settlements and judgments, to include all reasonable investigative fees, attorney's fees, suit and court costs for personal injury, property damage, and/or deaths or damages arising out of the Engineers' or any of its agents' and servants' and employees' negligent acts, errors or omissions for services under this Agreement.

8. INSURANCE. The Engineers shall furnish the Owner with certificates of insurance by insurance companies licensed to do business in the State of Iowa, upon which the Owner is endorsed as an additional named insured, in the following limits. It must be disclosed on the face of the certificates the coverage is on an occurrence basis, unless otherwise noted.

- 9. STATUTES, REGULATIONS AND CODES. The Engineers agree all services provided under this Agreement shall be subject to all applicable Federal, State and County laws, regulations and code requirements, including the provisions of Section 479.29 of the Code of Iowa.

10. OBLIGATIONS OF COUNTY.

- a. Provide all available information that would be mutually beneficial or prudent to the project.
- b. Designate a liaison from the County who will serve at the primary point of contact with the Engineers and shall be responsible to coordinate the Engineers services and receive documents generated by the Engineer during the course of performance of services under this agreement.
- 11. COMPLETENESS OF CONTRACT. This document contains all terms and conditions of this Agreement. Any alterations shall be invalid unless made in writing, signed by both parties and incorporated as an amendment to this Agreement.

The undersigned do hereby covenant and state that this Agreement is executed in duplicate as though each were an original and that there are no oral agreements that have not been reduced to writing in this instrument.

It is further covenanted and stated that there are no other considerations or monies

contingent upon or resulting from the execution of this Agreement, nor have any of the above been implied by or for any party to this Agreement.

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TIME AND PLACE OF MEETINGS

GOAL: The Board will develop ways to increase transparency and increase public understanding and input.

Objective: The Board will approve a new meeting time and place for weekly meetings by January 13, 2015. (Recommendation: Meetings to be held in the basement of the Courthouse. Time: 5:30 p.m. on Tuesdays.

Objective: The Board will approve monthly joint meetings with City and town Councils in their location by February 2015. For 2015 the goal would be 10 community visits.

Objective: The Board will purchase audio, visual equipment and other items from gaming funds to be able to function as they do in the current Board Chambers. If approved the cost for the equipment would be brought back to the Board for approval by January 13, 2015.

- Meetings need to be more accessible to all citizens. Moving to the basement would be more accessible and holds more people. Current Chambers holds 20 people and the remaining stand. The room is not wheelchair accessible.
- 2. Late afternoon will allow more people to attend.
- 3. By going out to communities for meetings the Board will have better communication, transparency, and input from the rural areas.
- 4. To conduct meetings in the basement and in rural areas there needs to be the necessary equipment to record the meetings and display materials. This will include a computer, large computer screen/TV, recording equipment, microphones, cameras, etc. The equipment should be the same as the Board Chambers so transitioning is easy. This equipment will need to be portable. Estimates would come back to the Board for Approval.
- 5. Equipment currently in the Board Chambers needs to remain for closed sessions and hearings not open to the public.

A Program of Honors and Tribute to Volunteerism and Woodbury County Employees

<u>Goal/Objective</u>: To honor a volunteer or individual in Woodbury County who has had a significant impact through meritorious actions and improved quality of life as well as Woodbury County Employees who have been faithful or excellent in service.

Background: Legislative bodies and deliberative bodies such as Boards have a public platform. In a bipartisan, common goal fashion, the Board can champion those who work in order to improve our community and uphold our desire to recognize the vital impact that volunteerism has. Such individuals can be invited to the Board meeting with their families in order to be recognized.


The Volunteer Resolution may range from those who have demonstrated exemplary military service, contributed significantly to those less fortunate, or were heroes during periods of emergency or natural disaster. Doing so on a bi-monthly basis would allow the Board of Supervisors through public recognition to highlight those who selflessly serve this community and honor them by Resolution. The designation could rotate through each Supervisor. Therefore, , done on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of every month, a Supervisor could each choose an individual to honor at least 4 times a year. The Chairperson would be responsible for designating and noticing each Supervisor early in the year so as to give preparatory time to complete this function.

Additionally, honoring Employees of Woodbury County who reach certain milestones regarding quantity in terms of longevity of service (a 15 year, 25 year, or 35 year employee) will make employees know the appreciation that we have of fidelity to the County as a place of employment. This can be done on an annual basis perhaps at the final meeting of the year. Finally, it is important to have an Employee of the Month nominee submitted by Department Heads to the Director of Human Resources to be chosen among applicants by an *ad hoc* committee under the Director of Human Resources.

Action

I would like to move on Tuesday, January 13, that the Board's secretary craft a resolution format by which the Board can highlight those who are dedicated to public service. Submissions would be made to the Board and have ultimate approval at least one week in advance of the meeting by the Chairperson in order to make sure that the nominee fit into a category such as military service, contributions to those less fortunate, and heroes during emergency or natural disaster. Additionally, the Chairperson will help ensure Supervisors avoid individuals whose primary contributions are governmental, political, or otherwise partisan so as to keep the focus clearly on the selfless service we desire to highlight.

I would like to move on Tuesday, January 13, that the Director of Human Resources craft a program with an application process, format, certificate, and plan by which we can honor both employees for longevity and excellence in customer service.



<u>Goal/Objective</u>: To comply with lowa Code, uphold recognized parliamentary procedures, and ensure smooth and effective deliberations which are clearly established both in bylaws and in rules for the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

<u>Background</u>: The lowa Code states, "The board of supervisors shall substantially comply with a procedure established by state law for exercising a county power and is authorized to adopt rules of procedure to govern the conduct of its meetings" (lowa Code Sec. 331.301 (5)]. The attorney general has held that in the absence of such adopted rules, the board is assumed to operate under recognized rules of order and parliamentary procedure.

Key Points of Support

- 1. The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors does not have established adopted rules or bylaws. While the above reference in Code is enabling language, codifying a more formal procedure would help meetings run smoothly and harmoniously with the following objectives:
 - a) Taking up business one item at a time
 - b) Promoting courtesy, justice, impartiality, and equality
 - c) Upholding majority rule while protecting the rights of individual, minority, or absent members
 - d) Clearly establishing rules and rights of each individual member
- 2. Auditor Pat Gill in a recent e-mail suggested that "the County and the Board would be well-served if formal procedures rules, similar to those adopted by Macomb County [MI], were adopted" when the question was posed as to who would assume temporary Chair during the first meeting.

The St. Croix, WI Board of Supervisors has clearly delineated rules which can be found here and gives an excellent example.

The Auditor, who statutorily serves as clerk of the board, is the most logical to serve as official parliamentarian of the proceedings. Therefore, the Auditor's role would be advisory in terms of creation of rules and bylaws. Additionally, the Auditor would be advisory to the Chairperson in meetings as the Chairperson would ultimately rule if such adopted rules and bylaws are in accordance with accepted parliamentary procedure. ("The parliamentarian, who should be seated next to the presiding officer, has a role that is purely advisory. Only the chair, not the parliamentarian, can rule on the proper application of the rules..." RONR In Brief, p. 95).

- 3. The Auditor would take the following into account as parameters in crafting a <u>proposed draft</u> of the Rules and Bylaws.
 - a) Iowa Code
 - b) Roberts Rules of Order, 11th Edition Newly Revised, pages 565-99.
 - Stipulations should be made in which the rules refer to the following: "All situations not covered by the foregoing rules shall be determined by the latest edition of Roberts Rules of Orders."
 - 2) Key parts that would be corrective in nature at the discretion of the Auditor may be presented. For example:

Calling the Question. Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised (In Brief) describes a frequent but mistaken practice of a chairperson halting debate whenever any member shouts, "I call the question." This is out of order and violates rules for ending debate because a member must seek and get recognition to "move the previous question" in order to end debate.

Usage of "Same Sign." The practice of calling for negative votes by using the same sign "Aye" is both outdated and not in accordance with standard parliamentary procedure. Negative votes should be voiced and recorded as a "No."

Absence of the Statement of the Question in Precise Form Before Voting. By repeating the exact language of the motion, the Chairperson helps everyone to hear it clearly, and calls everyone's attention to the fact that a new proposal is ready to be considered.

Recognition of Speakers and a Framework for Debate. Parameters include addressing the Chairperson, addressing one another, and how to limit or close debate. Heightening the formality of debate is not necessarily the goal but the general goals are sticking to the subject, avoiding personality, and having general order.

4. The following parameters should be addressed in rules and bylaws:

1) Organization, Election of Officers, and Quorum

This would address the frequency by which the Chair is chosen, role of the Vice-Chair, annual adoption of rules, the presiding by the previous Chair over the next year until a new Chairperson is chosen, and what happens at the beginning of a year in which a sitting Chair is unable to continue in such a role as to temporarily preside until the election of a new Chairperson.

2) Officers and Duties

This would delineate the roles of Chairperson, Vice-Chair, and Parliamentarian.

3) Duties of Supervisors

This would include presence, conflict of interest, attendance, conduct, voting, and parameters for debate of Supervisors.

4) Order of Business

This would include a typical, general agenda (Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, Adoption of Agenda, Approval of Minutes, Reports from Committees, New Business (labelled as <u>discussion</u> or <u>action</u> items), and Public Participation or Supervisor Concerns.

5) Change or Suspension of Rules

This would constitute how rules could be changed or suspended.

6) Notice of Meetings

This would include how the agenda will be disseminated, how long before a meeting an agenda shall be received, and parameters for complying with lowa Law.

7) Minutes and Resolutions

This would include minutes preparation, responsibilities, and postings.

8) Committee Meeting Assignments

This would include the Chairperson's selection of current assignments subject to approval by a majority of the Board and the reporting mechanisms wherein each Board member will state his or her attendance at such assigned meetings and an Executive Summary during the Committee Reports portion of the agenda.

Action

At next week's meeting, I will seek to move that the Auditor's Office bring in draft form to the County Attorney by January 27 rules and bylaws for review. I will then ask that the County Attorney distribute by Friday, January 30, an actionable item for Tuesday, February 3.

The Auditor would present the rules and be able to take questions before voting on final passage and adoption if it is the pleasure of the Board.

Woodbury County Conservation Board would like to thank you for the opportunity to submit a budget proposal for Fiscal Year 2016 based on what we believe our needs will be for department operating expenses. Our budget proposal represents an increase of 2.9% in operating expenses (\$8,950). This increase is due to rising costs for electricity as well as increased costs for supplies and repairs to operate and maintain parks and facilities. We anticipate our proposed budget will still be short \$10,000 for electricity in our parks activity area but did not want to request that large an increase. It is our goal to work with you each year to develop a budget from limited revenues that will allow us to maintain quality facilities. We would like to provide you with some facts and concerns about the Conservation Department as you consider our budget request:

- Manage 5,525 acres and accommodate 750,000 visitors each year.
- Maintain \$30 million in facility and equipment assets.
- ➤ Economic Impact of \$11.8 million to the County each year based on 467,000 visitors.*
- Employ 13 full time and several part time/seasonal employees.
- > Operations budget has remained flat for the past six fiscal years (about \$300,000).
- Electrical costs have increased over 20% during the past six fiscal years (\$13,000+).
- Lean, efficient department provides a great return on investment for the County.

*Based on 2012 ISU Study on Economic Value of Outdoor Recreation Activities in Iowa

Like many departments, we find it a continual challenge to provide quality services with limited resources. While it has been a great advantage for us to use our park revenues for capital improvements in our parks through the Conservation Reserve Fund by leveraging those revenues with other grant sources, we have had to use a growing portion of those funds for maintenance projects on our roads and facilities over the past several years. We are halfway completed with bond repayment of the Snyder Bend cabins and road paving project which requires half our revenues each year. As more of our remaining capital funds are used to maintain our facilities, the end result is fewer dollars available for new improvements or matching grant funds.

We consistently look for ways to control expenses and are currently considering solar applications in our parks to reduce cost for electricity. My Board would welcome a joint discussion with the Board of Supervisors on this topic.

Thank you for letting us tell our story, and for your past support. We strongly believe we have one of the best county conservation systems in the state, and plan to work hard to maintain that level of service. We look forward to working with you in the future.


