A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE 2017 URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AMENDMENT FOR THE GROW WOODBURY COUNTY URBAN RENEWAL AREA

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa (the "County") has created the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and has approved an urban renewal plan for the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 403 of the Code of lowa requires that, before a county approves any new urban renewal project, or adds property to an urban renewal area, a county must amend the existing urban renewal plan to include that new project or new property; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the urban renewal plan for the Urban Renewal Area (the "2017 Amendment") has been prepared, which (1) describes certain property to be added to the Urban Renewal Area including 246.39 acres located at 2445 Port Neal Road, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa; and (2) describes a new urban renewal project consisting of an agreement between the County and GELITA USA, Inc. which involves the construction by the company of a collagen peptide processing facility and the commitment of the County to make economic development tax increment payments to the company in an amount not exceeding \$499,612; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing by the Board on the proposed 2017 Amendment was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and the Board has conducted said hearing; and

WHEREAS, copies of the 2017 Amendment, notice of public hearing and notice of a consultation meeting with respect to the 2017 Amendment were sent to each School District affected by the 2017 Amendment; the consultation meeting was held and no additional comments were submitted; and

WHEREAS, the Woodbury County Zoning Commission has reviewed the 2017 Amendment and has reported that it conforms to, or is consistent with, the County's 2005 General Development Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, It is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. An economic development area as defined in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa is found to exist as legally described on Exhibit A to the 2017 Amendment.

Section 2. The area identified in Section 1 hereof is hereby declared to be part of the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 3. The development of this area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of Woodbury County.

Section 4. It is hereby determined by this Board as follows:

A. The 2017 Amendment conforms to the general plan of the County.

B. County participation in the agreement with GELITA USA, Inc. described in the 2017 Amendment is necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.

Section 5. The 2017 Amendment, in the form attached to this Resolution and made a part hereof, is hereby in all respects approved.

APPROVING DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH GELITA USA, INC., AUTHORIZING TAX INCREMENT PAYMENTS AND PLEDGING CERTAIN TAX INCREMENT REVENUES TO THE PAYMENT OF THE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa (the "County"), pursuant to and in strict compliance with all laws applicable to the County, and in particular the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, has adopted an Urban Renewal Plan for the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area"); and

WHEREAS, this Board has adopted an ordinance providing for the division of taxes levied on taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa and establishing the fund referred to in Subsection 2 of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa (the "Urban Renewal Tax Revenue Fund"), which fund and the portion of taxes referred to in that subsection may be irrevocably pledged by the County for the payment of the principal and interest on indebtedness incurred under the authority of Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, an agreement between the County and GELITA USA, Inc. (the "Company") has been prepared (the "Agreement"), pursuant to which the Company would construct a collagen peptide processing facility in the Urban Renewal Area (the "GELITA Project") and the County would provide tax increment payments in a total amount not exceeding \$499,612; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 403.6 of the Code of Iowa, the Agreement also provides that all valuation added to the Company's property during the construction of the GELITA Project will be exempt from property taxation for a period of not to exceed two years; and

WHEREAS, this Board, pursuant to Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa, has published notice, has held a public hearing on the Agreement, and has otherwise complied with statutory requirements for the approval of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A of the Code of Iowa ("Chapter 15A") declares that economic development is a public purpose for which a County may provide grants, loans, tax incentives, guarantees and other financial assistance to or for the benefit of private persons; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A requires that before public funds are used for grants, loans, tax incentives or other financial assistance, a Board of Supervisors must determine that a public purpose will reasonably be accomplished by the spending or use of those funds; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 15A requires that in determining whether funds should be spent, the Board must consider any or all of a series of factors;

NOW, THEREFORE, It is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the factors listed in Chapter 15A, the Board hereby finds that:

(a) The GELITA Project will add diversity and generate new opportunities for the Woodbury County and Iowa economies;

(b) The GELITA Project will generate public gains and benefits, particularly in the creation and retention of jobs, which are warranted in comparison to the amount of the proposed property tax incentives.

Section 2. This Board further finds that a public purpose will reasonably be accomplished by entering into the Agreement and providing the property tax payments and the construction period valuation exemption to the Company.

Section 3. The Agreement is hereby approved and the Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Agreement on behalf of the County, in substantially the form and content in which the Agreement has been presented to this Board, and such officers are also authorized to make such changes, modifications, additions or deletions as they, with the advice of bond counsel, may believe to be necessary, and to take such actions as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the Agreement.

Section 4. As provided and required by Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, the County's obligations under the Agreement shall be payable solely from a subfund which is hereby established, into which shall be paid that portion of the income and proceeds of the Urban Renewal Tax Revenue Fund attributable to property taxes derived from the property described as follows:

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the division of taxes levied on the taxable property in the 2017 Amendment to the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, each year by and for the benefit of the state, county, school districts or other taxing districts after the effective date of this ordinance in order to create a special fund to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, including bonds proposed to be issued by Woodbury County to finance projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area.

Section 2. Definitions. For use within this ordinance the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"County" shall mean Woodbury County, Iowa.

(a) that portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which there is certified to the County Auditor the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the special fund referred to in paragraph (b) below, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for said taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid. For the purpose of allocating taxes levied by or for any taxing district which did not include the territory in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment on the effective date of this ordinance, but to which the territory has been annexed or otherwise included after the effective date, the assessment roll applicable to property in the annexed territory as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the effective date of the ordinance which amends the plan for the Urban Renewal Area Amendment to include the annexed area, shall be used in determining the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the annexed area.

that portion of the taxes each year in excess of such amounts shall be allocated to (b) and when collected be paid into a special fund of the County to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1), of the Code of Iowa, incurred by the County to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area, and to provide assistance for low and moderate-income family housing as provided in Section 403.22, except that taxes for the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 298.2 of the Code of Iowa, to the extent authorized in Section 403.19 (2) of the Code of Iowa, taxes for the instructional support program levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 257.19 of the Code of Iowa, to the extent authorized in Section 403.19(2) of the Code of Iowa, and taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the taxing district without limitation by the provisions of this ordinance. Unless and until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in such area as shown by the assessment roll referred to in subsection (a) of this section, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for said taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes. When such loans, advances, indebtedness, and bonds, if any, and interest thereon, have been paid, all money thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Amendment shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.

(c) the portion of taxes mentioned in subsection (b) of this section and the special fund into which that portion shall be paid may be irrevocably pledged by the County for the payment of the principal and interest on loans, advances, bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1) of the Code of Iowa, or indebtedness incurred by the County to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area.

(d) as used in this section, the word "taxes" includes, but is not limited to, all levies on an ad valorem basis upon land or real property.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Saving Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.

We are continuing to move forward and working on the draft plans for Hornick and Correctionville.

In March, we talked via phone with the officials in Correctionville in an effort to try and get some additional community input there. They determined that they would identify approx. 25 community members that we could do phone interviews with in early April. We are waiting on that list from the City but want to finish that up so that we can work toward a prioritization meeting in late April or early May.

Since our last update, we were able to meet for the kickoff meeting with the Sloan staff, Mayor and Council member. We are set to hold a meeting with their Planning and Zoning Commission as well as conducting their public visioning session on the 18th of April.

We also made some initial contacts and work on behalf of the City of Hornick for a potential Hazard Mitigation Grant for relief from flooding. The City is currently considering their options currently and if they want to move forward we have indicated that we could assist them in that process. I&S Group has also been of help with that process. The first step here, should they want to proceed, will be to do an update to the County Hazard Mitigation Plan. We are going to add an objective to update the Hazard Mitigation Plan to the City's Comprehensive Plan, as the current plan does not have sufficient specific projects to address the needs that the City has.

The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors agreed to pay for one half of rural Woodbury County communities' membership dues to SIMPCO for FY 2017 (July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017). The goal of the partnership is for rural Woodbury County communities to utilize the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council (SIMPCO) in providing tools, research, technical assistance and regional collaboration to help grow community and economic development project across Woodbury County.

In the spring of 2016, SIMPCO staff visited 14 rural Woodbury County communities and secured SIMPCO membership with eight towns. The member communities include: Bronson, Danbury, Hornick, Lawton, Oto, Salix, Smithland and Sergeant Bluff. At the end of the 3rd quarter, SIMPCO had been in contact with all eight communities, assisting with various projects, research, grant assistance and data collection. Information in this report demonstrates project(s)/information requested, total time, and estimated value of services offered directly to each of the communities as well as the indirect value of SIMPCO membership and regional collaboration.

During the 3rd quarter, SIMPCO spent approximately 52 direct hours which equals an estimated value of nearly \$3,536 assisting member communities in Woodbury County. Indirect time working on projects, committees, outreach that indirectly benefits Woodbury County communities is estimated at 74 hours or an estimated value of \$5,032. The net benefit of SIMPCO membership for rural Woodbury County communities in the second quarter is equaled \$8,568.

Second Quarter Notes:

- While we try to reach out to all the Woodbury County Communities, however, not all need SIMPCO's assistance every quarter. We also recognize that the communities have begun the process to update the Comprehensive Plans with Simmering-Cory and thus may not be ready to implement community plans or grant applications until that process is complete
- SIMPCO continues to work with the city of Lawton on the Regional Nutrition and Physical Activities grant (\$10,000) through the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) and Iowa Association of Regional Councils (IARC). SIMPCO is partnering with Siouxland District Health Department on the project to implement a physical activity and nutrition project for the community. Sidewalk construction will begin this spring.
- Unlike the other rural Woodbury County communities, Sergeant Bluff is part of the SIMPCO Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the urban area of Sioux City. MPO work may



not be specifically directed to Sergeant Bluff but pertains to metropolitan transportation planning as a whole and Sergeant Bluff's placement in the MPO. Twenty percent of MPO funds are from MPO members' dues used as local match to complete the necessary work required to ensure federal transportation funds continue to flow into the metropolitan region. In the third quarter SIMPCO Staff developed the draft FY 2018 Transportation Planning Work Program and the FY 2018 – 2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Both of these documents are required for Federal transportation funds to flow to the metropolitan area.

- As part of the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and Siouxland Regional Transportation Planning Association (SRTPA), SIMPCO solicited projects from both the Sioux City metropolitan area and rural planning area for the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) program. Both Sergeant Bluff and Woodbury County were awarded funds through this program for FY 2021. Sergeant Bluff was awarded \$1,400,000 for the 1st Street Project from the MPO. Woodbury County was awarded \$707,900 for the Port Neal Project from the MPO and \$1,200,000 for K64 from the SRTPA
- Woodbury County communities received the following electronic newsletters and information sent out by SIMPCO:
 - o January Grant Blast Information on current grants and upcoming events
 - *February Newsletter* Updates on projects, grant information and upcoming events
 - o March Updates Updates on grants and upcoming events/workshops/trainings
- SIMPCO staff sits on the Mid-states Community and Economic Development Conference Planning Committee. This conference took place in April 2017 (4th quarter). The conference is one of the largest rural development events in the three state regions and is a joint project of several agencies and organizations in Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota. It is designed for local leaders and offers workshops on strategies and ideas for rural development. Woodbury County communities were encouraged to attend the event.
- SIMPCO staff provided assistance to Danbury with the DNR Land and Water Conservation Fund grant application.
- During the 3rd quarter SIMPCO staff continued to work with the Clerks in Oto and Smithland on budget preparations and submittal.
- On March 14 we met with Lawton's City Clerk and Mayor to discuss possible projects and priorities for the community.
- A summary of SIMPCO services were provided at the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors Town Hall Meeting at the end of March in Correctionville. As a follow-up to the meeting, staff researched the U.S Economic Development Administration's Planning Program and Local Technical Assistance Program. This grant program could fund up to 50% of a planning study that would examine Economic Development and Marketing for communities along U.S. Highway 20.
- SIMPCO continued to hold the Regional Policy and Legislative Committee meetings monthly during the 3rd quarter. Staff is preparing to attend the Siouxland Chamber trip to Washington DC the first week of May. Several key programs to Iowa's rural communities are being proposed to

be cut in President Trump's Budget Blueprint including elimination of the U.S. Economic Development Administration, Community Development Block Grants and the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program.

- On March 9th, Skip Meisner provided a Missouri River Workshop. Skip provided an overview of past and current issues facing the management of the Missouri River. This workshop event was open to all SIMPCO Board members.
- Time was spent on the Siouxland Regional Transportation Planning Association (SRTPA RPA 4) during the 3rd Quarter including updating the public participation plan, administering Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) amendments (one in Woodbury County) and the development of the FY 2018 Transportation Planning Work Program (TPWP) and the FY 2018-2021 TIP.
- SIMPCO staff continues to administer the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). The group held their regularly scheduled meeting in early February. The group continues to work on the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grants which includes funding for planning exercises and training. In addition, Staff dedicated time to the 2019 County Hazard Mitigation Grant Program application process.
- SIMPCO continued to work with Siouxland District Health Department on the Partnership to Improve Community Health (PICH) project. This project focuses on Safe Routes to School and Complete Street (bicycle/pedestrian) projects in the communities of Lawton-Bronson, Sergeant Bluff, Moville (non-member), and Sloan (non-member).
- SIMPCO staff is currently working on establishing a pavement management analysis program which would allow the county and communities within the county to measure pavement condition.
- SIMPCO leads or participates in several groups and committees that benefit Woodbury County rural communities through regional cooperation. During the second quarter, SIMPCO lead or participated in the following committees/boards/organizations/groups:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Dale Frank, Jean Frank and Christine Foster previously filed a 5 lot subdivision application for Whiskey Acres Addition. Their goal being to have their adjacent parcels subdivided to provide additional residential development opportunities. Final plat approval occurred on May 9, 2017.

The proposed lots are currently zoned AP (Agricultural Preservation). AP zoning limits residential density to two dwellings per quarter-quarter. As such the AP zoning does not allow for the potential residential density afforded by the subdivision. Re-zoning of the lots to AE (Agricultural Estates) is requested to allow building permit issuance for the planned residential development on the 3 undeveloped lots; and to allow the two existing dwellings to retain "legal conforming structure" status.

On April 24, 2017 the Zoning Commission held a public hearing voting to recommend AP to AE re-zoning approval. Staff concurs with the Commission recommendation.

1.) Change Order #1- Trosper Hoyt Steam Trap Replacement and Repair

2.) Change Order #2- Addition of Courthouse Steam Trap Isolation Valves (45 Units) and Steam Pipe replacement.

BACKGROUND:

1.) Change Order #1-

Trosper Hoyt Steam Traps recently identified in drawings (by contract) with Resource Consulting Engineers have been found to be in similar condition as those that were in need of repair at the Courthouse. It is advisable that these repairs be executed at the Trosper-Hoyt Building as a change order to the Courthouse Steam Trap Project. The replacement and/or servicing of each unit will provide improved energy savings and functionality.

2.) Change Order #2-

Addition of Courthouse Steam Trap Isolation Valves (45 Units) and Steam Pipe replacement. The addition or replacement of shut off valves was necessary to isolate steam traps being serviced. Many areas did not have valves for this purpose, or in other instances valves that failed to seal required replacement to repair the steam traps. System Steam Pipe replacement was also necessary in some areas. Both of these repair types had been anticipated and discussed prior to beginning the project.

Woodbury County has submitted a successful application for a Hungry Canyons Alliance Grant to assist with construction of the replacement for structure number Q10 on 220th Street.

PROJECT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this <u>5th</u> day of <u>May</u>, 2017, by and between <u>Woodbury County</u>, called the Sponsor, and the Hungry Canyons Alliance, hereafter known as HCA.

WITNESSED THAT:

WHEREAS, under the provision of Chapter 161D, Code of Iowa, the Hungry Canyons Alliance is authorized to assist the Sponsor in measures related to the unique natural resources, rural development and infrastructure problems of counties in the deep loess soil region of western lowa.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of several promises to be faithfully performed by the parties hereto as set forth, the Sponsor and Hungry Canyons Alliance do hereby agree as follows:

A. It is agreed that the following described work is to be performed at a total estimated cost of <u>\$438,000</u>. This amount includes survey, engineering, construction, inspection, and administration of:

Construction of stream channel stabilization structure(s) as proposed in the project application(s) labeled Attachment C to this agreement.

- B. THE SPONSOR WILL:
 - 1. Contract for and complete construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
 - Accept responsibility for land and water rights acquisition, survey, design, construction inspection, contract administration, and cost above that provided in C.1. for construction of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The Sponsor's share will constitute a minimum of 20% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
 - 3. Accept all financial and other responsibility for excess costs resulting from their failure to obtain or their delay in obtaining adequate land and water rights, permits, and licenses needed for the work described in Attachment C.

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- 4. Accept responsibility for the operation, maintenance and repairs of the structure unless it is determined by HCA and the Sponsor that the cost of repair exceeds the learned benefits of the repaired structure.
- 5. Hold and save the HCA free from any and all claims or causes of action whatsoever resulting from the obligations undertaken by the Sponsor under this agreement or resulting from work provided for in this agreement.
- 6. Accept responsibility for performing and keeping records regarding the operation and maintenance of works described in Attachment C and provide necessary facilities, administrative and bookkeeping personnel, and legal counsel for the provision of financial and technical assistance to support installation of grade stabilization measures as described in Attachment C.
- 7. Prepare a design, construction plans, and construction specifications in accordance with standard engineering principles. The design, construction plans, and construction specifications shall be reviewed and approved by a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa.
- 8. Ensure that all contracts for design and construction services will be procured in accordance with procedures prescribed in the Code of Iowa applicable to the Sponsor.
- 9. Ensure that any special requirements for compliance with environmental and/or cultural resource laws are incorporated into the project.
- 10. Retain all records pertaining to all work performed in Attachment C for three (3) years from the date of the submission of the final request for reimbursement or until final audit findings have been resolved, whichever is longer.
- 11. Require that a professional engineer registered in the State of Iowa certify that the project was installed in accordance with the plans and specifications.
- 12. Request reimbursement from the HCA by submitting a Request for Reimbursement form.
- 13. Administer their action under this agreement in accordance with 7 CFR 3015, CFR 3016, CFR 3017, CFR 3018, CFR 3052, and OMB Circulars A-102, A-87, and A-133.
- 14. Comply with the requirements of Attachment A and Attachment B SPECIAL PROVISIONS which are made a part of this agreement. Attachment A describes Drug Free Workplace and Clean Air and Water requirements. Attachment B describes equal opportunity and nondiscrimination requirements.
- 15. Comply with Hungry Canyons Cost-Share Program Administrative Procedures labeled Attachment D to this agreement.
- 16. Issue Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 1099 G, Statement for Recipients of Government Payments to the participant and to IRS as required by IRS regulations.

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C. HCA WILL:

- 1. Provide a maximum of <u>\$67,687</u> for total construction costs of the works of improvement described in Attachment C. The HCA share will constitute a maximum of 80% of the total cost of the works of improvement described in Attachment C.
- 2. Provide advice and counsel as needed with the technical and contractual administration of this agreement at the request of the Sponsor.
- 3. Upon notification of the completion of construction, HCA shall promptly review the performance of Sponsor to determine if it has met the requirements of this agreement and fund expenditures as agreed.
- 4. Pay the Sponsor pursuant to this agreement with request submitted on HCA Request for Reimbursement form.

D. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

- 1. All work under this agreement will be completed by <u>December 31, 2018</u>.
- 2. This agreement shall be effective on the date appearing in the first paragraph and shall continue in effect until the purpose of the agreement has been fulfilled or until the agreement expires on the date set forth in D.1.
- 3. Failure to properly design or construct a project receiving HCA funding will result in 10% of the final reimbursement being withheld and no approval of further county projects for HCA funding until the project has been fixed to accepted standards. All counties are encouraged to contact and work closely with the HCA project director to avoid this situation. All counties are to use the HCA weir design and construction checklist to help assure a good final product.
- 4. The furnishing of financial and other assistance by the HCA is contingent on the availability of funds appropriated by State Legislature from which payment may be made and shall not obligate the HCA upon failure of the Congress to appropriate funds.
- 5. HCA may terminate this agreement in whole or in part when it is determined by HCA that the Sponsor has failed to comply with any of the conditions of this agreement. The HCA shall promptly notify the Sponsor in writing of the determination and reasons for the termination, together with the effective date. Payments or recoveries made by HCA under this termination shall be in accord with the legal rights and liabilities of HCA and the Sponsor.
- 6. This agreement may be temporarily suspended by HCA if it determines that corrective action by the Sponsor is needed to meet the provisions of this agreement. Further, HCA may suspend this agreement when it is evident that a termination is pending.
- 7. The terms and conditions of this agreement are subject to modification by amendment agreed to in writing by both HCA and the Sponsor.

- 8. If any part of this agreement is found to be void and unenforceable, then the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in effect.

- 11. The program or activities conducted under this agreement will be in compliance with the nondiscrimination provisions as contained in Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (Public Law 100-259); and other nondiscrimination statutes: namely, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. 

BRS-CO97(112)—60-97, D25 Bridge over Whiskey Creek on Old Highway 141 west of Bronson. Letting date: April 18, 2017. The bridge replacement project is a federal aid funded project with 80% federal - 20% farm to market fund dollars paying the cost of construction. The bridge is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season. A new, 30' wide continuous concrete slab structure will replace the existing bridge. This project will result in Old Highway 141 being closed with traffic detoured for much of the summer. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

FM-CO97(131)—**55-97,** HMA resurfacing of County Route L37, Danbury Blacktop, from D38 to Highway 20. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. This project will do cold in-place recycling of the existing pavement followed by a 2 ½ to 3-inch hot mix asphalt overlay on top of the recycled pavement. This project will be constructed in 2017. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

BROS-CO97(129)—**55-97,** Replacement of Bridge L275 on Union Avenue. Letting Date: April 18, 2017 at the Iowa DOT. The bridge is programmed for replacement with 80% federal aid bridge replacement funds, 20% farm to market funds. This project will be constructed in 2017. County Bridge L275 is on Union Avenue between 190th and 200th Streets. Summer 2016 inspection of the structure has determined that severe deterioration to the piling in the north pier required that the bridge be closed as it is no longer safe to carry traffic. The bridge had been posted 10 tons prior to its closure. The bridge has been closed through the winter of 2016-2017 and will remain so for much of 2017 the new structure is completed. The letting results are being reviewed by Iowa DOT. Board award is pending Iowa DOT recommendation.

L-B(W107)—**73-97**, Replacement of Bridge W107 on 330^{th} Street west of Danbury. Letting date: May 16, 2017. This bridge is programmed for replacement during FY 2017 with special project levy funds. County bridge W107 is on 330^{th} Street between Michigan and O'Brien Avenues. The existing bridge is posted 3 tons and subject to monthly inspection due to the condition of the bridge caps on the abutments. The new bridge will be a 80' x 30' Single Span Precast Concrete Beam Bridge.

Under Contract:

L-C(M208)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Pocahontas Avenue between 270th and 280th Streets. Letting date: January 24, 2017. Late Start Date: April 15, 2017. Contractor: Midwest Contracting. Bid price: \$127,399. The existing bridge has been posted for restricted loads due to deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has received Corps of Engineer approval and permitting. The Board has awarded the bid to Midwest Contracting at the March 10, 2017 meeting.

The old bridge has been removed and all precast sections have been put in place. The road is backfilled. Gravel will be placed on the road Friday and the road will open by this weekend.

L-B(D38)—73-97, Bridge replacement on 120th Street between Emmett and Fayette Avenues. Letting date: October 11, 2016. Late Start Date: April 15, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$397,114.00. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund.

A preconstruction meeting was held with the prime contractor on November 18th. The contractor started work the week of November 21, 2016. The bridge deck was poured Monday, April 17 and the deck is currently curing. The project is scheduled to be completed in the 2017 construction season.

L-B(X14)—**73-97**, Bridge on 280th Street north of Danbury. Letting date: April 5, 2016. Late Start Date: August 1, 2016. Contractor: Graves Construction. Bid price: \$490,806.48. This is a locally funded project from the \$1.3 million special projects levy paying the cost of construction.

The contractor has moved on site and started work. Substructure work is complete and the bridge deck was poured Monday, March 27th. The deck is now cured and the bridge rail has been poured. The contractor is working on backfilling the road at both abutments. Channel work remains, but will be done after the road has reopened to traffic. The project is expected to be complete by June 2017.

L-B(L212)—73-97, Bridge replacement on Story Avenue between 190th and 200th Streets. Letting date: July 26, 2016. Late Start Date: September 26, 2016. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid price: \$238,096.50. The existing bridge is posted to a maximum 20 gross load and is in deteriorating condition. This is a locally funded project paid from the secondary road fund. A box culvert has been designed to replace the existing bridge and has been submitted for Corps of Engineer approval and permitting.

The board approved the contract at the August 16th board meeting. A preconstruction meeting was held with the contractor on November 18th. Work on the project started in December. All concrete work is completed and the box culvert is finished. Backfilling around the culvert has started and is expected to be completed next week. We expect the road to open either the first or second week of May.

FM-CO97(126)—**55-97**, HMA resurfacing of County Route D22, Old Highway 20. Letting date: September 20, 2016. Contractor: Knife River Midwest. Bid price: \$2,060,532.31. The project has been let by the Iowa DOT and we are awaiting bid tabulations and an award recommendation from the Iowa DOT Office of Contracts. The project will overlay the existing pavement on county road D22 from the intersection of K49 northeast of Lawton to approximately one half mile east of Buchanan Avenue. Some cross-road culverts will also be replaced as part of the project work. The project will be paid for with county farm to market funds. A preconstruction meeting was held last week. Construction has started. Culvert replacements are underway. There will be periodic closures on the road during culvert construction at several sites along the road. Paving is scheduled for early May with project completion by the end of May.

Work Under Design:

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting sometime during 2017.

250th Street Grading Project - 2.25-mile grade for paving project south of Anthon. Right of way will be necessary to allow construction of this road. Final design is underway. Once design is complete, there will be a preliminary rollout of the design with affected landowners. Platting and right of way acquisition will follow the rollout. We are working toward a summer 2017 letting. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

Bridge Q10 - Design work is underway to replace an aging greenwood structure on 220^{th} street west of Bronson. The existing bridge will be replaced with a large box culvert. A summer 2017 letting is planned. This project is funded with special project levy funds.

280th Street Intersection relocation – Design work is nearing completion on the relocation of the intersection of 280th Street and Old Highway 141. The existing intersection has restricted sight distance to the north and is a hazardous site for farm traffic entering higher speed traffic on Old Highway 141. This project is being done in cooperation with a local landowner who is donating the right of way for the new intersection. A letting is planned for the summer of 2017 with work to be completed before November 2017.

Bridge L1 - This structure is on Old Highway 20 near Cushing. The project involves the replacement of an existing short span bridge with a concrete box culvert. The current bridge is restricted to less than legal loads. This project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

Bridge D156 – This structure is on Franklin Avenue north of Old Highway 20/150th Street. The structure is posted 8 tons. The existing structure is significantly oversized and built from salvaged materials. The replacement structure is proposed to be a large culvert. This project is funded with money received in the local budget from the new \$0.10 state fuel tax. The project is scheduled for 2017 construction.

OTHER PROJECTS:

COUNTY BRIDGE B82

County Bridge B82 is on 140th Street between Kossuth and Lee Avenues. It was one of the flood damaged structures from the June 18, 2016 flood event. Initially, we were going to try to replace the east abutment bridge piling to reopen the bridge this fall, but since it would remain a posted bridge and it is scheduled for replacement in the 2017 construction season, we will be moving it forward in our design schedule to replace it in whole, hopefully with a winter 2016-2017 letting. The result is that the bridge will be closed through the winter of 2016-2017.

ORTON SLOUGH DRAINAGE DISTRICT

Work on the Orton Slough Ditch cleanout was let to contract by the Board of Supervisors on behalf of the drainage district in late 2016. The work is being done by L.A. Carlson Construction. Ditch cleaning and shaping work is complete. Seeding of the disturbed areas and final clean-up of the site is underway and has been delayed by weather. Weather permitting, work should be completed next week.

HASKELL AVENUE BRIDGE

The Board has determined that the Haskell Avenue bridge will not be closed. The replacement project will be added to the FY 2019 construction program and it will be let to contract

sometime after July 2018. Other projects will be delayed to free funding for this bridge replacement. The projects to be delayed have not yet been determined.

220th STREET EAST OF OLD LAKEPORT ROAD

The Board had a public information meeting with residents of 220th Street on April 25, 2017. They heard comments from landowners bordering the road. The board will reach a decision on the type of improvements for 220th Street at their May 9, 2017 meeting.
