RE: SIMPCO Progress Report Qtr. 4 | April 1, 2020 – June 30, 2020

The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors agreed to pay for one half of rural Woodbury County communities' membership dues to SIMPCO for FY 2020 (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020). The goal of the partnership is for rural Woodbury County communities to utilize the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council (SIMPCO) in providing tools, research, technical assistance and regional collaboration to help grow community and economic development project across Woodbury County.

For FY 2020, the following communities signed-up for a SIMPCO Membership: Anthon, Bronson, Cushing, Correctionville, Hornick, Lawton, Moville, Oto, Salix and Sergeant Bluff. Information in this report demonstrates project(s)/information requested, total time, and estimated value of services offered directly to each of the communities as well as the indirect value of SIMPCO membership and regional collaboration.

During the 4th quarter, SIMPCO spent approximately 88 direct hours which equals an estimated value of \$5,984 assisting member communities in Woodbury County. Indirect time working on projects, committees, regional projects, and outreach that indirectly benefits Woodbury County communities is estimated at 256 hours or an estimated value of \$17,408. The net benefit of SIMPCO membership for rural Woodbury County communities in the fourth quarter is equaled \$23,392.

Fourth Quarter Notes:

• Unlike the other rural Woodbury County communities, Sergeant Bluff is part of the SIMPCO Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the urban area of Sioux City. MPO work may not be specifically directed to Sergeant Bluff but pertains to metropolitan transportation planning as a whole and Sergeant Bluff's placement in the MPO. Twenty percent of MPO funds are from MPO members' dues used as local match to complete the necessary work required to ensure federal transportation funds continue to flow into the metropolitan region.

- SIMPCO staff is working on several regional plans and which indirectly benefits the members these include the Transportation Improvement Programs, Census promotion, Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), and the Hazard Mitigation Plans.
- SIMPCO has been working closely with Sergeant Bluff on a 5-2-1-0 IDPH grant application and a TAP Application for the MPO.
- SIMPCO hosted a Virtual 101 via Zoom, for members to learn more about the organization.
- SIMPCO reached out to all the members to see if they needed any assistance due to the COVID19 pandemic. Meeting with communities during the 4th quarter proved challenging due to the situation.
- SIMPCO completed the five-year Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) plan for the region, including rural Woodbury County. This plan is linked to U.S. EDA funds coming to the region.
- SIMPCO applied for U.S. EDA CARES Act Recovery funds to provide technical services to members and small businesses throughout the region. In addition, SIMPCO will use the funds to create an addendum to the CEDS document regarding the recovery and resiliency of the region due to the pandemic.
- SIMPCO created resource page on the website for the COVID19 response. In addition, we will be checking with all the communities to see what assistance they might need during the pandemic. In addition, weekly newsletters with updates and information will be sent to members during the crisis.





- 5. Records: The County shall maintain a proper accounting system in accordance with generally accepted accounting standards, including books, records, documents and other evidence pertaining to all costs and expenses for which funds are expended. AMENDED AND RESTATED 28E AGREEMENT BETWEEN WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA AND THE WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY

This Amended and Restated 28E Agreement ("Amended Agreement") is made and entered into pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa as of this ______ of ______, 2020, by and between WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA, a political subdivision, organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa ("County") and the WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY, a body corporate, organized and existing under and by virtue of Iowa Code Section 346.27 ("Authority"). The County and the Authority are herein referred to as the "Parties" to this Amended Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Authority was created pursuant to Iowa Code Section 346.27, by its incorporating units, Woodbury County, Iowa and Sioux City, Iowa, for purposes of constructing and owning a law enforcement center ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to finance the entire cost of the Project, including certain fees for the design, engineering, testing and project management of the Project, by issuing revenue bonds; and

WHEREAS, certain of the design, engineering, testing and project management fees for the Project will become due prior to the issuance of said bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County and the Board of Commissioners of the Authority have determined it to be in the best interests of their respective constituencies and incorporating units to cooperate in the payment of certain design, engineering, testing and project management fees for the Project not to exceed \$1,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a contract under Chapter 28E in order to define their respective rights and obligations in connection with payment associated with the design, engineering, testing and project management fees for the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein, the County and the Authority hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the joint exercise of the respective powers of the parties in connection with financing certain design, engineering, testing and project management costs of the Project not to exceed \$1,000,000, which is a public improvement project of mutual benefit to the constituents and incorporating units of both Parties.

Section 2. <u>Agreement – Manner of Financing</u>. In order to effectuate the purpose hereunder and to facilitate the design and construction of the Project, the Parties agree as follows:

A. County's Obligations – The County shall pay the Authority for the cost of certain design, engineering, testing and project management services for the Project in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 from the general basic fund cash on hand. The payment shall be financed in cash from such funds as may be legally available including cash on hand and such other funds as the Board of Supervisors may at its sole discretion determine and provide.

<u>B. Authority's Obligations</u> – The Authority shall use said payment(s) from the County to pay for such design, engineering, testing and project management services as the Board of Commissioners deems reasonable and necessary. The Authority shall accept payment from the County for the purpose of paying such design, engineering, testing and project management fees due on the Project. The Authority shall reimburse the County for 100% of its payment(s), not to exceed \$1,000,000. The Authority's reimbursement to the County shall be made within sixty (60) daysafter the proceeds from the Authority's revenue bonds for the Project become available.

Section 3. <u>Agreement – Method of Approval</u>. The Parties shall approve this Agreement by resolution adopted by action of their respective governing bodies, which resolution shall authorize the Chairperson and County Auditor of the County and the Chairperson and Secretary of the Authority to execute this Amended Agreement.

Section 4. <u>Agreement – Filing with Secretary of State</u>. When this Amended Agreement has been executed by the Parties, it shall be electronically filed with the Secretary of State of the State of Iowa in accordance with the provisions of Iowa Code Section 28E.8.

Section 5. <u>Duration.</u> This Amended Agreement shall be in effect as of the date of the filing of the Amended Agreement with the Secretary of State and shall continue indefinitely until and unless terminated by the action of any party to this Amended Agreement as provided herein. This Amended Agreement may also be terminated by either party for any reason, at any time, by providing the other party with written notice of such party's desire to terminate this Amended Agreement. Upon such notice, this Amended Agreement shall automatically terminate 60 days after such notice is provided.

Section 6. No Entity. No separate entity is created hereby.

Section 7. <u>Designated Administrator</u>. The parties agree that Dennis Butler, or his designee, shall be designated as the sole administrator of this Amended Agreement for purposes of the filing requirements outlined by Iowa Code Section 28E.8. Each party shall otherwise separately administer its own activities.

Section 8. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, demand or other communication under this Amended Agreement shall be made in writing as follows:

Section 9. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Amended Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa now or hereinafter applicable hereto.

Section 10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Amended Agreement contains the entire Amended Agreement between the parties hereto and may not be changed except by an amendment in writing signed by the parties hereto.

Section 11. <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this Amended Agreement shall be construed to confer any right upon any third party, and the parties hereto specifically acknowledge, agree and declare that no person is intended to be a third-party beneficiary to this Amended Agreement.

Christy Road Trail Extension - Summary

Thanks for your consideration of this proposed trail extension. Below is additional information to help clarify the project.

The project is defined as: Extending a 7' trail from the west entrance of Overlook Lane to Southern Hills Drive with one rest stop. This will be roughly 12,825 ft2 of new trail area connecting the existing trail to Southern Hills Drive. (see attached map)

Work is scheduled to be completed in October, 2020.

Based on City of Sioux City's prior trail projects and square footage the total cost is estimated around \$145k.

Project Donors/Contributors:

Woodbury County: \$15k (requested)

Siouxland Trails Foundation: \$10k (committed)

SCOPE OF WORK:

Trail Work:

Survey and layout the trail, remove vegetation/topsoil, compact top 6" and trim sub-grade. Paving to include 6" of DOT C4 mix, 7' wide with a target of 1.5% cross slope (not to exceed 2%). Trail to be approximately 4' off of the back of curb and 3" above curb. There will be three sets of ADA panels for road crossings.

Landscaping:

Trail will be back filled, graded and all disturbed areas will be seeded with MidAmerican Fescue. Disturbed areas will be watered and maintain till grass established.

Rest Stop Area:

Rest Stop Area consists of a concrete slab, bike repair station, bike rack, bench, and landscaping.

IOWA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION Agreement for a Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Federal-aid Swap Project

Iowa DOT Agreement No.: 3-20-STBG-SWAP-045

This is an agreement between the Woodbury County, Iowa (hereinafter referred to as the Recipient) and the Iowa Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as the Department) for Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Federal-aid Swap funds under 761 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) Chapter 162. Iowa Code Section 306A.7 provides for the Recipient and the Department to enter into agreements with each other for the purpose of financing transportation improvement projects on streets and highways in Iowa.

Pursuant to the terms of this agreement, applicable statutes, and administrative rules, the Department agrees to provide STBG Federal-aid Swap funding to the Recipient for the authorized and approved costs for eligible items associated with the project.

Under this agreement, the parties further agree as follows:

- 1. The Recipient shall be the lead local governmental agency for carrying out the provisions of this agreement.
- 2. All notices required under this agreement shall be made in writing to the appropriate contact person. The Department's contact persons will be the Local Systems Project Development Engineer, Christy VanBuskirk, and Western Region Local Systems Field Engineer, Vincent L. Ehlert. The Recipient's contact person shall be the County Engineer.
- 3. The Recipient shall be responsible for the development and completion of the following described STBG project:
 - On K25 from Relocated Port Neal Road South 1.8 miles to Gelita Plant Entrance PCC Pavement Grade and Replace.
- 4. Eligible project activities will be limited to the following: construction, engineering, inspection, and right-of-way acquisition. Under certain circumstances, eligible activities may also include utility relocation or railroad work that is required for construction of the project.
- 5. The Recipient shall receive reimbursement for costs of authorized and approved eligible project activities from STBG Federal-aid Swap funds. The portion of the project costs reimbursed by STBG Federal-aid Swap funds shall be up to \$2,125,000 for the following phases of work as stipulated by the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council:

Preliminary Engineering
Construction Engineering
Right-of-Way
X Construction

- 6. The Recipient shall pay for all project costs not reimbursed with STBG Federal-aid Swap funds.
- 7. If the project described in Section 3 drops out of the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council current TIP or the approved current STIP prior to obligation of funds, and the Recipient fails to reprogram the project in the appropriate TIP and STIP within 3 years, this agreement shall become null and void.
- 8. The Recipient shall let the project for bids through the Department.
- 9. If any part of this agreement is found to be void and unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in effect.
- 10. It is the intent of both parties that no third party beneficiaries be created by this agreement.

11.	This agreement and the attached Exhibit 1 constitute the entire agreement between the Department and the Recipient concerning this project. Representations made before the signing of this agreement are not binding, and neither party has relied upon conflicting representations in entering into this agreement. Any change or alteration to the terms of this agreement shall be made in the form of an addendum to this agreement. The addendum shall become effective only upon written acceptance of the Department and the Recipient.

EXHIBIT 1

General Agreement Provisions for use of Federal-aid Swap Funds on Non-primary Projects

Unless otherwise specified in this agreement, the Recipient shall be responsible for the following:

1. General Requirements.

- a. The Recipient shall take the necessary actions to comply with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations. To assist the Recipient, the Department has provided guidance in the Instructional Memorandums to Local Public Agencies (I.M.s), available on-line at:

 https://iowadot.gov/local_systems/publications/im/lpa_ims. The Recipient shall follow the applicable procedures and guidelines contained in the I.M.s in effect at the time project activities are conducted.
- b. In accordance with lowa Code Chapter 216 and associated subsequent nondiscrimination laws and regulations, the Recipient shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, creed, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, religion, pregnancy, or disability.
- c. The Recipient shall comply with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), the associated Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) that implement these laws, and the guidance provided in I.M. 1.080, ADA Requirements. When pedestrian facilities are constructed, reconstructed, or altered, the Recipient shall make such facilities compliant with the ADA and Section 504.
- d. The Recipient agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the Department harmless from any action or liability arising out of the design, construction, maintenance, placement of traffic control devices, inspection, or use of this project. This agreement to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless applies to all aspects of the Department's application review and acceptance process, plan and construction reviews, and funding participation.
- e. Termination of funds. Notwithstanding anything in this agreement to the contrary, and subject to the limitations set forth below, the Department shall have the right to terminate this agreement without penalty and without any advance notice as a result of any of the following: 1) The Federal government, legislature or governor fail in the sole opinion of the Department to appropriate funds sufficient to allow the Department to either meet its obligations under this agreement or to operate as required and to fulfill its obligations under this agreement; or 2) If funds are de-appropriated, reduced, not allocated, or receipt of funds is delayed, or if any funds or revenues needed by the Department to make any payment hereunder are insufficient or unavailable for any other reason as determined by the Department in its sole discretion; or 3) If the Department's authorization to conduct its business or engage in activities or operations related to the subject matter of this agreement is withdrawn or materially altered or modified. The Department shall provide the Recipient with written notice of termination pursuant to this section.

2 Programming

- a. The Recipient shall be responsible for including the project in the appropriate Regional Planning Affiliation (RPA) or Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The Recipient shall also ensure that the appropriate RPA or MPO, through their TIP submittal to the Department, includes the project in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). If the project is not included in the appropriate fiscal year of the STIP, funds cannot be obligated.
- b. Before beginning any work for which funding reimbursement will be requested, the Recipient shall submit a written request for acceptance to the Department. The Department will notify the Recipient when acceptance is granted. The cost of work performed prior to acceptance will not be reimbursed. The turning in of plans for letting by the Department's administering bureau shall be considered acceptance for construction. The Department will notify the Recipient when acceptance is granted.

3. Design and Consultant Services

a. The Recipient shall be responsible for the design of the project, including all necessary plans, specifications, and estimates (PS&E). The project shall be designed in accordance with the design guidelines provided or referenced by the Department in the Guide and applicable I.M.s.

4. Environmental Requirements and other Agreements or Permits.

a. The Recipient shall obtain project permits and approvals, when necessary, from the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs (State Historical Society of Iowa; State Historic Preservation Officer), Iowa Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Department, or other agencies as required. The Recipient shall follow the applicable procedures in the Instructional Memorandums to Local Public Agencies Table of Contents, Chapter 4 – Environmental Regulations.

5. Right-of-Way, Railroads, and Utilities.

- a. The Recipient shall acquire the project right-of-way, whether by lease, easement, or fee title, and shall provide relocation assistance benefits and payments in accordance with the procedures set forth in I.M. 3.600, Right-of-Way Acquisition, and the Department's Right of Way Bureau Local Public Agency Manual. The Recipient shall contact the Department for assistance, as necessary, to ensure compliance with the required procedures.
- b. If a railroad crossing or railroad tracks are within or adjacent to the project limits, the Recipient shall obtain agreements, easements, or permits as needed from the railroad. The Recipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 3.670, Work on Railroad Right-of-Way.
- c. The Recipient shall obtain agreements from utility companies as needed. The Recipient shall comply with the "Policy for Accommodating Utilities on the County and City a Non-Primary Federal-aid Road System" for projects on non-primary Federal-aid highways. For projects connecting to or involving some work inside the right-of-way for a primary highway, the Recipient shall follow the Department's "Policy for Accommodating and Adjustment of Utilities on the Primary Road System" The Recipient should also use the procedures outlined in I.M. 3.640, Utility Accommodation and Coordination, as a guide to coordinating with utilities.

6. Contract Procurement.

- a. The following provisions apply only to projects involving physical construction or improvements to transportation facilities:
- b. The project plans, specifications, and cost estimate (PS&E) shall be prepared and certified by a professional engineer or architect, as applicable, licensed in the State of Iowa.
- c. The Recipient shall be responsible for the following:
 - i. Prepare and submit the PS&E and other contract documents to the Department for review and acceptance in accordance with I.M. 3.700, Check and Final Plans and I.M. 3.500, Bridge or Culvert Plans, as applicable.
 - ii. The contract documents shall use the Department's Standard Specifications for Highway and Bridge Construction. Prior to their use in the PS&E, specifications developed by the Recipient for individual construction items shall be approved by the Department.
 - iii. Follow the procedures in I.M. 5.030, Iowa DOT Letting Process, to analyze the bids received; make a decision to either award a contract to the lowest responsive bidder or reject all bids; and if a contract is awarded, execute the contract documents and return to Department.

Note: The Department may not be able to allow a project to be let in the scheduled letting due to possible issues with cash flow availability.

- d. The Recipient shall forward a completed Project Development Certification (Form 730002) to the Department in accordance with I.M. 5.050, Project Development Certification Instructions. The project will not be turned in for bid letting until the Department has reviewed and accepted the Project Development Certification.
- e. If the Recipient is a city, the Recipient shall comply with the public hearing requirements of the Iowa Code section 26.12.

f. The Recipient shall not provide the contractor with notice to proceed until after receiving written notice that the Department has concurred in the contract award.

7. Construction.

- a. The Recipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 6.000, Construction Inspection, and the Department's Construction Manual, as applicable, for conducting construction inspection activities. The Recipient's engineer shall at all times be responsible for inspection of the project.
- b. A full-time employee of the Recipient shall serve as the person in responsible charge of the project. For cities that do not have any full time employees, the mayor or city clerk will serve as the person in responsible charge, with assistance from the Department.
- c. Traffic control devices, signing, or pavement markings installed within the limits of this project shall conform to the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" per 761 IAC Chapter 130. Proper protective measures and devices such as fences, barricades, signs, flood lighting, and warning lights as needed.
- d. The project shall be constructed under the Department's Standard Specifications for Highway and Bridge Construction and the Recipient shall comply with the procedures and responsibilities for materials testing according to the Department's Materials I.M.s. Available on-line at: https://www.iowadot.gov/erl/index.html.
- e. If the Department provides any materials testing services to the Recipient, the Department will bill the Recipient for such testing services according to its normal policy as per Materials I.M. 103.

8. Reimbursements.

- a. The Recipient will be initially responsible for all project costs. After costs have been incurred, the Recipient shall submit to the Department periodic itemized claims for reimbursement for eligible project costs. Requests for reimbursement shall be made at least semi-annually but not more than bi-weekly.
- b. To ensure proper accounting of costs, reimbursement requests for costs incurred prior to June 30 shall be submitted to the Department by August 1, if possible, but no later than August 15.
- c. Reimbursement claims shall include a certification that all eligible project costs, for which reimbursement is requested, have been reviewed by an official or governing board of the Recipient, are reasonable and proper, have been paid in full, and were completed in substantial compliance with the terms of this agreement.
- d. The Department will reimburse the Recipient for properly documented and certified claims for eligible project costs. The Department may withhold up to 5% of the total funds available for the project. Reimbursement will be made either by State warrant or by crediting other accounts from which payment was initially made. If, upon final review or audit selected by the Administering Bureau, the Department determines the Recipient has been overpaid, the Recipient shall reimburse the overpaid amount to the Department. After the final review is complete and after the Recipient has provided all required paperwork, the Department will release the funds withheld.
- e. The total funds collected by the Recipient for this project shall not exceed the total project costs. The total funds collected shall include any funds received; for example, Federal funds not received through FHWA, any special assessments made by the Recipient (exclusive of any associated interest or penalties) pursuant to lowa Code Chapter 384 (cities) or Chapter 311 (counties), proceeds from the sale of excess right-of-way, and any other revenues generated by the project. The total project costs shall include all costs that can be directly attributed to the project. In the event that the total funds collected by the Recipient do exceed the total project costs, the Recipient shall either:
 - i. in the case of special assessments, refund to the assessed property owners the excess special assessments collected (including interest and penalties associated with the amount of the excess), or
 - ii. refund to the Department all funds collected in excess of the total project costs (including interest and penalties associated with the amount of the excess) within 60 days of the receipt of any excess funds.

9. Project Close-out.

- a. Acceptance of the completed construction shall be with the concurrence of the Department. Within 30 days of completion of construction or other activities authorized by this agreement, the Recipient shall provide written notification to the Department. The Recipient shall follow and request a final review, in accordance with the procedures in I.M. 6.110, Final Review, Audit, and Close-out Procedures for Federal-aid, Federal-aid Swap, and Farm-to-Market Projects. Failure to comply with the procedures may result in loss of funds and the ability to let future projects through the Department; reimbursed funds shall be returned and a possible suspension may be placed on the Recipient from receiving funds from the Department on future projects until the Recipient has demonstrated responsible management of funds on roadway projects.
- b. For construction projects, the Recipient shall provide a certification by a professional engineer, architect, or landscape architect as applicable, licensed in the State of lowa, indicating the construction was completed in substantial compliance with the project plans and specifications.
- c. Final reimbursement of funds shall be made only after the Department accepts the project as complete.
- d. The Recipient shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, reports, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred for the project. The Recipient shall also make this documentation available at all reasonable times for review by the Department. Copies of this documentation shall be furnished by the Recipient if requested. Such documentation shall be retained for at least 3 years from the date of the Department's signature of the Department's Final Payment Form (Form 830436) or the bottom part of the Certificate of Completion and Final Acceptance of Agreement Work (Form 640003).
- e. The Recipient shall maintain, or cause to be maintained, the completed improvement in a manner acceptable to the Department.
