# "Stepping Up to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails"

**WHEREAS**, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year; and

**WHEREAS**, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are three to six times higher than for the general public; and

**WHEREAS**, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance use disorders; and

**WHEREAS**, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and, upon release, are at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and

**WHEREAS**, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and

**WHEREAS**, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families; and

**WHEREAS**, Woodbury County, Iowa and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and

WHEREAS, Woodbury County has developed as part of the Sioux Rivers Regional Mental Health and Disabilities Services the Assessment and Stabilization Center to assist persons with mental health needs to remain out of the hospitals and jails by providing treatment alternatives thereby preventing hospitalization through involuntary commitments and/or jails stays; and

**WHEREAS**, through Stepping Up, the National Association of Counties, The Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private, and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails.

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, THAT I,** Matthew Ung, Chairman of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors, do hereby sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jail, commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in my state and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials, employees, and residents to participate in Stepping Up. We resolve to utilize the comprehensive resources available through Stepping Up to:

- Convene or draw on a diverse team of leaders and decision makers from multiple agencies committed to safely reducing the number of people with mental illnesses in jails;
- Collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify adults entering jails with mental illnesses and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program, and case levels;
- Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community;
- Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while considering identified barriers;
- Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan; and
- Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on successes.

# BYLAWS OF

## THE WOODBURY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

## ARTICLE I Name

The name of this statutorily created assembly is the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

## ARTICLE II Purpose

The purpose of this assembly is to perform the duties of the Board of Supervisors according to the Iowa Code.

## ARTICLE III Members

There are five members of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors. They are elected at large from Woodbury County, Iowa but with equal-population district residence requirements.

## ARTICLE IV Officers

**Section 1.** Officers and Duties. The officers shall be a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Clerk to the Board. These officers shall perform the duties as prescribed by Iowa Code, these bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Board in descending order.

- **a.** Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside at all the meetings of the Board during the year. The Chairperson shall make all committee assignments to committees recognized in these bylaws. The Chairperson shall set the tentative agenda for all meetings of the Board. The Chairperson shall oversee the daily operations of county administration while acting within the policies established by the Board. Subject to approval of the Board, the Chairperson shall be authorized, with a Board approved committee form, to establish special purpose committees as needed.
- **b. Vice Chairperson.** The Vice Chairperson shall serve during the absence of the Chairperson and be the presiding officer when the Chairperson participates by electronic means.
- **c. Clerk to the Board.** The Auditor and Recorder or the designee of the Auditor and Recorder shall serve as Clerk to the Board *ex officio*. The Clerk to the Board shall be recognized as the parliamentarian for all meetings of the Board.

**Section 2.** <u>Time, Nomination Procedure, Method of Election and Term of Office.</u> The election of The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall occur at the first meeting in each year. Nominations shall be made from the floor and elections shall be by roll call vote. A temporary chair shall be elected to preside over the election of the Chairperson. The Chairperson's term shall begin immediately. The Chairperson shall preside over the election of the Vice Chairperson.

## ARTICLE V Meetings

- **Section 1.** Compliance with Open Meetings Law. All meetings of the Board shall be scheduled and conducted in compliance with Chapter 21 of the Code of Iowa and other applicable law.
- **Section 2.** <u>First Meeting.</u> The Board shall meet on the first day of January which is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.
- **Section 3.** <u>Regular Meetings.</u> The Board shall hold regular meetings on each Tuesday of the year unless canceled or postponed by a majority of the Board.
- **Section 4.** <u>Special Meetings.</u> The Board may hold special meetings from time to time as required to conduct the business of the county. A special meeting may be called by the Chairperson or by the Vice Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.
- **Section 5.** <u>Agenda.</u> Items to be considered for a meeting shall be submitted in a format prescribed by the Board. All items requested for Board action shall be submitted in the form of a proposed written motion. Any member of the Board may direct the Chairperson to place an information or discussion item on the agenda of a subsequent meeting. The Chairperson shall place an action item on the agenda of a subsequent meeting when directed by a majority of the Board. The chairperson may place items of routine business on a consent agenda to be considered in gross by the Board without debate or amendment. A member may, at the time of approval of the agenda, ask for an item to be considered as a separate item.
- **Section 6. Quorum and Consensus.** A quorum and consensus shall consist of three members of the Board. A quorum is required to transact the official business of the County.
- **Section 7.** <u>Majority Required.</u> Unless where otherwise provided by law, a majority of the quorum present is required for the adoption of any matter to come before the Board.
- **Section 8.** Manner of Acting. Any question to come before the Board shall be in the form of a motion made by a member and shall require a second for consideration. Remarks by members shall be limited to ten minutes unless an extension is granted by a majority of the Board. A member or any other elected official of the county shall address the Chairperson and confine their remarks to the question before the Board and shall be respectful of other elected officials and avoid referencing or questioning the motives of another elected official.

- **Section 9. Roll Call Votes.** The Chairperson shall order a roll call vote when requested by a member. The roll shall be called alphabetically except the Chairperson shall be called last. If a member is not ready to vote, the member may pass and shall be called upon again after the roll has been completely called and shall vote or abstain.
- **Section 10.** Effect of Abstention. When a member abstains due to a conflict of interest, the vote of the Board shall be computed on the basis of the number of members not disqualified by reason of conflict of interest. However, at least three (3) members eligible to vote are required for a quorum on any matter. Abstentions that are not due to a conflict of interest shall be counted as a "no" vote.
- **Section 11.** Electronic Participation. A member of the Board may participate in a meeting by electronic means only in circumstances where participation in person is impossible or impractical. Any member participating electronically shall be connected by a speaker phone, video conference, or other device or software, so that the public can hear any discussion by that member. The vote of any member participating electronically must be made public at the meeting and the minutes of the meeting shall include sufficient information to indicate the vote of each member participating.

# **ARTICLE VI Committees**

- **Section 1.** Committees Required by Iowa Code. All Board representation on committees required by the Iowa Code shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- **Section 2.** Committees Created by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 28E. All Board representation on committees required by 28E agreements shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board and the requirements of the 28E agreement.
- **Section 3.** Committees Created by Agreement. All Board representation on committees required by agreement shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- **Section 4.** <u>Committees Created for Special Purpose.</u> All Board representation on committees required for a special purpose shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- **Section 5.** <u>Attendance at Committees Created Under Article VI.</u> Attendance by members of the Board at committees created under Article VI of these bylaws shall be limited to those approved by the Board as committee representatives unless the committee meeting has also been posted as a special meeting of the Board of Supervisors.

ARTICLE VII Conflicts of Interest Except as otherwise provided by law, members shall not have an interest, direct or indirect, in any contract, or job of work, or material, or the profits thereof, or services to be furnished or performed for Woodbury County. Members should avoid any action that would result in, or create the impression of, using public office for private gain, giving preferential treatment to any person, or losing impartiality in conducting county business.

# ARTICLE VIII Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the most current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Iowa Code, these bylaws and any special rules of order that the Board may adopt.

## ARTICLE IX Bylaws

**Section 1.** <u>Adoption of Bylaws.</u> Bylaws shall be adopted at the first meeting in each year following a General Election.

**Section 2.** <u>Amendment of Bylaws.</u> These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board with a majority vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

Hi Matthew - Please see the following information regarding the list of properties Keith has listed on his request form.

1309 W. 14th Street: On our Weed List given to Kenny. We have tried selling this lot in 2007, 2009, and 2012 for \$1 with no response.

1415 Center Street: On our Weed List. We have tried selling this lot in 2011 and 2014. We did have issues with this lot as they were parking their cars on the grass, so Building Maintenance placed No Parking/No Trespassing signs in the yard and we haven't had issues since. Boykin had \$500 as the minimum bid.

1123 W. 14th Street: On our Weed List. We have tried selling this 2008, 2012 and 2016. I had this on the November 29th, 2016 agenda to have the board approve the notice of property sale resolution but right beforehand the interested party was no longer interested. She has a vineyard next to the this lot and went to the city to see about using it for parking and they advised her she couldn't (I'm not 100% sure what the reason was from the city). The minimum bid was \$50.

1402 Myrtle Street: On our Weed List. This property is right next to the previous one at 1123 W. 14th Street. This was included in the \$50 minimum bid along with that property. They have both been offered for sale to adjoining property holders in 2008, 2012 and 2016.

He has this listed as 21 1/2 17th Street, actual address is 29 17th Street

29 17th Street: This is the huge property we own that is behind Bomgaars and all along 18th Street beyond that guardrail. For the longest time this was listed as Not for sale as we had issues with the legal description (I have since fixed that). The neighbor that lives at 111 17th Street has been interested in purchasing just a small piece of it next to their house but the board was never interested in splitting off the parcel. Joshua also recommended that we don't split the parcel. This was also the garage that had damage done to it from one of our trees falling onto it. I have offered to sell this to the City for \$1 on numerous occasions over the years and they were not interested. The problem with selling it is, the property owner is responsible for maintaining the sidewalk that is 6 blocks long along 18th Street. It would be in the best interest to sell this property if we could.

1802 W. 14th Street: This is on our Weed List. We have offered to sell this for \$1 in 2008 and 2012 with no response.

1523 Nebraska Street: This is on our Weed List. I obtained deed to this property for a man that owned the house next to it, but around the same time, he passed away. I did speak with the family, and they are trying to sell all of his properties and they aren't interested. Since then I have sent letters out to property owners in the area, with no response. The minimum bid was set at \$250.

1821 Pierce Street: This is on our Weed List. I obtained this property for Roger Caudron as he was interested. After obtaining deed, I contacted him to set up the sale. At that time, he advised me he was no longer interested. I then contacted the city and they advised me they were not interested either (even though they were initially). This lot is right next to Siouxland Residential, which is vacant currently and up for sale. I have sent them two letters offering it for sale (minimum bid: \$279) and received no response. I had an individual show interest and ask to set up for sale, but did not show up for the auction last June. I don't know if the county would be interested in selling this just yet, as I have heard rumors that Casey's was interested in that block but would need our corner lot. So, could be a good money making lot. But then I thought if Caudron nor the city were interested anymore, maybe that deal fell through.

There are many lots like the one's listed above. Same history, same outcomes to my letters showing no interest, some are on our weed list and some are not.

Like I said, it is part of my performance evaluation as a goal to publish county owned lots quarterly in the official newspapers. This is to include a brief summation as to the nature of the public bidding process. As we all know, I have only been full-time with this office for less than a year. And until recently, with the clarification of my job duties, able to utilize my time to get these properties back on the tax rolls. I believe it is a task I can handle, but with the number of properties the county currently owns and the number of requests for me to obtain deed to properties, it does take time. Taking property from property owners is not an easy task and it's very time consuming, but it can be done.

As far as Development Agreements, we have never done that before, especially on small residential lots. We issue a Quit Claim Deed and that is all we can do. I also would like to work on these properties in the way I spoke about as far as publications and using social media if possible before we get into the practice of taking the time to set up public hearings and auctions when we aren't even aware of

interested buyers. I would like to be given a chance to do it my way, the way I feel can work, before wasting my time and money from the public bidder budget on legal publications. But, I'm always up for suggestions and better ways of doing things. I just feel I have given this my best effort over the years with the time I had available to do it. I'm in a better position at this point.



The Learn page is where users will view the curriculum in the Naturally Slim program. From this page, the user can view their lessons, complete their quizzes and download the accompanying weekly manual and food diary. Each week beginning in Week 2, users will start their week with the Yes/Mostly/No quiz. This quiz assesses whether the user is putting the skills they learn to use. Feedback from the quiz is tailored to the user's responses in an effort to boost adherence and foster weight loss.



#### **Progress**

The My Progress page allows users to track their weight loss progress. #### **Construction Project Report**

As spring approaches, project work will be resuming soon. This was a good winter for doing work on county bridge and structure projects, and some projects are ahead of schedule. For the next couple of weeks, project work will continue as weather conditions allow.

#### To be let:

BRS-CO97(112)—60-97, D25 Bridge over Whiskey Creek on Old Highway 141 west of Bronson. Letting date: April 18, 2017. The bridge replacement project is a federal aid funded project with 80% federal - 20% farm to market fund dollars paying the cost of construction. The bridge is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season. A new, 30' wide continuous concrete slab structure will replace the existing bridge. This project will result in Old Highway 141 being closed with traffic detoured for much of the summer.

FM-CO97(131)—55-97, HMA resurfacing of County Route L37, Danbury Blacktop, from D38 to Highway 20. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. This project will do cold in-place recycling of the existing pavement followed by a 2 ½ to 3-inch hot mix asphalt overlay on top of the recycled pavement. This project will be constructed in 2017.

BROS-CO97(129)—55-97, Replacement of Bridge L275 on Union Avenue. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. The bridge is programmed for replacement with 80% federal aid bridge replacement funds, 20% farm to market funds. This project will be constructed in 2017. County Bridge L275 is on Union Avenue between 190<sup>th</sup> and 200<sup>th</sup> Streets. Summer 2016 inspection of the structure has determined that severe deterioration to the piling in the north pier required that the bridge be closed as it is no longer safe to carry traffic. The bridge had been posted 10 tons prior to its closure. The bridge has been closed through the winter of 2016-2017 and will remain so for much of 2017 the new structure is completed.

L-B(W107)—73-97, Replacement of Bridge W107 on 330<sup>th</sup> Street west of Danbury. Letting date: Late May 2017. This bridge is programmed for replacement during FY 2017 with special project levy funds. County bridge W107 is on 330<sup>th</sup> Street between Michigan and O'Brien Avenues. The existing bridge is posted 3 tons and subject to monthly inspection due to the condition of the bridge

caps on the abutments. The new bridge will be a 80' x 30' Single Span Precast Concrete Beam Bridge.

#### **Under Contract:**

L-C(M208)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Pocahontas Avenue between 270<sup>th</sup> and 280<sup>th</sup> Streets. Letting date: January 24, 2017. Late Start Date: April 15, 2017. Contractor: Midwest Contracting. Bid price: \$127,399. The existing bridge has been posted for restricted loads due to deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has received Corps of Engineer approval and permitting. The Board has awarded the bid to the low bidder and approved the contract at the March 10, 2017 meeting. No preconstruction meeting has been scheduled for the project yet. The project is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season.

L-B(D38)—73-97, Bridge replacement on 120<sup>th</sup> Street between Emmett and Fayette Avenues. Letting date: October 11, 2016. Late Start Date: April 15, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$397,114.00. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund.

A preconstruction meeting was held with the prime contractor on November 18<sup>th</sup>. The contractor started work the week of November 21, 2016. Pier pile driving have been driven and encased. Abutment pile are also driven and the bridge berms have been shaped for riprap placement. Abutment concrete pours are the next item of work followed by falsework construction. Work will continue as weather conditions are favorable. The project is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season.

L-B(X14)—73-97, Bridge on 280<sup>th</sup> Street north of Danbury. Letting date: April 5, 2016. Late Start Date: August 1, 2016. Contractor: Graves Construction. Bid price: \$490,806.48. This is a locally funded project from the \$1.3 million special projects levy paying the cost of construction.

The contractor has moved on site and started work. Pile driving is complete at both abutments and piers, the pier piling are encased and the abutments are poured. Channel and berm shaping and riprap placement are underway. We anticipate that falsework construction is nearing completion. Installation of reinforcing steel is the next work item. Work will continue as weather permits. Project completion is expected before July 2017.

L-B(L212)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Story Avenue between 190<sup>th</sup> and 200<sup>th</sup> Streets. Letting date: July 26, 2016. Late Start Date: September 26, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$238,096.50. The existing bridge is posted to a maximum 20 gross load and is in deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has been submitted for Corps of Engineer approval and permitting.

The board approved the contract at the August 16<sup>th</sup> board meeting. A preconstruction meeting was held with the contractor on November 18<sup>th</sup>. Work on the project started in December. All concrete work is completed and the box culvert is finished. Backfilling around the culvert, road reconstruction, and final channel shaping remain for project completion. This work cannot begin until frost comes out of the roadway. The project is scheduled to be completed early in 2017.

FM-CO97(126)—55-97, HMA resurfacing of County Route D22, Old Highway 20. Letting date: September 20, 2016. Contractor: Knife River Midwest. Bid price: \$2,060,532.31. The project has been let by the Iowa DOT and we are awaiting bid tabulations and an award recommendation from the Iowa DOT Office of Contracts. The project will overlay the existing pavement on county road D22 from the intersection of K49 northeast of Lawton to approximately one half mile east of Buchanan Avenue. Some cross-road culverts will also be replaced as part of the project work. The project will be paid for with county farm to market funds. Project work will be done in early

2017, with a preconstruction meeting scheduled for next week. Contracts were approved by the Board at their November 8, 2016 meeting.

#### Work Under Design:

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting sometime during 2017.

250<sup>th</sup> Street Grading Project - 2.25-mile grade for paving project south of Anthon. Right of way will be necessary to allow construction of this road. Final design is underway. Once design is complete, there will be a preliminary rollout of the design with affected landowners. Platting and right of way acquisition will follow the rollout. We are working toward a summer 2017 letting. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

Bridge Q10 – Design work is underway to replace an aging greenwood structure on 220<sup>th</sup> street west of Bronson. The existing bridge will be replaced with a large box culvert. A summer 2017 letting is planned. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

280<sup>th</sup> Street Intersection relocation – Design work is nearing completion on the relocation of the intersection of 280<sup>th</sup> Street and Old Highway 141. The existing intersection has restricted sight distance to the north and is a hazardous site for farm traffic entering higher speed traffic on Old Highway 141. This project is being done in cooperation with a local landowner who is donating the right of way for the new intersection. A letting is planned for the summer of 2017 with work to be completed before November 2017.

Bridge L1 – This structure is on Old Highway 20 near Cushing. The project involves the replacement of an existing short span bridge with a concrete box culvert. The current bridge is restricted to less than legal loads. This project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

Bridge D156 – This structure is on Franklin Avenue north of Old Highway 20/150<sup>th</sup> Street. The structure is posted 8 tons. The existing structure is significantly oversized and built from salvaged materials. The replacement structure is proposed to be a large culvert. This project is funded with money received in the local budget from the new \$0.10 state fuel tax. The project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

#### **OTHER PROJECTS:**

#### **COUNTY BRIDGE B82**

County Bridge B82 is on 140<sup>th</sup> Street between Kossuth and Lee Avenues. It was one of the flood damaged structures from the June 18, 2016 flood event. Initially, we were going to try to replace the east abutment bridge piling to reopen the bridge this fall, but since it would remain a posted bridge and it is scheduled for replacement in the 2017 construction season, we will be moving it forward in our design schedule to replace it in whole, hopefully with a winter 2016-2017 letting. The result is that the bridge will be closed through the winter of 2016-2017.

#### ORTON SLOUGH DRAINAGE DISTRICT

Work is starting this week on the Orton Slough Ditch cleanout. This work was let to contract by the Board of Supervisors on behalf of the drainage district. The work is being done by L.A. Carlson Construction. Ditch cleaning and shaping work is complete. Seeding of the disturbed areas remains. The ground is now frozen, so warmer temperatures are needed to allow completion of the project.

#### HASKELL AVENUE BRIDGE

The Board will be receiving quotes for removal of the existing Haskell Avenue Bridge in late December. The bridge cannot be repaired as it has been shifted off its bearings by over 5 feet at the south end. The remaining substructure acts like a trash rack in the stream and channel damage will be minimized by removing the bridge prior to spring flooding. Removal of the bridge will not preclude replacement of the bridge, if the board decides to replace the bridge.

The Board will need to discuss whether the bridge should be replaced. It is a convenient road for people from Moville that are headed north to LeMars or the north side of Sioux City. The replacement structure will cost approximately \$600,000 and I feel that this money could be better spent replacing another bridge on the county system being that this project only saves approximately ½ mile of out of distance travel. This will be the Board's choice as to whether the bridge is replaced or the road is dead ended north of the McElheney Creek channel. I would like to schedule a discussion of the bridge in April.

#### 220th STREET EAST OF OLD LAKEPORT ROAD

Due to deterioration of a seal coat installed to provide a dust free road on 220<sup>th</sup> Street in proximity to a large rural subdivision, 220<sup>th</sup> Street will require extensive work this summer. The seal coat is in poor condition and can no longer be cost effectively patched. A decision will need to be made in consultation with area residents as to the type of improvement and continued maintenance of the roadway. I am hoping once budgeting is done that the Board might find time for a field trip to look at the road prior to a public information meeting with the area landowners so that we can discuss alternatives for maintaining an acceptable road for area residents. Many of the rural lots are subject to paving agreements put in place prior to the current landowners acquiring the property. Many other lots are subject to no such agreement. Assessing the cost of road improvement is difficult to address fairly considering the varied land use fronting the road and the lack of paving agreements covering significant areas of the properties fronting the road.
