This letter is to inform Woodbury County of my intention to start recently hired Deputy Sheriff Eric M. Fay, as a Class I Deputy Sheriff, effective immediately.

Deputy Fay came to the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office with 7 years of law enforcement experience with the Sergeant Bluff Police Department. He was already a state certified law enforcement officer through the lowa Law Enforcement Academy. Because of Deputy Fay's training and experience, he greatly reduced the cost of his hire by not needing the expensive Academy training. We were also able to provide him with an abbreviated field training program, which saved the County even more.

To attract this type of deputy recruit, it is necessary that the deputy recruits experience and training be recognized through the increased starting rate of pay over an untrained, inexperienced deputy filling the same position. Please prepare the appropriate paperwork necessary to fulfill this objective. Thank you.



- 1. The applicant will at any time subsequent to placing said facility agree to relay, replace, reconstruct, or relocate said facility and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment or widening of right-of-way resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such highway improvement. The applicant agrees to do this promptly on order by the Board of Supervisors. If the applicant is unable to comply promptly, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors will endeavor to give the applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover-up, or disturb any part of the facility belonging to the applicant in order that the applicant may arrange to protect the facility. The Board of Supervisors will inform contractors and others working on the right-of-way of the location of the facility so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facility. The County and the Board of Supervisors assume no responsibility, however, for failure to give such notice.
- 3. The County and the Board of Supervisors assume no responsibility for damages to the applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said highways, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the applicant's facility.
- 4. The applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facility to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the traveling public and adjacent property owners and shall indemnify and hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damage or losses that may be sustained by the traveling public or adjacent property owners on account of such construction operations.





#### Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

1. The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be reseeded.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- 12. Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.

#### WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA RESOLUTION NO.\_\_\_\_ WEED DESTRUCTION ORDER

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of each of Iowa County's Board of Supervisors to enforce the provisions of Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended with regard to the destruction of weeds, and

WHEREAS, under Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended each county Board of Supervisors must prescribe and order a program of weed destruction to be followed by landowners, tenants, and other persons in possession or control of land, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors that a program of weed destruction for the year 2020 is necessary,

#### NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa that each landowner, tenant or other person in possession or control of private land shall on or before the dates stated below, destroy the below-listed noxious weeds on their land by spraying them with a suitable herbicide in a strength sufficient to kill such weeds.

- 1. May 4, 2020 for Palmer amaranth annual.
- 2. May 11, 2020 for musk, thistle, sow thistle, bull thistle, leafy spurge, perennial pepper grass, sour dock perennial, smooth dock perennial, and sheep sorrel perennial.
- 3. June 1, 2020 for Canada thistle, Russian knapweed, buckhorn perennial, wild mustard annual, horse nettle, and teasel biennial.
- 4. June 8, 2020 for field bindweed, wild carrot biennial, and quack grass.
- 5. June 15, 2020 for butterprint annual, puncture vine annual, and cocklebur annual.
- 6. July 1, 2020 for wild sunflower annual and poison hemlock.
- 7. October 5, 2020 all thistles in the rosette stage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that any person using county road Right-of-Way for haying or grazing are responsible for following the labeled restrictions listed on the following products used by Woodbury County Weed Commissioner: Grazon P&D, Streamline, Perspective, Method 240SL, and MSN 60.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that all weeds on county trunk and local roads and between the fence lines of such roads, whether they be noxious weeds or other weeds, shall be eradicated or otherwise destroyed, to prevent seed production, by the owner of the land adjoining the road on or before June 12, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that weeds that are not destroyed in compliance with the above order may be destroyed by the Weed Commissioner, and the costs of destruction by the Weed Commissioner, including the cost of serving notice, plus a penalty of twenty-five percent of total costs shall be assessed against the property upon which the weeds were destroyed, in the case of private lands, or against the adjoining land, in the case of weeds on county roads. Landowners are to contact Weed Commissioner and notify him if there are areas that should not be sprayed with herbicides.

### **Construction Project Report**

#### To be let:

**L-B**(C274)—73-97, Bridge C274 on Jewell Avenue between 110<sup>th</sup> Street and 120<sup>th</sup> Street will be replaced with a precast concrete box culvert. Letting date: April 14, 2020. Late start date: July 2020.

The project involves replacement of an aging bridge with a precast concrete box culvert. The project is funded with local secondary road funds.

**L-B (M66)**—73-97, Bridge M66 on 240<sup>th</sup> Street will be replaced with a reinforced concrete box culvert. The project is between Taylor Avenue and Union Avenue. Letting date: May 2020. Late start date: July 2020.

The project involves replacement of an aging bridge on 240<sup>th</sup> Street. The bridge will be replaced with a cast in place, reinforced concrete box culvert. The project is funded with local secondary road funds.

**BROS-SWAP-CO97(135)**—**FE-97,** Hancock Avenue Bridge replacement project between 210<sup>th</sup> Street and 220<sup>th</sup> Street. Letting date: June 16, 2020. Late start date: To be determined.

The bridge was closed in 2019 due to failure of substructure components. A new single span concrete beam bridge will be constructed in 2020 to replace the old structure. The project is funded with county bridge funds allocated by Iowa DOT to Woodbury County.

**BRS-SWAP-6012(601)**—**FF-97,** D12/110<sup>th</sup> Street bridge replacement project on corporate line with the City of Pierson. Letting date: June 16, 2020. Late start date: to be determined.

The project involves replacement of a load restricted and aging bridge on the east side of Pierson. The project is being done in cooperation with the city using city bridge replacement funds for which the city was eligible. A new 80'x30' continuous concrete slab bridge will be constructed on site.

**BROS-SWAP-CO97(140)**—**SE-97,** 200<sup>th</sup> Street bridge replacement project between the Moville Blacktop and Grundy Avenue. Letting date: August 18, 2020. Late start date: to be determined.

The bridge was closed in 2019 due to failure of substructure components. A new bridge will be constructed in 2020 to replace the old structure. The project is funded with county bridge funds allocated by Iowa DOT to Woodbury County.

**BRS-CHBP-CO97(139)**—**GB-97,** Hancock Avenue Bridge replacement project between County Highway D38 (220<sup>th</sup> Street) and 200<sup>th</sup> Street. Letting date: September 15, 2020. Late start date: Spring 2021

The bridge is funded with Competitive Highway Bridge Program funds administered by the Iowa DOT and allocated to Woodbury County. This bridge is fully funded with CHBP and SWAP funds.

**BROSCHBP-CO97(141)**—**GA-97,** O'Brien Avenue Bridge replacement project between Highway 20 and 160<sup>th</sup> Street. Letting date: September 15, 2020. Late start date: Spring 2021.

The bridge is funded with Competitive Highway Bridge Program funds administered by the Iowa DOT and allocated to Woodbury County. This bridge is fully funded with CHBP and SWAP funds.

### **Under Contract:**

**FM-CO97(136)**—**55-97,** D38 HMA resurfacing project between Bronson and the Moville Blacktop. Letting date: December 17, 2019. Late start date: June 2020. Contractor: Knife River Corporation of Sioux City, IA. Contract price: \$1,991,352.65.

The project involves cold in place recycling of existing pavement followed by an overlay of the pavement with new hot mix asphalt pavement. The contractor has been out getting core samples on the road for the design of the cold in place recycling. A preconstruction meeting will be held on Thursday, April 9, at which time the contractor will present his proposed schedule for the project.

**L-B(C160)**—**73-97**, County Bridge C160 is on Haskell Avenue between 140<sup>th</sup> Street and Iowa Hwy 141. Letting date: May 7, 2019. Late start date: September 3, 2019. Contractor: Graves Construction of Spencer, IA. Contract price: \$620,679.27.

This bridge construction is complete. This week, the contractor has been removing the temporary stream crossing, removing pavement, and shaping the grade for paving and approach sections. Once paving is complete, guardrail will need to be installed for the bridge to be ready to open. We estimate completion of the project in mid-May.

**L-FM(D50)**—**7X-97,** D50 Grading for Paving Project on 250<sup>th</sup> Street from Hwy 31 to County Route L27. Letting date: September 10, 2019. Late start date: April 13, 2020. Contractor: Mather Construction Co. Total bid price: \$2,031,975.53. The project involves grading 250<sup>th</sup> Street east of Iowa Highway 31 for approximately 2.25 miles in preparation for paving the road. The project is funded by the \$1.3 million special projects levy.

The project was let to contract on September 10<sup>th</sup> and awarded to Mather Construction on September 17<sup>th</sup>. The contract was approved by the board on September 24<sup>th</sup>. Grading and culvert installation has started last fall and was suspended for winter until last week. The contractor has resumed grading on the east end of the project, just west of Mason Avenue. Clearing and grubbing has started on the whole project corridor. The contractor expects to close the intersection of County routes L27 and D50 in two to three weeks to allow grading of the new intersection at the east end. We expect the project to be completed in late summer, 2020. The road is programmed for paving. Paving will be done in either FY 2022 or FY 2023 after the grade has had time to settle.

FM-CO97(137)—55-97, K49 HMA resurfacing project between Plymouth County line and county route D12. Letting date: February 19, 2019. Contractor: Knife River. Woodbury County share of contract price: \$286,297.37.

This project is being done in coordination with a Plymouth County project on county route K49 in both counties. The project involves cold in place recycling of the existing pavement followed by an overlay of high performance asphalt surfacing. The high-performance surface provides a thinner overlay on top of the recycled pavement than standard hot mix asphalt. This is Woodbury County's first project using this material.

Cold in place recycling is complete. Surface HMA placement was completed on Friday, October 25. Shouldering is complete as are pavement markings. Some work in the northbound lane needs to be redone. This work will be done in the spring of 2020 before the project is complete.

### **Work Under Design:**

Design work is underway on the following projects for letting in 2019.

- 1) The Mason Avenue bridge was severely damaged by flooding on the Little Sioux River in July 2018. The bridge has been closed to traffic due to damage caused by the bridge being struck by a large tree. The county engineer's office was notified that FEMA has determined that the damage is eligible for repair/replacement assistance. The county road department has filed required documentation requesting assistance from FEMA with eligible costs and has started work on design of a new bridge at this location. Preliminary design work is underway for a 209' x 24' continuous concrete slab bridge that meets the hydraulic requirements of this crossing. There will still be road grade overflow on both sides of the bridge for extreme flooding, similar to the way the current truss has worked. We will be submitting the design to FEMA shortly to obtain approval for an improved project. We expect the bridge replacement project will be undertaken in 2020.
- 2) Design work is starting on K64 from Highway 141 north to Old Highway 141. This work includes new pavement through the town of Hornick. The project is proposed for letting in spring 2021.
