RESOLUTION #<u>13,368</u> RESOLUTION EXPRESSING INTENT TO PROVIDE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT TO AG PROCESSING INC

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa (the "County") by resolution previously established the Grow Woodbury County Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and adopted an urban renewal plan (the "Plan") for the governance of initiatives and projects therein; and

WHEREAS, Ag Processing Inc (the "Cooperative") has proposed to undertake the expansion of an existing soybean processing facility (the "Project") for use in its business operations on certain real property (the "Property") situated at 2753 Port Neal Circle, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa in the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the Cooperative has requested that the County provide financial support to help to defray the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to provide such financial support by entering into a development agreement (the "Development Agreement") with the Cooperative and thereby making provision for the funding of incremental property tax payments (the "Payments") to the Cooperative; and

WHEREAS, prior to entering into the Development Agreement, the Board must undertake the statutory process for (1) approving the Project as an urban renewal project under the Plan for the Urban Renewal Area; and (2) authorizing the Development Agreement and the funding of the Payments; but the County desires to convey its intent to pursue these actions to the Cooperative in order to facilitate progress on the development of the Property through the adoption of this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby expresses its intent to support the Project in the future. The County will in good faith negotiate the Development Agreement with respect to the undertaking of the Project, such proposed Agreement to minimally include the following terms:

A) The Cooperative will agree to submit documentation demonstrating the costs (the "Project Costs") incurred by the Cooperative in the completion of the Project; and

B) In undertaking the Project, the Cooperative intends to make a capital investment in the approximate amount of \$70,400,000 and to create not less than two (2) new full time jobs; and

C) The Cooperative will commit to maintaining material compliance with its agreements with the Iowa Economic Development Authority respecting the undertaking of the Project and the workforce to be employed therein; and

E) The County will agree to fund five (5) annual Payments to the Cooperative each in the amount of \$200,000, provided, however, that such Payments will be payable solely and only from incremental property tax revenues to be derived from the incremental valuation added to the Property by the undertaking of Project.


Section 2. The Board hereby agrees to use its best efforts to complete the statutory requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa in order to amend the Plan and to authorize the Development Agreement. The County's commitments expressed in this Resolution are merely a present statement of intent, and the Board of Supervisors must still exercise its ordinary political discretion in the completion of the statutory processes referenced herein. The County will not be held liable in the event that the Board of Supervisors, through the exercising of its ordinary political discretion, determines to not approve any of the actions outlined herein.

Section 3. Nothing in this Resolution shall prevent the parties from negotiating additional terms, not set forth herein, for inclusion in the Development Agreement.

Section 4. All resolutions and orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed.



Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

1. The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be thoroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be reseeded.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.
- 12. Engagement in the operations as herein applied for by the Applicant shall be considered and constitute an acceptance of all the terms and conditions herein set forth.

WHEREAS, Woodbury County, State of Iowa (the "County"), is a political subdivision, organized and existing under and by the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the County has now adopted a resolution adopting Articles of Incorporation to form the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority and has authorized the execution of the Articles of Incorporation: and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 346.27 requires that the Authority be directed and governed by a Board of Commissioners of three members, one to be elected by the Board of Supervisors of the County from the area outside the county seat, one to be elected by the City Council of the City from the area inside the City, and one to be elected by the joint action of the Board of Supervisors of the County and the City Council of the City; and

WHEREAS, the two-year term of the first Commissioner elected by the Board of Supervisors expires on December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the County hereby intends to appoint a Commissioner to the Board of Commissioners of the Authority to serve a six-year term; and

WHEREAS, the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>Appointment</u>. <u>Rocky De Witt</u>, currently residing outside of the City of Sioux City, Iowa, is hereby appointed to serve as the County's Commissioner on the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Authority's Board of Commissioners for a term of six years beginning on January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2027.

Section 2. <u>Compensation</u>. The Commissioner shall not receive compensation in any actual and necessary expenditures in connection with the performance of the Commissioner's duties.

Section 3. <u>What constitutes vacancy</u>. The appointment shall be vacant if any of the following occur:

(a.) The Commissioner ceases to reside in the area outside of the county seat of Woodbury County, Iowa (i.e. Sioux City, Iowa).

(b.) The Commissioner ceases to be a member of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

If a vacancy occurs, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors shall fill the vacancy and the person filling such vacancy shall serve out the remainder of the term of the prior Commissioner.
