WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Woodbury County Emergency Services is requesting the Board's approval to apply for the 2016 EMS System Development Grant. In addition, to have the Board's approval to have Dawn Zahnley documented as the Authorized Representative and Jean Jessen documented as the Fiscal Officer.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: This grant award is from the lowa Department of Public Health. The funding amount is \$11,570.00; this funding is used to reimburse Woodbury County Emergency Services and the rural EMS Services in Woodbury County for initial training and continuing education. This includes tuition, books and fees associated with the EMS. The grant timeline is July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.

BACKGROUND: Woodbury County Emergency Services with Woodbury County Board of Supervisors has participated and facilitated the EMS System Development Grant well over ten years. The EMS Squads participate at very near 100% annually. The grant award does vary year to year dependent on available funds. (\$6K-\$11K) However, when the award is at the optimum levels there has not been a situation where there has been any funding remaining. The EMS Squad pays for the expenses and submits them annually and Emergency Services presents that information to IDPH and they submit the reimbursement as one check. Once that check is received then Emergency Services generates payments back to each of the EMS Squads. Emergency Services has historically over the past ten years, provided the financial information to the Auditor's office for annual review.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: This grant provides Emergency Services and the rural EMS Squads financial relief from the increased expense of new volunteers with initial training. The cost of initial training for an EMT is approximately \$1,200.00 per EMT student. Any advanced skills are well above that. Continued education for all levels approximately \$200.00-\$500.00 per squad member annually to maintain their EMS Certification.

RECOMMENDATION: Our recommendation is for the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors approves the application for the 2016 EMS System Development Grant and approve that Dawn Zahnley be listed as the Authorized Representative and Jean Jessen be listed as the Fiscal Officer.

ACTION REQUIRED: Approval is needed (as stated above) by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors to proceed.

28E AGREEMENT BETWEEN WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA AND THE WOODBURY COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMISSSION CONCERNING PROVISION OF EMPLOYE BENEFITS, HUMAN RESOURCES, AND PAYROLL SERVICES

AGREEMENT effective as of April 15, 2015, made by and between Woodbury County ("County") and the Woodbury County Emergency Management Commission ("EMC").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, County is a political subdivision in the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, EMC is a local emergency management commission established in Woodbury County pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 29C; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to enter into an Agreement in compliance with and as authorized by Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa;

IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to allow Woodbury County to provide human resources, employee benefits, payroll, and other similar services to the Woodbury County Emergency Management Commission. These services will be more efficient and economical when provided by the County than if the EMC performed or acquired these services independently.

Section 1. General Provisions

- 1.1 Legal Status. This Agreement is solely for the provision of services between the parties. It does not create a separate legal entity. No separate financing mechanism is required.
- 1.2 Duration. The duration of this Agreement shall be perpetual unless terminated pursuant to Section 1.3 of this Agreement.
- 1.3 Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause or penalty upon sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party.
- 1.4 Status of Employees. The employees of EMC shall remain employees of the EMC. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating an employment relationship between the employees of the EMC and County. EMC shall retain all authority in hiring, termination, and supervision of its employees.

Section 2. Employee Benefits

2.1 Provision of Benefits. County agrees to make its group insurance and other employee benefits available to the employees of the EMC.

Section 3. Human Resources Services

- 3.1 Utilization of County Human Resources Department. County agrees to allow the EMC to utilize the County Human Resources Department for the development, implementation, and administration of personnel policies, benefit programs, and procedures.
- 3.2 Application of Personnel Polices. In its By Laws, EMC has adopted County personnel policies. EMC may adopt agency specific policies in addition to the County policies. Any such policies shall be provided to the County Human Resources Department. In the event of a conflict between EMC policies and County policies, the County Human Resources Department may decline to implement and administer any such policy at the sole discretion of the County.

Section 4. Payroll Services

4.1 Utilization of County Payroll Services. County agrees to process the payroll and perform the related services for the EMC subject to the policies and procedures established by the County.

County and EMC certify that the foregoing Agreement was duly adopted by their respective bodies in accordance with Iowa law.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN WOODBURY COUNTY AND THE CITY OF SERGEANT BLUFF, IOWA

This Agreement is entered into on this	day of	, 2015 by and between
Woodbury County, Iowa, hereafter referred to as "C	County", and the City	y of Sergeant Bluff, Iowa,
hereafter referred to as "City", pursuant to Section	331.429(2) of the Co	ode of Iowa.

The parties to this Agreement hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The City will let bids for a project designated as Dogwood Trail, with a date to be set in February, 2015, hereafter referred to as the "Project". The Project involves the construction of a new 24 feet wide PCC pavement section, approximately 3,600 feet long, known as "Segment 1". Segment 1 will connect the intersection of South Lewis Boulevard/K45 and 220 Street west to Port Neal Road at a point 850 feet easterly of I-29. Segment 1 is being partially funded with an lowa DOT RISE grant. The Project also includes a County Secondary Roads funded 850 feet of PCC overlay between the west end of Dogwood Trail and the east end of the I-29 bridge approach, known as "Segment 2". The Project has been assigned the new Farm to Market connection through Sergeant Bluff and will replace the former route along Port Neal Road.
- The City will be the administrating and contracting authority for this Project. All rights of the County under the construction contract within the corporate limits of the City shall inure to the benefit of the County as if it was also the contracting authority, except for any penalty that may be assessed the Contractor due to late performance of the contract work.
- 3. The City's Consultant Engineer, VEENSTRA & KIMM, INC., shall be responsible for all office and field engineering services in connection with Project. The Project shall be constructed in accordance with the standards of the lowa Department of Transportation and Iowa SUDAS. The City's Consultant Engineer shall inspect for compliance of said standards and requirements. The County shall enter into a separate agreement with the City's Consultant Engineer for design services of Segment 2.
- 4. Each party is responsible for liability occurring as a result of its own acts or omissions in performing its obligations under this agreement. The City shall protect, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County for acts or omissions of the City, its officers, employees, and agents with respect to the obligations of the City under this agreement. The County shall protect, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City for acts or omissions of the County, its officers, employees, and agents with respect to the obligations of the County under this agreement.
- The City shall be responsible for procuring all permits and approvals that are necessary to construct this project.
- The City shall be responsible for signing within the limits of this Project and shall properly place all necessary advance warning signs.

- At the time that construction of the Project is completed and upon written notice of completion by the City, the County shall conduct its own inspection and report any perceived problems to the Sergeant Bluff City Administrator within ten (10) days of receiving notice.
- Upon final acceptance of the Project, continuing maintenance on the road within the corporate limits will be in compliance with the Chapter 28E agreement, dated July 6, 2004 and signed by the City and County.
- 9. The County agrees to make financial contribution to Segment 1, based on the proposed cost share percentages listed in the table below, up to a maximum cost of \$801,677. Payment structure shall be made based on an amendment to this agreement or separate agreement addressing the Urban Renewal Area financing from the County. Payment from the County will not be due until after such amendment or separate agreement has been executed by both parties.

- 10. The County agrees to reimburse the City for 100% of the costs for Segment 2. Reimbursement to the City for the County share of the cost of the Segment 1 and Segment 2 shall be issued by the County within 45 days of receipt an itemized project progress payment to the contractor by the City. Said requests for reimbursement shall be submitted to the Woodbury County Engineer for review.
- The terms of this agreement shall be in perpetuity or until such time as the obligations contained in this Agreement are fully complied with.
- 12. The City does not waive any right or remedy which may be available to recover money due under this agreement. Upon material breach of the terms of this Agreement by the County and after giving the County reasonable notice and opportunity to cure the breach, the City may initiate any action or procedure to protect its interests.
- The Agreement may be amended from time to time by written agreement of both parties.

WORDING FOR AGENDA ITEM: Action to Authorize Chairman to sign Letter of Intent to Baker Group

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Given the nature of the request for two elevator repairs estimated at +\$150,000, a request by one supervisor for a "space study," 5 Nexant-driven "Facility Energy Assessments" (2012), issues with the Law Enforcement steps and potential redesign, the CIP request of Siouxland District Health for Proposed Building Modifications, Jail Issues, and the long-term question of Prairie Hills, Woodbury County is in need for a long-term facilities plan that can be helped by a project developer. This would be akin to a 2050 Vision in terms of prioritization and a "roadmap" in conversations with the Board.

BACKGROUND: The Baker Group can minimize upfront financial risk to owners while developing the project scope, reduce overall project costs, work as the county's advocate, help realize energy efficiency potentials, maintain professional continuity from concept through completion, and beyond the warranty period, comply with all public procurement laws, and offer in-house expertise on all HVAC, Electrical, Building Automation, Fire and Security, and Professional Engineering and Construction Management. The Facility Improvement Master Plan is a time tested Comprehensive Turnkey Approach in project implementation.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: There is no upfront cost or obligation for Phase 1, the initial assessment. Costs are deliverable later on based on the initial estimate and a more detailed audit based on the prioritization of the Board. Professional Services under the Iowa Procurement Codes are not required to go out for bid or RFP and that includes engineering, architecture, and construction management. The Baker Group is unique in that they are the only company that has a State Master Contract with the State of Iowa.

- Schedule a workshop meeting to review Baker Group's Preliminary Building and Equipment Survey findings and collectively determine the next appropriate course of action.




