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Agreement for Electronic Provision of Woodbury County Recorder's Office Public Record Images

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), effective as of the date the last Party signs this Agreement (the "Effective Date"), is made and entered into by and between Zillow, Inc. ("Zillow") and Woodbury County, Iowa, a political subdivision of the State of Iowa having its principal offices at 620 Douglas St., Sioux City, IA 51101 ("County"). Zillow and County are each individually referred to herein as a "Party" and jointly as the "Parties."

1. RECITALS:

- 1.1 County's recorded documents are stored in a digitized image format in County's electronic document management system. Certain recorded documents are public records under lowa's Open Records law.
- 1.2 Zillow desires to obtain the digitized images on an ongoing basis and also possibly obtain certain historical digitized image files.
- 1.3 Zillow desires to obtain and County desires to provide the Services, as described herein, to Zillow in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto do hereby mutually promise, covenant and agree as follows:

2. SERVICES.

County shall provide electronic access to Zillow to County's recorded digitized images subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. County shall have the sole discretion to determine the frequency, method, manner and location of the performance of its Services under this Agreement. County may, at its convenience and sole discretion, suspend or terminate electronic access to the digitized images. Zillow's use of digitized images obtained under this Agreement shall comply with applicable state and federal law.

COMPENSATION.

Access to images on an ongoing basis in a format determined by County shall be provided at no charge to Zillow. However, Zillow shall pay the reasonable actual costs for:

- 1.) Provision of historical digitized images;
- 2.) Data in a specific format requested by Zillow.

No fees shall be incurred under this Agreement without prior authorization from Zillow. Zillow shall prepay any fees due under this Agreement prior to County performing the Services.

4. PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION.

Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 331.606A, "personally identifiable information" means one or more of the following specific unique identifiers when combined with an individual's name: (1) social security number. (2) Checking, savings, or share account number, credit, debit, or charge card number. Digitized images provided under this agreement have be redacted through a system created by the Iowa County Recorders Association. However, no redaction system has been shown to be completely accurate. Any personally identifiable information which may be found on a digitized image is confidential. If Zillow discovers any personally identifiable information in an image provided under this agreement, Zillow shall immediately notify the Woodbury County Recorder's Office so that the information can be restricted or redacted. Additionally, Zillow is expressly prohibited from distributing, sharing, or publicizing any personally identifiable information which may be found.

5. DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTY:

ZILLOW AGREES THAT WOODBURY COUNTY HAS MADE NO EXPRESS WARRANTIES, ORAL OR WRITTEN, TO ZILLOW REGARDING THE PRODUCTS AND DATA AND THAT THE PRODUCTS AND DATA ARE BEING PROVIDED TO ZILLOW "AS IS" WITHOUT WARRANTY OF ANY KIND. WOODBURY COUNTY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESSED, IMPLIED, OR STATUTORY, INCLUDING, BUT WITHOUT LIMITATION, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF NONINFRINGEMENT OF THIRD PARTY RIGHTS, MERCHANTABILITY, SECURITY, AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.

6. INDEMNITY AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:

6.1 INDEMNITY

Zillow agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Woodbury County, lowa and its officials, employees, contractors, suppliers, and agents harmless from any and all claims and/or demands, including reasonable attorneys' fees, made by any third party in connection with or arising out of (a) any use or misuse by Zillow (or anyone using your account) of the Services or data; (b) any act or omission to act by Zillow related to this Agreement; or (c) harm of any kind caused to any third party in any way involving the Agreement.

IN NO EVENT WILL WOODBURY COUNTY'S LIABILITY FOR ANY CLAIM, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT, OR ANY OTHER THEORY OF LIABILITY, EXCEED THE FEE PAID BY ZILLOW, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, IF THE RELEVANT PRODUCT WAS PROVIDED TO ZILLOW AT NO CHARGE ZILLOW AGREES WOODBURY COUNTY SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO ZILLOW FOR ANY DAMAGES.

This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect until terminated as provided in this section. Either party may terminate this agreement as follows:

- 7.1 Upon failure or neglect of Zillow to pay any undisputed amounts payable pursuant to this Agreement when due, if default continues for thirty (30) days after written notice to Zillow;
- 7.2 Upon the failure of either Party to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement if continuing for ten (10) days after written notice to such breaching Party;
 - 7.3 For the convenience of either Party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

If either Party shall breach the terms of this Agreement, the other Party shall reasonably and in good faith attempt to reduce and mitigate damages and injuries. County shall be paid for all work completed prior to termination of this Agreement. The payment, indemnity, and disclaimer of warranty provisions of this Agreement shall survive termination of the Agreement.

8. MISCELLANEOUS:

8.1 SOFTWARE TERMS OF USE AND ELECTRONIC ACCESS.

Zillow agrees to be bound by the applicable Terms of Use of any software used to provide electronic access to the digitized images. The computer system is for authorized use only. Users have no explicit or implicit expectation of privacy. Any or all uses of this system and all data on this system may be monitored, recorded, or audited and disclosed to authorized personnel and authorized officials of other agencies.

By using this system, the user consents to such disclosure at the discretion of authorized personnel. Unauthorized or improper use of this system may result in termination of the contract, and civil and criminal penalties.

8.2 SEVERABILITY

In the event of invalidity of any provision of this Agreement, the Parties agree that such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement.

8.3 GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement will be governed by Iowa law, without regard to choice of law principles. Venue for litigation shall be in Woodbury County, Iowa.

8.4 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This is the entire agreement between Zillow and Woodbury County, which supersedes any prior agreement, whether written or oral, and all other communications between Woodbury County and Zillow relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

Nothing expressed or implied in this Agreement is intended, or shall be construed, to confer upon or give any person or entity other than Zillow and Woodbury County any rights or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement. Zillow may not assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of Woodbury County. This Agreement shall be binding on Zillow and your affiliates, employees, agents and permitted assigns.

8.5 RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

All rights not expressly granted in this Agreement are reserved by Woodbury County.

8.6 AUTHORITY AND APPROVAL

Each Party has full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each had been properly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement. Each Party further acknowledges that it has read this Agreement and agrees to be bound by it.

- **170. Use.** The type of activity or purpose for which a parcel of land and/or structure is arranged, designed, or intended, or for which it may be occupied.
- **171. Use, Accessory.** A use that serves or is subordinate in purpose to another allowed use on the same lot.
- **172. Use, Allowed.** A principal, conditional or accessory use that may be established in conformance with the regulations of the zoning district in which it is located.
- **173.** Use, Conditional. A use that is allowed in conformance with the regulations of the zoning district in which it is located, if and only if, approved by the Board of Adjustment as provided in subsection 2.02-9.
- **174.** Use, Principal. A use that is allowed as a matter of right in conformance with the regulations of the zoning district in which it is located.

Section 2.02.9 - Conditional Uses

9. Conditional Uses

- A. Authority. The Board of Adjustment shall hear and decide upon requests for a conditional use pursuant to subsection 2.01-5.D subject to the procedures, standards and conditions set out in this subsection.
- B. Purpose. Conditional uses are those uses having special or unique characteristics that require a careful review of their location, design, configuration, and impacts to determine the desirability of permitting their establishment on any given site. Conditional uses may or may not be appropriate in a particular location.

C. Filing.

- (1) Right to apply for conditional uses. An application for a conditional use may be filed by the owner of, or any other person with a contractual interest in, the subject property.
- (2) Form of application. An application for a conditional use shall be submitted to the zoning director and shall include at least the following information:
 - (a) The name and address of the property owner and the applicant;
 - (b) The address, if any, and the legal description of the property;
 - (c) The current zoning district classification;
 - (d) A specific description of the proposed conditional use including the section of this title for which a conditional use is authorized;
 - (e) A map, drawn to scale, showing the subject property, all structures and other improvements, with the proposed conditional use identified;
 - (f) Statements in response to the criteria and standards for approval of conditional uses in subsection 2.02-9. F below.
- (3) Fee. A nonrefundable filing fee, as established by resolution of the Board of Supervisors to defray administrative costs, shall accompany the application for a conditional use.
- (4) A certified abstractor's listing of the names and mailing addresses of all owners of real property lying within 500 feet from the subject property, except that in the case of a conditional use to allow construction of an airport, a sanitary landfill, or a telecommunication tower as provided in subsection 5.05-3, the abstractor's list shall be for all owners of real property located within one mile of the subject property.
- D. Stay of proceedings. A request for a conditional use shall have the effect of a temporary suspension of enforcement of the provisions of these regulations that are the subject of the conditional use until the conclusion of the conditional use process, unless the zoning director certifies that the suspension may cause imminent peril to life or property.
- E. Review and decision-making process.
 - (1) Review by the planning and zoning commission. The planning and zoning commission shall review the application for a conditional use and report its findings and recommendations to the Board of Adjustment before their public hearing on the application. In their review, the planning commission shall consider each of the standards and other considerations for review of conditional uses as specified in subsection 2.02-9. F below.
 - (2) Action by the Board of Adjustment.
 - (a) Hearing required. After receiving the report of the planning and zoning commission, the Board of Adjustment shall conduct a public hearing on the variance request in accordance with subsection 2.02-1. B.
 - (b) Notification. Public notification of the Board of Adjustment hearing on the conditional use request shall be as required by subsection 2.02-1. B(1).

- Such notices shall provide information on the time, date and location of the hearing and a brief description of the requested conditional use.
- (c) Decision. Within 35 days after the public hearing, the Board of Adjustment shall approve, approve with conditions or limitations, or deny the requested conditional use. The Board of Adjustment shall set forth findings of fact addressing the points enumerated in subsection 2.02-9. F below as a basis for its action.
- F. Requirements for conditional uses.
 - (1) Standards. In order to grant a conditional use, the Board of Adjustment must determine that:
 - (a) The conditional use requested is authorized as a conditional use in the zoning district within which the property is located and that any specific conditions or standards described as part of that authorization have been or will be satisfied.
 - (b) The proposed use and development will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of this ordinance and the goals, objectives and standards of the general plan.
 - (c) The proposed use and development will not have a substantial or undue adverse effect upon adjacent property, the character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, utility facilities, and other factors affecting the public health, safety and general welfare.
 - (d) The proposed use and development will be located, designed, constructed and operated in such a manner that it will be compatible with the immediate neighborhood and will not interfere with the orderly use, development and improvement of surrounding property.
 - (e) Essential public facilities and services will adequately serve the proposed use or development.
 - (f) The proposed use or development will not result in unnecessary adverse effects upon any significant natural, scenic or historic features of the subject property or adjacent properties.
 - (2) Other considerations. In its review of conditional use requests, the Board of Adjustment shall consider whether, and to what extent:
 - (a) The proposed use or development, at the particular location is necessary or desirable to provide a service or facility that is in the public interest or will contribute to the general welfare of the neighborhood or community.
 - (b) All possible efforts, including building and site design, landscaping and screening have been undertaken to minimize any adverse effects of the proposed use or development.

G. Limitations.

(1) The Board of Adjustment may set a time limit for establishment of the use authorized by a conditional use permit as a condition for approval. If the use has not been established within that time, the Board of Adjustment may consider revocation of the conditional use permit.

ADMINISTRATION

- (2) If the use or development for which the conditional use permit was granted ceases to exist for a period of ninety days, the certificate of occupancy shall be terminated. The use or development shall not be reinstated unless the Board of Adjustment issues another conditional use permit.
- H. Appeal of the actions of the Board of Adjustment. Any interested party may appeal a decision of the Board of Adjustment as provided by the Code of Iowa. Such an appeal suspends the effect of the action of the Board of Adjustment until the appeal has been resolved.
