- WHEREAS, one in three women will be a victim of violence in her lifetime; domestic violence violates an individual's human rights by destroying dignity, security, and self-worth due to the systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological, and economic control or abuse; and
- WHEREAS, in Siouxland, the Council on Sexual Assault & Domestic Violence is available 24 hours a day and last year responded to 1,780 unduplicated victims, provided 11.475 nights of shelter to 380 women and 301 children fleeing domestic abuse and despite high census, no one in an unsafe situation was turned away.


