WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2022 and January 31, 2023 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

This property is on the north side of existing county owned property and the Little Sioux Park. The property was known as the Briese Farm and was purchased for gravel extraction. The conservation department would have first right of refusal to purchase upon completion of mining.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into between the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors, Woodbury County Conservation Department, and the Woodbury County Secondary Roads Department. This agreement is a statement of intent and agreement by the Board of Supervisors and the Woodbury County Conservation Board for the future use of the Briese farm, purchased by the Secondary Road Department for the production of gravel. The subject property is described as follows:

Lots Three (3), Four (4) and Five (5) of Briese Addition, a minor Subdivision to Woodbury County, Iowa, and Parcel C: A parcel of land located in Government Lot Ten (10) of Section 1, T88N, R43W of the 5th P.M., Woodbury County, Iowa, and being more particularly described as follows; Commencing at the SW Corner of said Government Lot 10; easterly along the southerly line of said government lot on an assumed bearing of S89°03'01"E (with all subsequent bearings referenced therefrom) for a distance of 365.00 feet to a point on the centerline of Iowa State Highway No. 31 and the Point of Beginning; thence N30°10'58"E along Highway No. 31 centerline for a distance of 1,100.95 feet; thence continuing along said centerline along a curve to the right, concave southeasterly, having a radius of 1,146.00 feet and a central angle of 23°05'33" on a chord bearing of N41°43'44"E for a chord distance of 458.76 feet to a point on the northerly line of Government Lot 10; thence S89°32'27"E along the northerly line of said government lot for a distance of 78.95 feet to the NE corner of Government Lot 10; thence S00°05'42"E along the easterly line of said government lot for a distance of 1,309.02 feet to the SE corner of Government Lot 10; thence N89°03'01"W along the southerly line of said government lot for a distance of 940.12 feet to a point on the centerline of Iowa State Highway No. 31 and the Point of Beginning.

The parties hereby state and agree:

WHEREAS; Woodbury County Secondary Road Department has purchased approximately seventy seven (77) acres in Section 1 of Kedron Township adjacent to Highway 31 and on the north side of existing county owned property and Little Sioux Park, known as the Briese Farm, and purchased for gravel extraction,

WHEREAS; This site was previously used as a gravel pit and the Secondary Road Department will extract available gravel from this site over an indeterminate period of years.,

WHEREAS; It has been determined that Woodbury County Conservation Department has an interest in this property at the completion of the gravel extraction process with plans to expand and enhance its park facilities at Little Sioux Park and along the Little Sioux River,

THEREFORE; the parties agree to the following:

Woodbury County Conservation will reimburse the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department 50% of the cost of the property surrounding and including the gravel pit at the Briese Farm, comprising 35 acres more or less that was purchased for \$7500 per acre. The total buy out of this property by Conservation totals \$131,250, upon submittal of a request for payment at the completion of mining on the property. The county road department will remove stockpiles, spread suitable onsite soil on top of production areas and shape the land around the lake at the completion of gravel operations and storage. The county conservation department will prepare, seed, and if necessary, fence areas around the lake upon transfer of the site.

Woodbury County Conservation will have the option and right of first refusal for the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department to transfer the management of the quarry and farm property from the balance of the Briese Farm consisting of 41 acres more or less and operated in the interim as farm property at the cost of \$7500 per acre or \$307,500 which may be paid in installments over up to a 5-year period at no interest. By agreement, the option may be exercised up to 5 years after completion of mining operations on the Briese Farm property. Should Conservation decide they do not want to exercise this option to assume management of the property, the Board of Supervisors and Secondary Road Department may sell or otherwise purpose the farm ground and reimburse the Secondary Road Department the proceeds of the transaction.

AN ACT

RELATING TO COUNTY ZONING PROCEDURES, AND INCLUDING EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICABILITY PROVISIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 335.2, Code 2020, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraphs:

<u>NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH</u>. A county shall not require an application, an approval, or the payment of a fee in order for an ordinance to be deemed inapplicable to land, farm barns, farm outbuildings, or other buildings or structures that are primarily adapted for use for agricultural purposes under this section.

<u>NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH</u>. Land, farm houses, farm barns, farm outbuildings, or other buildings or structures may qualify under this section independently or in combination with other agricultural uses. Land enrolled in a soil or water conservation program shall be considered land primarily adapted for use for agricultural purposes under this section.

Sec. 2. Section 335.5, subsection 4, Code 2020, is amended to read as follows:

4. a. A comprehensive plan recommended for adoption <u>or</u> <u>amendment</u> by the zoning commission established under section 335.8, may be adopted by the board of supervisors. <u>The</u> <u>board of supervisors shall not hold a public hearing or take</u> <u>action on the recommendation until it has received the zoning</u> commission's final report containing the recommendation.

b. Before taking action on the recommendation, the board of supervisors shall hold a public hearing at which parties in interest and citizens shall have an opportunity to be heard. Notice of the time and place of the hearing shall be published as provided in section 331.305.

<u>c.</u> The board of supervisors may amend a proposed comprehensive plan <u>or amendment</u> prior to adoption. The board of supervisors shall publish notice of the meeting at which the comprehensive plan <u>or amendment</u> will be considered for adoption. The notice shall be published as provided in section 331.305.

b. <u>d.</u> Following its adoption, copies of the comprehensive plan <u>or amended plan</u> shall be sent or made available to neighboring counties, cities within the county, the council of governments or regional planning commission where the county is located, and public libraries within the county.

c. Following its adoption, a comprehensive plan may be amended by the board of supervisors at any time.

Sec. 3. Section 335.8, subsection 1, Code 2020, is amended to read as follows:

1. In order to avail itself of the powers conferred by this chapter, the board of supervisors shall appoint a commission, a majority of whose members shall reside within the county but outside the corporate limits of any city, consisting of eligible electors, as defined in section 39.3, who reside within the area regulated by the county zoning ordinance, to be known as the county zoning commission, to. The commission may recommend the boundaries of the various original districts and appropriate regulations and restrictions to be enforced therein in the districts. Such The commission shall, with due diligence, prepare a preliminary report and hold public hearings thereon on the preliminary report before submitting its the commission's final report; and the. The board of supervisors shall not hold its public hearings or take action until it has received the final report of such the commission. After the adoption of such the regulations, restrictions, and boundaries of districts, the zoning commission may, from time to time, recommend to the board of supervisors amendments, supplements, changes, or modifications. The commission's

Sec. 4. Section 335.11, Code 2020, is amended to read as follows:

335.11 Membership of board.

The board of adjustment shall consist of five members, a majority of whom shall reside within the county but outside the corporate limits of any city who are eligible electors, as defined in section 39.3, and who reside within the area regulated by the county zoning ordinance, each to be appointed for a term of five years, excepting that when the board shall first be created one member shall be appointed for a term of five years, one for a term of four years, one for a term of three years, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of one year. Members shall be removable for cause by the appointing authority upon written charges and after public hearing. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term of any member whose term becomes vacant.

Sec. 5. CODE EDITOR DIRECTIVE. The Code editor may number unnumbered paragraphs within section 335.2, as amended in this Act, in accordance with established section hierarchy and correct internal references in the Code and in any enacted Iowa Acts, as necessary.

Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

Sec. 7. APPLICABILITY. The following applies to comprehensive plans and amendments to comprehensive plans proposed or adopted on or after July 1, 2020:

The section of this Act amending section 335.5, subsection 4.

Sec. 8. APPLICABILITY.

1. The following apply on and after the effective date of this Act to members of county zoning commissions and county boards of adjustment holding office on or after that date:

a. The section of this Act amending section 335.8, subsection 1.

b. The section of this Act amending section 335.11.

2. If a current member of a county zoning commission or county board of adjustment does not meet the eligibility

ARTICLE 2: ADMINISTRATION

Section 2.01: Administrative Officials and Bodies

- 1. **Planning and Zoning Department**. Within the Planning and Zoning Department, the Planning and Zoning Director (also called the Zoning Director throughout this ordinance) or his/her designee shall be the administrative official with primary responsibility for carrying out the provisions of this ordinance. The roles of the Zoning Director include:
 - A. Administration and enforcement of the development regulations, including this ordinance, including:
 - (1) Interpretation of the provisions of this ordinance;
 - (2) Coordination of the review processes for development-related applications by the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Board of Adjustment, and the Board of Supervisors as provided in this ordinance;
 - (3) Administrative review processes (i.e., zoning certificates, sign permits, site plan approvals, etc.) as provided in this ordinance;
 - (4) Enforcement of the requirements of this ordinance as provided in Section 1.05 of this ordinance;
 - (5) Maintenance of public records related to administration and enforcement of this ordinance.
 - B. Serve as Secretary to the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Adjustment, including:
 - (1) Provide staff reports on issues and applications that come before the Commission and the Board of Adjustment; and
 - (2) Maintain records of the deliberations and decisions of the Commission and the Board of Adjustment.
 - C. Provide staff services for the development and maintenance of the County's general planning processes.
- 2. Other County Officials and Departments. Every department and employee of the County shall cooperate in the administration and enforcement of this ordinance.
- **3.** Board of Supervisors. As an exercise of the powers and duties conferred upon the Board of Supervisors by the Iowa Code, they shall:
 - A. Establish policies for physical development of Woodbury County, including the General Development Plan;
 - B. Adopt legislation, including this ordinance and any amendments thereto related to effective management of the physical development of Woodbury County;
 - C. Appoint the members of the Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Adjustment; and
 - D. Appropriate funds, establish fees and levy taxes to provide for the costs of administering the provisions of this ordinance.
- 4. Planning and Zoning Commission.

- A. Establishment. Pursuant to Chapter 335 of the 2007 Code of Iowa, a Planning and Zoning Commission, consisting of five members, as previously established, is hereby continued.
- B. Appointment and membership
 - (1) The members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years. Terms of the commissioners shall be staggered so that no more than two memberships expire on December 31 of any year. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner for the remainder of an unexpired term.
 - (2) Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall be qualified resident electors of the county and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the county. Not less than three of the five members of the Commission shall be residents of the unincorporated area outside any city.
 - (3) Members of the Planning and Zoning Commission shall serve without compensation.
 - (4) A member of the Planning and Zoning Commission may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Commission, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Commission, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the commission including failure to attend six or more regular meetings in any twelve month period, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of procedure. The Commission shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, rules of procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and duties. The Planning and Zoning Commission shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To prepare and recommend to the Board of Supervisors, a general plan for the county and amendments thereto;
 - (2) To review and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on any proposed dedication, vacation or partial vacation of public rights-of way or public easements within the county, except as provided otherwise in either this ordinance or the Iowa Code;
 - (3) To review and make recommendations on preliminary and final subdivision plats of land located within the county as provided in the County's Subdivision Regulations;
 - (4) To initiate as it deems appropriate and in the public interest, amendments to the text or the zoning district map of this ordinance;
 - (5) To review, conduct hearings as required, and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on amendments to the text or the zoning district map of this ordinance, including planned developments; and

(6) To carry out studies and investigations and to make recommendations on other projects and issues related to the development of the county as may be requested by the Board of Supervisors.

5. Board of Adjustment.

- A. Establishment. Pursuant to Chapter 335 of the 2007 Iowa Code, a Board of Adjustment, consisting of five members, as previously established, is hereby continued.
- B. Appointment and membership.
 - (1) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years. Terms of the Board of Adjustment members shall be staggered so that no more than two memberships expire on December 31 of any year. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner for the remainder of an unexpired term.
 - (2) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall be qualified resident electors of the county and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the county. Not less than three of the five members of the Board of Adjustment shall be residents of the unincorporated area outside any city.
 - (3) Board of Adjustment members shall serve without compensation.
 - (4) Any member of the Board of Adjustment may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Board of Adjustment, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Board of Adjustment, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the Board of Adjustment, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of Procedure. The Board of Adjustment shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, rules of procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and duties. The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, interpretation, or determination made by the Zoning Director in the enforcement of this ordinance.
 - (2) To hear and decide by granting or denying a variance from the provisions of this ordinance where unique conditions would result in undue hardship or practical difficulties if strict enforcement of those provisions were required. Such variances shall not be contrary to the public interest, and are to assure that the spirit of the ordinance is preserved and substantial justice is done.
 - (3) To hear, review and decide on requests for conditional use permits that are authorized by the provisions of the zoning ordinance.
 - (4) To hear, review and decide on appeals, variances and conditional uses within the flood plain management overlay zones subject to concurrence by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources as required.

- A. Establishment. Pursuant to Chapter 335 of the Code of Iowa, a County Zoning Commission, consisting of five members, as previously established, is hereby continued.
- B. Appointment and Membership.
 - (1) The members of the Zoning Commission shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years. Members may serve up to 2 terms on the Commission, whether the terms are successive or not. Terms of the Commissioners shall be staggered so that no more than two memberships expire on December 31 of any year. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner for the remainder of an unexpired term. Commissioners with past service on the Zoning Commission prior to <u>(insert effective date)</u>, regardless of the number of terms or years served, shall be eligible for appointment and membership on the Zoning Commission for up to 2 additional five-year terms.
 - (2) Members of the Zoning Commission shall consist of eligible electors, as defined by Iowa Code section 39.3, who reside within the area regulated by the County Zoning Ordinance and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the County. Iowa law requires all appointive boards, commissions, committees, and councils of a political subdivision to be gender balanced by using a fair and unbiased method of selecting the best qualified applicants. The Board of Supervisors may appoint any qualified applicant, regardless of gender, after making a three-month good faith effort to appoint a gender balanced Commission.
 - (3) Members of the Zoning Commission shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual expenses incurred while performing their official duties, which shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
 - (4) Any member of the Zoning Commission may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Commission, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Commission, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the Commission, including failure to attend 50% or more regular meetings in any twelve month period, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of Procedure. The Commission shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, Rules of Procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and Duties. The Zoning Commission shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To recommend the boundaries of the various districts and appropriate regulations and restrictions to be enforced in the districts within the area regulated by the County Zoning Ordinance.
 - (2) To, with due diligence, prepare a preliminary report and hold public hearings on

the preliminary report before submitting the Commission's final report to the Board of Supervisors as provided in the County Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations.

- (3) To recommend to the Board of Supervisors amendments, supplements, changes or modifications to the text or Zoning District Map of the County Zoning Ordinance. The Commission's report and any recommendations may include a proposed ordinance or amendments to an ordinance.
- (4) To recommend to the Board of Supervisors, the adoption of a comprehensive plan pursuant to Iowa Code Section 335.5, or amendments thereto.
- (5) To contract with professional consultants, regional planning commissions, the economic development authority, or the federal government, for local planning assistance, with the approval of the Board of Supervisors.

- A. Establishment. Pursuant to Chapter 335 of the Code of Iowa, a County Board of Adjustment, consisting of five members, as previously established, is hereby continued.
- B. Appointment and Membership.
 - (1) The members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years.  - (2) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall consist of eligible electors, as defined by Iowa Code section 39.3, who reside within the area regulated by the County Zoning Ordinance and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the County. Iowa law requires all appointive boards, commissions, committees, and councils of a political subdivision to be gender balanced by using a fair and unbiased method of selecting the best qualified applicants. The Board of Supervisors may appoint any qualified applicant, regardless of gender, after making a three-month good faith effort to appoint a gender balanced Board.
 - (3) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual expenses incurred while performing their official duties, which shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
 - (4) Any member of the Board of Adjustment may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Board, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Board, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the Board, including failure to attend 50% or more regular meetings in any twelve-month period, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of Procedure. The Board of Adjustment shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, rules of procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and Duties. The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination made by an administrative official in the enforcement of Iowa Code Chapter 335, or of any ordinance adopted pursuant thereto.

- (2) To hear and decide special exceptions to the terms of the ordinance upon which such Board is required to pass under such ordinance.
- (3) To authorize upon appeal, in specific cases, such variance from the terms of the ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions a literal enforcement of the provisions of the ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of the ordinance shall be observed, and substantial justice done.
