Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and A + B Real Estate (hereinafter referred to as property owner, organization or authorized representative) do hereby enter into the following permit and agreement:
1. Woodbury County hereby consents to and grants permission to the property owner, organization or authorized representative, to conduct the following described construction or activities within the right-of-way:
Shape foreslopes to blend into work in farm field. Work will
drain to culvert intake.

- 2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:

The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.
- C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.
- D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. Thank you for your willingness to reach out to Woodbury County regarding their decision not to participate in the lowa Homeowner Assistance Fund (HAF) program. As of today, there are five pending HAF applications from Woodbury County homeowners that have all been on hold for quite some time, ranging from seven to 15 months.

As of the application submission dates, the five homeowners owed approximately \$5,000 to Woodbury County in delinquent property taxes. With the additional payments due since the application submission dates, staff estimates that the County is likely to collect over \$10,000 in delinquent property taxes paid on behalf of these five homeowners. It is impossible to estimate how many additional eligible homeowners may apply for property tax assistance if Woodbury County were to be listed as a participating county on the HAF web page.

In order to participate in HAF, the County must execute a Provider Participation Agreement via AdobeSign. Deb Townsend from our team manages the HAF program and would be happy to work directly with the Woodbury County Treasurer's office to execute the required agreement and answer any questions. It is my understanding that our HAF program team has discussed the situation directly with the Woodbury County Treasurer who said that the Woodbury County Attorney would not agree to the County participating in the HAF program. We do not have any additional

information regarding the County Attorney's decision in this matter. IFA's legal counsel has simplified the required Provider Participation Agreement recently so perhaps that might provide a new opportunity for reconsideration by the Woodbury County Attorney and Treasurer.


