EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Delete the Haskell Avenue Bridge from the current list of projects, freeing up \$700,000 in estimated cost. Shifting \$500,000 to another bridge and \$200,000 to the Frontage Road project.

BACKGROUND:

Previously, the board had approved the Haskell Avenue Bridge project. A meeting was held in Moville on November 30th to discuss the priority for Moville. Frontage Road is currently a county road and we would like to turn it over to Moville.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Mostly a shifting of funds. Although there is a request to agree to county participation in the \$350,000 range for Frontage Road. So it was discussed to use \$75,000 from LOST funds from FY 2020 and FY 2021.
