427B.26 Special valuation of wind energy conversion property.

- 1. *a*. A city council or county board of supervisors may provide by ordinance for the special valuation of wind energy conversion property as provided in subsection 2. The ordinance may be enacted not less than thirty days after a public hearing on the ordinance is held. Notice of the hearing shall be published in accordance with section 331.305 in the case of a county, or section 362.3 in the case of a city. The ordinance shall only apply to property first assessed on or after the effective date of the ordinance.
- b. If in the opinion of the city council or the county board of supervisors continuation of the special valuation provided under this section ceases to be of benefit to the city or county, the city council or the county board of supervisors may repeal the ordinance authorized by this subsection. Property specially valued under this section prior to repeal of the ordinance shall continue to be valued under this section until the end of the nineteenth assessment year following the assessment year in which the property was first assessed.
- 2. In lieu of the valuation and assessment provisions in section 441.21, subsection 8, paragraphs "b", "c", and "d", and sections 428.24 to 428.29, wind energy conversion property which is first assessed for property taxation on or after January 1, 1994, and on or after the effective date of the ordinance enacted pursuant to subsection 1, shall be valued by the local assessor for property tax purposes as follows:
 - a. For the first assessment year, at zero percent of the net acquisition cost.
- b. For the second through sixth assessment years, at a percent of the net acquisition cost which rate increases by five percentage points each assessment year.
- c. For the seventh and succeeding assessment years, at thirty percent of the net acquisition cost.
- 3. The taxpayer shall file with the local assessor by February 1 of the assessment year in which the wind energy conversion property is first assessed for property tax purposes, a declaration of intent to have the property assessed at the value determined under this section in lieu of the valuation and assessment provisions in section 441.21, subsection 8, paragraphs "b", "c", and "d", and sections 428.24 to 428.29.
 - 4. For purposes of this section:
- a. "Net acquisition cost" means the acquired cost of the property including all foundations and installation cost less any excess cost adjustment.
- b. "Wind energy conversion property" means the entire wind plant including, but not limited to, a wind charger, windmill, wind turbine, tower and electrical equipment, pad mount transformers, power lines, and substation.

WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA ORDINANCE NO.____

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ASSESSMENT OF WIND ENERGY CONVERSION PROPERTY AS AUTHORIZED BY IOWA CODE CHAPTER 427B.26

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the special valuation of wind energy conversion property pursuant to lowa Code Section 427B.26.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

For use in this Ordinance, certain terms and words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

- A.) "Net Acquisition Cost" means the acquired cost of the property including all foundations and installation cost less any excess cost adjustment.
- B.) "Wind Energy Conversion Property" means the entire windplant including, but not limited to, a wind charger, windmill, wind turbine, tower and electrical equipment, pad mount transformers, power lines and substation.

SECTION 3. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH

The Board of Supervisors is authorized, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 427B.26 to provide by ordinance for special valuation of wind energy conversion property as provided in Section 4.

SECTION 4. ESTABLISHMENT

Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 427B.26, a special valuation of wind energy conversion property is allowed in lieu of the valuation assessment provisions in Iowa Code Section 441.21(8)(b) and (c), and Iowa Code Sections 428.24 to 428.29. The special valuation shall only apply to wind energy conversion property first assessed on or after the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. AMOUNT OF VALUATION

Wind energy conversion property first assessed on or after the effective date of the Ordinance shall be valued by the County Assessor for property tax purposes as follows:

- A.) For the first assessment year, at zero percent (0%) of the net acquisition cost.
- B.) For the second through sixth assessment years, at a percent of the net acquisition cost which rate increases by five percent (5%) each assessment year.
- C.) For the seventh and succeeding assessment years, at thirty percent (30%) of the net acquisition cost.

SECTION 6. DECLARATION OF SPECIAL VALUATION

The taxpayer shall file with the County Assessor by February 1 of the assessment year in which the wind energy conversion property is first assessed for property tax purposes, a declaration of intent to have the property assessed at the value determined under Section 5 in lieu of the valuation assessment provisions in Iowa Code Section 441.21(9)(b) and (c), and Iowa Code Sections 428.24 to 428.29.

If the taxpayer does not file with the County Assessor by February 1 of the assessment year for which the person files a declaration of intent to have the property assessed as provided above, then the declaration of intent shall be considered as a declaration filed for the following year.

SECTION 7. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The following reports shall be filed annually with the County Assessor by the taxpayer; in the first year, with the declaration of intent as prescribed in Section 6; and by Feb. 1 of each year thereafter.

- A.) Copy of Asset ledger sheet to IRS;
- B.) Engineering breakdown of component parts;
- C.) Tower numbering system;
- D.) Name of contact person, phone number, fax number and mailing address;
- E.) Report of all leased equipment, the name(s) of the company(s) it is leased from, and the agreement between the lessor and lessee regarding who is responsible for the property tax on the leased equipment.

SECTION 8. REPEAL OF SPECIAL VALUATION

If in the opinion of the Board of Supervisors, continuation of the special valuation provided under Sections 4 and 5 ceases to be of benefit to the County, the Board of Supervisors may repeal the Ordinance. Property specially valued in accordance with the above prior to the repeal of this Ordinance shall continue to be so valued until the end of the nineteenth (19th) assessment year following the assessment year in which the property was first assessed.

SECTION 9. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, provision, or other part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, said adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or other part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 11. PENALTY

Any person, firm or corporation violating any regulation in or any provision of this Ordinance or of any amendment of supplement thereto, shall be guilty of a simple misdemeanor which is punishable by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) or by imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days and shall be guilty of a county infraction punishable by a civil penalty of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100), or if the infraction is a repeat offense, by a civil penalty not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200). Each day that a violation occurs or is permitted by the Defendant to exist, constitutes a separate offense.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective after final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

The Woodbury County Board of Supervisors has heard from many landowners living in or owning land in Woodbury County that could potentially be affected by the two proposed private pipeline companies, and it has been unanimous from the landowners that each and every one of them is adamant that they do not want any pipelines encroaching on or through their property.

Reasons are many and varied, including:

- loss of value to their land
- loss of future use of their land for development or structure placement
- rights-of-way violations by contractors
- no financial gain from use of the land while still having to pay property assessments.

The County also owns approximately 204 acres of farm ground that has been requested for survey as a possible path for at least one pipeline company. The County has owned this property for over 100 years and has, on occasion, given thought to sale or other development in the future. It has been deemed that a pipeline will diminish the value or at minimum reduce development opportunities for the County.

This Board, as the undersigned, having been elected to represent the county residents and taxpayers, do hereby support them in their efforts to resist the pipelines proposed and ask the lowa Utilities Board to deny any and all permits and/or eminent domain declarations against the landowners in Woodbury County.

Polk County

Military Leave Proposal

BACKGROUND

Chapter 29A of the Code of lowa regulates minimum responsibilities of employers of individuals who are active in the military reserves and are required to report for training and/or active duty status. Currently Polk County allows 30 paid working days of military leave each calendar year. While on paid leave status, employees receive full pay, benefits and benefit accrual status as if they were "on the job".

- Once an employee has exhausted the 30-day allowance, they have the option
 of utilizing other paid leave (vacation, personal, etc.) to extend their pay and
 benefit packages. After all paid leave have been exhausted or if the
 employee chooses not to utilize their accumulated leave, any remaining time
 of their military activation is unpaid.
- Employees receive service credit for the period of military leave, if the
 employee returns to covered IPERS employment within 12 months after the
 military leave ends. No contributions from employers or employees are
 required to receive the service credit.
- 3. Health insurance coverage extends for the month in which the last day of paid leave is utilized. Currently employees with family coverage are offered the ability to continue family coverage, but must pay all associated premiums.

PROPOSAL

While Chapter 29A of the Code sets out minimum responsibilities for employers, it does not prohibit the expansion of benefits to employees while on active military leave. In an effort to show support for Polk County employees who have been called to active military service as a result of the current conflict with Iraq, Polk County offers the following proposal:

- This provision will cover employees called to active military service on or after February 1, 2003. The Board of Supervisors shall determine the service period (beginning and ending date) for this proposal.
- 2. This proposal would be funded from potential savings for unpaid military duty; which in essence reduces the potential savings Polk County would normally realize resulting from unpaid military leaves. This proposal also assumes that every effort will be made by offices/departments to minimize overtime or other expenses associated with covering day-to-day activities normally performed by employees who are on military leave.

- 3. Polk County will continue to pay employees on active military duty the difference between their military pay and base County compensation. The amount paid to the employee shall be the computed difference between the employees base County compensation less their standard monthly military compensation (based on rank) and housing allowance. Hazardous duty or combat pay will not be included in the computation of the employee's military compensation.
- Employees on military service must provide the employer with proof of military compensation and immediately notify the employer of any rank and/or pay status change.
- 5. Employees will not be compensated for premium hours (shift differential, overtime, etc.) during their active military status. However for the purpose of computing an employee's family insurance contribution, flex benefits will be included in the compensation package.
- Employees will also be eligible to maintain their family insurance coverage for their dependents in the same manner as currently provided for by County policy or negotiated contract. County medical and health benefits do not cover employees on active military duty.
- 7. Compensation paid during this period shall be considered covered wages for IPERS purposes and employee and County contributions will be made accordingly. For purposes of this proposal employees on military leave will be entitled to step increases as provided for in the current negotiated agreement.
- 8. Employees shall be responsible for all normal payroll taxes (federal, state, social security, etc.).
- 9. This benefit will be extended to the employees for a period not to exceed 24 months following the last day of the employees paid leave status.
- 10. These provisions do not entitle activated employees to other County benefits of such as worker's compensation for medical and benefit payments.
- 11. This proposal in no way negates the employees' right to return to County service following the end of their activation in accordance with Chapter 29A.

RESOLUTION

MOVED By brownell seconded By Mauro that the following Resolution be adopted.
WHEREAS, the Polk County currently has employees that have been called to military service following the events of September 11 th and due to the war with Iraq, and
WHEREAS, the current military leave agreement language is based on the Code of Iowa Chapter 29A which sets a minimum responsibilities of paid leave, and
WHEREAS, Polk County employees called to active duty military service are making a tremendous sacrifice on behalf of citizens of Polk County, the State of Iowa and the United States and,
WHEREAS, the families of the Polk County employees on full-time military call-up continue their sacrifice by having to live on military salary which is in some cases substantially less monthly income in addition to the potential loss of Polk County insurance benefits and,
WHEREAS, as the Polk County Sheriff has submitted a proposal whereby the pay differential and insurance will be addressed and will greatly assist those families, and
WHEREAS, there is no additional costs to Polk County for this program, and
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Polk County Board of Supervisors whole-heartedly endorses the proposal and authorizes directs Polk County Human Resources to facilitate the program.
