WOODBURY COUNTY SECONDARY ROAD DEPARTMENT PERMIT & AGREEMENT TO PERFORM WORK WITHIN WOODBURY COUNTY RIGHT OF WAY

Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and Cry of Sour (hereinafter referred to as property owner, organization or authorized representative) do hereby enter into the following permit and agreement:
1. Woodbury County hereby consents to and grants permission to the property owner, organization or authorized representative, to conduct the following described construction or activities within the right-of-way:
CLEAR DEBRIS BRUSH FROM DITCH ALONG CARROLL AVENUE
(*WESTSIDE) TO ALLOW FOR BETTER DRAINAGE.

2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:

- A. The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.
- B. The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.
- C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.
- D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.
- E. The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.

F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.
G. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will reseed and mulch the disturbed areas. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will be responsible for seed, mulch, and labor unless otherwise provided in section L.
H. The property owner, organization, or authorized representative hereby agrees to hold Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department, its employees and agents harmless against any and all claims for damages and personal injury arising out of work performed or actions taken by the applicant related to the construction or maintenance of the facility. The applicant further agrees to reimburse the County or the Department for any expenditures that the County or Department may have to make on said highway rights of way on account of said applicant's construction or maintenance activity or other activities or lack thereof. The applicant shall also save Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department harmless of any damage or losses that may be sustained by the traveling public on account of such construction, repair or maintenance operations, or other activities.
I. FAILURE TO CONFORM TO OR TO ACQUIRE A PERMIT IS A VIOLATION OF SECTION 318.8, 2009 CODE OF IOWA. This permit is subject to any laws now in effect or any laws that may be hereafter enacted and all applicable rules and regulations of local, state and federal agencies. This permit is subject to all the rules and regulations of Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department.
J. This permit is subject to revocation by the Department at any time and at no cost to the Department, when in the judgment of the Department it is necessary in the improvement or maintenance of the highway or for other reasonable cause.
K. All proposed work covered by this permit shall be at the applicant's expense. The applicant shall reimburse the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department for any materials removed from the highway right of way described as follows:

317.3 Weed commissioner -- standards for noxious weed control.

The board of supervisors of each county may annually appoint a county weed commissioner who may be a person otherwise employed by the county and who passes minimum standards established by the department of agriculture and land stewardship for noxious weed identification and the recognized methods for noxious weed control and elimination. The county weed commissioner's appointment shall be effective as of March 1 and shall continue for a term at the discretion of the board of supervisors unless the commissioner is removed from office as provided for by law. The county weed commissioner may, with the approval of the board of supervisors, require that commercial applicators and their appropriate employees pass the same standards for noxious weed identification as established by the department of agriculture and land stewardship. The name and address of the person appointed as county weed commissioner shall be certified to the county auditor and to the secretary of agriculture within ten days of the appointment. The board of supervisors shall fix the compensation of the county weed commissioner and deputies. In addition to compensation, the commissioner and deputies shall be paid their necessary travel expenses. At the discretion of the board of supervisors, the weed commissioner shall attend a seminar or school conducted or approved by the department of agriculture and land stewardship relating to the identification, control, and elimination of noxious weeds.

The board of supervisors shall prescribe the time of year the weed commissioner shall perform the powers and duties of county weed commissioner under this chapter which may be during that time of year when noxious weeds can effectively be killed. Compensation shall be for the period of actual work only although a weed commissioner assigned other duties not related to weed eradication may receive an annual salary. The board of supervisors shall likewise determine whether employment shall be by hour, day or month and the rate of pay for the employment time.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AREAS PROHIBITING THE USE OF COMPRESSION BRAKES OR BRAKING, ALSO KNOW AS "JAKE BRAKES" WITHIN WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA

(This ordinance repeals and replaces Ordinance Numbers 14 and 20.)

Be It Enacted by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors, Woodbury County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. PROHIBITION AND PENALTY

- A. Engine Brakes and Compression Brakes. It is unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to use or operate within the area described in Section B any engine brake, compression brake or mechanical exhaust device designed to aid in the braking or deceleration of any vehicle that results in excessive, loud, unusual or explosive noise from such vehicle, except in the case of an emergency.
- B. The prohibition above described shall be in effect for the following described roads and highways within Woodbury County, Iowa:
 - 1. U.S. Highway 20 beginning one half mile east of the intersection of U.S Highway 20 and Emmett Avenue and continuing to the intersection of U.S. Highway 20 and Eastland Avenue. This restriction shall apply to both westbound traffic and eastbound traffic in the designated area.
 - 2. County Route K49 (Easter Avenue) from 150th Street south to the City Limits of the City of Lawton, Woodbury County Iowa.
 - 3. U.S. Highway 20 beginning one half mile east of the intersection of U.S. Highway 20 and Humboldt Avenue to the intersection of U.S. Highway 20 and Iowa Highway 140/County Route K64 (Moville Blacktop). This restriction shall apply to both westbound traffic and eastbound traffic in the designated area.
 - 4. County Road D38 from the intersection of Old Lakeport Road east to the intersection of Elk Creek Road (north)/Buchanan Avenue (South). This restriction shall apply to both westbound traffic and eastbound traffic in the designated area.
 - 5. U. S. Highway 75 Bypass beginning at the U.S. Highway 20 interchange and continuing north to the 28th Street/Outer Drive interchange. This restriction shall apply to both northbound traffic and southbound traffic in the designated area in the rural portions of U.S. Highway 75 Bypass.
 - 6. U.S. Highway 20 from the intersection of Buchanan Avenue/Glen Ellen Road west to the U.S. 20/75 interchange. This restriction shall apply to both westbound traffic and eastbound traffic in the designated area.
 - 7. Iowa Highway 141 beginning at the intersection with Dillon Avenue and continuing west to the intersection of Iowa Highway 141 and County Route K45 (Old Highway 75). This restriction shall apply to both westbound traffic and eastbound traffic in the designated area.
 - 8. County Road K45, also known as Old Highway 75, beginning ¼ mile north of the north city limits of the city of Salix to a point ¼ mile south of Salix. The restriction shall apply to northbound and southbound traffic.
- C. Violation of this ordinance is a scheduled violation with a penalty of \$100.00.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. This includes current county ordinances Number 14 (enacted April 11, 2006) and Number 20 (enacted December 12, 2006), which are combined within this new ordinance.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law and when appropriate signage is erected and placed upon the areas described above to give notice of the ordinance.

Construction Project Report

To be let:

FM-CO97(136)—55-97, D38 HMA resurfacing project between Bronson and the Moville Blacktop. Letting date: March 19, 2019. Late start date: to be determined. The project involves cold in place recycling of existing pavement followed by an overlay of the pavement with new hot mix asphalt pavement. Work will be done in 2019.

FM-C)97(137)—55-97, K49 HMA resurfacing project between Plymouth County line and county route D12. Letting date: February 19, 2019. Late start date: to be determined. This project is being done in coordination with a Plymouth County project on the same county route. The project involves cold in place recycling of the existing pavement followed by an overlay of high performance asphalt surfacing. The high-performance surface provides a thinner overlay on top of the recycled pavement than standard hot mix asphalt. This is Woodbury County's first project using this material. Work will be done in 2019.

Under Contract:

L-B(U51)—73-97, 320th Street Bridge replacement. Letting date: October 30, 2018. Late start date: April 15, 2019. Contractor: Graves Construction, Spencer, IA. Contract price: \$475,343.66. Working days: 65. This bridge has been closed since 2014 due to a failed substructure piling.

The project will allow winter work at the contractor's option. We are awaiting a request for a preconstruction meeting from the contractor and expect him to move in within the next two weeks.

BROS-CO97(133)—55-97, Hancock Avenue Bridge replacement. Letting date: October 16, 2018 (IDOT Letting) Late start date: June 17, 2019. Working days: 85. Contractor: Dixon Construction. Bid Price: \$567,393.30. This project replaces an aging truss bridge on Hancock Avenue near the 200th Street intersection. The current bridge is posted 3 tons.

The project contract has been signed and approved by Iowa DOT. After the contractor requests a preconstruction meeting, we will know when the start date for construction will be. The project schedule allows winter work that may allow the bridge project to be completed earlier in 2019.

STP-S-CO97(134)—55-97, D50 PCC Resurfacing near Oto. Letting date: April 17, 2018. Late start date: July 23, 2018. Working days: 60. Contractor: Cedar Valley Corporation, Waterloo, IA. Contract price: \$2,354,844.71.

All mainline paving is complete. The bridge approaches on the Little Sioux River bridge have been poured and should be ready for traffic by Thursday. Shouldering is complete up to Morgan Trail with only the segment between Morgan Trail and Highway 31 remaining. The guardrail subcontractor is coming on Tuesday to install new guardrail on the river bridge east of Oto. The project should reopen to traffic Thursday, November 29 after pavement markings are applied.

BROS-CO97(132)—**55-97,** 150th Street Bridge replacement near Lawton. Letting date: June 19, 2018 (IDOT Letting). Late start date: May 1, 2019. Working days: 105. Contractor: Dixon Construction, Correctionville, IA. Contract price: \$1,019,550.42. This project replaced an aging truss bridge on 150th Street (Old Highway 20) north of Lawton.

The bridge removal is complete and channel excavation for the new bridge opening is almost completed. The contractor is going to drive east pier pile on the bridge this week. Work will continue as weather allows through the winter.

L-B(J9)—73-97, County Bridge J9 is on 170th Street between Jasper and Jewell Avenues. Letting date: August 21, 2018. Late start date: April 15, 2019. Contractor: Dixon Construction, Correctionville, IA. Contract price: \$544,821.40. This bridge was one of the flood damaged structures from the June 18, 2016 storm event. The bridge has been closed to traffic since it was damaged in the flood.

The contractor is replacing county road closed signs with new traffic control. Removal of the old bridge should begin this week. Work will continue through the winter as weather allows.

Work Under Design:

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting sometime during 2018 and 2019.

250th Street Grading Project - 2.25-mile grade for paving project south of Anthon. Right of way will be necessary to allow construction of this road. Final design is complete. Plats for right of way acquisition are complete and acquisition has started. We have been delayed in further right of way negotiations in cooperation with landowners who have been busy with fall harvest. We hope to resume right of way acquisition in December after harvest. We are working toward a winter 2018 letting. This project is funded with the \$1.3 million per year special project levy funds.

Bridge D156 – This structure is on Franklin Avenue north of Old Highway $20/150^{th}$ Street. The structure is posted 8 tons. The existing structure is significantly oversized and built from salvaged materials. The replacement structure is proposed to be a large culvert. This project is funded with money received in the local budget from the new \$0.10 state fuel tax. The project is scheduled for early 2019 construction.

Haskell Avenue Bridge C-160 - Design work and permitting are complete on the Haskell Avenue Bridge. The new bridge will be a single span 100' x 30.5' pretensioned, prestressed concrete beam bridge. Final plans are being prepared for a March 2019 letting.

Gravel crushing is underway at both the Railroad pit and the Briese pit. About 17,000 tons has been processed at the Railroad pit. The crusher at the Briese pit broke down last week and production is just starting for the contract quantity.

Mason Avenue Bridge:

The Mason Avenue bridge was severely damaged by flooding on the Little Sioux River in July 2018. The bridge has been closed to traffic due to damage caused by the bridge being struck by a large tree. The county engineer's office was notified Wednesday that FEMA has determined that the damage is eligible for repair/replacement assistance. The county road department is filing preliminary documentation requesting assistance from FEMA for assistance with eligible costs and will be having an applicant briefing on Tuesday, October 16th. Communication is open with FEMA at this time to replace the existing bridge. We expect that work to be completed in 2020 at this time.
