WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of

supervisors between February 1, 2023 and January 31, 2024 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in lowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix:



- B. Appointment and membership.
 - (1) The members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors for terms of five years. Terms of the Board shall be staggered so that no more than two memberships expire on December 31 of any year. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner for the remainder of an unexpired term.
 - (2) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall consist of eligible electors, as defined by Iowa Code section 39.3, who reside within the area regulated by the County Zoning Ordinance and shall not be officers or employees of any agency or department of the County. Iowa law requires all appointive boards, commissions, committees, and councils of a political subdivision to be gender balanced by using a fair and unbiased method of selecting the best qualified applicants. The Board of Supervisors may appoint any qualified applicant, regardless of gender, after making a three-month good faith effort to appoint a gender balanced Board.
 - (3) Members of the Board of Adjustment shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual expenses incurred while performing their official duties, which shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
 - (4) Any member of the Board of Adjustment may be removed for cause by the Board of Supervisors following a public hearing on written charges. Cause for removal may be found by the Board of Supervisors in any action or condition which it determines to be detrimental to the proper functioning of the Board, including conflicts of interest, violations of laws or regulations pertaining to the role of the Board, failing to carry out the duties of a member of the Board, including failure to attend 50% or more regular meetings in any twelve-month period, or other conduct which casts doubt upon the integrity or effectiveness of the member.
- C. Rules of Procedure. The Board of Adjustment shall organize itself and shall adopt and maintain, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, rules of procedure in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Iowa Code to govern the conduct of its business.
- D. Powers and Duties. The Board of Adjustment shall have the following powers and it shall be its duty:
 - (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is an error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination made by an administrative official in the enforcement of Iowa Code Chapter 335, or of any ordinance adopted pursuant thereto.
 - (2) To hear and decide special exceptions to the terms of the ordinance upon which such Board is required to pass under such ordinance.
 - (3) To authorize upon appeal, in specific cases, such variance from the terms of the ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions a literal enforcement of the provisions of the ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of the ordinance shall be observed, and substantial justice done.

Currently I have been retired and helping my 20 year old son as a beginning farmer take over the family farm. I was the CFO for Interstate Powder Coatings and College Products, both of Sioux City. I farmed and was an Ag Loan Officer for Firstar Bank, Sioux City and Cooperative Credit Company, Sioux Center. At Firstar my primary responsibility were large cattle feeding accounts. My first loan was \$3 million on up to \$30 million. At Cooperative Credit my partner and I started and managed a finance company for originally 6 cooperatives, in 2 years I was asked to present our company to 60 different Coop Board of Directors and 40 of those Coops became members of Cooperative Credit, which is currently over \$100 million in assets. Coopertive Credit loans money directly to farmers for short and intermediate-term farm financing needs through member cooperatives. I went through banking backwards, starting with large loans and then going to smaller loans. Prior to that I worked as a cattle agent for a firm at The Sioux City Stockards and I was the night Safety Director for Direct Transit, responsible for accidents, overages/shortages, license and permit issues for 1500 trucks.

Interest in Appointment:

While working for Cooperative Credit, my territory was essentially everything west of I35 in lowa. That opportunity put me in a lot of different communities with many different dynamics, working with both community leaders, businesses, and farmers. Many times I was negotiating between other lenders, the borrower and our member cooperatives. This experience gives me a working knowledge of what other communities have tried, what works, what doesn't work, but most of all, it made me appreciate my home community that much more. We are very fortunate in Woodbury County to have such a diversity of people, industries, geography, and opportunities. Two counties to the north of us we have one of the wealthiest counties in the state, they have the smallest average farm size in the state and they are a large net importer of corn. One county south of us we have one of the poorest counties in the state with the largest average farm size. It is one of the largest corn exporting counties in the state and the county seat which sits on I29 has the distinction as the poorest town in the state. The people are always the key to success but good local government can be a vital partner in success as well.

My goal is to continue and hopefully expand the relationship between the citizens and the government of Woodbury County. Our citizens need to know that their opinions are always heard, considered and valued. When people feel that their voices are heard, they are more willing to engage in both government and business within our county. They are more willing to start businesses or expand existing businesses when they feel confident that the local government is intent on fairly representing all citizens.



RESOLUTION APPOINTING COMMISSIONER TO WOODBURY COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER AUTHORITY'S BOARD OF COMMISSIOINERS

WHEREAS, Woodbury County, State of Iowa (the "County"), is a political subdivision, organized and existing under and by the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the County has approached the City of Sioux City, Iowa (the "City") with a proposal to establish a Joint County and City Building Authority pursuant to Iowa Code Section 346.27 (the "Authority") for the purposes of building and financing a new law enforcement center for joint use by the City and County; and

WHEREAS, the County has now adopted a resolution adopting Articles of Incorporation to form the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Center Authority and has authorized the execution of the Articles of Incorporation: and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 346.27 requires that the Authority be directed and governed by a Board of Commissioners of three members, one to be elected by the Board of Supervisors of the County from the area outside the county seat, one to be elected by the City Council of the City from the area inside the City, and one to be elected by the joint action of the Board of Supervisors of the County and the City Council of the City; and

WHEREAS, the County's appointee Rocky De Witt has resigned from the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors and per the County's Resolution #13,371 his appointment is vacant; and

WHEREAS, the County hereby intends to appoint a Commissioner to the Board of Commissioners of the Authority to serve the remainder of the current six-year term; and

WHEREAS, the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County and residents thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WOODBURY COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>Appointment</u>. <u>Rocky De Witt,</u> currently residing outside of the City of Sioux City, Iowa, is hereby appointed to serve as the County's Commissioner on the Woodbury County Law Enforcement Authority's Board of Commissioners for a remainder of the current six-year term ending December 31, 2027.

Section 2. <u>Compensation</u>. The Commissioner shall not receive compensation in any actual and necessary expenditures in connection with the performance of the Commissioner's duties.

Section 3. What constitutes vacancy. The appointment shall be vacant if the Commissioner ceases to reside in the area outside of the county seat of Woodbury County, Iowa (i.e. Sioux City, Iowa).

If a vacancy occurs, the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors shall fill the vacancy and the person filling such vacancy shall serve out the remainder of the term of the prior Commissioner.
