EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Rolling Hills Governance Board met on Wednesday, January 8, 2020 for a budget work session and board meeting to set the Fiscal Year 2021 budget. The Region's Budget expenditure amount for FY'21 is \$7,631,840 with anticipated revenues of \$470,395 and a \$36.00 Per Capita of \$7,102,980. This will result in a Projected Ending Fund Balance of \$2,490,178 (33%) on the Regional Level.

FY'21 Woodbury County Budget Summary:

Woodbury County's Per Capita Contribution: \$3,691,404

Woodbury County additional contribution to Rolling Hills due to shortfall in FY'20: \$170,395

FY'21 Expenditures: \$4,196,346 FY'21 Revenue: \$334,547

FY'21 Levy recommendation: \$3,861,799 –Ending Fund Balance \$0 (may want to Levy higher to have small fund balance in Fund 10)

BACKGROUND:

SF504 (2018) required Regions and Counties to reduce their ending fund balances to either 20% or 25% based on population. Per Capita contribution was reduced to spend down reserves. SF691 (2019) increased the ending balances to 40% or below.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Woodbury County will have contributed \$829,605 toward the Rolling Hills fund balance per the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding between the parties. The shortfall of \$170,395 is owed for FY'21 in addition to the Per Capita results in Woodbury County's contribution of \$37.66. Additional cost for salaries (which will be reimbursed to Woodbury County from the Per Capita Contribution) adds \$3.26 Per Capita for a Total Contribution of \$40.92 for (\$4,196,346) for FY'21.

Comments:

The Woodbury County Sheriff's Office, the Sioux City Police Department and the Woodbury County Communications Center work within an AS/400 computer environment to database information. Each agency then utilizes a component of the HTE/Sungard product named, CRIMES, JALAN and CAD. The systems are separate but work together to provide dispatching services, law enforcement records management and the jail's arrest, booking and record keeping functions among many other things. The

system(s) were purchased nearly twenty years ago and have greatly exceeded their useful life. While the systems serve to database our information, they do little else.

The iteration of product currently in use, is the oldest past offering of HTE/Sungard and has been replaced with entirely new systems many times since our original purchase. HTE/Sungard itself has undergone several different makeovers during this period and is now called Central Square. The products currently in use are still supported but are no longer being developed. Arguably, they were never developed beyond the originally purchased product, with the exception of patching to more current outside software packages.

Technology has outpaced our current system. Information that takes many minutes to find currently, can be found in a fraction of the time. Moreover, information that we currently have, but are unable to draw connections between, becomes available due to the advancement in algorithms that compare data

Digital information such as pictures cannot be transmitted or even stored in our current system. The communications center also lacks the ability to receive digital information from callers such as pictures and video. The currently available RMS Systems also provide additional features that would advance our efforts towards a seamless, paperless reporting system.

Each agency listed shares in the costs of the current system. A future purchase would require the participation of those agencies. Even before that, a commitment must be made to move forward in the process. To date, both the Sioux City Police Department and the Communications Center have expressed interest, after seeing the potential improvements. Conversations with SCPD have centered around a 50/50 cost sharing arrangement for purchase, licensing and support.

Comments: The 2.2 miles of asphalt roads in Little Sioux Park have exceeded their life expectancy and are in very poor shape. We have been working with Secondary Roads Dept. to find the best solution for resurfacing the roads, and this is based on their estimate. Roads were originally hard surfaced in 1976 and again in 1997. In 2017, we had the horizontal cracks filled by slurry levelling which will buy some time for the road. Secondary Roads may recommend white topping with concrete which would be a long-term solution but cost closer to a million dollars. This project needs to be programmed into the County's CIP for future planning when funds become available.





Liaisons act as a two-way conduit of information both to implement board policy and to keep the board informed concerning each department. While each supervisor is assumed to have an "open door policy," the proper procedure for dealing with concerns is to channel them through the appropriate supervisor. In this way, supervisors can divide their time and focus most productively.

Construction Project Report

To be let:

L-B (M66)—**73-97,** Bridge M66 on 240th Street will be replaced with a reinforced concrete box culvert. The project is between Taylor Avenue and Union Avenue. Letting date: March 2020. Late start date: July 2020.

The project involves replacement of an aging bridge on 240th Street. The bridge will be replaced with a cast in place reinforced concrete box culvert. The project is funded with local secondary road funds.

L-B(C274)—**73-97,** Bridge C274 on Jewell Avenue between 110th Street and 120th Street will be replaced with a precast box culvert. Letting date: March, 2020. Late start date: July 2020.

The project involves replacement of an aging bridge with a precast box culvert. The project is funded with local secondary road funds.

BROS-SWAP-CO97(135)—**FE-97,** Hancock Avenue Bridge replacement project between 210th Street and 220th Street. Letting date: June 16, 2020. Late start date: August, 2020.

The bridge was closed in 2019 due to failure of substructure components. A new bridge will be constructed in 2020 to replace the old structure. The project is funded with county bridge funds allocated by Iowa DOT to Woodbury County.

BROS-SWAP-CO97(140)—**SE-97,** 200th Street bridge replacement project between the Moville Blacktop and Grundy Avenue. Letting date: June 16, 2020. Late start date: August 2020.

The bridge was closed in 2019 due to failure of substructure components. A new bridge will be constructed in 2020 to replace the old structure. The project is funded with county bridge funds allocated by Iowa DOT to Woodbury County.

BRS-SWAP-CO97(602)—**FF-97,** D12/110th Street bridge replacement project on corporate line with the City of Pierson. Letting date: June 16, 2020. Late start date: August 2020.

The project involves replacement of an aging bridge on the east side of Pierson. The project is being done in cooperation with the city using city bridge replacement funds for which the city was eligible. A new 80'x30' continuous concrete slab bridge will be constructed on site.

Under Contract:

FM-CO97(136)—55-97, D38 HMA resurfacing project between Bronson and the Moville Blacktop. Letting date: December 17, 2019. Late start date: June 2020. Contractor: Knife River Corporation of Sioux City, IA. Contract price: \$1,991,352.65.

The project involves cold in place recycling of existing pavement followed by an overlay of the pavement with new hot mix asphalt pavement. The late start date for the project is June 1, 2020.

L-B(C160)—**73-97**, County Bridge C160 is on Haskell Avenue between 140th Street and Iowa Hwy 141. Letting date: May 7, 2019. Late start date: September 3, 2019. Contractor: Graves Construction of Spencer, IA. Contract price: \$620,679.27.

This bridge was programmed for replacement in FY 2019. The existing bridge was destroyed in flooding during a June 2016 storm event. Work is underway. Channel work under the bridge is complete, the abutments are both complete, precast beams have been set, the deck is formed for concrete and reinforcing steel has been placed. The bridge deck is ready to be poured when weather conditions allow. Winter work is allowed on this project.

L-FM(D50)—**7X-97,** D50 Grading for Paving Project on 250th Street from Hwy 31 to County Route L27. Letting date: September 10, 2019. Late start date: April 13, 2020. Contractor: Mather Construction Co. Total bid price: \$2,031,975.53. The project involves grading 250th Street east of Iowa Highway 31 for approximately 2.25 miles in preparation for paving the road. The project is funded by the \$1.3 million special projects levy.

The project was let to contract on September 10th and awarded to Mather Construction on September 17th. The contract was approved by the board on September 24th. Grading and culvert installation has started. The contractor is working on the east end of the project, just west of Mason Avenue. Clearing and grubbing has started on the whole project corridor. The project work is suspended until spring. We expect the project to be completed in late summer, 2020. The road is programmed for paving. Paving will be done in either FY 2022 or FY 2023 after the grade has had time to settle.

FM-CO97(137)—**55-97,** K49 HMA resurfacing project between Plymouth County line and county route D12. Letting date: February 19, 2019. Contractor: Knife River. Woodbury County share of contract price: \$286,297.37.

This project is being done in coordination with a Plymouth County project on county route K49 in both counties. The project involves cold in place recycling of the existing pavement followed by an overlay of high performance asphalt surfacing. The high-performance surface provides a thinner overlay on top of the recycled pavement than standard hot mix asphalt. This is Woodbury County's first project using this material.

Cold in place recycling is complete. Surface HMA placement was completed on Friday, October 25. Shouldering is complete as are pavement markings. Some work in the northbound lane needs to be redone. This work will be done in the spring of 2020 before the project is complete.

Work Under Design:

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting in 2019.

1) The Mason Avenue bridge was severely damaged by flooding on the Little Sioux River in July 2018. The bridge has been closed to traffic due to damage caused by the bridge being struck by

a large tree. The county engineer's office was notified that FEMA has determined that the damage is eligible for repair/replacement assistance. The county road department has filed required documentation requesting assistance from FEMA with eligible costs and has started work on design of a new bridge at this location. Preliminary design work is underway for a 209' x 24' continuous concrete slab bridge that meets the hydraulic requirements of this crossing. There will still be road grade overflow on both sides of the bridge for extreme flooding, similar to the way the current truss has worked. We will be submitting the design to FEMA shortly to obtain approval for an improved project. We expect the bridge replacement project will be undertaken in 2020.
