WHEREAS, neither Chapter 331 nor any other Code provision sets forth any procedural action required to be taken before said Second Amendment can be approved, and pursuant to Section 331.301(5), Code of Iowa, it is deemed sufficient if the action hereinafter described be taken and the Woodbury County Auditor causes to be published notice of the proposal and of the time and place of the meeting at which the Board of Supervisors proposes to take action thereon and to receive oral and/or written objections to such action; and

WHEREAS, the following action is now considered to be in the best interests of the County.

Permit Provisions and Conditions of Issuance

1.

The County and/or the County Board of Supervisors will not be charged with any responsibility for damages to the Applicant's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said county roads, including new or additional right-of-way acquired in connection therewith, subsequent to the building of the Applicant's facilities. The Board will endeavor to give the Applicant sufficient notice of any proposed construction or maintenance work, on either existing or newly acquired right-of-way that is likely to expose, cover up, or disturb any facilities belonging to the Applicant, in order that the Applicant may arrange to protect the facilities. The Board will inform contractors, and others working on the job of the location of the facilities so that reasonable care may be taken to avoid damaging the facilities, however the County and the Board of Supervisors will assume no responsibility for failure to give such notice.

- 2. The Applicant shall take all reasonable precaution during the construction of said facilities to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the adjacent property owners and the traveling public and shall save the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless of any damages or losses that may be sustained by adjacent property owners and the traveling public on account of such construction operations.
- 3. Operations in the construction and maintenance of said facilities shall be carried on in such a way as to not interfere with, or interrupt traffic on said roads. However, should the performance of work called for in this permit in any way interfere with or obstruct traffic on said roads, the Applicant shall provide the necessary flagmen as required by the Statutes when one-way traffic is involved and/or otherwise mark said work so as to protect the traveling public.
- 4. The Applicant shall hold the County and the Board of Supervisors harmless from any damages that may result to said highway because of the construction or maintenance of said facilities and shall reimburse the County or the Board of Supervisors for any expenditures that the County or the Board of Supervisors may have to make on said roads on account of replacement of surfacing gravel and bridge and culvert repairs.
- 5. Applicant shall lay, construct, operate and maintain said facilities so as not to interfere with natural drainage of the road and so as not to interfere with the construction or maintenance of said roads. When buried cable or wire lines are to be placed lengthwise with the roadway, they shall be placed in the County road shoulder or ditch near the toe of the fore-slope and parallel to centerline of roadbed at a depth of three (3) to four (4) feet by using specially designed plows or by trenching, whichever is appropriate. Plow slots and trenches shall be repacked as necessary to restore the disturbed area to its original condition. For buried line crossings of roadways not paved, an open trench may be dug and the lines placed therein, and the trench back-filled over the lines. Buried line crossings on paved roadways, lines may be placed through the sub-grade by jacking, or by boring a hole just large enough to take the lines; or if the County Engineer approves, a tunnel may be dug through and the cable or wire lines placed therein. All backfill of tunnels and trenches shall be toroughly compacted in layers of 6" or less in depth. Back-filling of trenches within the right-of-way by not under the traveled roadway shall be tamped sufficiently to avoid settlement. When crossing an existing roadway, all buried facilities shall be placed a minimum of three (3) to four (4) below the bottom of the existing adjacent ditches. Overhead lines, where practical, shall be placed adjacent to and with two (2) feet of the Road/Highway Right-of-Way Line.
- 6. The Applicant will at any time subsequent to placing the facilities, and at the Applicant's expense, relay, replace, alter, change, reconstruct, or relocate its overhead and/or buried facilities and appurtenances thereto as may become necessary to conform to new grades, alignment, or widening right-of-way, resulting from maintenance or construction operations by the County Board of Supervisors irrespective of whether or not additional right-of-way is acquired in connection with such road improvements. The Applicant agrees to do this within ninety (90) days written notice from the Board of Supervisors, and without cost to the County. If the Applicant is unable to comply within said ninety (90) days, the Board of Supervisors may cause the work to be done and the Applicant will pay the cost thereof upon receipt of statement.
- 7. All work shall be done in a workmanlike manner; the surrounding ground, slopes, and ditch bottoms shall be reshaped to conform to the area and left in a neat condition satisfactory to the County Engineer. All areas where sod has been damaged or destroyed shall be re-seeded.
- 8. The Applicant shall notify the County Board of Supervisors at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the Applicant's intention of starting work covered by this permit on the road right-of-way. Said notice shall be in writing to the County Engineer.
- 9. Applicant, its' successors, grantees and assigns shall and hereby agrees to assume all responsibility, risks and liabilities for all accidents and damages that may occur to persons and/or property on account of the work done under this permit, and to this end, indemnify and hold the County and all authorized representatives thereof harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, and expense including judgements, costs and including attorney's fees, for personal injuries (including death) or property damage arising or resulting from the activities of the Applicant in connection herewith, now and at all times in the future.
- 10. It is understood that this permit is issued only insofar as Woodbury County has jurisdiction and does not presume to release the Applicant from fulfilling any existing statutes relating to the installation, construction and operation of said facilities.
- 11. It is further understood that the facilities covered by this permit shall be constructed or installed within one (1) year after the date of approval of this permit, unless otherwise extended in writing by Woodbury County.

The city of Salix has requested establishment of a drainage district. Our drainage engineer has provided guidance for the Board for this process.

BACKGROUND:

ISG is preparing a letter to the Board outlining the steps under Chapter 468 of the Iowa Code that would need to be followed in addressing this petition. In this letter ISG is recommending additional project discovery by means of a meeting with the City of Salix and their City Engineer V&K. This discovery work would be completed prior to appointment of ISG as Engineer under Section 468.8 for addressing this specific (city of Salix) petition/project. ISG will bill for the services for discovery and meetings under the District Watchman Service agreement with Woodbury County.

RE: CITY OF SALIX PETITION TO ESTABLISH A DRAINAGE DISTRICT

Woodbury County Board of Supervisors:

We have reviewed the drainage petition filed with the Board of Supervisors by the City of Salix and two (2) additional landowners. This petition is requesting a new Drainage District be established to afford the City of Salix and the landowners of Salix an improved outlet, for there is no natural surface outlet available to the City and their current outlet agreement with the Farmers Drainage Ditch is being terminated. The City submitted with their petition a conceptual map that provides the approximate location of the proposed drainage ditch they wish constructed and potential area to be improved by the establishment of said open ditch. The formation of a new drainage district will be required to follow the procedures within Chapter 468 of the lowa Code .

While researching background information for this area, we reviewed the City of Salix 2015 Comprehensive Plan, which contains information regarding the petitioned improvements. It is stated in this Plan that V&K Engineering had completed a preliminary engineering study of the proposed outlet. Therefore, to fully scope the improvements the City is requesting, we feel a due diligence meeting with the City of Salix and their City Engineer, V&K needs to be held to discuss the preliminary engineering work and it's alignment with Chapter 468. From this discovery, ISG can better estimate the cost of engineering necessary to complete the Engineering Study and Report for the improvements as required by the code. This engineering cost estimate is necessary to establish the amount of Bond the petitioners will need to post under Section 468.9 of the lowa Code.

Therefore, as the appointed Drainage District Watchman for Woodbury County, we are providing you this guidance letter with our recommendations of steps to be followed in accepting the petition and appointing ISG as Drainage Engineer to make the necessary study and report. The original petition and associated conceptual map are included for reference along with a copy of the Stormwater page from the City of Salix Comprehensive Plan.

DRAINAGE DISTRICT ESTABLISHMENT (IAC CHAPTER 468)

lowa Code Chapter 468 "Levee and Drainage Districts and Improvements" provides the requirements for the establishment of a drainage district. If Woodbury County does not have an appointed drainage legal counsel, ISG recommends that legal counsel with drainage district proceeding experience be appointed and engaged throughout the establishment process to ensure that requirements of the code are being met. Below are summaries of the specified code sections for the establishment of a drainage district, meant to provide the Board with an overview of the necessary steps.

- 468.6 Number of Petitioners Two (2) or more landowners may file a petition for establishment of a drainage district
- 468.8 Petition Requirements of Petition
- **468.9 Bond** A bond shall be filed with the petition, conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings in case the district is not established
- 468.10 Engineer Board to appoint a competent civil engineer
- 468.11 Survey Engineer to examine lands and facilities described in petition
- 468.12 Report Engineer to prepare full written report of proposed improvements for establishment
- **468.13 Classification** If requested by the petitioners prior to hearing on the Engineer's Report, the Board shall order a classification of lands in proposed district to determine the distribution of benefits

- 468.14-.20 Outlines requirements for notice of hearing on engineer's report for establishment
- **468.21 Hearing** Board may dismiss petition at hearing if proposed improvement will not materially benefit the petitioned lands or would not be for public benefit
- 468.22 Establishment Board may establish district or direct engineer to complete further investigation. Also, Board shall direct the Auditor to appoint appraisers to assess value of right-of-way required for the proposed open ditch improvements
- 468.24-.25 Appraisers Appraisers shall be appointed to assess claims for damages, other than right-of-way, and shall
 prepare and file a report outlining recommended damages for proposed improvements
- 468.26 Award by Board At hearing, Board to consider Appraiser's report and make final determinations of damage amounts for proposed improvements
- 468.27 Dismissal or establishment Board at hearing shall evaluate costs of improvement and damages, and either dismiss the petition for establishment or permanently establish and locate district.
- 468.28 Remonstrance If at or before final hearing remonstrance is filed by a majority (+50%) of landowners owning in aggregate seventy percent (70%) or more of the land in proposed district, Board shall dismiss the proceedings and assess incurred costs to the petitioners

PROJECT DISCOVERY

Prior to the Board's appointment of ISG for the survey and report to address this petition, the petitioners must file a bond conditioned for the payment of all costs and expenses incurred in the proceedings described above. Working with the Board's appointed legal counsel, ISG can provide an estimate of cost and expenses anticipated to address this petition through hearing and establishment as described above. This estimate would provide the Board with a value of bond to be required by the petitioners prior to proceeding.

However, as noted in our introduction of this letter we are recommending additional discovery and research be performed to better determine the scope of this proposed project and the associated costs and expenses. A meeting with the City and their Engineer, V&K would facilitate the discovery of previously completed work. This due diligence will prevent duplicate effort, such as concept engineering work, coordination efforts with existing infrastructure entities (Utilities, Secondary Roads, IDOT, etc.), and coordination efforts regulating authorities for permitting (USACE, DNR, NRCS, etc.) which will reduce costs to the proposed landowners.

RECCOMENDED ACTION

Therefore, ISG is recommending that the following actions:

- 1. The Board direct ISG to meet with City of Salix, Veenstra & Kimm as engineer for the City of Salix, and Woodbury County Engineer to review needs and previously completed studies and options evaluated.
- 2. Based on discovery from said meeting, ISG will meet with appointed legal counsel to considered other concerns to be covered with the Board for consideration of acceptance of petition.
- 3. If Board accepts petition, ISG will provide a fee estimate to the Board of Supervisors outlining the expected costs & expenses to complete the engineering study and report and provide the services necessary to follow through hearings for determination of establishment.
- 4. After the necessary bond has been provided to the Board by the petitioners, appoint ISG as engineer for study and report.

Dear Mr. Gill,

The City of Salix has been notified by the Famers Drainage District that the pumping agreement that has been in place since May 11th, 1984 will terminate in December 2023 and will not be renewed. This leaves the City of Salix and the surrounding area with no natural outlet for their stormwater runoff. Without an outlet for the stormwater, the City and surrounding areas will have flooding issues that could result in damage to homes, streets, utilities, and farmground.

The City of Salix has been working with Veenstra & Kimm, Inc. and has had discussions with County Engineer, Mark Nahra, to determine a potential route for a new drainage ditch. The drainage ditch would start at the intersection of 280th Street and S. Tama Street then going west along 280th Street to the existing drainage channel near Port Neal Road that drains into Snyder Bend (See Attached Map).

After the drainage district has been created the City of Salix would request that the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors transfer control of the drainage district to the City of Salix per Iowa Code Chapter 468.322.

We, the undersigned petitioners, respectfully request that the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors work with the City of Salix and Veenstra & Kimm, Inc. to establish a new Salix Drainage District per Iowa Code Chapter 468.

Per Iowa Code 468.8 this petition includes:

- 1. See attached map for the lands that may have potential improvements created by the new drainage ditch.
- 2. Due to no natural outlet for stormwater runoff, the City of Salix and surrounding areas will be subject to flooding.
- 3. Creating the new drainage ditch will alleviate flooding and provide drainage which will promote public benefit, utility, health, convenience, or welfare.

Stormwater Project



Description

Flash Flooding has been a recurring problem in Salix during severe storms, as pointed out several times during the public meeting process. The high water table also exacerbates the flash flooding situation. This project aims to attain the goals of Supporting the Rural Landscape and Helping Existing Places Thrive by managing stormwater. This project is based on a conceptual plan developed by V&K Engineering (refer to map below). This project calls for planting wetland and prairie plants around the proposed retention ponds.

Implementation

The city should coordinate with the lowa Department of Transportation and Woodbury County on having the drainage line run across Interstate-29 and through unincorporated areas. The SCPT recommends planting native wetland and prairie plants around the retention ponds. These plants stabilize the pond against erosion. The inclusion of a sediment forebay at the inlets of detention ponds prevents sediments from accumulating at the bottom of the pond.



The pond should have a gradual slope so that it supports wetland and prairie plants. Grading the shoreline at approximately five feet horizontal and one foot vertical will achieve this. An underwater ledge about six to 12 inches below the normal water level of the pond will help support wetland plants.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

During the last 9 years, we have engaged in long-term planning to include replacement of the failing Law Enforcement Center, energy inefficiencies, an underutilized Prairie Hills building, a hundred-year-old "county farm," failing terra cotta/courthouse windows, and roads. We will now have a new jail, all-LED lighting, a Sheriff's training center in place of the now-demolished Prairie Hills building, courthouse windows replaced and terra cotta secured, a 10-year plan to borrow from future CF industries through tax increment financing and build back a 4-6 inch gravel base, and the farm sold to help keep taxes flat. We should continue to evaluate long-term planning as it relates to the Courthouse, Trosper Hoyt, and Emergency Services.

BACKGROUND:

The building at Climbing Hills has had several issues that have come back before the Board of Supervisors to include the need for tuckpointing the building, which is a very expensive proposition not to mention the high cost and ill-advised retrofit of the HVAC system there. Additionally, energy efficiencies should be studied from a cost-benefit analysis to see over 10 and 20 years time less rebates what upfront costs in a more efficient building would be versus the old. Additionally, the Sheriff's Office Training Center was something we originally put forward as a promise when fears were that law enforcement personnel would simply lose training space. We followed through on that promise, but the roadmap and blueprint can serve as one for this present problem:

1) Direct Kenny Schmitz to work with Emergency Services Director Scott Mitchell for a rough scope of magnitude

2) Identify additional needs/wants (differentiating between the two) and a working plan not to exceed \$1.2 million

3) Identify sources of funds to include a 5 and 10 year plan of payback (most likely from Gaming Revenue) in working on a potential lease-purchase agreement

4) Identify problems or risks associated with the problem (leech field) and recommendations for current building that could

re-purpose rather than demolish the building, e.g. storage, etc.

5) Come back to BOS with an approvable plan within 4-8 weeks

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The impact could be anywhere from \$500,000 to \$1.2 million but the impact should be predicated on having options. The amount of revenue could come--as it did with the Sheriff's Training Center--through gaming revenue regularly scheduled on a program ranging from \$75,000-\$120,000 per year for 5 or 10 years.

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Compliance and Reporting Guidance

- Expenses of establishing temporary medical facilities and other measures to increase COVID-19 treatment capacity, including related construction costs;
- Acquisition of equipment for COVID-19 prevention and treatment, including ventilators, ambulances, and other medical or emergency services equipment;
- Improvements to or construction of emergency operations centers and acquisition of emergency response equipment (e.g., emergency response radio systems);
 - Installation and improvements of ventilation systems;
 - Costs of establishing public health data systems, including technology infrastructure;
 - Adaptations to congregate living facilities, including skilled nursing facilities, other long-term care facilities, incarceration settings, homeless shelters, residential foster care facilities, residential behavioral health treatment, and other group living facilities, as well as public facilities and schools (excluding construction of new facilities for the purpose of mitigating spread of COVID-19 in the facility); and
 - Mitigation measures in small businesses, nonprofits, and impacted industries (e.g., developing outdoor spaces).

<u>Other clarifications on COVID-19 mitigation: medical care, supports for vulnerable</u> <u>populations, data systems, carceral settings</u>. Based on public comments and questions received from recipients following the interim final rule, Treasury is making several further clarifications on enumerated eligible uses in this category.

Public Comment: Several commenters requested clarification on eligible uses of funds for medical care; Treasury addresses those comments in the section Medical Expenses below.

Public Comment: Recipients posed questions on the type and scope of activities eligible as "supports for vulnerable populations to access medical or public health services."

Capital Expenditures

Excerpt from SLFRF Final Rule Overview:

The SLFRF final rule clarifies that recipients may use funds for programs, services, and capital expenditures that respond to the public health and negative economic impacts of the pandemic. Any use of funds in this category for a capital expenditure must comply with the capital expenditure requirements, in addition to other standards for uses of funds.

Capital expenditures are subject to the same eligibility standard as other eligible uses to respond to the pandemic's public health and economic impacts; specifically, they must be related and reasonably proportional to the pandemic impact identified and reasonably designed to benefit the impacted population or class. For ease of administration, the final rule identifies enumerated types of capital expenditures that Treasury has identified as responding to the pandemic's impacts; these are listed in the applicable subcategory of eligible uses (e.g., public health, assistance to households, etc.).

Recipients may also identify other responsive capital expenditures. Similar to other eligible uses in the SLFRF program, no preapproval is required for capital expenditures.
