WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA RESOLUTION #12,157 WEED DESTRUCTION ORDER

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of each of lowa County's Board of Supervisors to enforce the provisions of Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended with regard to the destruction of weeds, and

WHEREAS, under Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended each county Board of Supervisors must prescribe and order a program of weed destruction to be followed by landowners, tenants, and other persons in possession or control of land, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors that a program of weed destruction for the year 2015 is necessary,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, lowa that each landowner, tenant or other person in possession or control of private land shall on or before the dates stated below, destroy the below-listed noxious weeds on their land by spraying them with a suitable herbicide in a strength sufficient to kill such weeds.

- 1. May 18, 2015 for musk, thistle, sow thistle, bull thistle, leafy spurge, perennial pepper grass, sour dock perennial, smooth dock perennial, and sheep sorrel perennial.
- June 1, 2015 for Canada thistle, Russian knapweed, buckhorn perennial, wild mustard annual, horse nettle, and teasel biennial.
- 3. June 8, 2015 for field bindweed, wild carrot biennial, and quack grass.

- 4. June 15, 2015 for butterprint annual, puncture vine annual, and cocklebur annual.
- 5. July 6, 2015 for wild sunflower annual and poison hemlock.
- 6. October 5, 2015 all thistles in the rosette stage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that any person using county road Right-of-Way for having or grazing are responsible for following the labeled restrictions listed on the following products used by Woodbury County Weed Commissioner: Grazon P&D, Streamline, and Perspective.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that all weeds on county trunk and local roads and between the fence lines of such roads, whether they be noxious weeds or other weeds, shall be cut or otherwise destroyed, to prevent seed production, by the owner of the land adjoining the road on or before June 19, 2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that weeds that are not destroyed in compliance with the above order may be destroyed by the Weed Commissioner, and the costs of destruction by the Weed Commissioner, including the cost of serving notice, plus a penalty of twenty-five percent of total costs shall be assessed against the property upon which the weeds were destroyed, in the case of private lands, or against the adjoining land, in the case of weeds on county roads. Landowners are to contact Weed Commissioner and notify him if there are areas that should not be sprayed with herbicides.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: This request is the result of a need for the Child Health Specialty Clinic for additional office space within the area they currently lease. This is to accommodate the services they provide.

BACKGROUND: The Child Health Specialty Clinic leases 1,350 square feet of space with Siouxland District Health Department located at 1014 Nebraska Street. The rent of this space generates revenue that offsets the overhead expenses of the building that would otherwise need to be covered by program revenue and tax funds. BYLAWS OF

THE WOODBURY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

ARTICLE 1 Name

The name of this statutorily created assembly is the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

ARTICLE II Purpose

The purpose of this assembly is to perform the duties of the Board of Supervisors according to the Iowa Code.

ARTICLE III Members

There are five members of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors. They are elected at large from Woodbury County, Iowa but with equal-population district residence requirements.

ARTICLE IV Officers

Section 1. Officers and Duties. The officers shall be a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Clerk to the Board. These officers shall perform the duties as prescribed by Iowa Code, these bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Board in descending order.

- a. Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside at all the meetings of the Board during the year. The Chairperson shall make all committee assignments to committees recognized in these bylaws. The Chairperson shall set the tentative agenda for all meetings of the Board. The Chairperson shall oversee the daily operations of county administration while acting within the policies established by the Board. The Chairperson shall be authorized to establish special purpose committees as needed subject to approval of the Board.
- b. Vice Chairperson. The Vice Chairperson shall serve during the absence of the Chairperson.
- c. Clerk to the Board. The Auditor and Recorder or the designee of the Auditor and Recorder shall serve as Clerk to the Board ex officio. The Clerk to the Board shall be recognized as the parliamentarian for all meetings of the Board.

Section 2. <u>Time, Nomination Procedure, Method of Elections and Term of Office.</u> The election of The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall occur at the first meeting in each year. Nominations shall be made from the floor and elections shall be by roll call vote. A temporary

chair shall be elected to preside over the election of the Chairperson. The Chairperson's term shall begin immediately. The Chairperson will preside over the election of the Vice Chairperson.

ARTICLE VI Meetings

- Section 1. Compliance with Open Meetings Law. All meetings of the Board shall be scheduled and conducted in compliance with Chapter 21 of the Code of Iowa and other applicable law.
- **Section 2.** <u>First Meeting.</u> The Board shall meet on the first day of January which is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.
- **Section 3.** Regular Meetings. The Board shall hold regular meetings on each Tuesday of the year unless canceled or postponed by a majority of the Board.
- **Section 4.** <u>Special Meetings.</u> The Board may hold special meetings from time to time as required to conduct the business of the county. A special meeting may be called by the Chairperson or by the Vice Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.
- Section 5. <u>Agenda.</u> Items to be considered for a meeting shall be submitted in a format prescribed by the Board. All items requested for Board action shall be submitted in the form of a proposed written motion. The Chairperson shall place an item on the agenda for a subsequent meeting when directed by a majority of the Board.
- Section 6. Quorum and Consensus. A quorum and consensus shall consist of three members of the Board. A quorum is required to transact the official business of the County.
- Section 7. <u>Majority Required</u>. Unless where otherwise provided by law, a majority of the quorum present is required for the adoption of any matter to come before the Board.
- Section 8. Manner of Acting. Remarks by members shall be limited to ten minutes unless an extension is granted by a majority of the Board. A member or any other elected official of the county shall address the Chairperson and confine their remarks to the question before the Board and shall be respectful of other elected officials and avoid referencing or questioning the motives of another elected official.
- Section 9. <u>Roll Call Votes.</u> The Chairperson shall order a roll call vote when requested by a member. The roll shall be called alphabetically except the Chairperson shall be called last. If a member is not ready to vote, the member may pass and shall be called upon again after the roll has been completely called and shall vote or abstain.
- Section 10. <u>Effect of Abstention.</u> When a member abstains due to a conflict of interest, the vote of the Board shall be computed on the basis of the number of members not disqualified by reason of conflict of interest. However, at least three (3) members eligible to vote are required for a quorum on any matter. Abstentions that are not due to a conflict of interest shall be counted as a "no" vote.

Section 11. <u>Electronic Participation</u>. A member of the Board may participate in a meeting by electronic means only in circumstances where participation in person is impossible or impractical. Any member participating electronically shall be connected by a speaker phone, video conference, or other device or software, so that the public can hear any discussion by that member. The vote of any member participating electronically must be made public at the meeting and the minutes of the meeting shall include sufficient information to indicate the vote of each member participating.

ARTICLE VII Committees

- **Section 1.** Committees Required by Iowa Code. All Board representation on committees required by the Iowa Code shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- Section 2. <u>Committees Created by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 28E.</u> All Board representation on committees required by 28E agreements shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board and the requirements of the 28E agreement.
- Section 3. <u>Committees Created by Agreement.</u> All Board representation on committees required by agreement shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- Section 4. <u>Committees Created for Special Purpose</u>. All Board representation on committees required for a special purpose shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII Conflicts of Interest

Except as otherwise provided by law, members shall not have an interest, direct or indirect, in any contract, or job of work, or material, or the profits thereof, or services to be furnished or performed for Woodbury County. Members should avoid any action that would result in, or create the impression of, using public office for private gain, giving preferential treatment to any person, or losing impartiality in conducting county business.

ARTICLE IX Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the most current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Iowa Code, these bylaws and any special rules of order that the Board may adopt.

ARTICLE X Bylaws

Section 1. Adoption of Bylaws. Bylaws shall be adopted at the first meeting in each year.

Section 2. <u>Amendment of Bylaws.</u> These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board with a majority vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

LOAN AND SERVICING AGREEMENT, executed this 14th day of April, 2015, by and between Woodbury County, Iowa (Woodbury County), with principal offices at 620 Douglas Street, County Courthouse, Sioux City, IA 51101, and Countryman Financial Group, LLC (Borrower/Debtor), with principal offices at 1264 Ida Avenue, Moville, IA 51039.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Woodbury County and Borrower have heretofore or will hereafter enter into certain undertakings and agreements and execute certain instruments, including security and collateral instruments, for the purpose of enabling Woodbury County to lend to Borrower the initial sum of Thirty-Five Thousand-and-No/100's Dollars (\$35,000.00).

WHEREAS, Woodbury County may lawfully lend said funds and Borrower may lawfully borrow same.

- 2. <u>Loan</u>. To further assist in the financial undertaking described in Section 1 above, Woodbury County shall lend Borrower the sum of Thirty-Five Thousand--and--No/100's Dollars (\$35,000.00) subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and any ancillary agreements and instruments.
- Note. The loan to Borrower shall be evidenced by a promissory note, in a form acceptable to Woodbury County, executed by Borrower's duly authorized official(s).
- 4. <u>Payment</u>. Repayment of the loan provided for in Sections 1 and 2 above shall be made under the terms and conditions contained in the promissory note for said loan.
- 5. Security. Borrower covenants, represents and warrants: (a) that a Security Agreement shall be executed granting Woodbury County a first security interest in all business assets now owned or hereafter acquired by the debtor, whether now existing or hereafter arising, and wherever located, together with the proper financing statements for filing in the appropriate public office or office(s); (b) that a Mortgage shall be executed granting Woodbury County a third security interest in the real property legally described on Exhibit A Page 4; and (c) that a Personal Guarantee shall be executed by Christen J. Countryman.
- 6. <u>Responsibility of Woodbury County</u>. Woodbury County shall be responsible for the administration, monitoring and servicing of the loan from the inception of said loan through payment in full of all obligations to Woodbury County. All servicing actions of Woodbury County are expressly made subject to the terms of this Agreement, the Woodbury County Loan Program, and any promissory notes, security agreements and related instruments executed by and between Woodbury County, Borrower and Guarantors.
- 7. Borrower's Fees. Borrower shall be responsible for assuming all costs of closing, including attorney's fees and expenses incurred for filing or recording necessary to perfect a security interest in the assets of the Borrower. Borrower shall receive a written statement disclosing all fees and expenses associated with the loan closing.

- 8. Method of Repayment. Borrower shall repay the Woodbury County loan by making sixty (60) installment payments directly to Woodbury County at the address first written above in a sum including principal and interest computed as described in the promissory note evidencing said loan.
- 9. <u>Additional Affirmative Covenants of Borrower</u>. Borrower covenants, warrants, guarantees and represents:
- (a) Borrower shall fully and faithfully repay the principal and interest due on all other debt of Borrower now existing or hereafter acquired.
- (b) Borrower has the full power and authority to enter into this Agreement, undertake the borrowings provided for or reflected herein, and deliver the note or notes, and to execute and deliver the instruments and documents which may be required pursuant hereto; no consent or approval of any public authority or regulatory agency is required as a condition of validity of the obligation of Borrower under this Agreement; the note or notes or the documents or instruments contemplated hereby other than those consents or approvals which have already been obtained and copies of which have been delivered or will be delivered to Woodbury County pursuant to this or any ancillary agreements.
- (c) There is no provision of any existing mortgage, indenture, contract, or agreement binding upon Borrower which would conflict with or in any way prevent the execution, delivery or performance of the terms of this Agreement.
- (d) That neither Borrower nor a close relative of such entity is an officer, director or person or group of persons controlling as much as ten percent of the voting power of Woodbury County. If during the terms of this Agreement, Borrower or its affiliates acquire, directly or indirectly, in excess of ten percent ownership or interest in Woodbury County, all sums due and owing pursuant to the note given in connection with the loan referred to herein shall immediately become due and payable.
- (e) That Borrower will take all reasonable actions to provide and maintain hazard insurance in such amounts and for such coverages as shall be satisfactory to Woodbury County and will further purchase Federal Flood Insurance in amounts and coverages satisfactory to Woodbury County if it becomes located within a special flood hazard area as defined by FEMA during the term of this loan and Federal Flood Insurance is available.
- (f) Borrower will annually submit to Woodbury County financial statements consisting of a Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Statement, and Reconciliation of Changes in Net Worth for Countryman Financial Group, LLC. In addition, Christen J. Countryman will annually submit a personal financial statement consisting of a Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss Statement. The statements will be certified as true and correct copies by Borrower. Financial statements may be requested more frequently if deemed necessary by Woodbury County for servicing purposes.
- (g) Borrower, by executing this agreement, gives written consent to Borrower's accounting service to allow the release of financial statements pertaining to Borrower to Woodbury County as may be requested.
- (h) Borrower will maintain Countryman Financial as a financial services business during the term of this loan.
- 10. <u>Default and Acceleration</u>. It is understood and acknowledged that in any one of the following events, all outstanding unpaid balances due and owing to Woodbury County shall immediately become due and payable without further notice to Borrower:
- (a) Borrower shall file a petition in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court or an involuntary petition shall be so filed against Borrower.

- (b) Breach of any of the covenants, promises or conditions of any note, security agreement or other agreement with the holder.
- (c) A default by Borrower in the payment of the debt to Siouxland Economic Development Corporation.
- (d) Woodbury County, in good faith, deems itself insecure.
- 11. Conflicting Provisions. In the event of any conflict between any provision of this Agreement and any other document, instrument or agreement executed by and between Woodbury County and Borrower in connection with the financing described in Sections 1 and 2 above, the terms of such other document, instrument or agreement shall control.
- 12. Confidentiality. All financial statements or any other business or financial information of the Borrower and Christen J. Countryman shall be kept confidential by Woodbury County to the fullest extent permissible under applicable law.

INTERCREDITOR AGREEMENT

THIS INTERCREDITOR AGREEMENT IS ENTERED INTO this 1st day of April, 2015, by and between Woodbury County, Iowa (Woodbury County), Siouxland Economic Development Corporation (SEDC), and Countryman Financial Group, LLC (Debtor).

WITNESSETH

- WHEREAS, Woodbury County has agreed to extend credit to Debtor in the sum of \$35,000.00 ("Original Loan") for the purpose of purchasing a book of business from EGR Insurance, Inc. in Moville, IA; and
- WHEREAS, SEDC has also agreed to extend credit to Debtor in the sum of \$15,000,00 for the purpose of purchasing a book of business from EGR Insurance, Inc. in Moville, IA; and
- 3. WHEREAS, Woodbury County's credit to Debtor is secured by certain collateral documents executed by Debtor which grants Woodbury County a first security interest in all business assets of Debtor, a third security interest in the personal residence owned by Christen J. Countryman and Jodi L. Countryman, husband and wife, and legally described on Exhibit A Page 6, and a personal guarantee from Christen J. Countryman (hereinafter "Woodbury County's Collateral"); and
- 4. WHEREAS, SEDC's credit to Debtor is secured by (a) a Security Agreement granting SEDC a second security interest in all business assets of Debtor, together with the proper financing statements for filing in the appropriate public office or offices; (b) a Mortgage granting SEDC a second security interest in the personal residence owned by Christen J. Countryman and Jodi L. Countryman, husband and wife, and legally described on Exhibit A Page 6; and (c) a Personal Guarantee from Christen J. Countryman. This security shall include all future advances and other debts of Debtor to SEDC of any nature whatsoever whether now existing or hereafter incurred (hereinafter collectively "SEDC's Security Interest in Collateral"); and
- WHEREAS, to induce SEDC to extend credit to Debtor, Debtor has secured payment of its
 indebtedness to SEDC by granting SEDC's Security Interest in Collateral which is junior and inferior in
 priority only to the security interest granted to Woodbury County for the Original Loan; and
- WHEREAS, Woodbury County may, from time to time, extend additional advances of credit to Debtor which shall be inferior and junior to SEDC; and
- 7. WHEREAS, upon Debtor's request and in order to induce SEDC to extend credit to Debtor, Woodbury County is willing to establish the following priority in the event of default, including but not limited to, foreclosure, sale or other disposition of or realization upon the collateral of any part thereof.
- NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES HEREIN ABOVE STATED, the representations, warranties, covenants and agreements herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, Woodbury County, SEDC and Debtor agree as follows:
- Woodbury County's Priority Limitation. Woodbury County's first priority in the business
 assets shall be limited to the amount of \$35,000.00, accrued interest and costs as further set forth in
 paragraph 2 hereof or amount of indebtedness of Debtor under the Original Loan, whichever is less.

- 2. <u>Distribution of Proceeds</u>. Notwithstanding the aforesaid priority of Woodbury County under its Security Agreement on Woodbury's Collateral, Woodbury County hereby agrees that after default on Debtor's Original Loan to Woodbury County, the proceeds from voluntary surrender, foreclosure, sale, liquidation or other disposition of or realization upon Woodbury County's Collateral shall be applied in the following manner:
 - A. The payment of all costs and expenses of Woodbury County and SEDC, including reasonable attorney fees in the event of legal action relative to a foreclosure, sale, liquidation or other disposition or realization upon the Woodbury County's Collateral incurred by either party or both parties initiating and conducting such legal action, provided that SEDC's costs shall not be reimbursed from the Woodbury County's Collateral without the prior consent of Woodbury County or the payment to Woodbury County of the amount due in Section B, below.
 - B. The payment of an amount from Woodbury County's Collateral to Woodbury County in the sum of \$35,000.00 (Original Loan), and interest thereon at the rate set out in Woodbury County's promissory note, or the amount of the indebtedness of Debtor owed to Woodbury County, whichever is lesser, realized from the sale of Woodbury County's Collateral.
 - C. The payment of an amount to SEDC in the sum of \$15,000.00 or the amount of the indebtedness of Debtor owed to SEDC, including unreimbursed costs, the unpaid principal balance, and interest thereon at the rate set out in SEDC's promissory note, whichever is lesser.
 - Payment to Woodbury County of the amount equal to the indebtedness of Debtor to Woodbury County.
 - E. Payment to any party, including, but not limited to, Debtor, entitled to any surplus remaining.

The effectiveness and enforceability of this provision and this agreement are conditioned on the existence and continuation of valid enforceable and perfected liens and security interests in favor of Woodbury County or SEDC, as the case may be.

- Default Under Loan Documents. Debtor agrees that any default or event of default which
 may occur under any loan documents for SEDC and/or Woodbury County shall also be a default under
 the loan documents of the other lender.
- 4. Notification and Necessary Consent. Woodbury County and SEDC shall promptly give written notice to the other of the occurrence and/or continuance of any default or event of default by Debtor under any agreement, instrument or document to which Debtor is a party. Woodbury County and SEDC shall each be entitled to receive and retain payment properly paid by Debtor pursuant to the loan documents until notification of default is given by Woodbury County or SEDC to the other. Woodbury County and SEDC agree that neither shall amend, increase, extend, renew, alter, modify nor receive additional collateral or guarantees with the respect to the original note of Woodbury County or SEDC's original note without written consent of the other party. After notification, all proceeds received must be distributed pursuant to paragraph 2 hereof unless otherwise agreed in writing by Woodbury County and SEDC. Woodbury County and SEDC agree to mutually establish an escrow account for deposit and accounting of the proceeds.

- Financial Data. Debtor agrees that Woodbury County and SEDC may provide to one another financial data provided by Debtor or otherwise obtained including, but not limited to, financial statements.
- 6. <u>Cure</u>. Woodbury County and SEDC agree that, with respect to the indebtedness, obligations and liabilities, now and hereafter arising, of Debtor to either of them, Woodbury County or SEDC shall have the same right to cure any default by payment or performance of such obligations as shall be afforded to Debtor under any agreement, instrument, or document to which Debtor and Woodbury County or Debtor and SEDC are parties.
- 7. <u>Successor and Assigns Amendment</u>. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of Woodbury County, SEDC and Debtor, their successors and assigns. This is a continuing agreement and may not be revoked or terminated or modified in any way except in writing executed by all the parties hereto.
- 8. <u>Termination</u>. This agreement and the relative lien priorities herein contained shall be continued in full force and effect until the payment in full of all indebtedness, obligations and liabilities now or hereafter arising of Debtor owed to Woodbury County and SEDC.



317.3 Weed commissioner - standards for noxious weed control.

The board of supervisors of each county may annually appoint a county weed commissioner who may be a person otherwise employed by the county and who passes minimum standards established by the department of agriculture and land stewardship for noxious weed identification and the recognized methods for noxious weed control and elimination. The county weed commissioner's appointment shall be effective as of March 1 and shall continue for a term at the discretion of the board of supervisors unless the commissioner is removed from office as provided for by law. The county weed commissioner may, with the approval of the board of supervisors, require that commercial applicators and their appropriate employees pass the same standards for noxious weed identification as established by the department of agriculture and land stewardship. The name and address of the person appointed as county weed commissioner shall be certified to the county auditor and to the secretary of agriculture within ten days of the appointment. The board of supervisors shall fix the compensation of the county weed commissioner and deputies. In addition to compensation, the commissioner and deputies shall be paid their necessary travel expenses. At the discretion of the board of supervisors, the weed commissioner shall attend a seminar or school conducted or approved by the department of agriculture and land stewardship relating to the identification, control, and elimination of noxious weeds.

The board of supervisors shall prescribe the time of year the weed commissioner shall perform the powers and duties of county weed commissioner under this chapter which may be during that time of year when noxious weeds can effectively be killed. Compensation shall be for the period of actual work only although a weed commissioner assigned other duties not related to weed eradication may receive an annual salary. The board of supervisors shall likewise determine whether employment shall be by hour, day or month and the rate of pay for the employment time.





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Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

1. The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of sald roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be reseeded.
- The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (I) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- 12. Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.





- In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:
- The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.
- The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.
- C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.
- The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.
- The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.

- F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.
- G. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will reseed and mulch the disturbed areas. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will be responsible for seed, mulch, and labor unless otherwise provided in section L.

WITNESSED THAT:

WHEREAS, under the provision of Chapter 161D, Code of Iowa, the Hungry Canyons Alliance is authorized to assist the Sponsor in measures related to the unique natural resources, rural development and infrastructure problems of counties in the deep loess soil region of western Iowa.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of several promises to be faithfully performed by the parties hereto as set forth, the Sponsor and Hungry Canyons Alliance do hereby agree as follows:

A. It is agreed that the following described work is to be performed at a total estimated cost of \$18,838. This amount includes survey, engineering, construction, inspection, and administration of:

Construction of stream channel stabilization structure(s) as proposed in the project application(s) labeled Attachment C to this agreement.

B. THE SPONSOR WILL:

- Contract for and complete construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
- Accept responsibility for land and water rights acquisition, survey, design, construction inspection, contract administration, and cost above that provided in C.1. for construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The Sponsor's share will constitute a minimum of 20% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
- Accept all financial and other responsibility for excess costs resulting from their failure to obtain or their delay in obtaining adequate land and water rights, permits, and licenses needed for the work described in Attachment C.

- Accept responsibility for the operation, maintenance and repairs of the structure unless it is determined by HCA and the Sponsor that the cost of repair exceeds the learned benefits of the repaired structure.
- Hold and save the HCA free from any and all claims or causes of action whatsoever resulting from the obligations undertaken by the Sponsor under this agreement or resulting from work provided for in this agreement.
- Accept responsibility for performing and keeping records regarding the operation and maintenance of works described in Attachment C and provide necessary facilities, administrative and bookkeeping personnel, and legal counsel for the provision of financial and technical assistance to support installation of grade stabilization measures as described in Attachment C.
- Prepare a design, construction plans, and construction specifications in accordance with standard engineering principles. The design, construction plans, and construction specifications shall be reviewed and approved by a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa.
- Ensure that all contracts for design and construction services will be procured in accordance with procedures prescribed in the Code of lowa applicable to the Sponsor.
- Ensure that any special requirements for compliance with environmental and/or cultural resource laws are incorporated into the project.
- Retain all records pertaining to all work performed in Attachment C for three (3)
 years from the date of the submission of the final request for reimbursement or
 until final audit findings have been resolved, whichever is longer.
- Require that a professional engineer registered in the State of lowa certify that the project was installed in accordance with the plans and specifications.
- Request reimbursement from the HCA by submitting a Request for Reimbursement form.
- Administer their action under this agreement in accordance with 7 CFR 3015, CFR 3016, CFR 3017, CFR 3018, CFR 3052, and OMB Circulars A-102, A-87, and A-133.
- 14. Comply with the requirements of Attachment A and Attachment B SPECIAL PROVISIONS which are made a part of this agreement. Attachment A describes Drug Free Workplace and Clean Air and Water requirements. Attachment B describes equal opportunity and nondiscrimination requirements.
- Comply with Hungry Canyons Cost-Share Program Administrative Procedures labeled Attachment D to this agreement.
- Issue Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 1099 G, Statement for Recipients of Government Payments to the participant and to IRS as required by IRS regulations.

C. HCA WILL:

- Provide a maximum of <u>\$14.895</u> for total construction costs of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The HCA share will constitute a maximum of 80% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
- Provide advice and counsel as needed with the technical and contractual administration of this agreement at the request of the Sponsor.
- Upon notification of the completion of construction, HCA shall promptly review the performance of Sponsor to determine if it has met the requirements of this agreement and fund expenditures as agreed.
- Pay the Sponsor pursuant to this agreement with request submitted on HCA Request for Reimbursement form.

D. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- All work under this agreement will be completed by <u>December 31, 2016</u>.
- This agreement shall be effective on the date appearing in the first paragraph and shall continue in effect until the purpose of the agreement has been fulfilled or until the agreement expires on the date set forth in D.1.
- 3. Failure to properly design or construct a project receiving HCA funding will result in 10% of the final reimbursement being withheld and no approval of further county projects for HCA funding until the project has been fixed to accepted standards. All counties are encouraged to contact and work closely with the HCA project director to avoid this situation. All counties are to use the HCA weir design and construction checklist to help assure a good final product.
- 4. The furnishing of financial and other assistance by the HCA is contingent on the availability of funds appropriated by State Legislature from which payment may be made and shall not obligate the HCA upon failure of the Congress to appropriate funds.
- 5. HCA may terminate this agreement in whole or in part when it is determined by HCA that the Sponsor has failed to comply with any of the conditions of this agreement. The HCA shall promptly notify the Sponsor in writing of the determination and reasons for the termination, together with the effective date. Payments or recoveries made by HCA under this termination shall be in accord with the legal rights and liabilities of HCA and the Sponsor.
- This agreement may be temporarily suspended by HCA if it determines that
 corrective action by the Sponsor is needed to meet the provisions of this
 agreement. Further, HCA may suspend this agreement when it is evident that a
 termination is pending.
- The terms and conditions of this agreement are subject to modification by amendment agreed to in writing by both HCA and the Sponsor.

- If any part of this agreement is found to be void and unenforceable, then the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in effect.
- The contract for constructing the work described in Attachment C will not be awarded by the Sponsor to any company in which any official of the Sponsor or any member of such an official's immediate family has direct or indirect interest in the pecuniary profits or contracts of such company.
- 10. This agreement, as set forth on pages 1-4, constitutes the entire agreement between Hungry Canyons Alliance and the Sponsor. No representations, promises, or warranties have been made by either party that are not fully expressed in this agreement.
- The program or activities conducted under this agreement will be in compliance with the nondiscrimination provisions as contained in Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (Public Law 100-259); and other nondiscrimination statutes: namely, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. They shall also be in accordance with regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture (7 CFR 15, Subparts A & B), which provide that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender, religion, age, disability, political beliefs, marital or familial status, or sexual orientation, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance from the Department of Agriculture or any agency thereof.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Services of a cultural resources consultant are needed for assuring that proposed county projects do not impact any archaeological or historical sites within proposed project corridors prior to completing design and platting new right of on seven county projects. Bear Creek Archaeology, Inc. has offered a contract for completion of this work for the county. Quotes were requested from three consultants. Bear Creek provided the only responsive quotation.

BACKGROUND: Projects covered by this contract are in current year of the five year program for construction. Design work is underway and necessary additional right of way has been identified. Prior to platting right of way and completing design, cultural resources investigation must be completed to maintain federal aid eligibility of these projects.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: The county road department budgets for necessary consultant services.

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of contract.

CONSULTANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN OFFICE OF THE WOODBURY COUNTY ENGINEER AND BEAR CREEK ARCHEOLOGY, INC.

This will confirm your acceptance of our proposal (Exhibit A) for providing professional services relating to a Phase I investigation for three bridge replacements, three right-of-way acquisitions, and a road widening project in Woodbury County, Iowa.

1. Term

The term of this agreement shall be for a period of six months commencing April 7, 2015 or submittal of the reports to the Office of the Woodbury County Engineer.

2. General

Bear Creek Archeology, Inc. (BCA) has submitted a proposal (Exhibit A) to conduct a Phase I investigation for three bridge replacements, three right-of-way acquisitions, and a road widening project in Woodbury County, Iowa to Office of the Woodbury County Engineer. Acceptance of this proposal was received by BCA on April 7, 2015 (Exhibit B).

3. Scope of Work

The scope of services shall include Phase I cultural resource surveys for the three bridge replacements, three right-of-way acquisitions, and a road widening project in Woodbury County as outlined in our proposal dated March 26, 2015. Major tasks to be completed by BCA include:

- · Phase I fieldwork
- Coordination and integration of geomorphic work on the sites and associated landforms
- · Artifact and data analysis
- The production of a high quality field map
- The production of a high quality report for each of the five projects

4. Responsibility of Bear Creek Archeology, Inc.

BCA shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, and the coordination of all Phase I investigations and analysis, designs, drawings, specifications, and other services furnished by BCA under this contract. BCA shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its investigations, analysis, designs, drawing, specifications, and other services if requested by the State Historical Society of Iowa.

5. Landowner Permission

Office of the Woodbury County Engineer shall assist BCA in obtaining landowner permission for conducting the Phase I cultural resource surveys. Phase I cultural resource surveys shall be conducted only where landowner permission has been obtained. If landowner permission is denied at one or more of the locations, the responsibilities of BCA and the Payment will be adjusted accordingly.

6. Indemnification

BCA shall hold harmless and indemnity Office of the Woodbury County Engineer from and against all claims, suits, damages, losses, expenses, and attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from performance of the work, except for damage in the proposed right-of-way. Also, any liability on the part of BCA is limited to claims, suits, damages or losses, or expenses attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or to the injury, damage, or destruction of property (including the loss of use therefrom) resulting from the negligent acts or omissions of BCA, its agents and its direct or indirect employees (not including subcontractors of BCA).

7. Insurance

BCA will procure and maintain such insurance to protect the Office of the Woodbury County Engineer from claims under workmen's compensation acts, claims for damages because of bodily injury, including personal injury, sickness, disease, or death of any and all BCA employees or of any person other than such BCA employees. Also, any claims or damages because of injury to or destruction of property including loss of use resulting therefrom, and from claim, arising out of the performance of professional services caused by an error, omission, or negligent act for which he is legally liable. BCA's insurance coverage shall provide \$1,000,000 for general liability, \$1,000,000 for professional liability, and \$1,000,000 for auto liability.

BCA shall furnish certificates of insurance to the Office of the Woodbury County Engineer (Exhibit C) confirming the amounts of coverage and deductible for the following types of insurance:

Worker Compensation Comprehensive General Liability Professional Liability Automobile-Personal Injury and Property Damage

8. Schedule

BCA shall proceed in a timely manner. Five copies of the report will be submitted to the Office of the Woodbury County Engineer no later than 30 business days after the completion of the fieldwork.

9. Payment

Payment for services outlined in our cost proposal shall be at the unit price amount for the various services shown in Exhibit B. The total payment for all services shall not exceed \$12,288.15 without prior authorization by the Office of the Woodbury County Engineer.

BCA warrants that the rates and prices to be charged under this Agreement represent competitive rates and prices that do not exceed its current established or published prices and charges and are no higher than BCA would quote to any other customer, including agencies of the U.S. Government.

INTRODUCTION: The Office of the Woodbury County Engineer, Sioux City, Iowa is proposing a road widening project along 250th Street (Site A), a bridge replacement project along County Road D38 (Site B), a bridge replacement project along County Road K49 (Site C), a bridge replacement project along 280th Street (Site D), and three right-of-way (ROW) acquisitions along County Road D38 (Site E). This proposal will present basic background information concerning the landscape, previously recorded archeological sites, and other pertinent information at each of the locations. This proposal will also outline the types of intensive Phase I archeological work that can be expected at the affected sites, it will document the type of information that will be included in the reports, and it will offer a schedule for completion.

Bear Creek Archeology, Inc. (BCA) proposes to conduct the field investigations at each of the properties within the same week to limit expenses caused by travel time. Each of the projects (Sites A-E) will be described in individual reports even though fieldwork estimates are combined.

250th Street Road Widening Project (Site A). According to project plans, this project requires a project area that is approximately 2 miles long and 300 feet wide, centered on the existing centerline. The project will encompass approximately 72 linear acres. The widening will occur primarily on upland landforms, although a few potential alluvial fans might also be present. Most of the area occurs in agricultural fields and a few places are covered with grass. A site records review indicates that this entire area was previously surveyed by Billeck (1985) and Molyneaux (1996) prior to the publication OF Guidelines for Archeological Investigations in Iowa (Association of Iowa Archaeologists 1999). Because of this, the project area will need to be resurveyed. There are two previously recorded archeological sites within the project area (13WD98 and 13WD99). Both sites represent abandoned Euro-American farmstead locations and neither site has been adequately tested to determine National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility.

BCA proposes to conduct intensive Phase I investigations of this project area using a mixture of landform modeling, pedestrian survey, and subsurface testing. Pedestrian survey will be used in

areas with greater than 30% ground surface visibility (GSV), with transect intervals spaced at no more than 15 m (49.2 ft). Subsurface testing will be conducted in areas with limited GSV that have archeological potential (approximately 3.5 acres), on alluvial fans if buried soils are encountered that might yield archeological sites, and at recorded/newly identified archeological sites. Subsurface tests will be spaced at no greater than 15 m (49.2 ft) intervals, with reduced spacing of no more than 10 m (32.8 ft) at archeological sites. Encountered sites will be tested at the Phase I level to determine potential NRHP eligibility.

County Road D38 Bridge Replacement (Site B): Project plans indicate that the project area is to encompass a 150 ft radius of the bridge. This is approximately 2.2 acres on mixed upland and Holocene alluvial landforms. Upland landforms occur in agricultural fields and alluvial landforms are covered with grass. At present, there are no known sites or potential historic resources noted in the project area and it has not been previously investigated.

BCA proposes to conduct intensive Phase I investigations of this project area using a mixture of landform modeling, pedestrian survey, and subsurface testing. Pedestrian survey will be used in areas with greater than 30% GSV, with transect intervals spaced at no more than 15 m (49.2 ft). Subsurface testing will be conducted in areas with limited GSV that have archeological potential and/or on alluvial landforms that might yield deeply buried archeological sites. Subsurface tests will be spaced at no greater than 15 m (49.2 ft) intervals, with reduced spacing of no more than 10 m (32.8 ft) at archeological sites. Encountered sites will be tested at the Phase I level to determine potential NRHP eligibility.

County Road K49 Bridge Replacement (Site C): Project plans indicate that the project area is to encompass a 150 ft radius of the bridge, which encompasses approximately 2.4 acres. This area occurs on Holocene alluvial landforms in agricultural fields. At present, there are no known sites or potential historic resources noted in the project area and it has not been previously investigated.

BCA proposes to conduct intensive Phase I investigations of this project area using a mixture of landform modeling, pedestrian survey, and subsurface testing. Pedestrian survey will be used in areas with greater than 30% GSV, with transect intervals spaced at no more than 15 m (49.2 ft). Subsurface testing will be conducted in areas with limited GSV that have archeological potential and/or on alluvial landforms that might yield deeply buried archeological sites. Subsurface tests will be spaced at no greater than 15 m (49.2 ft) intervals, with reduced spacing of no more than 10 m (32.8 ft) at archeological sites. Encountered sites will be tested at the Phase I level to determine potential NRHP eligibility.

280th Street Bridge Replacement (Site D): Project plans indicate that the project area is to encompass a 150 ft radius of the bridge. This is approximately 2.1 acres on Holocene alluvial landforms in agricultural fields. At present, there are no known sites or potential historic resources noted in the project area and it has not been previously investigated.

BCA proposes to conduct intensive Phase I investigations of this project area using a mixture of landform modeling, pedestrian survey, and subsurface testing. Pedestrian survey will be used in areas with greater than 30% GSV, with transect intervals spaced at no more than 15 m (49.2 ft).

Subsurface testing will be conducted in areas with limited GSV that have archeological potential and/or on alluvial landforms that might yield deeply buried archeological sites. Subsurface tests will be spaced at no greater than 15 m (49.2 ft) intervals, with reduced spacing of no more than 10 m (32.8 ft) at archeological sites. Encountered sites will be tested at the Phase I level to determine potential NRHP eligibility.

County Road D38 ROW Acquisitions (Site E): There are three small areas where the County plans to acquire additional ROW. These areas total about .6 acres covered with grass and trees. These areas appear to occur within drainages. Active drainages generally have low potential for archeological sites. One of the areas was previously surveyed (Thompson 1990). Because this area was surveyed before the issuance of the AIA (1999) guidelines, this ROW area will need to be re-examined. At present, there are no known sites or potential historic resources noted in the project area and it has not been previously investigated.

BCA will begin investigations of these areas using a geomorphological assessment. If it is found that these areas have potential for archeological sites, BCA will conducted pedestrian survey in areas with greater than 30% GSV, with transect intervals spaced at no more than 15 m (49.2 ft). Subsurface testing will be conducted in areas with limited GSV that have archeological potential. Subsurface tests will be spaced at no greater than 15 m (49.2 ft) intervals, with reduced spacing of no more than 10 m (32.8 ft) at archeological sites. Encountered sites will be tested at the Phase I level to determine potential NRHP eligibility.

Reporting: A project completion report will be completed for each of the projects (Sites A-E; five reports) at the close of field investigations. The reports will include descriptions of the project areas, geological background information, the results of archival research, methods used during the field investigations, and the results of the field investigations with clear recommendations concerning archeological properties. The texts will be accompanied by topographic maps, scale maps, plat maps, aerial photographs, and representative photographs of the project area generally and all encountered archeological sites.

TIME ESTIMATES AND COSTS: This cost proposal includes:

- 1) All expenses.
- A complete review of archeological and historical records.
- Comprehensive field investigations including extensive shovel testing or bucket augering in locations with deep site potential.
- 4) Geoarcheological assessments.
- A preliminary evaluation of any archeological sites if they are encountered.
- 6) Preparation of contract completion reports that will meet or exceed the guidelines established by the Secretary of Interior and the State Historical Society of Iowa.

While this cost proposal does not include the advanced testing (Phase II) of any archeological sites that might be encountered during the investigation, it does include preliminary evaluations of all identified sites. It has been our experience that archeological sites can commonly, but not always, be properly evaluated at the Phase I level of investigation.

BCA anticipates 186 person-hours to complete these projects. This includes the time needed for archival reviews, field investigations, and report preparations. These hours are further broken down on the enclosed cost proposal sheet. The combined not-to-exceed cost for these proposals is \$12,288.15. If the projects can be completed for less than the proposed cost, we would invoice only for the actual time accrued.

BCA anticipates that one crew of two people can complete the fieldwork portion of these projects in five days, including driving time. We anticipate that 40 hours will be needed for post-field write-up, analysis, graphics, and editing for the road widening project (Site A). BCA anticipates that 56 hours will be needed for post-field write-up, analysis, graphics, and editing for the bridge replacement and ROW acquisition projects (Sites B–E). These hours are further broken down on the enclosed cost proposal sheet.



WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Consideration of the Secondary Road FY 2016 to FY 2020 Construction Program for Iowa Department of Transportation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On or before the fifteenth day of April of each year the board of supervisors, with the assistance of the county engineer, shall, subject to the approval of the department, adopt a secondary road construction program which shall include a project accomplishment list for the next fiscal year, and a project priority list for the succeeding four fiscal years based upon the construction funds, local secondary and farm-to-market, estimated to be available for the period. Subject to departmental approval, any project on the approved priority list may be advanced to and constructed in the accomplishment year and the project accomplishment list may be revised due to unforeseen conditions.

BACKGROUND: The program has some new projects advanced because of need or programmed for the fifth year of the program. Most projects have been working their way through the program toward letting and construction. The project selection reflects the county engineer's recommendation of work necessary to maintain the county secondary road system as required by sections 309.27 and 309.28 of the Code of lowa.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: Annual five year program approval. The FY 2016 projects are within the accomplishment year and are budgeted for construction in FY 2016, barring unforeseen circumstances that may lead to project delay. Subsequent years provide guidance for programming and budgeting future projects and are based on anticipated revenue levels in out years.

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of the FY 2016 Five Year Construction Program.







WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Information on Long-Term Facilities Planning

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: A proposal for a long-term facilities plan. Given the nature of the request for two elevator repairs estimated at +\$150,000, a request by one supervisor for a "space study," 5 Nexant-driven "Facility Energy Assessments" (2012), issues with the Law Enforcement steps and potential redesign, the CIP request of Siouxland District Health for Proposed Building Modifications, Jail Issues, and the long-term question of Prairie Hills, Woodbury County is in need for a long-term facilities plan that can be helped by a project developer. This would be akin to a 2050 Vision in terms of prioritization and a "roadmap" in conversations with the Board.


BACKGROUND: The Baker Group can minimize upfront financial risk to owners while developing the project scope, reduce overall project costs, work as the county's advocate, help realize energy efficiency potentials, maintain professional continuity from concept through completion, and beyond the warranty period, comply with all public procurement laws, and offer in-house expertise on all HVAC, Electrical, Building Automation, Fire and Security, and Professional Engineering and Construction Management. The Facility Improvement Master Plan is a time tested Comprehensive Turnkey Approach in project implementation.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: There is no upfront cost or obligation for Phase 1, the initial assessment. Costs are deliverable later on based on the initial estimate and a more detailed audit based on the prioritization of the Board. Professional Services under the Iowa Procurement Codes are not required to go out for bid or RFP and that includes engineering, architecture, and construction management. The Baker Group is unique in that they are the only company that has a State Master Contract with the State of Iowa.

RECOMMENDATION: The major recommendation is simply an initial step. Today's meeting would simply be the delivery of materials to allow fellow Supervisors time to read and digest over more than 10 days' time. I have invited and requested that the Chair put on the agenda a presentation by the Baker Group on April 14.

The letter basically gives Baker Group access to and permission to obtain the required information at the customer site. It also describes what the customer will be given at this phase and a time line for completing this step. Even if the Customer chooses to not move forward with a project, they have no obligations because of this service. It Baker Groups way of getting to know the Customer and the facilities and gives the customer a chance to get to know us before we all move forward.



Step 2: Detailed Facility Audit -- Based on the customers input and direction from the Preliminary phase, the next step is far more detailed and will involve pre-engineering and budgeting from both equipment providers and various construction trades. A "Project Development Agreement" is used as an agreement between Customer and Baker Group for this phase and is priced based on our estimated raw cost of completing this phase. The Customer is carefully instructed that they will be responsible for paying this cost even if they choose not to move forward with a project after receiving the report.

Step 4: Project Implementation Phase

3 and 4 are both covered under various AIA documents. Since State laws vary it is not always possible to use standard documents. All of the documents we use have been revised to comply with Iowa design and procurement codes. Our legal council and management staff have invested a lot of time and effort to not only make sure our documents comply with all Iowa laws but also compliment and conform to each other. The documents have also been highly reviewed and revised by Customer's legal council. We have found, particularly in the Public Educations markets, one law firm does the majority of all School contracts. That firm has worked closely with our attorneys to revise the documents to their expectations. While there is never one contract to fit all, we believe we have a set of base contacts that will work for most projects and can be easily customized if needed. The documents will be supplied at the State's option if we are the chosen provider and will include the following:

There are some unique aspects of lowa Code that need to be taken into consideration and are complied with within these documents:

Professional Design work and Construction Management cannot be provided by the same company. While Baker Group has both services available in-house, to comply with this requirement we have chosen to provide the Construction Management services and not the final Professional Design work. We have Modus Engineering included under section 4.2.5.10 as a subcontractor. While they are part of our team, the Professional Design work is actually contracted directly to the Owners and the design team works closely with our Project Management team in both developing the plans and specification



but also in assuring a very competitive and transparent bid day for an Owner Direct Multiple Prime Contractor bid process.

Construction Management as Adviser is the only allowable process in Iowa that allows an Owner to select a Construction Service company that can be involved in a project from Concept to Completion. All actual installation contracts and equipment are still put out for bid per Iowa Procurement Codes. Each project is different in complexity and size and project costs are not yet known so it becomes difficult to price this portion based on cost per square foot or percentage of project. We typically estimate all expenses that we will incure and base the contract amount on that. Is has been our experience in past projects that the cost per square foot for the Detailed Audit has been in the \$.14 to \$.25 per square foot of building space.
