

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Plans have been completed and permits received for construction of a new bridge to replace existing bridge Q10 on 220th Street east of Bronson. A project letting is scheduled for August 22, 2017.

BACKGROUND:

The county programmed bridge Q10 for replacement in fiscal year 2017. The existing bridge is structurally deficient and functionally obsolete and has a restricted load posting.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This bridge is paid for with special project levy funds, the \$1.3 million levy for bridge and project work levied since 2014.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Courtroom #201 is the final Courtroom in need of window and structural repairs.

Courtrooms #203, #207, & #209 renovations discovered additional areas requiring attention.

These discoveries is some instances were unique to the particular Courtroom being repaired.

Courtroom #207 required the replacement of a deteriorated sill plate, and the repair of the window frame to building interior finish via an addition of trim pieces.

In Courtroom #209 the marble headers original construction differed in that the marble extended inward approximatly 1-1/4". This inward extension was due to the thickness of the materials used to adhere the marble to the structure metal beam. Current adhesives do not allow for a thickness depth of more than 1/4" and an of addition of metal plates welded in place were necessary to reduce this gap to achieve the proper marble clearance and materials adherence.

CMBA Architects have received costs for the final Courtroom from Bogenrief Studios for the stained glass repairs and Baker Group as general contractor. Repair increases from sub-contractors Haberl Tile & Stone and Denny Carlson combined with the additional repairs necessary and additional labor time attributed to the overall increase.



Candidates should arrive no later than 6:40 P.M. in order to acquaint themselves with seating and microphone usage. League of Women Voters of Sioux City members will arrive by 6:00 P.M. and will be available to greet and seat you at the podium. Water will be available at your seat. <u>No</u> candidate promotional or informational posters, handouts, etc. will be allowed! Both Cable One and YouTube live coverage is scheduled (see the attached Forum/Debate flyer) and the YouTube coverage will also be available after the event.

There will be two parts to the forum/debate: questions posed by our panelists from the LWVSC, MYC, & Greater Sioux City Press Club followed by questions posed from the audience. 
