WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA RESOLUTION #12,210 VACATION OF EXCESS RIGHT OF WAY – CHRISTY ROAD

WHEREAS the Code of Iowa, section 306.10 gives the Board of Supervisors the power on alter or vacate and close any highway or road under its jurisdiction, and

WHEREAS the Code of lowa, section 306.11 allows the Board to vacate a road right of way held by easement that will not change the traveled portion of the road or deny access to adjoining landowners, and

WHEREAS a road vacation under the circumstances outlined in 306.11 does not require a

hearing, and

WHEREAS there is excess right of way at the east end of Christy Road, and

WHEREAS vacation of the excess right of way does not affect access or highway use, and

WHEREAS the current Board of Supervisors no longer believes the county needs to maintain its easement on the following county highway,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors, in session this 30th day of June, 2015, enters the following order in regard to the aforementioned road closure.

The Board of Supervisors orders the following described right of way be vacated. Said road is described as follows:

RESOLUTION FOR INTERFUND OPERATING TRANSFERS RESOLUTION #12,212

Whereas, it is desired to authorize the Auditor to periodically transfer sums from the General Supplemental to the General Basic Fund during the Fiscal Year 2015-16 budget year, and

Whereas, said transfers must be in accordance with Section 331.432 Code of Iowa,

Whereas, the purpose of the transfers are to fund the appropriations for the matching FICA, IPERS, Health Insurance, Life Insurance and LTD costs expended from the General Basic Fund.

Now, therefore be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

The total maximum transfers from the General Supplemental Fund to the General Basic Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, shall not exceed the sum of \$5,678,120

The Auditor is directed to correct his books when said operating transfers are made and to notify the Treasurer of the amounts of said transfers.

Treasurer's Report

Ending fund balance as of February 28, 2015 is \$55,265.28 with a current radio loan payoff amount of \$227,653.50 with a net difference of \$326,611.78

Wireless Surcharge Legislative update

Glenn Sedivy and Gary Brown explained that there has been some Legislative bills introduced in the State Senate to change the formula that the E-911 Service Boards receive wireless 911 funds from 46% to 81%. The Governor also introduced the Governors bill to use the 911 funds to build a State wide radio system and this bill has a lot of controversy as a State wide radio system for the State will be used by State agencies such as the D.O.T. that are not considered emergency responders, it is agreed that the State needs a new radio system but should not take 911 funds away from the local 911 Service Boards to accomplish it.

Fire paging at Salix site, issues with water tower removal, review possible tower purchase.

Glenn Sedivy explained that the Salix water tower is going to be torn down in November of 2015. This is the primary paging site for the southwestern portion of Woodbury County. Glenn advised during the last meeting it was discussed that if the 911 Service Board paid for a used tower at \$9,000.00 plus \$1,000.00 delivery that Siouxland Wireless would pay \$24,406.25 for installation. Glenn advised that Siouxland Wireless decided not to participate. He explained after having some preliminary engineering done on the site that the proposed tower might not be the best solution anyway. Glenn is working with Electronic Engineering to determine the best location for the site as it may be in Sloan or remain in Salix but he will wait to see what is recommended and continue to determine the best solution and bring it back to the Board.

911 Trunks



He is working with the 911 phone system vendor and Centurylink to complete a activity study and Glenn will bring a recommendation back to this Baord in the May meeting.

Generator

Glenn Sedivy advised that the 911 Service Baord owns a 15 KW generator, automatic transfer switch and a propne tank that was taken out of service from the North High tower about 7 years ago and placed into storage. Glenn recommended that we try to sell this equipment and it was determined to sell it with sealed bids with a minimum amount to be determined by the Executive Board. The sealed bids will be opened during the May 13, 2015 meeting.


