BYLAWS OF

THE WOODBURY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

ARTICLE I Name

The name of this statutorily created assembly is the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

ARTICLE II Purpose

The purpose of this assembly is to perform the duties of the Board of Supervisors according to the Iowa Code.

ARTICLE III Members

There are five members of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors. They are elected at large from Woodbury County, Iowa but with equal-population district residence requirements.

ARTICLE IV Officers

Section 1. Officers and Duties. The officers shall be a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Clerk to the Board. These officers shall perform the duties as prescribed by Iowa Code, these bylaws and by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Board in descending order.

- **a.** Chairperson. The Chairperson shall preside at all the meetings of the Board during the year. The Chairperson shall make all committee assignments to committees recognized in these bylaws. The Chairperson shall set the tentative agenda for all meetings of the Board. The Chairperson shall oversee the daily operations of county administration while acting within the policies established by the Board. Subject to approval of the Board, the Chairperson shall be authorized, with a Board approved committee form, to establish special purpose committees as needed.
- **b. Vice Chairperson.** The Vice Chairperson shall serve during the absence of the Chairperson and be the presiding officer when the Chairperson participates by electronic means.
- **c. Clerk to the Board.** The Auditor and Recorder or the designee of the Auditor and Recorder shall serve as Clerk to the Board *ex officio*. The Clerk to the Board shall be recognized as the parliamentarian for all meetings of the Board.

Section 2. <u>Time, Nomination Procedure, Method of Election and Term of Office.</u> The election of The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall occur at the first meeting in each year. Nominations shall be made from the floor and elections shall be by roll call vote. A temporary chair shall be elected to preside over the election of the Chairperson. The Chairperson's term shall begin immediately. The Chairperson shall preside over the election of the Vice Chairperson.

ARTICLE V Meetings

- **Section 1.** Compliance with Open Meetings Law. All meetings of the Board shall be scheduled and conducted in compliance with Chapter 21 of the Code of Iowa and other applicable law.
- **Section 2.** <u>First Meeting.</u> The Board shall meet on the first day of January which is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.
- **Section 3.** Regular Meetings. The Board shall hold regular meetings on each Tuesday of the year unless canceled or postponed by a majority of the Board.
- **Section 4.** <u>Special Meetings.</u> The Board may hold special meetings from time to time as required to conduct the business of the county. A special meeting may be called by the Chairperson or by the Vice Chairperson in the absence of the Chairperson.
- **Section 5.** <u>Agenda.</u> Items to be considered for a meeting shall be submitted in a format prescribed by the Board. All items requested for Board action shall be submitted in the form of a proposed written motion. Any member of the Board may direct the Chairperson to place an information or discussion item on the agenda of a subsequent meeting. The Chairperson shall place an action item on the agenda of a subsequent meeting when directed by a majority of the Board.
- **Section 6. Quorum and Consensus.** A quorum and consensus shall consist of three members of the Board. A quorum is required to transact the official business of the County.
- **Section 7.** <u>Majority Required.</u> Unless where otherwise provided by law, a majority of the quorum present is required for the adoption of any matter to come before the Board.
- **Section 8.** <u>Manner of Acting.</u> Any question to come before the Board shall be in the form of a motion made by a member and shall require a second for consideration. Remarks by members shall be limited to ten minutes unless an extension is granted by a majority of the Board. A member or any other elected official of the county shall address the Chairperson and confine their remarks to the question before the Board and shall be respectful of other elected officials and avoid referencing or questioning the motives of another elected official.

- **Section 9.** <u>Roll Call Votes.</u> The Chairperson shall order a roll call vote when requested by a member. The roll shall be called alphabetically except the Chairperson shall be called last. If a member is not ready to vote, the member may pass and shall be called upon again after the roll has been completely called and shall vote or abstain.
- **Section 10.** Effect of Abstention. When a member abstains due to a conflict of interest, the vote of the Board shall be computed on the basis of the number of members not disqualified by reason of conflict of interest. However, at least three (3) members eligible to vote are required for a quorum on any matter. Abstentions that are not due to a conflict of interest shall be counted as a "no" vote.
- Section 11. <u>Electronic Participation</u>. A member of the Board may participate in a meeting by electronic means only in circumstances where participation in person is impossible or impractical. Any member participating electronically shall be connected by a speaker phone, video conference, or other device or software, so that the public can hear any discussion by that member. The vote of any member participating electronically must be made public at the meeting and the minutes of the meeting shall include sufficient information to indicate the vote of each member participating.

ARTICLE VI Committees

- **Section 1.** <u>Committees Required by Iowa Code.</u> All Board representation on committees required by the Iowa Code shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- Section 2. <u>Committees Created by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 28E.</u> All Board representation on committees required by 28E agreements shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board and the requirements of the 28E agreement.
- **Section 3.** Committees Created by Agreement. All Board representation on committees required by agreement shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- **Section 4.** <u>Committees Created for Special Purpose.</u> All Board representation on committees required for a special purpose shall be appointed by the Chairperson subject to approval of the Board.
- Section 5. <u>Attendance at Committees Created Under Article VI.</u> Attendance by members of the Board at committees created under Article VI of these bylaws shall be limited to those approved by the Board as committee representatives unless the committee meeting has also been posted as a special meeting of the Board of Supervisors. If a Board member is unable to attend a committee meeting that they are assigned to, that Board member may arrange to have a fellow Board member attend the meeting in their place after notification of the Board Chairperson.

ARTICLE VII Conflicts of Interest

Except as otherwise provided by law, members shall not have an interest, direct or indirect, in any contract, or job of work, or material, or the profits thereof, or services to be furnished or performed for Woodbury County. Members should avoid any action that would result in, or create the impression of, using public office for private gain, giving preferential treatment to any person, or losing impartiality in conducting county business.

ARTICLE VIII Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the most current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Iowa Code, these bylaws and any special rules of order that the Board may adopt.

ARTICLE IX Bylaws

Section 1. <u>Adoption of Bylaws.</u> Bylaws shall be adopted at the first meeting in each year following a General Election.

Section 2. <u>Amendment of Bylaws.</u> These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board with a majority vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

RESOLUTION #13,524 RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT OF THE LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Woodbury County, State of Iowa (the "County") and the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority (the "Authority") have heretofore entered into that certain Lease Agreement dated September 1, 2020 (the "Lease"); and

WHEREAS, it is now deemed necessary and advisable that the County should provide for the authorization of a First Amendment to the Lease (the "Amendment") with the Authority; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 346.27 provides that the Authority shall have and exercise certain public and essential governmental powers and functions including the right to lease all or any part of a building to an incorporating unit upon rental terms agreed upon between the Authority and the incorporating unit; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and County have negotiated the form of a proposed Amendment, which is intended to clarify that after the Commencement Date (as defined in the Lease) the County may place partitions, fixtures, furniture, equipment and make improvements and other non-structural alterations in the interior of the Facility (as defined in the Lease) at its own expense and that the County will own all such partitions, fixtures, furniture, equipment and improvements; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by law, this Board has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to approve and authorize execution of the Amendment and has considered the extent of objections received from residents or property owners as to said proposed Amendment; and, accordingly the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. That the performance by the County of its obligations under the Amendment, under the terms set forth in the Amendment, be and is hereby declared to be an appropriate and necessary undertaking of the County pursuant to Section 346.27, Code of Iowa.

Section 2. That the form and content of the Amendment, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference, be and the same hereby are in all respects authorized, approved and confirmed, and the Chairperson and the County Auditor be and they hereby are authorized, empowered and directed to execute, attest, seal and deliver the Amendment for and on behalf of the County in substantially the form and content now before this meeting, but with such changes, modifications, additions or deletions therein as shall be approved by such officers, and that from and after the execution and delivery of the Amendment, the Chairperson and the County Auditor are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Amendment as executed.

5. Board of Adjustment.

- A. Establishment. Pursuant to Chapter 335 of the Code of Iowa, a County Board of Adjustment, consisting of five members, as previously established, is hereby continued.
- B. Appointment and membership.
 - (1) The members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years. Terms of the Board shall be staggered so that no more than two memberships expire on December 31 of any year. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner for the remainder of an unexpired term.
 - (2) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall consist of eligible electors, as defined by Iowa Code section 39.3, who reside within the area regulated by the County Zoning Ordinance and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the County. Iowa law requires all appointive boards, commissions, committees, and councils of a political subdivision to be gender balanced by using a fair and unbiased method of selecting the best qualified applicants. The Board of Supervisors may appoint any qualified applicant, regardless of gender, after making a three-month good faith effort to appoint a gender balanced Board.
 - (3) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual expenses incurred while performing their official duties, which shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
 - (4) Any member of the Board of Adjustment may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Board, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Board, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the Board, including failure to attend 50% or more regular meetings in any twelve-month period, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of Procedure. The Board of Adjustment shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, rules of procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and Duties. The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination made by an administrative official in the enforcement of Iowa Code Chapter 335, or of any ordinance adopted pursuant thereto.
 - (2) To hear and decide special exceptions to the terms of the ordinance upon which such Board is required to pass under such ordinance.
 - (3) To authorize upon appeal, in specific cases, such variance from the terms of the ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions a literal enforcement of the provisions of the ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of the ordinance shall be observed, and substantial justice done.

Employment:

Currently I have been retired and helping my 20 year old son as a beginning farmer take over the family farm. I was the CFO for Interstate Powder Coatings and College Products, both of Sioux City. I farmed and was an Ag Loan Officer for Firstar Bank, Sioux City and Cooperative Credit Company, Sioux Center. At Firstar my primary responsibility were large cattle feeding accounts. My first loan was \$3 million on up to \$30 million. At Cooperative Credit my partner and I started and managed a finance company for originally 6 cooperatives, in 2 years I was asked to present our company to 60 different Coop Board of Directors and 40 of those Coops became members of Cooperative Credit, which is currently over \$100 million in assets. Coopertive Credit loans money directly to farmers for short and intermediate-term farm financing needs through member cooperatives. I went through banking backwards, starting with large loans and then going to smaller loans. Prior to that I worked as a cattle agent for a firm at The Sioux City Stockards and I was the night Safety Director for Direct Transit, responsible for accidents, overages/shortages, license and permit issues for 1500 trucks.

While working for Cooperative Credit, my territory was essentially everything west of I35 in lowa. That opportunity put me in a lot of different communities with many different dynamics, working with both community leaders, businesses, and farmers. Many times I was negotiating between other lenders, the borrower and our member cooperatives. This experience gives me a working knowledge of what other communities have tried, what works, what doesn't work, but most of all, it made me appreciate my home community that much more. We are very fortunate in Woodbury County to have such a diversity of people, industries, geography, and opportunities. Two counties to the north of us we have one of the wealthiest counties in the state, they have the smallest average farm size in the state and they are a large net importer of corn. One county south of us we have one of the poorest counties in the state with the largest average farm size. It is one of the largest corn exporting counties in the state and the county seat which sits on I29 has the distinction as the poorest town in the state. The people are always the key to success but good local government can be a vital partner in success as well.

My goal is to continue and hopefully expand the relationship between the citizens and the government of Woodbury County. Our citizens need to know that their opinions are always heard, considered and valued. When people feel that their voices are heard, they are more willing to engage in both government and business within our county. They are more willing to start businesses or expand existing businesses when they feel confident that the local government is intent on fairly representing all citizens.





If a county chooses to use the master matrix to evaluate applications for construction permits for large animal confinement operations, the board of supervisors must adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" annually.

According the DNR's administrative rules, if the board of supervisors wants to use the master matrix between February 1, 2023 and January 31, 2024, the board of supervisors must submit an adopted "construction evaluation resolution" to the DNR between January 1 and January 31, 2023.

A sample construction evaluation resolution is attached to this memo.

The construction evaluation resolution should be submitted to Kelli Book through mail or email:

Kelli Book Iowa Department of Natural Resources 502 East 9th Street Des Moines, IA 50319-0034 kelli.book@dnr.iowa.gov

Counties will receive a confirmation email for all CERs received.

The board of supervisors can adopt the resolution at any time, as long as it is actually submitted to the DNR during January of 2023.

Pay attention to this deadline. It seems like every year there is a county or two that misses the deadline.

If a county board of supervisors does not adopt a construction evaluation resolution for 2023, then the county cannot:

1) submit a formal recommendation to the DNR concerning a particular construction permit application; the county can submit comments, but they are not given nearly as much weight by DNR as a formal recommendation would be;


2)send county employee along on a DNR site inspection; or

3)appeal the DNR's decision regarding a construction permit application to the Environmental Protection Commission.

In addition, if the county chooses to use the master matrix, then applicants must meet stricter environmental standards than they would have to meet otherwise. So, using the master matrix provides greater environmental protection for the county.

CONSTRUCTION EVALUATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors wishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2023 and January 31, 2024 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

for the

WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY

The undersigned, acting as the incorporating units of an authority under Iowa Code Section 346.27, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority:

ARTICLE I

- Section 1.1. Name. The name of the Authority is the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority.
- Section 1.2. <u>Incorporating Units</u>. The Authority is incorporated by Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and the City of Sioux City, State of Iowa, which is the county seat of Woodbury County. These Articles of Incorporation have been adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the governing body of each incorporating unit.
- Section 1.3. <u>Effective Date</u>. The Authority shall become effective at such time as these Articles of Incorporation have been recorded in the Woodbury County Recorder's office (technically known as the Woodbury County Auditor and Recorder's office), filed with the lowa Secretary of State, and published once in the Sioux City Journal.

ARTICLE II

- Section 2.1. <u>Purposes</u>. The purposes of the Authority are to acquire, demolish, improve, enlarge, equip, furnish, repair, maintain, and operate a public building and to acquire and prepare any necessary site for the joint use of the incorporating units.
- Section 2.2. <u>Powers</u>. The Authority is a body corporate with the power to suc and be sued in any court in Iowa, to have a seal and alter it at its pleasure, and to make and execute contracts, leases, deeds, and other instruments necessary or convenient to the exercise of its powers. In addition, it has and may exercise the following public and essential governmental powers and functions and all other powers incidental or necessary to carry out and effectuate its express powers:
 - a. To select, locate, and designate an area lying wholly within the territorial limits of the City of Sioux City as the site to be acquired (the "Building Site") for the construction, alteration, enlargement, or improvement of a public building. The Building Site selected is subject to approval by a majority of the members of the governing body of each incorporating unit.
 - b. To acquire in the corporate name of the Authority the fee simple title to real property, including the Building Site, by purchase, gift, devise, or by the exercise

- of the power of eminent domain, or to take possession of real estate by lease.
- c. To demolish, repair, alter, or improve any building within the Building Site, to construct a new building on the Building Site and to furnish, equip, maintain, and operate the building.
- d. To construct, repair, and install streets, sidewalks, sewers, water pipes, and other similar facilities and otherwise improve the Building Site.
- e. To make provisions for off-street parking facilities.
- f. To operate, maintain, manage, and enter into contracts for the operation, maintenance, and management of buildings, and to provide rules for the operation, maintenance, and management.
- g. To employ and fix the compensation of technical, professional, and clerical assistance as necessary and expedient to accomplish the objects and purposes of the Authority.
- h. To lease all or any part of a building to the incorporating units for a period of time not to exceed fifty years, upon rental terms agreed between the Authority and the incorporating units. The rentals specified shall be subject to increase by agreement of the incorporating units and the Authority if necessary, in order to provide funds to meet obligations.
- i. To procure insurance of any and all kinds in connection with a building. The bidding procedures provided in Iowa Code Section 73A.18 shall be used in the procurement of insurance.
- j. To accept donations, contributions, capital grants, or gifts from individuals, associations, municipal and private corporations, and the United States, or any agency or instrumentality thereof, and to enter into agreements in connection therewith.
- k. To borrow money and to issue and sell revenue bonds in an amount and with maturity dates not in excess of fifty years from date of issue, to provide funds for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, demolishing, improving, enlarging, equipping, furnishing, repairing, maintaining, and operating buildings, and to acquire and prepare sites, convenient therefor, and to pay all incidental costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, architectural, engineering, legal, and financing expense, and to refund and refinance revenue bonds as often as deemed advantageous by the Board of Commissioners of the Authority.
- 1. The provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 73A applicable to other municipalities are applicable to the Authority.

ARTICLE III

Section 3.1. <u>Governance</u>. The Authority shall be directed and governed by the Board of Commissioners, consisting of three commissioners.

Section 3.2. <u>Election of Commissioners</u>. One commissioner shall be elected by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa, from the area outside of the county seat. One commissioner shall be elected by the City Council of the City of Sioux City, Iowa, from the area inside the City. One commissioner shall be elected by the joint action of the Board of Supervisors and the City Council, and if the governing bodies are unable to agree upon a choice for the third member within sixty days after the election of the first member, then the third member shall be appointed by the Governor of Iowa. Any vacancy in the Board of Commissioners shall be filled by election of the governing body of the incorporating unit or units that elected the prior Commissioner, and the person filling such vacancy shall serve out the remainder of the term of the prior Commissioner.

Section 3.3. <u>Terms</u>. Each Commissioner shall serve for a six-year term, except as set out below:

- a. The first Commissioner elected by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County will serve for a term of two years.
- b. The first Commissioner elected by the City Council of the City of Sioux City will serve for a term of four years.
- c. The first Commissioner elected by joint action of the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County and the City Council of the City of Sioux City (or appointed by the Governor of Iowa) will serve for a term of six years.
- Section 3.4. <u>Removal of a Commissioner</u>. A Commissioner may be removed from office by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the governing body of the incorporating unit or units that elected the Commissioner.
- Section 3.5. Officers. The Board of Commissioners shall designate one commissioner to serve as Chairperson, one commissioner to serve as Secretary, and one commissioner to serve as Treasurer. The Board of Commissioners may appoint such other officers as it deems necessary or appropriate.
- Section 3.6. <u>Compensation</u>. No commissioner shall receive any compensation in connection with his or her services as a commissioner. Each commissioner shall be entitled to reimbursement for any actual and necessary expenditures in connection with the performance of the commissioner's duties.

ARTICLE IV

Section 4.1. <u>By-Laws</u>. The Board of Commissioners shall adopt By-Laws and rules of procedures which provide for regular meetings, the proper safekeeping of the Commission's records, and such other matters as the Board of Commissioners deems appropriate. The By-Laws and any amendments to the By-Laws shall be subject to the approval by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the governing body of each incorporating unit.

Section 4.2. <u>Amendments</u>. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended, provided, however, that no amendment shall impair the obligation of any bond or other contract. Each amendment shall be adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the governing body of each incorporating unit, executed by the Chairperson of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors and the Woodbury County Auditor and by the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Sioux City, recorded in the Woodbury County Recorder's office, filed with the lowa Secretary of State, and published once in the Sioux City Journal.

Section 4.3. <u>Disposition of Assets</u>. The Authority's assets are dedicated exclusively to and shall be used exclusively for the purposes stated in Section 2.1. In the event of dissolution or liquidation of the Authority, its entire assets remaining after payment or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Authority and compliance with mandatory provisions of applicable law shall be distributed exclusively to Woodbury County, Iowa and the City of Sioux City, Iowa, as directed by the Board of Commissioners or by a court of competent jurisdiction if the Board of Commissioners fails to make the selection within a reasonable time.

Section 4.4. <u>Dissolution</u>. In the event all Authority assets are disposed of in accordance with Section 4.3, or in the event that the Authority unsuccessfully submits to the voters the question of whether the authority shall issue and sell revenue bonds on two separate occasions, the incorporating units may adopt Articles of Dissolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the governing body of each incorporating unit. The Authority shall cease to exist at such time as both incorporating units adopt the Articles of Dissolution and the Articles of Dissolution have been recorded in the Woodbury County Recorder's office, filed with the lowa Secretary of State, and published once in the Sioux City Journal.

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RESOLUTION APPOINTING COMMISSIONER TO WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY'S BOARD OF COMMISSIOINERS

WHEREAS, Woodbury County, State of Iowa (the "County"), is a political subdivision, organized and existing under and by the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the County has approached the City of Sioux City, Iowa (the "City") with a proposal to establish a Joint County and City Building Authority pursuant to Iowa Code Section 346.27 (the "Authority") for the purposes of building and financing a new law enforcement center for joint use by the City and County; and

WHEREAS, the County has now adopted a resolution adopting Articles of Incorporation to form the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority and has authorized the execution of the Articles of Incorporation: and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 346.27 requires that the Authority be directed and governed by a Board of Commissioners of three members, one to be elected by the Board of Supervisors of the County from the area outside the county seat, one to be elected by the City Council of the City from the area inside the City, and one to be elected by the joint action of the Board of Supervisors of the County and the City Council of the City; and

WHEREAS, the two-year term of the first Commissioner elected by the Board of Supervisors expires on December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the County hereby intends to appoint a Commissioner to the Board of Commissioners of the Authority to serve a six-year term; and

WHEREAS, the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>Appointment</u>. <u>Rocky De Witt</u>, currently residing outside of the City of Sioux City, Iowa, is hereby appointed to serve as the County's Commissioner on the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Authority's Board of Commissioners for a term of six years beginning on January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2027.

Section 2. <u>Compensation</u>. The Commissioner shall not receive compensation in any actual and necessary expenditures in connection with the performance of the Commissioner's duties.

Section 3. What constitutes vacancy. The appointment shall be vacant if any of the following occur:

- (a.) The Commissioner ceases to reside in the area outside of the county seat of Woodbury County, Iowa (i.e. Sioux City, Iowa).
- (b.) The Commissioner ceases to be a member of the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors.

If a vacancy occurs, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors shall fill the vacancy and the person filling such vacancy shall serve out the remainder of the term of the prior Commissioner.

This memo's purpose is to provide the Board of Supervisors an overall view of the proposed Woodbury County budget for FY 2024. These will be challenging times as inflation is currently at 7.1% and new expenses will be rising due to the new Law Enforcement Center. The County has a bond rating of AA3 which helped in achieving lower interest rates on bond issues and future CIP Loan Notes. The County will get through this without major changes in services provided to the citizens of Woodbury County.

Included in this memo are schedules that summarize the proposed FY 24 Budget by fund, proposed Tax Asking and projected Tax Rates.

Three tax funds are subject to the 2% cap. The Funds are General Fund (General Basic & General Supplemental) and Rural Basic Fund. If the tax asking is over 2% it than requires a super majority vote to pass the tax asking.

The fund that is exempt from any tax cap is Debt Service Fund.

The proposed tax askings based on budget requests requires tax asking increases in the General Fund up 19.68% and Rural Basic tax asking is up 15.69%
