FINANCIAL IMPACT: Fiscal impact to Woodbury County would be a tax increase of \$812,831, broken down as follows: Emergency Paramedic Services for rural cities & townships in the amount of \$288,365, plus \$524,466 to Sioux City paramedics. All the rural towns are at their maximum General Fund of \$8.10, with the exception of Danbury. The rural cities have no funds available for paramedic services. As for Sioux City's paramedics, the estimated cost is around \$1,000,000. By doing a county wide levy, the taxes collected for Sioux City's share would be rebated to Sioux City in the amount of \$524,466. This proposal would provide paramedic services to the rural cities and townships. Dear Supervisors:

We represent The Sioux City Community School District in the Counties of Woodbury and Plymouth, State of Iowa with regard to their purchase of the Public Museum Building located at 607 4th Street, Sioux City, Iowa. The property is owned by Museum Building Property, Inc., an entity set up by the City of Sioux City for tax reasons. As you may know, the City leased a portion of the Museum Building to Northwest Airlines, Inc. (subsequently Delta Airlines) pursuant to a long term lease which recently terminated and expired on October 31, 2017. According to the terms and provisions of the Northwest Airlines Lease, Northwest Airlines was to pay the property taxes during the term of its lease, since the building became taxable because of the lease. Now that the lease has expired, the School District desires to purchase the Museum Building for its Career Academy Classes and for other educational purposes relating to the Career Academy for the School District's students.

The City of Sioux City is represented by its City Attorney Nicole DuBois who is joining with me in this joint letter to the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors. We respectfully are seeking an abatement of the 2017-2018 real estate taxes for the second installment which covers the tax period of January 1, 2018 to June 30, 2018, the period of time that the property is no longer being leased for a profit, will be owned by The Sioux City Community School District, and the museum portion of the building will be leased to the City of Sioux City for \$1.00 on a long term lease. Because of the tax exempt status, we are requesting that the real estate taxes be abated for this period of January 1, 2018 to June 30, 2018. After that period of time, the Museum Building will be tax exempt under these circumstances as outlined.

Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be reseeded.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- 12. Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.

Subject: Law Enforcement Center Projects Assessment

An over-view of the LEC facility projects and components has been identified to establish a prioritized list of items that could lead to facility eventual improvement. The list provided below outlines these in limited detail. Associated costs are broad-based estimates similar to those which would be provided when estimating Capital Improvement Project allocations. Projects are listed in order of importance with the first Three commanding the most importance.

1. Air Handling Unit #1 (Estimate \$200,000)

AHU-1 is a main air handling unit that controls heating and cooling supply air to the first-floor office areas, and Judges Chambers. AHU one is original equipment and has reached what would be considered normal useful life expectancy. While this unit could not be replaced because of size, it could benefit from component replacement and some design configuration. Replacing existing squirrel-cage fan by sub-dividing compartment with two separate fans to increase air flow. Replace internal steam heating & water cooling coils increasing surface areas to address undersized velocity. Original plenum is of trident design and completed installation was less than desirable. Current configuration inhibits adequate or constant air distribution to each of the three main trunks being supplied. Motors and Variable Frequency Drives would also be replaced.

2. Staff Break Room, IT Equipment Closet (WCICC), Kitchen Dry- Food Goods Supply Storage Room Floor (Estimate \$40,000)

- a. Break Room 1st floor- Needed for Staff breaks. Could be located adjacent to dry food goods room (old conference room area).
- b. IT Equipment Closet- the existing IT closet is located in a first-floor electrical closet. Over the years equipment has been expanded and the current day result is inadequate space making it very difficult to meet code compliance in an area that was designed as an electrical room only.
- c. The current Kitchen dry-goods supply area should have outdated flooring (carpeting) replaced with tile flooring to afford proper and ease of cleaning.

3. Detention Areas Combi-Unit Valves, 1st Floor Skylights (Estimate \$50,000)

- a. Inmate Detention Combi-Units (Sink/ Toilet combination Units)- Current Metcraft Tempest-II flush valves are original equipment and repair parts are becoming obsolete. Failed valve parts are becoming a common problem and the valve bodies that retain the seats are becoming worn to the extent that replacement kits are not working well. A valve normally fails open causing continued water flow.
- b. Skylights located above the first-floor lobby are beginning to leak water into the interior space and will require reglazing.

4. Master Control Security Equipment Relocation, Detention Security System IT Room (Estimate \$225,000)

- a. Master Control security equipment is over-crowded causing internal space temperatures to elevate beyond the capacity of room design. A portable air conditioner has previously been installed in an attempt to reduce temperature demands however struggles to do so, and the scenario is detrimental to equipment life expectancies. The Security equipment does not need to be held within the Master Control area in fact experts have commented that equipment in this location is less than an ideal situation since it poses a control risk potential to exist in the event of an inmate breach.
- b. Detention Security System IT Equipment Room- Designed and built to accommodate Master Control Security Equipment. Housed outside of the detention area affording access to detention security equipment at all times, even during an inmate breach of the Master Control Area. Room design would include adequate space and proper air conditioning design to house equipment in a temperature controlled environment.

5. HVAC Controls & Valves (\$300,000)

HVAC Controls and Valves are outdated and will continue to fail at a greater rate.

RESOLUTION FOR REDUCED LEVEL OF MAINTENANCE TO AREA SERVICE "C" ROAD

Woodbury County Resolution No._____

WHEREAS, Woodbury County desires to classify certain roads on the area service system in the County to provide for a minimal level of maintenance and access by means of a gate or barrier; and

WHEREAS, the County, after consultation with the County Engineer, has the authority to specify certain roads within the County as Area Service "C" roads pursuant to Iowa Code Section 309.57; and

WHEREAS, the only persons who will have access rights to the roads shall be:

- (1) the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (2) the agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (3) any peace officer,
- (4) any magistrate,
- (5) any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road.
- (6) any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

WHEREAS, the minimal level of maintenance will be as follows:

- 1. Blading Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.
- 2. <u>Snow and Ice Removal</u>. Snow and ice will not be removed, nor will the road surface be sanded or salted on a regular basis.
- 3. <u>Signing</u>. Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. <u>ALL AREA SERVICE LEVEL C ROADS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED WITH A SIGN AT ALL POINTS OF ACCESS TO WARN THE PUBLIC OF THE LOWER LEVEL OF MAINTENANCE.</u>
- 4. <u>Weeds, Brush and Trees</u>. Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.
- 5. <u>Structures</u>. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.
- 6. <u>Road Surfacing</u>. There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service System C Roads on a regular basis.

- 7. Shoulders. Shoulders will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 8. Crown. A crown will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 9. Repairs. There will be no road repair on a regular basis.
- 10. <u>Uniform Width</u>. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.
- 11. Inspections. Regular inspections will not be conducted.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY that this County does hereby establish the road described as an Area Service "C" road, with restricted access and a minimal level of maintenance.

A portion of Pocahontas Avenue. from 300th Street to Liston Boulevard.

WHEREAS the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors finds that reserve peace officers are a vital part of the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office
WHEREAS Woodbury County is uniquely located on the border with two states, with populated areas on each side of the border
WHEREAS many adjoining counties do not offer reserve peace officer programs
WHEREAS residents of these counties have expressed interest in serving their community through a reserve peace officer program.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA:
SECTION 1 . The Woodbury County Sheriff's Office is authorized to waive the residency requirement for reserve police officers on a case by case basis, as defined in Iowa Admin, Code § 501-10.100(1).
SECTION 2 . All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
SECTION 3 . Should any section, phrase or provision of this ordinance be declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, that decision shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid or unconstitutional.
SECTION 4 . This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
