WOODBURY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESOLUTION #<u>12,821</u> A RESOLUTION OPPOSING SENATE STUDY BILL 1045 AND SENATE FILE 184 PASSED BY THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the Transportation Committee in the Iowa Senate has passed House Study Bill 1045 (SF 184) which would amend and make changes to Iowa Code Chapter 321 related to transportation of indivisible loads and raw forestry products on primary and non-primary highways, and;

WHEREAS, Woodbury County owns and maintains nonprimary highways, and is fiscally and legally responsible for the nonprimary highways within the County, and;

WHEREAS, Woodbury County owns and maintains 300 structures classified as bridges by the National Bridge Inspection Standards, and;

WHEREAS, many of the bridges owned by Woodbury County are aging and structurally deficient or functionally obsolete, and;

WHEREAS, current funding is not adequate to replace or rehabilitate these bridges at the rate their conditions are deteriorating, and;

WHEREAS, the nonprimary roads and bridges owned by Woodbury County serve a critical need for residents, agricultural users, businesses, schools, post offices, and emergency responders, and;

WHEREAS, the proposed bill would allow the Iowa Department of Transportation to issue annual permits to forestry industry haulers for loads up to 130,000 pounds on nonprimary highways throughout Iowa, without knowledge of or notice given to the agencies which own these highways and the structures thereon, and;

WHEREAS, bridges within Woodbury County have been designed for loads that were legal on lowa roads at the time of their construction, and bridges have only been rated or posted with weight restrictions for loads that are currently legal on roads, and;

WHEREAS, each bridge within Woodbury County is unique based on its age, design, and current condition, and;

WHEREAS, load rating to ensure safe passage of loads greater than 80,000 pounds would be unique for each load on each individual bridge, and;

WHEREAS, the traversing of Woodbury County bridges by loads up to 130,000 pounds without the County being afforded the knowledge of or the ability to restrict each occurrence, would result in gradual and possibly sudden failure of bridges within the County, and;

WHEREAS, Woodbury County would likely bear legal and financial liability for subsequent failure of its bridges, even if such failures are caused by loads they did not permit, and;

WHEREAS, Woodbury County is not financially able to repair or replace bridges which would be subject to accelerated deterioration by increased loads, and;

WHEREAS, Woodbury County and its residents, farmers, businesses, schools, post offices, and emergency responders, would be subjected to undue operational and economic hardships by further degradation of its road system and the structures thereon;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors strongly urges all Iowa lawmakers to vote in opposition to this legislation.

Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and <u>USCOC of Greater lowa</u> <u>UC</u> (hereinafter referred to as property owner, organization or authorized representative) do hereby enter into the following permit and agreement:

1. Woodbury County hereby consents to and grants permission to the property owner, organization or authorized representative, to conduct the following described construction or activities within the right-of-way:

plow snow on the frontage road to access tower site; as needed

2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:

A. The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.

B. The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.

C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.

D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.

E. The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.

F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.

G. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will resced and mulch the disturbed areas. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will be responsible for seed, mulch, and labor unless otherwise provided in section L.

H. The property owner, organization, or authorized representative hereby agrees to hold Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department, its employees and agents harmless against any and all claims for damages and personal injury arising out of work performed or actions taken by the applicant related to the construction or maintenance of the facility. The applicant further agrees to reimburse the County or the Department for any expenditures that the County or Department may have to make on said highway rights of way on account of said applicant's construction or maintenance activity or other activities or lack thereof. The applicant shall also save Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department harmless of any damage or losses that may be sustained by the traveling public on account of such construction, repair or maintenance operations, or other activities.

I. FAILURE TO CONFORM TO OR TO ACQUIRE A PERMIT IS A VIOLATION OF SECTION 318.8, 2009 CODE OF IOWA. This permit is subject to any laws now in effect or any laws that may be hereafter enacted and all applicable rules and regulations of local, state and federal agencies. This permit is subject to all the rules and regulations of Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department.

J. This permit is subject to revocation by the Department at any time and at no cost to the Department, when in the judgment of the Department it is necessary in the improvement or maintenance of the highway or for other reasonable cause.

K. All proposed work covered by this permit shall be at the applicant's expense. The applicant shall reimburse the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department for any materials removed from the highway right of way described as follows:

M. All work done by property owner, organization or authorized representative pursuant to this agreement shall be completed prior to the ______ day of ______, 2018.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The county board, as drainage district trustees, directed the drainage engineer to inspect drainage districts under board supervision. His report will be presented with a recommendation.

BACKGROUND:

ISG, serving as county drainage engineers, inspected board of supervisor managed drainage districts for damage following a flood event which began on March 12, 2019. He has prepared a report for presentation. The board will receive the report and make a determination as to whether to apply for public assistance for repairs to the drainage districts damaged by the flood event.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The repairs are eligible for FEMA and state funding for repairs following a successful application for assistance. The cost split is FEMA at 75% and the State of Iowa at 10%. The 15% balance, plus some engineering expenses, will be paid for by drainage district tax levies.



AGREEMENT FOR USE OF LOCAL AGENCY ROADS AS DETOURS This Agreement is entered into by and between the Iowa Department of Transportation, hereinafter known as the Department; and the Woodbury County , hereinafter known as the Local Public Agency (LPA). WHEREAS, the Department has determined the necessity to temporarily close primary highway IA31 East junction of IA31/US20 in Correctionville C-66 / Washta from to for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, maintenance, natural disasters, or other emergencies; and WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide a detour for the primary highway closure period; and WHEREAS, the LPA agrees to permit the use of its roads as a detour, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the east junction of IA31/US20; thence west .25 miles on IA31/US20 to the west junction of IA31/US20 and L-36 in Correctionville; thence north 7.0 miles on L-36 to the intersection of L-36 and C-66; thence east 4.5 miles on C-66 to the intersection of C-66 and IA31 in Washta. Project # STP-031-1(43)--2C-97 WHEREAS, Authorized representatives of both the Department and the LPA shall jointly execute and sign a written report concerning the condition of the proposed detour, after jointly inspecting said road, the subject of the proposed detour; said report to be in sufficient detail as to reasonably reflect the condition of the roadway base, surface, shoulders and bridges; and WHEREAS, the Department will inspect the bridges on the detour route and determine the maximum vehicle weight (up to 156,000 pounds) that can be safely carried on these bridges and submit this information to the LPA for its review. The LPA may choose to restrict detour traffic to only vehicles of legal weight or size. If the LPA allows oversize or overweight loads, it shall notify the Department in writing. The Department shall approve the routing of overweight vehicles on the detour route, up to the limits specified by the LPA; and WHEREAS, the Department agrees to perform the following pre-detour maintenance, if any: Paint Markings and Detour Signing ; and WHEREAS, the Department agrees to maintain the detour and provide all traffic control devices required by the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), as adopted by the Department pursuant to 761 IAC 130, including the marking of no-passing zones during the period the local agency road(s) and structure(s) are being utilized as a primary road detour; and WHEREAS, Prior to revocation of the detour, the Department shall restore the local agency road to as good condition as it was prior to its designation as a temporary primary road, or adequately compensate the local agency for excessive traffic upon the local agency road during the period it was used as a temporary primary road, in accordance with Section 313.28 or Section 313.29 of the lowa Code and lowa DOT Policy 600.05; and WHEREAS, The detour period is estimated to begin March 1, 2020 and end ; and November 30, 2020 (date) (date) WHEREAS, the parties agree to the following additional provisions, if any: NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED that the described road be used as a detour under stipulations outlined above.
