





Shane and Dennis:

I wanted to send you an e-mail summation from the other day in order to follow-up. As you know, I was not able to make the meeting as it was my first day back after being gone 15 days after National Guard training; otherwise, I would have been there, and thanks for understanding.

In retrospect of the agenda, I was curious as to the Sioux Rivers Region continuation of funding for an MOU between the Sioux City Community School District, the Sanford Center, and Sioux Rivers. This is a significant amount of funding during a time that we know expenses are tight, especially as we look to exercise our fiduciary responsibility with a lower-than-normal-tax levy. From appearances, it looks like characterizing this as an ongoing expense is appropriate.

During my short tenure on the Region—and previous 2 years on the Board of Supervisors I have often heard concerns related to whether or not the mental health levy was being used for its intended purpose, a good litmus test. Toward that end, I have the following questions:

- 1) What is the historic precedence for funding 5 FTEs for the Sanford Center from the mental health levy of county taxes (either Woodbury singularly, or Sioux Rivers as a region)?
- 2) What role do the outreach specialist have in addressing mental health issues, and how does this comport with the intended levy's usage? What is their educational background/role in being able to address this?
- We heard in arguments concerning funding mental health placement coordinator from juvenile detention, that juveniles were not necessarily to be serviced by the MH levy but that this was a qualified exception. On what basis, and if so, do outreach specialists again assist in this area?
- 4) What mechanisms are in place to ensure services are being rendered as a Region in the way that the Legislature originally intended for this levy to be used?

I am including my fellow Region members in on this e-mail, and I plan to use this as an opportunity to inform the rest of my Board of Supervisors just that I have raised these concerns via an informal agenda item. Shane, you assured me that you would follow-up on some of these questions and because of our good working relationship, I have no doubt that will be the case.

As always to my colleagues, please do not "Reply All" to this e-mail to keep us out of dicey Chapter 21 waters: I merely wanted to inform you as Region members of the concern and hope that we might address it on the next agenda with information that you, Shane and Dennis, can provide.

In 2001, Sioux City Community School District was awarded federal grant funds for "Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative". The grant funds expired and the Sioux Rivers Regional Mental Health and Disabilities Services has annually provided funds for the continuation of the programming related to the mental health components that were contained within the grant.

The services provided through the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are 5 Outreach Specialists provided to Sioux City Community School District from the Sanford Center and a maximum of 85 hours per week of therapy services provided to the Sioux City Community School District by Siouxland Mental Health.

The total cost of the services provided through the MOU is \$480,600. Of the total cost, the Sioux City Community School District agrees to pay \$30,000 and the Sioux Rivers Regional Mental Health and Disabilities Services agrees to pay \$450,600.

Provide Safe, Healthy and Supportive Learning Environments

Addressing mental health issues and supporting students with mental health issues allows students to be more successful in school.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING MENTAL HEALTH COMPONENTS OF SAFE SCHOOLS/HEALTHY STUDENTS INITIATIVE

SIOUX RIVERS REGIONAL MENTAL HEALTH AND DISABILITIES SERVICES and SIOUX CITY COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT

This **Memorandum of Understanding** between the Sioux Rivers Regional Mental Health and Disabilities Services (Region) and the Sioux City Community School District shall serve to provide identification and clarification of specific responsibilities between the parties involved for performance and funding of programming related to activities identified as a continuation of the mental health components of the **Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative** undertaken by the Sioux City Community School District originating in 2001 with federal grant funds.

Under the terms and scope of this **Memorandum of Understanding**, the Sioux City Community School District agrees to serve as program administrator and fiscal agent for Region funds dedicated to and awarded under this effort.

The period of performance for programming contained within this agreement shall be effective from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. Funding continuation and levels of funding after expiration of the agreement shall be reviewed by the Sioux City Community School District and the Region. Availability of funding and satisfactory performance by the School District and any/all subcontractors will be reviewed throughout the term of the agreement and taken into consideration for program continuation.

In accordance with the provisions of this funding agreement, the Sioux City Community School District agrees to the following:

- To dedicate \$30,000 from Sioux City Community School District funds to support efforts;
- To continue mental health service components of the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative as specified in the original grant application;
- To assure receipt of documentation filed on a monthly basis, necessary to support expenditures.
 No costs will be reimbursed outside the scope or timeframe of the grant, nor without the proper documentation.
- To provide the Region with appropriate and timely documentation, statistics and other related program progress and evaluation reports as designated in the original grant conditions and contract. At a minimum, throughout the term of the grant, these requirements will be reported on a quarterly basis and will include program and financial quarterly information.

Funds awarded under this agreement through the Region are at the discretion/review of said office. Any questions regarding allowable expenditures shall be clarified and/or determined as eligible through the Region.

In the application and administration of the contract involved, ALL PARTIES FURTHER AGREE to mediation if matters of unresolved dispute arise. All parties agree to resolve their differences through a process of mediation with a mutually agreed upon mediator and process.

ASSURANCES

A. PROCUREMENT OF EQUIPMENT

Any equipment purchase with Region funds shall be the property of the Region regardless of location or possession. If programs are continued beyond the grant period, the Region shall review remaining equipment for determination of distribution and use.

The Region expects that Subgrantees will follow competitive bid processes and procure such special equipment being purchased in whole or in part with funds by methods, which results in the lowest price of goods of the kinds or type required by that method, in accordance with County practices. Equipment is defined as costs that equal or exceeds \$1,000 and has a durable, useful life greater than one year.

B. REPORTS

All Subgrantees shall submit quarterly financial reports and quarterly progress reports indicating activities undertaken, expenditures, and general progress of the project for which the Subgrant was awarded. In addition to the above reports, final annual reports will be required. This data will verify the impact, success or failure of the project and a statement as to the effectiveness of the project. These reports will be used to file federal and community reports.

C. AMENDMENTS TO THE AGREEMENT

The Region reserves the right to modify this agreement at any time.

All modifications or amendments of the agreement shall be in writing and approved by the Region and the Sioux City Community School District prior to implementation.

D. COST OF PROPOSAL

The Region is not responsible for any costs incurred by the Sioux City Community School District related to other activities carried out by a sub grantee or Sioux City Community School District personnel outside the scope and definition of the budgetary parameters specified within as Attachments.

E. PUBLIC RECORDS

All report information submitted by an applicant will be treated as a public record by the Sioux City Community School District and the Region unless the information may be treated as confidential pursuant to applicable laws. Public records will be copied as necessary to comply with Iowa's public record law. This does not apply to specific program evaluation requirements and rights of privacy.

F. CONFIDENTIALITY AND PARTICIPANT PROTECTION

Applicants and Subgrantees are expected to develop and implement appropriate procedures to address confidentiality and other ethical issues pertinent to the protection of participants in proposed projects. Treatment for mental illness must maintain confidentiality in accordance with professional standards of practice and applicable law.

If applicable, project staff must meet State and local licensure, and professional accreditation standards in addition to normal professional standards of care and practice. The Project Directors and Evaluators will have direct and continuing responsibility to ensure that participant protection is adequate.

Notwithstanding any of the above, the all Sub grantees agree to not disclose or otherwise release any personally identifying information, such as, but not limited to: names, social security number, or addresses of any individuals associated with services received pursuant to the grant and/or obtained while performing duties pursuant to the grant, to any third party without first obtaining the appropriate consent of the individual(s) concerned.

CERTIFICATION AND ASSURANCE



ELEVENTH MEETING OF THE WOODBURY COUNTY POLICY REVIEW COMMITTEE

Approved by consensus.

IV. New Business

Ung welcomed everyone to the policy review committee meeting

A. Standard Format for County Policies

Gill, utilizing Blackhawk County as an example, recommended a template to use as a standard format for future County policies. Gill justified the need for a simple, precise and searchable format allowing easy accessibility for public request for contact copies. Jennings commented his personal preference would be to change the order of revise and approval date under the signature line. Skaff noted the Department of Justice requirement is signature and date adopted. Ung questioned whether headings should be in roman numerals, alphabetical, or numerical. Gill advised numerical. Motion by Ung, second by Gilliland, to approve policy template with the revision to change the order of revise and approval date under signature line. Passed 5-0.

B. Original Contracts (2nd review of new policy)

Jennings inquired whether there was already a policy regarding contract storage. Gill recalled only a 2015 memo, but no policy in place.

The committee discussed to to what extent other departments bear responsibility to upload onto their website. Ung affirmed if a contract is not approved by the Board, the approving department shall abide by posting to some sort of website. Gill/Jennings will start conversation via email with other departments to discover what other types of contracts are posted and come to an agreement. Gill recommended posting of contracts to avoid lost pages that may be missed later. Motion by Ung, second by Jennings, to recommend the Board approve the policy on original contracts. Passed 5-0.

Gill/Jennings plan to present to the Board within three weeks.

C. 1st Review and Comparison to 2016 Handbook of Existing Policies Dated 1981-1989

Ung opened discussion to compare employee handbook to old policy book, a subject Gill has brought to the committee. Ung had directed Karen James, Board Administrative Assistant, to maintain County policy book. James worked with the old policy book and to remove resolutions that shouldn't be in there, as well as creating separate binders—one for policies, and one for procedures and memos. Ung noted three of the four policies on the agenda appear repeated in the employee handbook. Ung questioned whether these outdated policies should be removed from the policy book by the board due to redundancy, or if there is any sense to keep or revise some. The committee noted that some of the policies below were undated or unsigned, and were known to passed by the full board at any time.

i. Policy on access to information shared on central computer (date unknown)

Gilliland noted that at the time this policy was written, technology and internet was not to the extent as it is today. Jennings advised policy be in conjunction with County policy of storage of information. Committee discussed timeline of stored information, noting a policy on document retention should come before this policy is brought back or revised. Jennings expressed his belief that more storage is needed; the current capacity retains information for 7 years. Committee would like to continue discussion at a later date and to invite others for input,

including Mark Nahra and John Malloy, regarding topics like additional storage needs. **No formal** action is recommended to the Board. This policy is undated, unsigned, and without record of ever being approved by the board, so it is declared outdated and removed from county policies.

ii. Policy regarding termination of employment with Woodbury County

Gilliland pointed out the current employee Handbook (pg. 74) covers termination of employment.

iii. Reemployment Policy

Gilliland noted lowa is an at-will state--employees and employers can terminate employment without consequences. Jennings agreed employment termination should remain covered in handbook, rather than in this policy, because if they can be construed to conflict, the potential for lawsuits increases.

iv. Fire and emergency rescue service

Gilliland referred to current policy 7.7 in employee handbook.

Ung questioned the hierarchy of Handbook versus Policies. Jennings responded the last impacted is acknowledged as current, however if a conflict occurs between either, it creates a legal risk. Ung directed Human Resources for future endeavors to review these old policies for omission, conflict and contradiction with handbook and bring back to the committee only if found. Motion by Ung, second by Gill, to recommend the Board rescind the following outdated policies: Policy regarding termination of employment with Woodbury County; Reemployment Policy; Fire and emergency rescue service. Passed 5-0.

Gilliland will present action item July 11th, 2017.

V. Policy item requests for future

Ung reiterated the need to review other polices that could be updated and combined with handbook.

Jennings requested a review of the travel expense policy that requires employees to include an itemized receipt for travel reimbursement, noting that sometimes it is impossible to gather an itemized receipt, or an initialed statement is accepted in the case of a lost receipt. Skaff called attention to the fact that all claims are posted on agenda for Board or Elected official to approve. Ung recalled that the Board was presented claims with notation from the Auditor's Office on which claims the Auditor's Office flagged for policy violations. Gill admitted that notation has not been provided to the board since the claims are no longer physically brought to the board meetings, although board members are able to see them in the Auditor's Office. Ung requested the Auditor's Office immediately resume the practice of noting which claims are "flagged/those without proper receipts" by coordinating with the board secretary, as the claims are currently emailed to the board members. Gill agreed. Committee acknowledged this practice was to give the board proper notice so they can decide whether or not to make exceptions for claims in violation of policy.

Gilliland identified a need to push training on computer usage, citing recent cyber attacks. Ung agreed and will invite John Malloy to next committee meeting.

Radig inquired on who is given reimbursement for cell phone usage, other than elected officials. Gill responded only elected officials. Gill noted the IRS changed a rule, meaning that cell phone reimbursement is no longer taxed. Ung summed up conversation, noting that reimbursement is still a claim to be approved by Board.

Of the ten residents detained on June 26, 2017, five or fifty percent were identified as gang members. Of the five, one or twenty percent were identified as a hard-core member.

We are currently detaining four juveniles from the BIA and one from Thurston County.
