

Woodbury County, State of Iowa, and Flock Group Inc dba Flock Safety (hereinafter referred to as propowner, organization or authorized representative) do hereby enter into the following permit and agreement:	erty				
1. Woodbury County hereby consents to and grants permission to the property owner, organization or authorized representative, to conduct the following described construction or activities within the right-of-way:					
Place two solar-powered automatic license plate reader (ALPR) cameras on new 12' Floor	k				
poles in the County ROW in the interest of public safety.					

- 2. In consideration of Woodbury County granting said permission and consent, the property owner, organization or authorized representative hereby promises and agrees to the following:
- A. The applicant shall carry on the construction, repair and maintenance with serious regard to the safety of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.
- B. The property owner, organization or authorized representative, at his/her own expense, shall provide all safety measures and warning devices necessary to protect the traveling public such as but not limited to, signs, lights, and barricades during the day and at night if the roadway will be obstructed. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. The Department will loan the required signs to the applicant who shall be responsible for placing the signs and covering or removing when not in use, removal after the work has been completed, and return of the Department owned signs to the Department maintenance facility from which obtained. The applicant shall be responsible for correctly using signs as needed while work is in progress. Flagging operations are the responsibility of the applicant.
- C. In placing any drainage structure, no natural drainage course will be altered or blocked.
- D. The finished project shall be left in a satisfactory condition subject to the approval of the County Engineer. The traveled portion of the roadway shall not be damaged or disturbed. The property owner, organization or authorized representative assumes all liability and agrees to reimburse Woodbury County for any damage to the roadway or ditch caused by placement of this structure. Permittee is to call County Engineer for upon completion for final inspection.
- E. The property owner, organization or authorized representative shall notify all appropriate telephone and utility companies in advance of any excavation and shall check for underground electric or telephone lines.
- F. Woodbury County will not assume any of the cost of the construction of the said improvement or structure nor will Woodbury County assume any future costs for maintenance or replacement of said improvement or structure. If in the best interest of Woodbury County, the said improvement or structure may be removed by the County, or may be caused to be removed, without any obligation by Woodbury County to pay damages or cost of replacement.
- G. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will reseed and mulch the disturbed areas. Property owner, organization or authorized representative will be responsible for seed, mulch, and labor unless otherwise provided in section L.

- H. The property owner, organization, or authorized representative hereby agrees to hold Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department, its employees and agents harmless against any and all claims for damages and personal injury arising out of work performed or actions taken by the applicant related to the construction or maintenance of the facility. The applicant further agrees to reimburse the County or the Department for any expenditures that the County or Department may have to make on said highway rights of way on account of said applicant's construction or maintenance activity or other activities or lack thereof. The applicant shall also save Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department harmless of any damage or losses that may be sustained by the traveling public on account of such construction, repair or maintenance operations, or other activities.
- I. FAILURE TO CONFORM TO OR TO ACQUIRE A PERMIT IS A VIOLATION OF SECTION 318.8, 2009 CODE OF IOWA. This permit is subject to any laws now in effect or any laws that may be hereafter enacted and all applicable rules and regulations of local, state and federal agencies. This permit is subject to all the rules and regulations of Woodbury County and the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department.
- J. This permit is subject to revocation by the Department at any time and at no cost to the Department, when in the judgment of the Department it is necessary in the improvement or maintenance of the highway or for other reasonable cause.
- K. All proposed work covered by this permit shall be at the applicant's expense. The applicant shall reimburse the Woodbury County Secondary Road Department for any materials removed from the highway right of way described as follows:

Installation of a new Flock pole only requires a 1' sq hole to be dug; minimal disturbance

No materials should be removed during installation.

#### WOODBURY COUNTY, IOWA RESOLUTION NO.\_\_\_\_ WEED DESTRUCTION ORDER

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of each of Iowa County's Board of Supervisors to enforce the provisions of Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended with regard to the destruction of weeds, and

WHEREAS, under Chapter 317 of the Code of Iowa as amended each county Board of Supervisors must prescribe and order a program of weed destruction to be followed by landowners, tenants, and other persons in possession or control of land, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors that a program of weed destruction for the year 2025 is necessary,

#### NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Woodbury County, Iowa that each landowner, tenant or other person in possession or control of private land shall on or before the dates stated below, destroy the below-listed noxious weeds on their land by spraying them with a suitable herbicide in a strength sufficient to kill such weeds.

- 1. May 1, 2025 for Palmer amaranth annual.
- 2. May 5, 2025 for musk, thistle, sow thistle, bull thistle, leafy spurge, perennial pepper grass, sour dock perennial, smooth dock perennial, and sheep sorrel perennial.
- 3. June 2, 2025 for Canada thistle, Russian knapweed, buckhorn perennial, wild mustard annual, horse nettle, and teasel biennial.
- 4. June 9, 2025 for field bindweed, wild carrot biennial, and quack grass.
- 5. June 16, 2025 for butterprint annual, puncture vine annual, and cocklebur annual.
- 6. July 1, 2025 for wild sunflower annual and poison hemlock.
- 7. October 1, 2025 all thistles in the rosette stage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that any person using county road Right-of-Way for haying or grazing are responsible for following the labeled restrictions listed on the following products used by Woodbury County Weed Commissioner: Grazon P&D, Streamline, Perspective, Method 240SL, Milestone, and MSN 60.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that all weeds on county trunk and local roads and between the fence lines of such roads, whether they be noxious weeds or other weeds, shall be eradicated or otherwise destroyed, to prevent seed production, by the owner of the land adjoining the road on or before June 6, 2025.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that weeds that are not destroyed in compliance with the above order may be destroyed by the Weed Commissioner, and the costs of destruction by the Weed Commissioner, including the cost of serving notice, plus a penalty of twenty-five percent of total costs shall be assessed against the property upon which the weeds were destroyed, in the case of private lands, or against the adjoining land, in the case of weeds on county roads. Landowners are to contact Weed Commissioner and notify him if there are areas that should not be sprayed with herbicides.



#### **BACKGROUND**:

February 18th, 2025- Board Approves 2025 CIP Courthouse Clerks Project (\$78,833.00)

The First Floor Clerks Office has been effected for several months by aggregate salts dropping down from the ceiling above the office area. The current building demolition across the street from the Courthouse has substantially increased the amount of talcum powder-like material (salts) that is falling. Previously the material was a nuisance but the situation is now to a level that needs to be addressed sooner than later. The material if allowed to continue could eventually be detrimental to items such as printers and/or desktop computers if it infiltrated interior components. This is also an annoyance to office staff. Project may require relocation of Clerks Office employees to other areas for several weeks.

The Clerks Office Ceiling was originally inteneded and was scheduled to be a 2026 CIP Project.

Plaster ceiling salting occurs due to plaster being impacted as a result of high humidity or water.

Plaster is made up of aggregate and limestone. In humid conditions the aggregate will release its salts.

The salts form on the exterior of the plaster as a talcum powder like substance.

Project repairs may include the following:

Staff relocation.

Removing portions of ceiling to access steam, condensate, and waste lines present.

Identification of any lead or asbestos containing products.

Replacing leaking heating steam lines, and condensate lines in crawlspace above ceiling.

All entrances shall be constructed in a manner to acceptable standards. This permit shall expire one year after date of approval by Woodbury County, if proposed driveway or entrance construction is not completed within that time.

# WOODBURY COUNTY SECONDARY ROAD DEPARTMENT POLICY AND PROCEDURE MEMORANDUM #1

PPM Origination Date: 2011

Revisions: 1/2012, 4/2025

SUBJECT: Secondary Road Driveways and Entrances PPM #1

#### I. PURPOSE:

This policy outlines the application for new and modified entrance permits. The purpose of this policy is to establish rules for control of access to Secondary Roads throughout Woodbury County and to formalize the requirements for the location and establishment of driveways, field entrances, streets (private or public) and subdivision streets requested by property owners. This policy is to assure that adequate standards are maintained to assure safe road access for persons entering and exiting Secondary Roads while providing safe road use for traffic already on the road. For this policy, any access to a Secondary Road will be noted as an entrance.

#### II. CODE OF IOWA: Section 318.8.

A person shall not excavate, fill, or make a physical change within a highway right-of-way without obtaining a permit from the applicable highway authority. At the request of a permittee, a modification may be granted in the discretion of the highway authority. Work performed under the permit shall be performed in conformity with the specifications prescribed by the highway authority. If the work does not conform to permit specifications, the person shall be notified to make the conforming changes. If after twenty days the changes have not been made, the highway authority may make the necessary changes and immediately send a statement of the cost to the responsible person. If within thirty days after sending the statement the cost is not paid, the highway authority may institute legal proceedings to collect the cost of correction. A violation of the permit specifications shall be considered a violation of section 318.3. A public utility subject to section 306A.3 is exempt from this section.

#### III. ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- Residents seeking an entrance permit to construct new or modify an existing entrance must follow this policy and have an approved permit before work commences
- Must give sufficient time to the County Engineers office for a review of the application.
- Rock provided by the County for entrance maintenance, must be kept within the right-of-way and can not be used or moved to private property.

#### IV. CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS:

- Contractors must be preapproved by the Woodbury County Engineer.
- Contractor must provide a Certificate of Insurance, annually.
- Proper traffic control measures must be followed.
- Work is not permitted on: Sundays, Holidays, between Sunset and Sunrise.
- Drainage must be always maintained.
- Work may include drainage and shaping of ditch as part of the entrance requirements.
- Call Iowa One Call at (800) 292-8989.

#### V. PREAPPROVED CONTRACTORS:

Call the County Engineers office to become a preapproved contractor and for the list of preapproved contractors contact information.

#### VI. MATERIALS:

- Corrugated metal culverts must be purchased through Woodbury County Engineers office. Cost will be determined by the current prices.
- New reinforced concrete culverts must be Iowa DOT approved. Documentation and proof of culvert must accompany the entrance permit.

#### VII. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Entrance side slopes 6:1 or flatter on all paved roads and 3:1 or flatter on granular and dirt roads. Vertical headwalls are not permitted.
- Minimum setback of 125 feet from County Road intersections.
- Can not be directly connected to an intersection.
- Minimum sight distance requirements:

Speed limit has been established by the Woodbury County Board of Supervisors or by Code of Iowa, Section 321.285.

- Entrances will not be approved unless they meet the minimum sight distance requirements above. Exceptions may be granted if, due to road alignment, proximity to an intersection or other geometric feature prevents traffic from driving the legal speed limit of the road. The County Engineer will be the final judge in such cases and a driveway may not be approved if it cannot be safely located.
- One driveway per rural residential lot under 10 acres in size.

- Circle driveways (two separate driveways in the ditch connected by a continuous lane or driveway on private property) are not allowed on rural residential properties.
- On paved roads, entrance shall be rock surfaced from the edge of shoulder to the right-of-way line.
- Must be separated by at least 50 feet to allow drainage of the road surface.

#### VIII. NEW ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- Will be removed by the County or Contractor.
- Property owner will be charged all equipment and labor costs for the removal.
- Minimum setback of 125 feet from the end of a bridge.

#### IX. ENTRANCE WIDENING REQUIREMENTS:

- Existing culvert will be reviewed for adequate sizing and structural soundness.
- Property owner will be responsible for required upgrades to existing culvert and extension including necessary band.

#### X. PAVED ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- Maintenance is the responsibility of the landowner, applicant, and/or homeowners association.
- If determined to be a safety concern, the County will remove the pavement, and the property owner will be charged all equipment and labor costs for the removal.

### XI. AGRICULTURAL ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- Farm property may be served by a single entrance for the residence, plus a second entrance to allow access to farm buildings or grain bins.
- Two field entrances may be allowed per forty (40) acre field.

#### XII. UNATHORIZED ENTRANCES:

- Will be removed by the County or Contractor.
- Property owner will be charged all equipment and labor costs for the removal.

#### XIII. INCORRECT ENTRANCES:

- Permit holder will be informed of deficiencies.
- All deficiencies must meet specifications within 30 calendar days of notice, or the entrance will be removed, and the permit holder will be charged equipment and labor costs.

#### XIV. DRIVEWAY REMOVALS:

- Will be at the expense of the landowner.
- Drainage must not be affected by removal.
- Work on ROW permit must be completed, and no fee will be charged.

#### XV. WOODBURY COUNTY SECONDARY ROADS:

- Will determine the size and length of the culvert for acceptable entrance permits.
- Will provide corrugated metal pipe.
- Will provide equipment and operator during normal Secondary Roads hours to load corrugated metal pipe onto transport vehicle for approved entrance permit.
- Responsible for continuing maintenance on approved entrances. The maintaining of rock on the entrance within the County right-of-way will be added when the Engineer dictates the need and funds are available.
- Exceptions for special access needs may be granted by the County Engineer.

#### XVI. FEES:

- Culvert costs must be paid before an approved permit will be issued.
- An entrance permit fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00).
