Woodbury County earns national achievement award for cost-saving LED retrofit

WASHINGTON – Woodbury County, Iowa has been recognized with an Achievement Award from the National Association of Counties (NACo). The awards honor innovative, effective county government programs that enhance services for residents.

NACo recognized Woodbury County's *LED Lighting Energy Reduction & Cost Savings Project* for completing a county-wide retrofit that reduces energy consumption, saves tax payer dollars, and modernizes the Woodbury County Courthouse—a historical landmark on the eve of its centennial. Woodbury became the first county in Iowa to become an all LED-lit county, and is granted this award in the category of County Resiliency: Infrastructure, Energy and Sustainability.

Board Chairman Matthew Ung said, "In the last few years, Woodbury County has experienced transformational changes within its governing structure and its approach to new, innovative ideas. Identifying these areas where fiscal and environmental prudence intersect is critical. Honor is also due to the initiative, cooperation, and collaboration between our staff and project managers."

A resolution to approve 2017 Urban Renewal Plan Amendment for the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa (the "County") has created the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and has approved an urban renewal plan for the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa requires that, before a county approves any new urban renewal project, or adds property to an urban renewal area, a county must amend the existing urban renewal plan to include that new project or new property; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the urban renewal plan for the Urban Renewal Area (the "2017 Amendment") has been prepared, which (1) describes certain property to be added to the Urban Renewal Area including 246.39 acres located at 2445 Port Neal Road, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa; and (2) describes a new urban renewal project consisting of an agreement between the County and GELITA USA, Inc. which involves the construction by the company of a collagen peptide processing facility and the commitment of the County to make economic development tax increment payments to the company in an amount not exceeding \$499,612; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing by the Board on the proposed 2017 Amendment was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and the Board has conducted said hearing; and

WHEREAS, copies of the 2017 Amendment, notice of public hearing and notice of a consultation meeting with respect to the 2017 Amendment were sent to each School District affected by the 2017 Amendment; the consultation meeting was held and no additional comments were submitted; and

WHEREAS, the Woodbury County Zoning Commission has reviewed the 2017 Amendment and has reported that it conforms to, or is consistent with, the County's 2005 General Development Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. An economic development area as defined in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa is found to exist as legally described on Exhibit A to the 2017 Amendment.
- Section 2. The area identified in Section 1 hereof is hereby declared to be part of the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa.
- Section 3. The development of this area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of Woodbury County.

- Section 4. It is hereby determined by this Board as follows:
 - A. The 2017 Amendment conforms to the general plan of the County.
- B. County participation in the agreement with GELITA USA, Inc. described in the 2017 Amendment is necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.
- Section 5. The 2017 Amendment, in the form attached to this Resolution and made a part hereof, is hereby in all respects approved.
- Section 6. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

2017 AMENDMENT URBAN RENEWAL PLAN GROW WOODBURY COUNTY URBAN RENEWAL AREA May, 2017

The Urban Renewal Plan for the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area is being amended at this time in order to add certain property to the Area and to describe a development agreement that would be financed with incremental property tax revenues.

The County proposes to enter into a Development Agreement with GELITA USA, Inc., which calls for the Company to construct a collagen peptide processing facility on property that is being added to the Urban Renewal Area and commits the County to make incremental property tax rebate payments to the Company for a period of five years in an amount not exceeding \$499,612.

The property to be added to the Urban Renewal Area consists of 246.39 acres located at 2445 Port Neal Road, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa. A legal description of the property is attached to this Amendment as Exhibit A.

An Ordinance Providing for the Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the 2017 Amendment to the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the division of taxes levied on the taxable property in the 2017 Amendment to the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, each year by and for the benefit of the state, county, school districts or other taxing districts after the effective date of this ordinance in order to create a special fund to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, including bonds proposed to be issued by Woodbury County to finance projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area.

Section 2. Definitions. For use within this ordinance the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"County" shall mean Woodbury County, Iowa.

"Urban Renewal Area Amendment" shall mean the taxable property included in the 2017 Amendment to the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, which is identified below, such property having been identified in the Urban Renewal Plan Amendment approved by the Board of Supervisors of the County by resolution adopted on May 9, 2017:

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- Section 3. Provisions for Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment. After the effective date of this ordinance, the taxes levied on the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment each year by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, the County and any school district or other taxing district in which taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment is located, shall be divided as follows:
- (a) that portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which there is certified to the County Auditor the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the special fund referred to in paragraph (b) below, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for said taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid. For the purpose of allocating taxes levied by or for any taxing district which did not include the territory in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment on the effective date of this ordinance, but to which the territory has been annexed or otherwise included after the effective date, the assessment roll applicable to property in the annexed territory as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the effective date of the ordinance which amends the plan for the Urban Renewal Area Amendment to include the annexed area, shall be used in determining the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the annexed area.
- (b) that portion of the taxes each year in excess of such amounts shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into a special fund of the County to pay the principal of and interest

on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1), of the Code of Iowa, incurred by the County to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, and to provide assistance for low and moderate-income family housing as provided in Section 403.22, except that taxes for the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 298.2 of the Code of Iowa, to the extent authorized in Section 403.19 (2) of the Code of Iowa, taxes for the instructional support program levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 257.19 of the Code of Iowa, to the extent authorized in Section 403.19(2) of the Code of Iowa, and taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the taxing district without limitation by the provisions of this ordinance. Unless and until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in such area as shown by the assessment roll referred to in subsection (a) of this section, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for said taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes. When such loans, advances, indebtedness, and bonds, if any, and interest thereon, have been paid, all money thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

- (c) the portion of taxes mentioned in subsection (b) of this section and the special fund into which that portion shall be paid may be irrevocably pledged by the County for the payment of the principal and interest on loans, advances, bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1) of the Code of Iowa, or indebtedness incurred by the County to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area.
- (d) as used in this section, the word "taxes" includes, but is not limited to, all levies on an ad valorem basis upon land or real property.
- Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. Saving Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.

Approving Development Agreement with GELITA USA, Inc., Authorizing Tax Increment Payments and Pledging Certain Tax Increment Revenues to the Payment of the Agreement

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa (the "County"), pursuant to and in strict compliance with all laws applicable to the County, and in particular the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, has adopted an Urban Renewal Plan for the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area"); and

WHEREAS, this Board has adopted an ordinance providing for the division of taxes levied on taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa and establishing the fund referred to in Subsection 2 of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa (the "Urban Renewal Tax Revenue Fund"), which fund and the portion of taxes referred to in that subsection may be irrevocably pledged by the County for the payment of the principal and interest on indebtedness incurred under the authority of Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, an agreement between the County and GELITA USA, Inc. (the "Company") has been prepared (the "Agreement"), pursuant to which the Company would construct a collagen peptide processing facility in the Urban Renewal Area (the "GELITA Project") and the County would provide tax increment payments in a total amount not exceeding \$499,612; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 403.6 of the Code of Iowa, the Agreement also provides that all valuation added to the Company's property during the construction of the GELITA Project will be exempt from property taxation for a period of not to exceed two years; and

WHEREAS, this Board, pursuant to Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa, has published notice, has held a public hearing on the Agreement, and has otherwise complied with statutory requirements for the approval of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A of the Code of Iowa ("Chapter 15A") declares that economic development is a public purpose for which a County may provide grants, loans, tax incentives, guarantees and other financial assistance to or for the benefit of private persons; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A requires that before public funds are used for grants, loans, tax incentives or other financial assistance, a Board of Supervisors must determine that a public purpose will reasonably be accomplished by the spending or use of those funds; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A requires that in determining whether funds should be spent, the Board must consider any or all of a series of factors;

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the factors listed in Chapter 15A, the Board hereby finds that:

- (a) The GELITA Project will add diversity and generate new opportunities for the Woodbury County and Iowa economies;
- (b) The GELITA Project will generate public gains and benefits, particularly in the creation and retention of jobs, which are warranted in comparison to the amount of the proposed property tax incentives.
- Section 2. This Board further finds that a public purpose will reasonably be accomplished by entering into the Agreement and providing the property tax payments and the construction period valuation exemption to the Company.
- Section 3. The Agreement is hereby approved and the Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Agreement on behalf of the County, in substantially the form and content in which the Agreement has been presented to this Board, and such officers are also authorized to make such changes, modifications, additions or deletions as they, with the advice of bond counsel, may believe to be necessary, and to take such actions as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the Agreement.
- Section 4. As provided and required by Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, the County's obligations under the Agreement shall be payable solely from a subfund which is hereby established, into which shall be paid that portion of the income and proceeds of the Urban Renewal Tax Revenue Fund attributable to property taxes derived from the property described as follows:



The Conservation Board is requesting additional spending authority for its REAP Fund (Fund 266), CIP (Fund 360), Reserve Fund (Fund 667), and three small General Fund (Fund 001) expenditures and uses available cash reserves from the Reserve Fund 667, REAP Fund 266, several grants/donations, auction proceeds and General Fund Cash Reserves (for Electricity cost overruns) to provide additional budgeted spending authority.

R& Mhut

During the FY 17 budget reviews, I suggested not cutting our Electricity line items for Parks and Nature Center based on anticipated savings until we had a year to observe any savings. Supervisor Taylor informed me during the budgeting process that if our Electricity line items became over expended, I was to request the additional dollars through a budget amendment. I anticipate the shortage will be close to \$24,000 total for both Parks and Nature Center combined but believe our budget can cover the extra \$4,000 and am only requesting \$20,000 from Cash Reserves.

AGREEMENT TO IMPOSE COVENANT

The undersigned, Jean R. Frank and Dale E. Frank, wife and husband, and Christine Frank, a single person, collectively the owner(s) of the real estate to be known as Whiskey Acres, a minor subdivision to Woodbury County, Iowa, and legally described as set forth in Exhibit "A" (hereinafter "Whiskey Acres").

In consideration of the approval of the Plat of Whiskey Acres we agree as follows:

- 1. To impose a recorded covenant concerning 180th Street agreeing to an assessment on Lots One (1), Two (2), Three (3), Four (4) and (5) (collectively, the "Lots" or individually a "Lot"), in the event 180th Street abutting Whiskey Acres is hard surfaced and graded (the "Improvement").
- 2. NOW, THEREFORE, Declarant does hereby impose and charge the Property with the covenants, agreements, easements, restrictions, conditions, and charges hereinafter set forth, hereby specifying that all of said declarations shall constitute covenants to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties having any right, title, or interest in the Property or any portion of the Property, their heirs, successors, assigns, and all persons claiming under them, said declarations being intended to inure to the benefit of each owner of the Property or any portion thereof.

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>. The following words when used in this Declaration shall have the meanings set forth below:
 - a. "Lot" shall mean any one of the individual Lots.
- b. "Lots" shall mean, collectively, Lots Two (2), Three (3), Four (4), and Five (5) of Whiskey Acres, a minor subdivision to Woodbury County, Iowa.
- c. "Outlot A" shall mean Outlot A of Whiskey Acres, a minor subdivision to Woodbury County, Iowa.
- d. "Outlot A Owner" shall mean the Owner of Oulot A is who is also charged with the rights and responsibilities set forth in this Declaration.
- e. "Owner" shall mean the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of fee simple title to any Lot except that, where a Lot is being sold on a contract for deed and the contract vendee is in possession, then the vendee and not the vendor shall be deemed to be the "Owner". Under no circumstances shall Owner refer to any mortgagee unless and until the mortgagee has acquired title pursuant to foreclosure proceedings or any proceeding in lieu of foreclosure.

ARTICLE II OBLIGATIONS OF OUTLOT A OWNER

- 1. <u>Responsibility for Maintenance and Repair of Outlot A</u>. Outlot A Owner shall be solely responsible for the maintenance and repair of Outlot A so as to keep Outlot A at all times in a safe, sightly, good and functional condition for uses set forth herein. Without limiting the foregoing, Outlot A Owner shall:
 - i. Maintain the surface of Outlot A in a reasonably level, smooth and evenly-covered condition;
 - ii. Promptly remove all papers, ice and snow, mud and sand, debris, broken glass, filth and refuse from the surface of Outlot A; and
 - iii. Place, and promptly repair and replace, any necessary appropriate directional signs, markers and lines.
- 2. <u>Payment of Taxes</u>. Outlot A Owner shall timely pay, before delinquency, all real estate taxes and other lawfully assessed governmental charges against Outlot A.
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Outlot A Owner shall maintain comprehensive general public liability and property damage insurance on Outlot A, with reasonable limits and a reasonable deductible, covering any and all loss, cost, damage, and expenses arising out of any accident or other occurrence causing or inflicting injury and/or damage to any person or property, happening or done in, upon or about Outlot A.
- 4. <u>Outlot A Ownership</u>. At all times the Owner of Outlot A shall also be the Owner of Lot Three (3), Whiskey Acres, a minor subdivision to Woodbury County, Iowa.

ARTICLE III INGRESS AND EGRESS EASEMENT

- 1. Property Rights in Outlot A. Declarant hereby grants to the Owners of the Lots a nonexclusive, perpetual easement of use, access, and enjoyment in and to Outlot A, for purposes of ingress, egress, passage, and delivery, by vehicles and pedestrians and for no other purpose. This easement shall be appurtenant to and shall pass with the title of each Lot, subject to this Declaration as it may be amended from time to time.
- 2. <u>Private Roadway</u>. Outlot A is at all times to be utilized as a private roadway providing ingress and egress to each Lot as contemplated herein. No Owner shall obstruct, place

or install any improvements, barriers or other items that impede or otherwise limit access to any of the Lots using Outlot A.

ARTICLE IV UTILITY EASEMENTS

1. <u>Declaration of Easements for Utilities</u>. Declarant hereby grants and conveys to the Lot Owners a nonexclusive, perpetual easement in, to, over, under and across Outlot A for purposes of installation, operation, maintenance, repair, replacements, removal and relocation of utilities reasonably required to serve the Lots, including electric and communication cables, storm drainage, sanitary sewers, pipelines for supplying gas, water, or heat, including mains, service pipes and equipment and drainage purposes, facilities for general utility functions, and all equipment necessary thereto; provided, however, the foregoing shall: (i) not be utilized in such a fashion that it unreasonably interferes with the ingress and egress easement over Outlot A; and (ii) any damages caused by the installation, operation, maintenance, repair, replacements, removal and relocation of utilities shall be promptly repaired by the Owner utilizing the easement.

ARTICLE V COVENANT FOR ASSESSMENTS

- 1. <u>Assessments</u>. Outlot A Owner shall have the right to assess, fix, levy, collect, and enforce payment from the Owners for all charges, expenses and other costs incurred by Declarant to carry out its responsibilities and obligations under this Declaration in the form of an assessment to each Lot Owner (an "Assessment"). The Assessments shall be fixed at a uniform rate of twenty-five percent (25%) per Lot and no Assessment may be made on a front foot or other basis. Outlot A Owner shall fix the amount of the Assessment provided for herein against each Lot subject to assessment at least thirty (30) days in advance of each assessment period. Outlot A Owner shall reasonably assess each Lot as needed, but no more frequently than on a monthly basis. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any Assessment for paving Outlot A in excess of \$______00 shall require the express written consent of all of the Lot Owners.
- 2. <u>Creation of the Lien and Personal Obligation for Assessments</u>. Each Owner is deemed to covenant and agree to pay to Outlot A Owner the Assessments as herein provided. The Assessments due with respect to each Lot, together with interest, costs and reasonable attorneys' fees, shall be a charge on and a continuing lien against such Lot. Assessments shall become a lien upon each Lot when such assessment is due and payable. Each such Assessment, together with interest, costs, and reasonable attorneys' fees, shall also be the personal obligation of the person who was the Owner of such Lot at the time when the assessment fell due.
- 3. <u>Effect of Nonpayment of Assessments; Remedies of the Outlot A Owner</u>. Any Assessment not paid within thirty (30) days after the due date shall bear interest from the due date at the rate of fifteen percent (15%) per annum; provided, however, interest in excess of the

maximum permitted by law shall not be collected and in such case the interest rate will be reduced to the highest amount permitted by law. Outlot A Owner may bring an action at law against the Owner personally obligated to pay the same, or foreclose the lien against the property in the same manner as a real estate mortgage may be foreclosed. No Owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for Assessments by non-use of the Outlot A or abandonment of his or her Lot.

4. <u>Subordination of the Lien to Mortgages</u>. The lien of the Assessments provided for herein shall be subordinate to the lien of any first mortgage. Sale or transfer of any Lot shall not affect the Assessment lien. However, the foreclosure of any such first mortgage shall extinguish the lien of such Assessments as to payments which become payable prior to the completion of such foreclosure or which become payable during any period of redemption and, if the Assessments for which liens were extinguished cannot be collected in an action against the person personally obligated to pay them, the remaining Lot Owners shall bear such Assessments as a common cost. No sale or transfer shall relieve such Lot from liability for any Assessments thereafter becoming due or from the lien thereof.

ARTICLE VI GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. **Term.** These covenants shall run with the land and be binding on all parties and all persons claiming by, through or under them. Expiration and extension of these covenants shall be governed by Iowa Code Sections 614.24 614.28, as amended.
- 2. **Enforcement**. Enforcement shall be by proceedings at law or in equity against any person or persons instituted by any Owner and/or Outlot A Owner against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate this Declaration, either to enjoin or restrain the violation, or to recover damages, or both.
- 3. <u>Notices</u>. Any notices required to be sent to any Owner under the provisions of this Declaration shall be deemed to have been properly sent when hand-delivered or mailed postage paid to the last known address of the person who appears as such Owner.
- 4. **Severability**. Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgment or court order shall in no way affect any of the other provisions, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 5. <u>Amendment</u>. This Declaration may only be modified upon the written agreement of all of the Lot Owners.

I had a conversation with a gentleman in regard to the taxes and exemption for 4019 Floyd Blvd. The Edward H Monahan Post #64 purchased it September 16, 2016. He had told me they signed up with the City Assessor for the exemption. I told him that it would not take affect until 2018-19, and I verified that with Al Jordon, the City Assessor.

The taxes due now for 2016-17 are delinquent and he told me when they purchased the property, they received credit for the pro-rated tax. I did not see the paperwork, nor did he tell me how much, but I told him if they received the credit, they would be responsible to pay the taxes due 2016-17. If they request an abatement for the taxes due 2016-17, you should find out if they did receive a pro-rate at the time of purchase. If they didn't, the seller should have paid them, because it is for the time period July 2015-June 2016.

He then asked about the taxes payable in 2017-18. He wanted to have the Board abate them and I told him he would have to wait until August 2017, when they received the tax bill, to request an abatement.

Cathedral of the Epiphany
Discess of Sioux City



The stained glass windows are splendid examples of the turn-of-the-century work of the Bavarian studio of Franz Meyer. They depict the Twelve Apostles and stories from the life of Christ. Especially important are scenes from the New Testament infancy narratives, which include the Adoration of the Magi after which the Cathedral of the Epiphany is named.









The hand-carved statue of the Blessed Mother depicts Mary holding the Christ child in her lap. She offers the child a pomegranate, a symbol of His coming passion and a foretelling of the mystical Body of Christ. Mary's garment is adorned with snakes because the Lakota and Dakota word Sioux means snakes. A brooch depicting the crest of the Diocese of Sioux City holds Mary's mantle. The statue of the Blessed Mother was carved in the studios of Conrad Moroder in Ortisei, Italy.






The fourteen Stations of the Cross mark a processional route that commemorates the last moments of the life of Jesus. The ancient tradition of the Stations is inspired by the places of prayer along the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem, the route Jesus walked from the Roman Praetorium to Golgotha, the place of His death. These Stations were a gift from the people of St. Thomas Parish in Emmetsburg, Iowa. They date from 1905.

The triptych depicts the crucifixion of Jesus surrounded by a narrative cycle that tells the story of the martyrdom of some of the 117 men and women from throughout




Vietnam who were put to death for their faith in Jesus. The Martyrs of Vietnam died between the years 1830 and 1883 and were canonized Saints by Pope John Paul II in 1988.




The altar is the sacred table of the Christian people. Its square shape invites the faithful to gather equally at the Banquet of the Lord. The altar is one of the focal points of the gathered assembly. It is the place where the Church commemorates the Last Supper and the Sacrifice of the Lord at Calvary. Because the altar is the symbol of Christ, who is both the "altar and the Lamb of Sacrifice," the top of the altar is inlaid with a mahogany and walnut "X", the first letter in

the Greek word Christ.



The Guadalupe Shrine present copy of the image of Mary the miraculously appeared on the closof the Mexican peasant Blessed Ju Diego after several apparitions of Blessed Mother. Mary appeared Juan on December 9th and 12 1531. In 1945, Pope Pius I proclaimed our Lady of Guadalu patroness of the Americas. 




The carved reredos or retable, which forms a backdrop to the sanctuary, was removed from St. Thomas Church in Emmetsburg after it was closed in 1997. Similar carvings stand behind the statue of the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph. Originally painted white, the woodcarvings were refinished and installed in the Cathedral in 1998.

The reredos is made of pine, oak, walnut and mahogany.








The word cathedral derives from the Greek word καθεδρα (kathedra), meaning chair. A cathedral houses the Chair or Cathedra of the Bishop. Bishop Philip Garrigan, the first Bishop of the Diocese of Sioux City, commissioned the hand-carved oak chair which has been used by the Bishops of the Diocese of Sioux City since 1904. It is decorated with a miter, the Bishop's hat and the crosier, the pastoral staff of the Bishop crossed with the pastoral staff of the Pope. A carved medallion bears the coat of arms of Bishop Garrigan with his motto: "The Lord is my light."

The Diocese of Sioux City encompasses 24 counties in the Northwest Iowa.






























The oak-paneled Reconciliation Room is a small chapel where the mercy of God is celebrated. The faithful have the opportunity to confess their sins individually. This most personal and private moment is an experience of both self-confrontation and a healing experience of God's great mercy and love for each of us.



The entry serves as a gathering place before and after worship.



St. Jude, the Apostle, has long been the patron saint of (lost causes). When all seems lost and beyond our hope, we plead with St. Jude to lift our prayers and concerns before the throne of God. The hand-carved statue of St. Jude was commissioned in Italy in the 1940's and was a gift to the Cathedral from the Franciscan Sisters and the Alumni of Briar Cliff College.



The bronze Pieta depicts the dead Jesus being placed in the arms of His mother. The image of a mother embracing the body of her tortured and dead son is a tragic scene. The Pieta transforms the tragedy into a scene of tender grace as the Blessed Mother holds her crucified Son to her own Immaculate Heart and invites us to embrace the saving message that our Lord and Savior died for our sins and won for us salvation. This contemporary sculpture was commissioned in Italy and was a gift of Charles and Lynnette Hoffman.



Construction of St. Mary's Church, a two-story brick Gothic Revival building with cross gable roof was begun in 1891 from the designs of architect Charles P. Brown. Not yet finished when the Diocese of Sioux City was established in 1902, St. Mary's was chosen as the Cathedral and dedicated to The Epiphany of our Lord. The original design was modified somewhat and construction was completed in 1904. The two tall steeples were added to the towers in 1951-52.

The parish, first as St. Mary's and later as the Cathedral of the Epiphany, was established by immigrants of Italian, Irish and German heritage. Currently, the Cathedral also serves Sioux City's growing Asian and Hispanic population.






A NEW STYLE OF THE MIDWEST

BY LOU ANN LINDBLADE

HE CREATION OF SIOUX CITY, Iowa's, largest public-use Prairie Style building was not a foregone conclusion when a new Woodbury County Courthouse was being planned in 1914. That building, considered today to be one of the 100 most outstanding architectural structures in the U.S., came about through an inspired act of professional respect, a bait-and-switch of plans, and the political and economic lure of using locally manufactured brick and the labor of local bricklayers.

At the time the new courthouse was commissioned, a typical public building in the Midwest was constructed of Indiana limestone in the Greco-Roman style. That's what the Board of Supervisors expected,

and indeed it was what they saw on the plans submitted in a limited competition by local architect William L. Steele. Steele, one of the two or three best architects in the state, was also, not incidentally, a close friend of Henry Metz, then chairman of the Board of Supervisors.

Once hired, Steele convinced his friend Henry to let him produce new plans. "Sioux City deserves something different, something better," he told Metz, "a building built in a new style of the Midwest." To actually draft the new plans, he called on his former associates William Gray Purcell and George Grant Elmslie, with whom he had worked in the Chicago offices of Louis Sullivan and whose talents he much admired, to come in as associate architects. Purcell and Elmslie had by then established their own firm in Minneapolis and, in 1912, had already produced what would become known as a masterwork, the Mer-






chant's Bank in Winona, Minn. Steele would serve as the business manager for the project and would remain the architect of record. But Elmslie would be the building's principal designer; Purcell's role would be to supervise the creation of the elaborate decorations, commissioning bronze and terra-cotta sculptures by Alfonso Ianelli and murals by John Norton.

When the new design was presented to the supervisors, many—but only a minority—perceived it to be too radical. Metz again backed up his friend


Steele, persuading his fellow supervisors (the majority of whom were also his close friends) to approve the new plans, with a few concessions but with their providential utilization of Sioux City brick and Sioux City labor. As Purcell later wrote in his 1958 Notes on the Design of the Woodbury County Courthouse Sioux City:

"Official approval of Mr. Elmslie's designs by the Board was given as a matter of routine, as Bill's friends were in the majority. But not so with the public. ... Probably the determining factor in our favor was the fact that Mr. Elmslie's designs called for the use of brick made by the local brickyard, and as its owners and those who worked for it and did business with it represented a considerable block of the community, they, of course, were favorable, and fought for the design because of the cash which would be spent in the community."

It would be years, however, before the citizens of Sioux City would warm up to their "new Midwestern style" courthouse.

A Unified Whole

Although George Elmslie was largely responsible for the design of the now revered courthouse, Louis Sullivan's influence is seen in the extensive use of terra-cotta ornamentation, metalwork, marble and mosaic throughout the building and in the verticality of its eight-story office tower. The concept of the "skyscraper"—practiced and enunciated most eloquently by Sullivan in the 1890s—was still relatively new in the second decade of the 20th century, and the tower atop the two-story base, originally intended to be several stories taller, was restricted to six additional stories above the base as one of the concessions to the supervisors.

The narrow tower rising from the center of the base provided for a spacious roof atop the base's second story. Elmslie planned the courtrooms for the four corners of the second floor, allowing him to incorporate stained-glass skylights to illuminate them. The rotunda includes a stained-glass dome, naturally illuminated from windows where the building's base and tower meet.

In striving for unity of the whole, Elmslie and his team left nothing to chance, designing desks, benches, chairs and coat racks as integral elements of the building. Every element, from a mosaic fish pond in the rotunda to the glass dome and its illuminating windows, hidden from outside view by a parapet around the second-story roof, was meticulously planned and executed.


"Imposing and Inspiring"

The challenge of a public-use building is just that: it is used, and heavily. Every weekday for 92 years, hundreds of citizens and public servants have visited and worked in the Woodbury County Courthouse. As components began to wear out, they were not always replaced with the same high-quality materials and craftsmanship that went into designing and constructing the original building. As a result, along

the way, some of the stained-glass elevator doors were replaced with steel, stained-glass exterior windows were replaced with simple leaded glass, and other important details were lost or damaged.

In 1989, however, the Board of Supervisors began what would become a 20-year, \$7-million reno-

vation to ensure the building's revival as the astonishing work of art its creators intended it to be. The proof of this effort's success is that it is impossible to tell that any renovation has been done.




A Defining Act of Genius


For nearly a century, the beauty of the Woodbury County Courthouse

has defied capture, either in words or in photographs. Each visit to study the structure demands additional visits, each photograph provokes the need for scores more.

In the long run, the building of the Woodbury County Courthouse was good for William Steele, in Sioux City and beyond. He would go on to design many of the city's churches and the Knights of Columbus Hall, along with scores of residences. Even as the Woodbury County Courthouse was being built, he won the commission to design a much







smaller courthouse in Lake Andes, a small town in Charles Mix County, South Dakota, about 140 miles Northwest of Sioux City. He obviously relied heavily on Elmslie's Sioux City design for the Lake Andes commission, and a smaller, eerily similar building was built in 1917, as the Woodbury County Courthouse was being completed. A good and competent architect, his defining act of genius was to recognize, and hire, two of the nation's greatest. Together, they produced a masterpiece.





BRS-CO97(112)—60-97, D25 Bridge over Whiskey Creek on Old Highway 141 west of Bronson. Letting date: April 18, 2017. The bridge replacement project is a federal aid funded project with 80% federal - 20% farm to market fund dollars paying the cost of construction. The bridge is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season. A new, 30' wide continuous concrete slab structure will replace the existing bridge. This project will result in Old Highway 141 being closed with traffic detoured for much of the summer. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

FM-CO97(131)—55-97, HMA resurfacing of County Route L37, Danbury Blacktop, from D38 to Highway 20. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. This project will do cold in-place recycling of the existing pavement followed by a 2 ½ to 3-inch hot mix asphalt overlay on top of the recycled pavement. This project will be constructed in 2017. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

BROS-CO97(129)—55-97, Replacement of Bridge L275 on Union Avenue. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. The bridge is programmed for replacement with 80% federal aid bridge replacement funds, 20% farm to market funds. This project will be constructed in 2017. County Bridge L275 is on Union Avenue between 190th and 200th Streets. Summer 2016 inspection of the structure has determined that severe deterioration to the piling in the north pier required that the bridge be closed as it is no longer safe to carry traffic. The bridge had been posted 10 tons prior to its closure. The bridge has been closed through the winter of 2016-2017 and will remain so for much of 2017 the new structure is completed. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

L-B(W107)—73-97, Replacement of Bridge W107 on 330th Street west of Danbury. Letting date: May 16, 2017. This bridge is programmed for replacement during FY 2017 with special project levy funds. County bridge W107 is on 330th Street between Michigan and O'Brien Avenues. The existing bridge is posted 3 tons and subject to monthly inspection due to the condition of the bridge caps on the abutments. The new bridge will be a 80' x 30' Single Span Precast Concrete Beam Bridge.

Under Contract:

L-C(M208)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Pocahontas Avenue between 270th and 280th Streets. Letting date: January 24, 2017. Late Start Date: April 15, 2017. Contractor: Midwest Contracting. Bid price: \$127,399. The existing bridge has been posted for restricted loads due to deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has received Corps of Engineer approval and permitting. The Board has awarded the bid to Midwest Contracting at the March 10, 2017 meeting.

The old bridge has been removed and all precast sections have been put in place. The road is backfilled. Gravel will be placed on the road Friday and the road will open by this weekend.

L-B(D38)—73-97, Bridge replacement on 120th Street between Emmett and Fayette Avenues. Letting date: October 11, 2016. Late Start Date: April 15, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$397,114.00. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund.

A preconstruction meeting was held with the prime contractor on November 18th. The contractor started work the week of November 21, 2016. The bridge deck was poured Monday, April 17 and the deck is currently curing. The project is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season.

L-B(X14)—73-97, Bridge on 280th Street north of Danbury. Letting date: April 5, 2016. Late Start Date: August 1, 2016. Contractor: Graves Construction. Bid price: \$490,806.48. This is a locally funded project from the \$1.3 million special projects levy paying the cost of construction.

The contractor has moved on site and started work. Substructure work is complete and the bridge deck was poured Monday, March 27th. The deck is now cured and the bridge rail has been poured. The contractor is working on backfilling the road at both abutments. Channel work remains, but will be done after the road has reopened to traffic. The project is expected to be complete by June 2017.

L-B(L212)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Story Avenue between 190th and 200th Streets. Letting date: July 26, 2016. Late Start Date: September 26, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$238,096.50. The existing bridge is posted to a maximum 20 gross load and is in deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has been submitted for Corps of Engineer approval and permitting.

The board approved the contract at the August 16th board meeting. A preconstruction meeting was held with the contractor on November 18th. Work on the project started in December. All concrete work is completed and the box culvert is finished. Backfilling around the culvert has started and is expected to be completed next week. We expect the road to open either the first or second week of May.

FM-CO97(126)—55-97, HMA resurfacing of County Route D22, Old Highway 20. Letting date: September 20, 2016. Contractor: Knife River Midwest. Bid price: \$2,060,532.31. The project has been let by the Iowa DOT and we are awaiting bid tabulations and an award recommendation from the Iowa DOT Office of Contracts. The project will overlay the existing pavement on county road D22 from the intersection of K49 northeast of Lawton to approximately one half mile east of Buchanan Avenue. Some cross-road culverts will also be replaced as part of the project work. The project will be paid for with county farm to market funds. A preconstruction meeting was held last week. Construction has started. Culvert replacements are underway. There will be periodic closures on the road during culvert construction at several sites along the road. Paving is scheduled for early May with project completion by the end of May.

Work Under Design:

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting sometime during 2017.

250th Street Grading Project - 2.25-mile grade for paving project south of Anthon. Right of way will be necessary to allow construction of this road. Final design is underway. Once design is complete, there will be a preliminary rollout of the design with affected landowners. Platting and right of way acquisition will follow the rollout. We are working toward a summer 2017 letting. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

Bridge Q10 – Design work is underway to replace an aging greenwood structure on 220th street west of Bronson. The existing bridge will be replaced with a large box culvert. A summer 2017 letting is planned. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

280th Street Intersection relocation – Design work is nearing completion on the relocation of the intersection of 280th Street and Old Highway 141. The existing intersection has restricted sight distance to the north and is a hazardous site for farm traffic entering higher speed traffic on Old Highway 141. This project is being done in cooperation with a local landowner who is donating the right of way for the new intersection. A letting is planned for the summer of 2017 with work to be completed before November 2017.

Bridge L1 – This structure is on Old Highway 20 near Cushing. The project involves the replacement of an existing short span bridge with a concrete box culvert. The current bridge is restricted to less than legal loads. This project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

Bridge D156 – This structure is on Franklin Avenue north of Old Highway 20/150th Street. The structure is posted 8 tons. The existing structure is significantly oversized and built from salvaged materials. The replacement structure is proposed to be a large culvert. This project is funded with money received in the local budget from the new \$0.10 state fuel tax. The project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

OTHER PROJECTS:

COUNTY BRIDGE B82

County Bridge B82 is on 140th Street between Kossuth and Lee Avenues. It was one of the flood damaged structures from the June 18, 2016 flood event. Initially, we were going to try to replace the east abutment bridge piling to reopen the bridge this fall, but since it would remain a posted bridge and it is scheduled for replacement in the 2017 construction season, we will be moving it forward in our design schedule to replace it in whole, hopefully with a winter 2016-2017 letting. The result is that the bridge will be closed through the winter of 2016-2017.

ORTON SLOUGH DRAINAGE DISTRICT

Work on the Orton Slough Ditch cleanout was let to contract by the Board of Supervisors on behalf of the drainage district in late 2016. The work is being done by L.A. Carlson Construction. Ditch cleaning and shaping work is complete. Seeding of the disturbed areas and final clean-up of the site is underway and has been delayed by weather. Weather permitting, work should be completed next week.

HASKELL AVENUE BRIDGE

The Board has determined that the Haskell Avenue bridge will not be closed. The replacement project will be added to the FY 2019 construction program and it will be let to contract

sometime after July 2018. Other projects will be delayed to free funding for this bridge replacement. The projects to be delayed have not yet been determined.

220th STREET EAST OF OLD LAKEPORT ROAD

The Board had a public information meeting with residents of 220th Street on April 25, 2017.

They heard comments from landowners bordering the road. The board will reach a decision on the type of improvements for 220th Street at their May 9, 2017 meeting.
