Keith- Hope you're doing well. I'm contacting you in my capacity as a Boys and Girls Club of Siouxland board member. As you'll see from the trailing information below, we acquired 823 Pearl Street in 2019 and shortly thereafter began remodeling the space. Our executive director Eldon Bensen filed for the tax exemption and it was later granted, though it looks like we're still on the tax liability incurred in 19-20 and paid in '20-'21.

Is it possible to pull forward the approved exemption to avoid the \sim \$3,000 in property taxes? I seem to remember that you could get on the Board agenda and someone representing the organization could ask for an exemption. Is that still the case?

Thanks Keith, appreciate your help.

Hi Everyone,

Here is the update on Club happenings this week.

The document attached is a bill for the taxes on 813 Pearl St. (old dance studio). We took ownership of this building on July 9th 2019, and since the tax year starts on July 1st we will have to pay 2019's taxes. I submitted the tax exemption form right away after we took ownership to the Assessor office. Unfortunately the taxes run 18 months in the rear and the Assessor's office does not. My name is Steve Semingson with Civic Partners Sioux City, LLC. We are the owner of The Promenade cinema and retail center with addresses at 916-930 Fourth Street, Sioux City, Parcel Number 894728452010. From mid-March through late August the cinema, the primary revenue generator for the project, was closed due to COVID-19, producing nearly zero income for the property to cover property taxes.

The facility is over 90% leased and prior to COVID – 19 restrictions it was a main attraction delivering substantial consumer traffic to the Historic 4th Street revitalization currently underway. Today, in addition to the occupancy restrictions placed upon the businesses, customers are concerned with potential virus exposure. Main Street Theaters is doing an excellent job of maintaining necessary health and safety measures and although theater attendance is increasing, it remains below 25%. Consequently, operations can barely cover movie studio distribution fees and daily operating costs, leaving nothing left for rent. With the precautions in place attending the movies is safe, but between mandated occupancy limitations and consumer perceptions the pandemic we are all suffering from will continue to severely limit the Promenade revenues.

Our lender has graciously agreed to a debt service forbearance of 50% of the ongoing payments. Civic Partners Sioux City has agreed in return to rent forbearance without which the cinema anchor would not survive. Only a small fraction of the rentable space is producing rent leaving the property at an operating loss even before the payment of property taxes.

A property tax payment of \$106,000 is due at months end and to pressure our tenant to come out of pocket during this pandemic crisis is simply not in the best interest of the community. The benefit The Promenade provides to the vibrancy of Historic 4th Street is immeasurable and a vacant entertainment component would be disastrous to the improving vitality of the area.

In consideration of the above I respectfully request a property tax deferral until the center is again fully operational.
