BACKGROUND:						
The FY24 budget for Building Services related to the new Law Enforcement Center was \$1,191,420. Current expenditures as of December 31, 2023 are \$16,738. The balance remaining is \$1,174,682. This amount will default to General Fund reserves unless otherwise allocated.						
FINANCIAL IMPACT:						
Monthly average \$99,285 x 2.5 months = \$248,212 (half of April and all of May and June). This leaves \$926,470. The LEC Authority is still working towards their own estimated opening date, so it is proposed to be conservative and use \$900,000 of this amount towards the FY25 budget in General Basic.

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

WHEREAS, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate eve1y construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February I, 2024 and January 31 2025 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305 but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix.


